There's nothing the least bit unusual about the Coolmore team shipping to the U.S. and winning races, but the victories almost always come at the Grade I level and often in Breeders' Cup races. So when a filly named **Yesterdayoncemore (Ire)** (No Nay Never) was entered in the Sept. 2 Del Mar Juvenile Fillies Turf S., which had a \$100,000 purse, it was a bit of a head-scratcher. Why bring a horse all the way from Ireland, particularly one who was winless in five career starts, for a relatively minor race at a track about 8,400 kilometers from home?

It turns out that the ownership group, which includes Deron Pearson's DP Racing, felt they had a quality filly and bringing her to the U.S. was the best chance they had of being proven right. When deciding how to manage your horses, sometimes you take chances, even if they don't necessarily make sense on paper.

And sometimes they work.

Yesterdayoncemore won the race by a length ([video](#)) and is now being considered a potential starter for the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf.

DARK LADY PREVAILS IN THE DICK POOLE

Possibly stretched by seven furlongs, Cheveley Park Stud's **Dark Lady (GB)** (Dark Angel {Ire}) proved on Thursday that she is a strong stayer over six when edging out **Millisle (Ire)** (Starspangledbanner {Aus}) in the G3 Shadwell Dick Poole S. Having failed to truly see out the extra trip when third in the G2 Sweet Solera S. at Newmarket on Aug. 10 and runner-up in the G3 Prestige S. at Goodwood a fortnight later, the homebred tracked the pace against the inner travelling strongly. Delivered to swoop on the eventual runner-up with over a half furlong to race, the 13-2 shot held a slim advantage all the way to the line as the pair pulled 4 1/2 lengths clear of 'TDN Rising Star' **Summer Romance (Ire)** (Kingman {GB}).

Trainer Richard Hannon is aiming high now. "She takes her racing so well," he said. "She is very thick-set and is a bit of a favourite in the yard, as she looks a bit like a bull."

"The plan was always to start her in Europe and if she were able to win a graded stakes leave her there," said Pearson, a Las Vegas resident. "If it looked like the graded stakes were a little tough for her we planned to send her to the U.S. to race. There were two reasons for that. The competition for turf horses is a little easier here and she would have more chances to run on firm ground and we've always thought she was a firm ground filly."

Yesterdayoncemore was purchased at the 2018 Tattersalls October Yearling Sale for 110,000gns. Soon thereafter, Pearson bought a half interest in the filly.

She started off her career with two straight second-place finishes over all-weather tracks and then finished off the board in three straight tries on the turf. In all three races the going was listed as good.

"Deron Pearson lives over there and wanted to see his horse run at his home track," trainer Fozzy Stack said. "That was one of the factors. The other was that the ground was getting a bit soft at home and she wants a very fast track. The logical place to come for firm turf was the U.S."

They also got a bit lucky. The same card included a \$61,000 maiden race for 2-year-old grass fillies and Pearson said that he and Stack wanted to run in that race while Coolmore's Paul Shanahan wanted to go in the stakes race. The decision was taken out of their hands when the maiden race was oversubscribed and Yesterdayoncemore did not get in.

Irish-bred horses finished one, two, three in the race and another was ninth. Stack said he was confident he could beat the foreign shippers, but admitted he didn't have a good read on the American starters.

"I wasn't too worried about the European horses," Stack said. "I knew we'd have their measure. I didn't know how we would stack up to the Americans. But we did think she would stay and get the mile well and there weren't many in there that were proven at the trip."

Despite a rough trip (she steadied twice under jockey Victor Espinoza), Yesterdayoncemore found room in the stretch and won with something left in the tank.

"Any time you travel this far and get a little luck out of it you get a good kick out of it because a lot of planning and things go into it," Stack said. "It's a team effort and it's good when these things work out. It was an away game for us."

With Stack as the trainer, Yesterdayoncemore will stay in the U.S. and go next in the Oct. 6 Surfer Girl S. at Santa Anita. Should she run well there, the Breeders' Cup at Santa Anita will be next.

"If she runs as well in the next race as she did the other day, then, yes, I think we have a Breeders' Cup horse," Pearson said.

After the Breeders' Cup, Yesterdayoncemore will likely ship to Florida and will be based there with trainer Patrick Biancone. The other option would be to keep her in California with trainer Jim Cassidy.

Pearson has only recently teamed up with Coolmore and this was his first stakes win since he joined their team. He says he co-owns two horses with them in Europe and a handful in the U.S.

"What a great group to be partners with," he said. "I'd like nothing more than a long, successful partnership with them. We've gotten off to a good start."

Hannon continued, "She gets to the races and you think she can't be fit, but she is. She is immensely talented. I think that might be her trip and she will now go to the [Sept. 28 G1] Cheveley Park [at Newmarket]. She deserves her chance."

Dark Lady, who had broken her maiden by five lengths on Lingfield's Polytrack July 17 and ran fourth in Ascot's G3 Princess Margaret S. 10 days later over this trip before being tried at seven, is out of Ladyship (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) who captured the Listed City Plate at the latter distance. Out of the Thompsons' G1 Lockinge S. and G1 Sun Chariot S. heroine Peeress (GB) (Pivotal {GB}), she also has a colt foal by Iffraaj (GB).

FINAL ENTRY STAGE FOR OCTOBER SALE CRITERIUM

The final entry stage for the Haras de Bouquetot - Criterium de la Vente d'Octobre Arqana ends on Sept. 27. The Criterium, which takes place over a mile at ParisLongchamp on Oct. 5, is worth €275,000 and is open to graduates of the prior year's Arqana's October Yearling Sale. Full race conditions are available [here](#). Only horses kept eligible at the prior May 31 declaration stage may be entered at this final stage, and the full list of horses that remain eligible is available [here](#). No fee will be charged until declarations on Oct. 3, when a cost of €500 per horse will be charged.

In addition to the €275,000 on offer in prizemoney—which will be paid out to eighth place—coverings to Bouquetot stallions Shalaa (Ire), Olympic Glory (Ire) and Zelzal (Fr) will be awarded to the breeders of the first three horses past the post.

The first two runnings of the Criterium have highlighted talented runners: the inaugural winner Dice Roll (Fr) (Showcasing {GB}) went on to win the G3 Prix Djebel and was third in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains, while last year's winner Master Brewer (Fr) (Reliable Man {GB}) was subsequently exported to Hong Kong.

DUSTY DREAM (GB) (**Dubawi {Ire}**) is the latest progeny out of The Queen's G2 Cherry Hinton S. winner Memory (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) and like her pair of talented Galileo (Ire) half-siblings Call To Mind (GB) and Recorder (GB) is under the care of William Haggas. The homebred debuts against some useful types with experience and Qatar Racing's fellow newcomer **Heart Reef (Fr)** (**Australia {GB}**), a €220,000 Arqana August graduate whose dam is a half to Danedream (Ger) (Lomitas {GB}).

2.30 Ascot, Mdn, £16,000, 2yo, 7fT

ENEMY (GB) (**Muhaarar {GB}**) was a €420,000 Arqana August purchase by Qatar Racing and Lady O'Reilly who debuts for John Gosden and is a half-brother to the star mares Magic Wand (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) and Chicquita (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}). The April-foaled bay meets another notable unraced colt in Sir Evelyn de Rothschild's **Crystal Pegasus (GB)** (**Australia {GB}**), a Sir Michael Stoute-trained relative of Crystal Ocean (GB) (Sea the Stars {Ire}).

DONNYBROOK (IRE) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) is one of two Godolphin newcomers in this intriguing affair, with John Gosden responsible for the handling of the daughter of the G3 Prix Allez France scorer Mayhem (Ire) (Whipper). At €900,000 the highest-priced filly at the Arqana August Sale, the February-foaled bay encounters the similarly-unraced **Sorrel (Ire) (Dansili {GB})**, a rare runner in George Strawbridge's silks for the Sir Michael Stoute stable. Part-owned and bred by James Wigan, the March-foaled bay is a half-sister to the G2 May Hill S. winner Agnes Stewart (Ire) (Lawman {Fr}).

SNOW SHOWER (GB) (f, 2, Lope de Vega {Ire}--Solar Pursuit {GB}, by Galileo {Ire}) was restrained to settle off the pace in eighth through the early stages of this unveiling. Making smooth headway from halfway, the 16-1 chance challenged wide going well passing the quarter-mile marker and was ridden out inside the final furlong to assert by 1 3/4 lengths from Alash Orda (GB) (Kodiac {GB}). "I wasn't able to teach her as much as I'd have liked," admitted rider James Doyle. "They went a good pace, but the leaders fell away quickly and I was in the perfect position to take advantage. She handled the ground, she travelled through the race and picked up well. I don't know how strong the race was, but she did what she had to do." Kin to a colt foal by Bated Breath (GB), she is the fifth foal and scorer out of a winning half-sister to six black-type performers headed by G1SW sires Polish Summer (GB) (Polish Precedent) and Meteor Storm (GB) (Bigstone {Ire}). She shares her second dam Hunt the Sun (GB) (Rainbow Quest), herself a full-sister to MG1SW sires Raintrap (GB) and Sunshack (GB), with G1 Nassau S. heroine Winsili (GB) (Dansili {GB}) and G1 Prix Royal-Oak victor Ice Breeze (GB) (Nayef). Last off the bridle in the straight, the 5-2 second choice was shaken up with 1 1/2 furlongs remaining and surged clear in impressive fashion thereafter to easily account for Tombolo (Fr) (Le Havre {Ire}) by 3 1/4 lengths, becoming the fifth winner for his freshman sire (by Showcasing {GB}). Half to a 2019 colt by Elusive Pimpernel and from a family featuring G1 Sydney Cup hero Offer (Ire) (Lope de Vega {Ire}), he is the third scorer from as many runners out of a winning half-sister to MSW multiple Turkish champion Hakkar (Tur) (Halling) and the stakes-winning Galiphan (Tur) (Halling). Nudged along approaching the two pole, the 25-1 outsider improved into fourth entering the final furlong and quickened smartly in the closing stages to prevail by a head from stablemate Hartswood (GB) (Garswood {GB}). He becomes the second scorer produced by an unraced full-sister to MGSP Listed Esher S. victor Havana Beat (Ire) (Teofilo {Ire}) and the bay is kin to a yearling colt by Gutaifan (Ire) and a 2019 colt by El Kabeir. 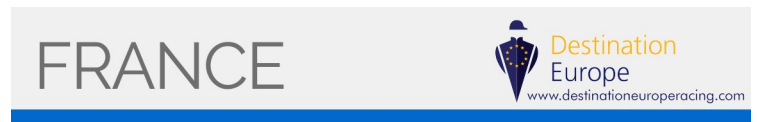

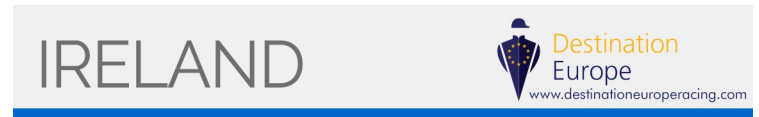

CURLIN COLT SET TO IMPRESS AT KEENELAND



The Curlin (USA) colt with dam at Stonestreet in Kentucky

Stonestreet Farm's penchant for speedy Australian pedigrees will be put to the test at the Keeneland September Sale next week and the major Kentucky operation has the highest of expectations when a son of **Bounding** (Lonhro) goes through the ring.

To be offered during the second session by Eaton Sales as **lot 274** on behalf of Stonestreet owner Barbara Banke, whose late husband Jess Jackson founded the stud, the Curlin (USA) youngster is the first foal of the former champion New Zealand sprinter and G1 Railway S. winner.

The Australian-bred mare was purchased at the 2016 Magic Millions National Broodmare Sale by Stonestreet for \$1.9 million out of Willow Park Stud's draft.

"This is Bounding's first foal and we couldn't be happier. He's a gorgeous, gorgeous horse and we feel he will be extremely well received at the sale," Stonestreet's long-time bloodstock advisor John Moynihan told *TDNAusNZ*.

"He would be in the top, top, top one per cent of what we've bred in any given year. We feel he's really special and Bounding is really stamping her horses."

Bounding has also produced a stunning filly by War Front (USA), whose future is yet to be decided.

"We don't make those decisions until we get a little bit further down the road. Barbara will sit down and decide what she wants to do, generally we offer just about our entire yearling crop so we'll see."

Moynihan is an integral part of the Stonestreet team that annually confirms the matings for the broodmare band.

"We go through them all very thoroughly and Bounding was a mare that for the most part had an almost American pedigree," he said.

"We are very familiar with her second and third dams and the first trip I made to an Australian breeding stock sale was when Vin Cox and Barry Bowditch got me to come down for the Teeley Dispersal Sale.

"There was one mare there that Brian Nutt had that wasn't offered for sale, which was Believe 'N' Succeed and Bounding's mother.

"We really, really wanted to buy that mare, but she had to leave the sale sick and go to a vet clinic and I think they sold her some months later.

"She was gorgeous and the dam of this year's English Derby winner (Anthony Van Dyck)."

Chance Snapped Up...

Moynihan said when Bounding came on the market they didn't have to think twice.

"We love Australian pedigrees and she's got a pedigree we can bring back here. We own Curlin and several other stallions and bringing those types of speed pedigrees that have been successful in Australia fits our model. **Cont. p2**



Bounding

“They have proven to be successful now in Europe, England and Ireland and it only enhances the programme we’re trying to create here.”

Stonestreet currently has two mares based at Coolmore, **Catch A Fire** (Sebring) and **Kangarilla Joy** (Lonhro).

The G2 Angus Armanasco S. winner Catch A Fire was bought out of Bhima Thoroughbreds’ draft at the Magic Millions National Broodmare Sale in 2017 for \$950,000 and is a sister to the G2 VRC Sires’ Produce S. winner and multiple Group 1 placegetter Seaburge and the family of the G1 Caulfield Guineas winner Mighty Boss (Not A Single Doubt).

Group 1 Pedigree...

Offered by Turangga Stud, Kangarilla Joy was signed for by Moynihan at the 2014 Inglis Easter Yearling Sale and she won three races and finished runner-up in the G2 Light Fingers S. before retirement.

Her second dam is the G1 Blue Diamond S. winner Midnight Fever (Luskin Star) and the G1 Australian Guineas winner Rock Classic (Fastnet Rock) also features in the pedigree.

“We have the option of leaving them in Australia or bringing them to America,” Moynihan said.

“Kangarilla Joy was the first ever yearling we bought down there and she missed winning a Group 2 by a nose. She’s just had a Snitzel foal and she’s been covered again by Snitzel.

“Catch A Fire has had a Snitzel foal too and she’s going to I Am Invincible. They will be sold at the Magic Millions or Inglis Easter, depending on the maturity of the horses.

“We own another filly in partnership with Coolmore called **Angel**. She’s by Fastnet Rock and is a half-sister to Miracles Of Life. We don’t have that many, but they are of real quality.”

Family Package...

The dual Group 1 winner **Miracles Of Life** (Not A Single Doubt) was another early Stonestreet purchase and was bought out of the Teeley Dispersal Sale during the Magic Millions National Broodmare Sale for \$900,000. The farm also claimed her dam Dazzling Gazelle at the same auction for \$400,000.

“Miracles Of Life had a paddock accident and we tried desperately to save her,” Moynihan said. “Unfortunately, we

weren’t able to do and it was an extreme loss as we loved the mare.”

Her daughter by Medaglia d’Oro was the first yearling that Stonestreet ever sold in Australia and she made \$1,000,000 at the Gold Coast earlier this year to the closing bid of Godolphin and has been named Jadida.

“I hope she’s doing well for them because we certainly loved her,” Moynihan said. “We also lost Dazzling Gazelle to another accident. It’s just the luck of the draw.

“We love Australia and from a personal standpoint you all do things down there similar to what we do in the United States with 2-year-olds.

“We haven’t bought that many horses to race down there, but we certainly love it. The sales environments are great and so is the racing product, arguably some of the fastest in the world today.

“They go to all parts of the world and race successfully. We like it because it mirrors a lot of what we do in the United States so we are very comfortable going there and getting involved.”

Coolmore aside, Stonestreet has also forged partnerships with Newgate’s Henry Field and SF Bloodstock.


“We own a small percentage of a few racehorses with Henry’s group and SF and we bought a few yearlings with them and we’ve done the same thing in the United States,” Moynihan said.

“We did buy some fillies last year at Magic Millions and hopefully they’ll be getting to the races as 2-year-olds. We’ve got a really nice Not A Single Doubt filly and others by Zoustar, Exceed And Excel and Hinchinbrook.

“On the colt’s side of it we’ve got two I Am Invincibles, a Deep Field and a Sebring. We’ve been trying to get lucky down there.

“We had a very good horse a few years back called **Stratosphere**. He was only able to make one start for us in a Group 3 (Canonbury S.) and missed by a nose and then had a career-ending injury coming out of that race.”

Stratosphere is standing his first season in 2019 in Tasmania at Grenville Stud.

The iconic Phipps Stable is doing the unprecedented. For the first time, it is selling its entire crop of yearling colts. This is set to go down next week at the Keeneland September sale through Claiborne, as agent. No need to sound the alarm, however--Daisy Phipps Pulito, who co-owns the elite Claiborne-based operation with her mother, brother, and two sisters, said the stable is not going anywhere. Known for racing homebred colts and fillies by top-notch sires and out of mares from some of the most storied families in the Stud Book--most of them developed and nurtured over decades by various generations of Phippses--the family is breaking new ground so that it can grow the operation in other directions. "We just want to spread some risk," she said. And she assuaged the fears of some inquiring minds on Twitter last week when she unequivocally tweeted: "We are not leaving. Phipps Stable is 100% committed to breed and race."

Pulito said the plan is to race the fillies and to keep improving the broodmare band with an occasional purchase or two, as the stable did a few years ago when it bought two well-bred yearling daughters of Tapit and Malibu Moon at Keeneland to introduce new blood into the broodmare band. **Cont. p3**

The \$675,000 Malibu Moon filly is Grade II winner and 'TDN Rising Star' Fly So High, who is from the family of Gun Runner (Candy Ride {Arg}).

"Part of selling these colts is, it lets us do a few things. It spreads our risk out a little bit, and it allows us, if we want to go to [Keeneland] November and buy a broodmare, we'll have some money to do that with, or if we want to wait until next September and buy some fillies and put those in our broodmare band when they're done racing, it allows us to do that," she said.

"We don't have a blank checkbook anymore, so we do run this as a business, but we're going to stay in it. We love it, and it's part of what we deal with in our everyday lives. I don't ever see that coming to an end."

The Phippses have eight colts in the sale, three of them in Book 1. "But we're not giving these colts away by any means," Pulito warned. "There will be reserves set on them. We'll see what they go for. If it's someone we like [who buys one], and they want a partner, maybe we'll stay in for a leg. And that'll be great. There's not a huge downside, right? And, you know, we'll have partners to have some fun with. I'm very excited about selling these colts."

Having partners is another new concept for the Phippses, who've always gone it alone save for the occasional cousin or friend in a horse or two, but partnerships have become a sustainable model that's commonplace nowadays at all levels in the business,

particularly at the top with expensive colts, and Pulito and her family are amenable to the idea of participating. "You have to change to stay current. Don't you think that's the way the whole thing is going? We're the only ones that don't [participate]. It's 2019, so maybe it's time for us to spread a little risk," Pulito said.

She has, on her own account, been in Gatewood Bell's Hat Creek Racing partnerships but noted that because of her family's long history of breeding and racing their own horses, the Phipps Stable doesn't get the partnership offers others do.

"You know what our problem is? You get a really nice colt like Performer (Speightstown), for example. Really nice horse, he's run three times, won twice and won the other day [at Saratoga, on Aug. 24]. If there was anybody else but us, their phones would be ringing off the hook. 'Can we buy a part of this horse, can we get a piece of this horse?' But nobody is calling us for a horse like that because no one knows that we're interested in doing that," Pulito said.

There's a lot of fan interest in the Phipps Stable, however, because it's the last of the great American homebreeding dynasties. Pulito and her siblings Ogden II, Samantha, and Lilly--the children of the late Ogden Mills "Dinny" Phipps and Ande Phipps--are the fifth generation of a racing family that came to

prominence with businessman and financier Ogden Mills, who raced horses in Europe with Lord Derby and won the vaunted Grand Prix de Paris in 1928 with Cri de Guerre when it was the greatest race in France. The Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe was just in a fledgling state in 1928, but Mills also won it that year with Kantar.

One of Mills's daughters was Gladys Phipps, who established Wheatley Stable in 1926 with her brother and raced, among many, many others, the outstanding racehorse and sire Bold Ruler in the stable's purple

and gold silks. Her twin sister Beatrice, later Lady Granard, inherited their father's European stable and raced many fine runners abroad in her name, including Bold Ruler's champion Irish-bred son Bold Lad, not to be confused with Wheatley's champion Bold Lad, also by Bold Ruler. **Cont. p4**

Gladys Phipps's son Ogden Phipps was the father of Dinny Phipps and grandfather of Daisy Phipps Pulito and her siblings.

Ogden Phipps introduced the black silks and cherry cap of his grandfather Ogden Mills to the American turf in the 1930s (Mills's partner Lord Derby's all-black silks with a white button and cap had no doubt been his inspiration) and raced too many good horses to list, but among them were Buckpasser (Tom Fool), Easy Goer (Alydar), and Personal Ensign (Private Account). Buckpasser, Easy Goer, and Private Account all descended from mares tracing to the imported La Troienne (Fr), lines that Phipps had developed from

Idle Hour stock, and Personal Ensign, whose female line is so vibrant now, was a granddaughter of the imported Dorine (Arg) (Aristophanes {GB}), a Haras Ojo de Agua mare that Phipps had long coveted. Performer, the promising Speightstown colt that Pulito referenced earlier, traces to Personal Ensign, as does the

stable's Grade III winner Fire Away (War Front), Grade I winner and Lane's End first-crop sire Mr Speaker (Pulpit), and Charles Fipke's homebred Grade I winner Seeking the Soul (Perfect Soul {Ire}).

Dinny Phipps also used the same silks as his father, but with cherry cuffs, and his long list of notables included champions Inside Information (Private Account) and Smuggler (Unbridled) as well as G1 1000 Guineas winner Quick As Lightning (Buckpasser)--all from the same Grey Flight family that was cultivated by Wheatley. The more recent Phipps graded winner Reload (Hard Spun) is from the family, too.

Pulito said she and her family put the entire crop in to avoid the impression that they were “cherry picking” horses to sell. “Our colt crop this year is larger than it will be next year,” she said, which means that pickings will be less next year. The yearlings have been named, so potential buyers get a Phipps moniker in the transaction as well.

Hips 58 and 345 trace to La Troienne through Numbered Account.

Hips 254, 611, 1317, and 2190 are from the immediate family of Personal Ensign.

Hip 594 goes back to Blitey/Lady Pitt.

Hip 829 is from the Grey Flight family and is from a daughter of Smuggler.

There's history and pedigree depth to the families of these colts that will potentially make any of them--some more than others--valuable stallion prospects should they become Grade I winners.

And any of them have the license to do just that on pedigree alone.

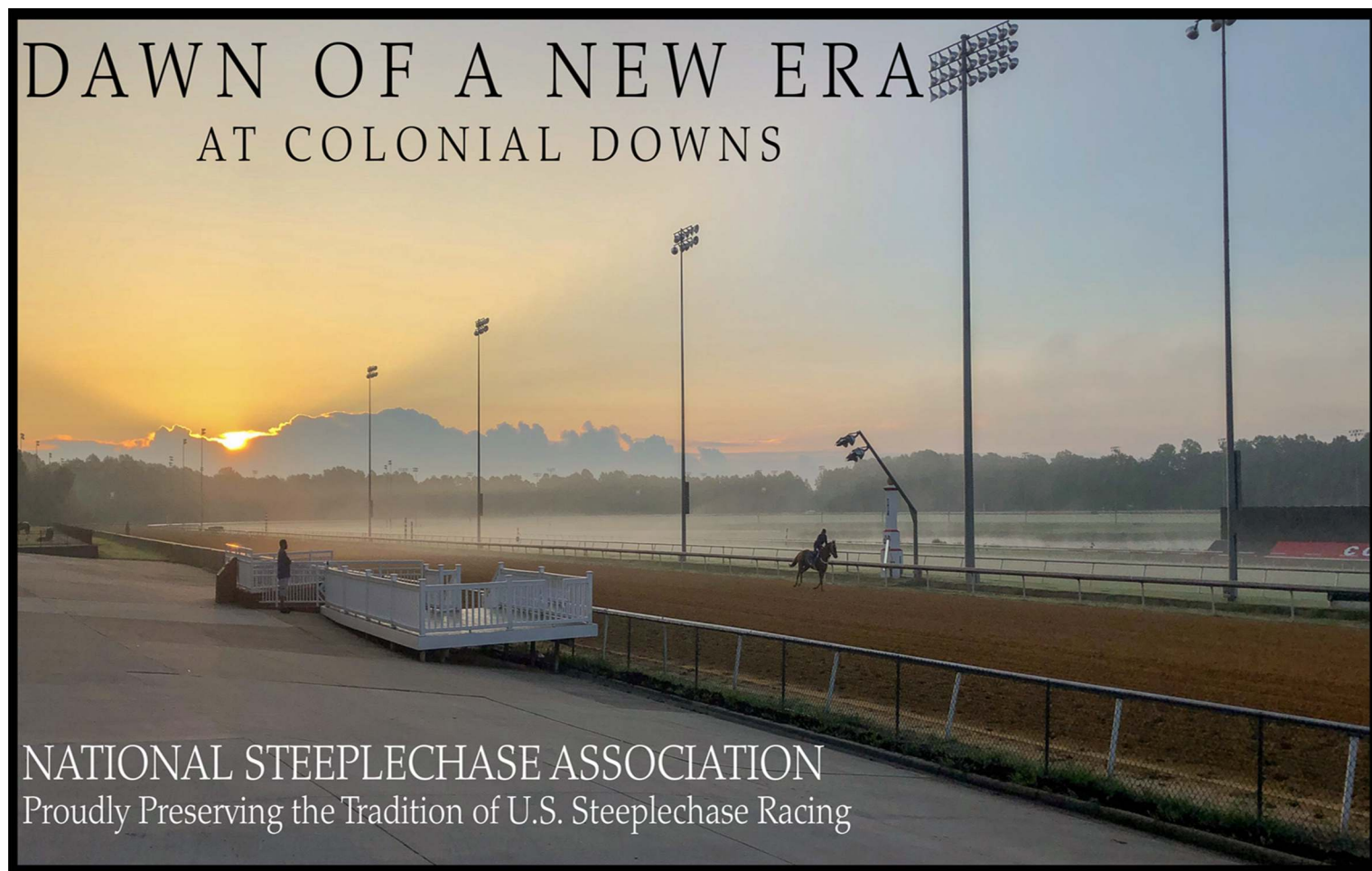

Churchill Will Apply for Turfway Dates cont. from p1

The Churchill release read: “Churchill Downs Incorporated (“CDI” or “the Company”) (Nasdaq: CHDN) announced today that it will file an application with the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission (“KHRC”) requesting to host a 2020 winter Thoroughbred racing meet at historic Churchill Downs Racetrack (“CDRT”) in Louisville, Kentucky as the Company constructs New Latonia Racing & Gaming (“New Latonia”), an up to \$200-million proposed live and historical racing and year-round training facility in northern Kentucky, to host Thoroughbred racing in future years.”

At issue is Turfway’s failure to install Historical Horse Racing (HHR) machines. The machines, which are similar to slot machines, are being used to bolster purses and other revenues at every track in Kentucky but Turfway. The machines have allowed Kentucky Downs to average \$2.3 million a day in purse money at its five-day meet and have also had a dramatic increase on purses at Churchill. Churchill’s machines, which are located at a separate facility called Derby City Gaming, which doubles as its Trackside training center, helped fuel \$95,000 maiden special weight races and \$104,000 allowance races at the spring meet.

“Churchill Downs is stepping up to protect and grow Kentucky’s Thoroughbred racing circuit,” said Kevin Flanery, President of CDRT, in the release. “Our willingness to make a sizeable investment in the neglected northern Kentucky market is our latest effort to improve Kentucky’s valuable horse racing and agriculture industries.”

The release said New Latonia Racing & Gaming would have 1,500 machines, a one-mile synthetic surface main track and an inner dirt track.

In April, JACK Entertainment announced that it had entered into an agreement to sell Turfway and Jack Cincinnati Casino to Hard Rock International. With Hard Rock owning a casino in nearby Cincinnati, its likely they do not want the HHR machines competing with the Ohio casino. Turfway Park is about 12 miles from Cincinnati.

When reached by the *TDN*, Turfway General Manager & Director of Operations Chip Bach said he had no comment on the Churchill proposal to take over Turfway’s dates.

Under JACK Entertainment management, Turfway has flirted with the idea of adding HHR machines, but has never followed through. Last December, it told the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission that it hoped to have 350 machines up and running by June, but none were ever installed.

Many Kentucky racing stakeholders, including the racing commission and the horsemen, have been frustrated by Turfway’s failure to move forward because the machines have proved so successful in the state and have pumped millions into purse accounts.

In an ironic twist to this story, Churchill is being accused of doing exactly the same thing in Illinois that Hard Rock is allegedly doing in Kentucky, putting casino interests and profits ahead of horse racing. Churchill did not apply for slot machines at Arlington Park and said it would only commit to keeping the track open through the 2021 meet. Many believe that the reason they don’t want slots at Arlington is because that would hurt business at the Churchill-owned Rivers Casino, which is about 11 miles from Arlington.

But with Churchill not owning any casinos in the Northern Kentucky-Cincinnati market, a new track built in that area with HHR machines could turn out to be quite profitable for the casino-racing company while also bolstering Kentucky racing overall.

Should the KHRC give the dates to Churchill, that would likely mean the end of Turfway. Then called Latonia, the track opened in 1959.

MIDNIGHT BISOU TO SELL AT FASIG-TIPTON NOVEMBER

Midnight Bisou (Midnight Lute), the five-time Grade I winner and 11-time graded stakes winner heavily favored to be this year’s champion older female, will be offered at the Fasig-Tipton November Sale’s Night of the Stars Nov. 4, according to a press release issued by Elite Sales, who will consign the filly.

Campaigned by Bloom Racing, Madaket Stables, and Allen Racing, the 4-year-old Midnight Bisou is currently undefeated in six starts in 2019 and has never finished off the board in 17 career outings while earning \$3,245,000.

“Very rarely is an in-form, young, set-to-be crowned champion offered at public auction,” said Elite Sales’ Bradley Weisbord. “Here is an opportunity to buy the best filly in training, a five-time Grade I winner, and a superstar physical. We’re honored that Bloom Racing has chosen Elite to consign her.”

In her most recent start, Midnight Bisou scored in the GI Personal Ensign S., running down Elate in a dramatic stretch duel. She has also won the GI Ogden Phipps S., the GI Apple Blossom H., the GII Azeri S., the GIII Molly Pitcher S. and the GIII Houston Ladies Classic S. this season. Last year at three, after breaking her maiden in the GII Santa Ynez S. at Santa Anita, she rattled off wins in the GIII Santa Ysabel S. and the GI Santa

Anita Oaks while under the care of trainer Bill Spawr. Switched to the barn of Steve Asmussen to target the big 3-year-old filly races in the east, she added the GII Mother Goose S. and the GI Cotillion S. Additionally, she placed in four Grade I stakes, including the Coaching Club American Oaks, Kentucky Oaks, Alabama S., and Breeders’ Cup Distaff.

Midnight Bisou is out of GIII Florida Oaks winner Diva Delite (Repent). An RNA at the 2016 Keeneland September Yearling Sale, she was purchased by Jeff Bloom at the OBS April 2-year-olds in training sale in 2017 for \$80,000.

“Midnight Bisou has truly been a dream come true for me, my family, and our partners,” said Bloom. “She exemplifies class, beauty, and elegance, and she consistently displays unrivaled determination and dominance on the racetrack. She has an incredibly intelligent eye and confident presence, combined with an engaging and warm personality. She has taken us all on the ride of a lifetime and has forever changed our lives.”

WALDER SEEKS TO PARLAY PERSONAL VICTORY TO KEENELAND KOREA SPRINT

Trainer Peter Walder is grateful for the invitation to run a horse in the \$823,000 Keeneland Korea Sprint, less than a year and a half after he entered a rehab center to combat a substance abuse issue.

Walder, perennially one of the top trainers at Gulfstream Park, will saddle Fast Pass (Successful Appeal) in the 1,200-metre sprint Sept. 8 at Seoul Racecourse. Walder owns a quarter-interest in the 6-year-old gelding, the other three-quarters owned by Peter Proscia, a 59-year-old oil executive who lives in New York and runs under the stable name Paradise Farms' Corp.

"It's nice to know I can have a horse again to compete at this level," he said in reference to Force Freeze (Forest Camp), who ran second in the 2011 GI Breeders' Cup Sprint. "I probably wouldn't be here to be in this race if I didn't go into rehab.

"It's an everyday struggle, less so now than it was in the beginning. They preach [in rehab] take one minute at a time, one day at a time. This whole situation was really stressful coming over here with this horse, and in the past I would have [succumbed to substance abuse] trying to get the horse prepared to leave, but it's nice to know I can handle any stressful situation without any substance issues."

Bought privately with another horse for \$70,000 last fall, Fast Pass ran third first time out for Walder and Proscia in the \$110,000 Claiming Crown Express last December at Gulfstream Park.

Fast Pass has been collecting checks regularly since. After winning the \$75,000 Open Lead S. at Gulfstream in May, Walder received a notification from Seungho Ryu, general manager of the International Department for the Korean Racing Authority (KRA), asking if he would consider running in the Keeneland

Korea Sprint. After Fast Pass finished third in the GIII Smile Sprint S. behind two horses that went on to finish in the money in Grade I races next time out, Walder travelled to New York to meet with Ryu. Walder then ran Fast Pass in a starter/optional claiming race as a prep for the Sprint and romped by six lengths.

"He's a dead closer and he's gotten really good since we've figured him out and let him be just that, and he's doing great," Walder said. "He needs a lot of things to go well in front of him as far as pace."

Because Japanese horses, which have done well in all three editions of the Keeneland Korea Cup and Keeneland Korea Sprint, aren't competing in the races this year due to the trade dispute between Korea and Japan, it opened the door for more American horses.

"I am not just here representing the United States, I'm also representing Gulfstream Park. It's been my home for many years," said Walder, who began his career at Woodbine before leaving for Florida in 1998. "I love [Gulfstream]. Everyone there throughout the years, and most recently Chief Operating Officer Tim Ritvo, has been great to me, and for that I will forever be loyal to them."

Walder last raced in a \$1-million race in 2015 with Sr. Quisqueyano (Exclusive Quality), who ran ninth in the GI Santa Anita H. after winning the Sunshine Millions Classic S.

A few months later, Walder's life and career began to fall apart. He had been at Lone Star Park with Sr. Quisqueyano for the GIII Texas Mile S. when his maternal grandfather, Sol Steinmetz, who had been like a father to him, passed away. Walder had been an occasional substance user before his grandfather's death, but that set him over the edge. **Cont. p9**

"That was the straw that broke the camel's back," he said.

During that time, his stable went into a funk, winning at less than 10%, far below his 24% career win percentage. Proscia, who is a recovering alcoholic, said there were signs that Walder had a problem when his winning rate dropped and he wasn't showing up for work.

In 2016, Walder went on hiatus for nine months after withdrawing his trainer's application to take care of a legal issue in California that had been hanging over his head for 30 years.

Walder returned to racing but ultimately decided in March 2018 to seek help.

"I was a [substance abuser] for a long time," he said. "But let me tell you something, when we won a race, it was an excuse to use. When we lost a race it was an excuse to use.

"As an addict we always blame everybody else for the way that we are. It's never our fault. Everything is everybody else's fault.

We never look in the mirror."

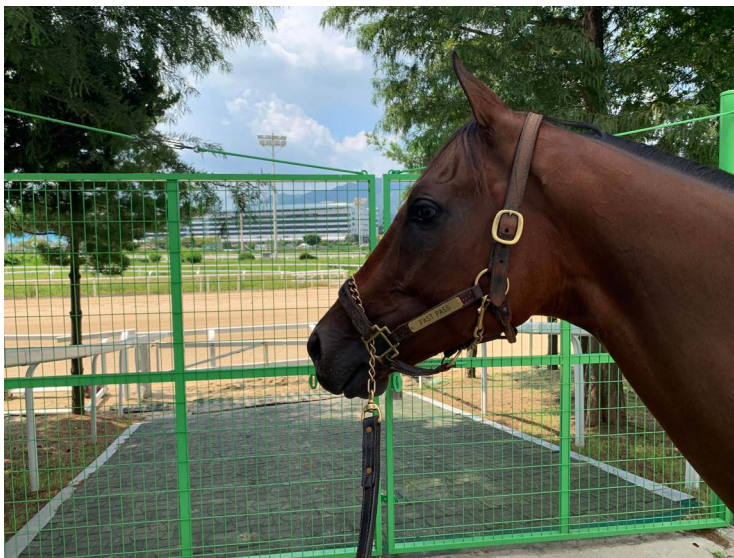
Proscia said he and most of Walder's clients rallied around

him. "I was concerned about it," Proscia said. "Obviously we became friends. I tried to do the right thing. Stay with him with the horses we had and help where I could. I was there occasionally going back and forth from New York. As a friend I was happy to see him come out of it, get his stuff together and now he seems to be doing really well."

When Walder returned to racing, he went public with what happened to him in an interview with *Daily Racing Form*. By that point, word had already

circulated about his stint in rehab, although he had managed to keep his substance abuse hidden from his owners prior to that.

"I realized the things that I had done and the damage I had done to people," he said about his reason to talk about his problem. **Cont. p10**

"To tell you the truth, you realize a lot of that when you are an addict, but rather than accepting it and trying to get forgiveness from people that you've hurt, you just turn around and hurt yourself. That's what addicts do, we hurt ourselves. Being in rehab, you learn to forgive yourself and to ask for forgiveness from the people you've hurt, and if they forgive you, fine, and if they don't forgive you it's on them."

Not only did he not lose clients, he actually gained some when the story of his rehab stint was published. And shortly after that, he won a stakes race and his stable was back winning at an impressive clip.

Last Thanksgiving he posted a Facebook entry to offer thanks to the many people who helped him battle through his problems.

"In life's struggles, it is easy to forget the people and things we are blessed to have in our lives and to only concentrate on the people and things we don't," he wrote. "We beat ourselves up for the problems we made and the people we hurt and let down along the way. I appreciate everyone that has helped me in the past and are still continuously being by my side now. What I am most thankful for now is being clean one day at a time and living life moving forward with no regrets of the past that I can't change and to only live in the present and to be good to me and all the people around me."

Life is good for Walder. He has 22 horses and has full or partial ownership in 15 of them. His stable is hitting at a 38% win clip at Gulfstream, although he knows if he starts going on a losing streak people will immediately begin to speculate his substance abuse problems have resurfaced.

"I know triggers, I know what can happen," Proscia said, speaking of his own experiences as a recovering alcoholic. "When I go to therapy I like to speak about it and tell people if you've got a problem, don't be ashamed about it and deal with it."

"Everybody's got problems, whether in business, personal, addictions, whatever they may be. Get it out in the open and address it. Fix it, the best you can. You'd be surprised about the people that rally around you. Friends that you thought were your friends that don't [support you], screw them. I'm happy for [Walder]. The guy's in good shape now and doing his thing, I'm glad for him."

Win or lose, Walder knows his biggest victory is what he did to address his issues and how he can use his experience to help others in a similar situation.

"We are taught [in rehab] that the best thing we could do when we get clean is to give back to others," he said. "The way to give back is by talking about it and being open about our issues and show people that we are only human and that we can actually beat this deadly disease and all the adversities that come with it as long as we stay clean."

SUMMERFIELD HOPING FOR ANOTHER BUMPER HARVEST

They carry around a long old surname--it's Belgian, imported by a grandfather who started out in Louisiana with "five acres and a mule"--but it's not half as long as their perspective.

Certainly Barbara and Francis Vanlangendonck have been around this business too long to be in any way inflated by their triumph this time last year, when a Curlin colt they presented at the September Sale made \$1.8 million. In fact, in returning to Keeneland with no fewer than 51 yearlings in their Summerfield Sales consignment, they don't even consider that coup the highlight of 2018.

"No, that came at OBS in October," says Barbara. "Selling a colt for two girls that work for us. One of our clients had given them a mare, and they bred her to Kantharos. The foal was just a stellar animal. Not much pedigree, but Francis got him in front of the right people. The girls said, 'Well, let's reserve it for \$35,000. Do you think we can get that?' And he brought \$190,000! Changed their world. It was awesome."

The infectious joy of Elizabeth LaPierre and Jennifer Given that day corroborated the sense of "family" that extends beyond the flesh and blood of the principals and their sons, Arthur and Andrew. As Francis said at the time, they can't ever pay what they feel their staff are truly worth, so the least they could do is provide some keep for a mare, and a slot in the consignment for the colt.

That experience could only mean as much as it did to people who pursue a precarious calling with due humility. Little wonder, then, if their expectations have not been distorted by a terrific run of results over the last year or so, notwithstanding another big result at Saratoga: a Frosted colt sold for \$500,000 on behalf of their Florida neighbors Lori and Tommy Fackler.

"This is a humbling business, we know that," Barbara says. "We've been doing this for a long time. The first sale I worked was 1980, and Francis maybe in '76. You have some success, and start thinking, 'Man, I am so smart.' And God quickly shows you: 'You know what? You're not that smart.'"

So the dividends the Vanlangendoncks cherish most are those shared with the clients they cherish, too. Ideally, then, the biggest will also be for the best. The Curlin colt, for instance, was bred and raised at Stonestreet.

"And when you deal with people like that, it's such a pleasure," Barbara says. "They're horsemen, they understand the game. They know things are going to go right, things are going to go wrong, and they're going to celebrate either way."

Similarly, with the \$1-million American Pharoah colt they sold at Saratoga last year. He was bred by Joanne Nielsen, whose late

husband Gerry was as important as anyone in their story. He got Francis started by offering him a partnership in a small Florida farm. Francis retorted that he had \$5,000 and a truck, and that was it. So Gerry put up the money for him. They bought 40 acres, then another 40, and continued partnering in mares and so on, for years until Gerry's death, aged just 69, in 2004.

"Broke my heart, I still miss him," says Francis. "And of course Joanne's like my sister, and we kept selling for them, and had some success down the years, and their kids became very good friends too. And then she stepped up and bred [the dam of Upstart] to American Pharoah. And I saw the foal and said: 'Oh my God, this could be serious.'"

"He looked exactly like his father," says Barbara.

"Which Baffert denied until after he bought him!" said Francis with a laugh. "It was so exciting, the night of the sale. We all got some ties to wear, and whatnot, and made toasts to Gerry, talking about how much he would enjoy it, and then Gerry Junior comes up in his father's trademark blue blazer that still had stains on it. And the horse is from a family that he started. It was very emotional, when he made a million: we were all crying, we were hugging, it was good stuff."

So the Vanlangendoncks understand that a Thoroughbred can win no race as prized as friendship. Take another adored patron who passed away: Richard Eamer of Mandysland Farm, who co-founded National Medical Enterprises in California.

"He was a very poor as a young man," Barbara recalls. "His girlfriend had to wait tables so they could buy a beer and a pizza to celebrate his 21st birthday. And he became a billionaire. He was so good to me. Our older son was born deaf, and Mr. Eamer sent the jet for us and flew us back to L.A., so that Arthur could be re-evaluated out there; just to make sure we were doing all the right things. Some of the people we've worked for have been such a blessing to us."

All that said, even the most rewarding interactions can only ever be incidental. First and foremost, the Vanlangendoncks have to excel in the service they provide. And while Barbara is a proud Kentuckian, and they have opened a Bluegrass division to cater to the market there, you can judge their brand from the way she reproves any condescension to their principal address near Ocala.

"I'm as blue as U.K. blue can be," says this accomplished lady, both an arts major and a veterinary technician. "And Kentucky is the most beautiful place in the world. When I cross the state line, I think, 'I'm home.' But let me tell you something about these people down in Florida. They learned this business from the end of a pitchfork. They didn't learn it because great-granddaddy left them 1,000 acres in Bourbon County. I feel that God placed me down here to realize that there's good horse people everywhere you go." **Cont. p12**

And now something of that same, hands-on culture has filtered down to their sons. Arthur evidently has the kind of preternatural empathy with animals that sometimes accompanies an early sensory impairment, to the extent that his cool, smiling nature is sometimes borrowed by other barns to assist with fiery horses; while Andrew is immersing himself gratefully in the business after 10 years serving with the Air Force.

"It's really fun to listen to them talk about pedigrees and bloodlines, getting so involved in it all," says their mother. "Francis and I used to sit out front years ago and just school each other on what works and what hasn't, and watching them now do the same thing is great."

Having seen so much of the world beyond, Andrew is palpably enthused by his integration in the business.

"Besides those military principles, like work ethic and integrity, there's really not much I could take from my old job and put into this," he says. "So I'm definitely starting from a blank slate. But I've been lucky to pull information from so many experienced individuals: I've done work for Eddie Woods and Paul Sharp; Nick De Meric [his godfather] has always been a lifeline; while Dad obviously has a wealth of knowledge I can tap into day-to-day. And the grooms, too: after all, they've been doing these things for 20 years. Being older, and trying to move

forward, it's a wonderful, eye-opening experience."

And whatever he has had to learn, some aspects of his military training-discipline, dedication, dependability-can only assist Andrew getting ahead in the business.

"It's the grind," he acknowledges. "When you're deployed, it can get a bit Groundhog Day: it doesn't matter if you just checked the runway an hour ago, when you have planes loading that cost millions of dollars, you check it again. Same with horses. You can't come in and try to do everything quickly and then get discouraged when it doesn't happen. It's the same horse that has to be brought in every day, and fed and checked and turned back out; the same stalls and shedrow to be swept. Yes, you have to enjoy what you're doing. But the grind is what gets you there."

The ultimate military ethic, of course, is teamwork. And that Kantharos colt is by no means the only evidence that the Vanlangendoncks relish sharing opportunity through the ranks.

"We have grooms that bought a filly from us last October for \$5,000," says Francis. "And she sold as a 2-year-old for \$150,000. Those guys are living the dream. They're working the shedrow and grooming and whatnot; they pool the money and buy a horse; and as part of their pay they get to bring her into where they're working, get her ready, take her to the sale."

After all, nobody knows better than the Vanlangendoncks that a young, unbroken Thoroughbred can be hard to value. Champion Xtra Heat (Dixieland Heat) arrived as a \$9,100 weanling, but even then was sold at a loss as a yearling (for \$4,700).

"I think she had a fragment in every joint, and was about the size of a collie dog," Barbara says. "But I think that's what keeps us all going: it's not just a game for rich people. Because let me tell you, if it can go wrong, it's gone wrong-for everybody. Lightning, van accidents, tornados, you name it."

"There's so much luck involved," agrees Francis. "So all you can ever do is present the horse as well as you can, have a good ethical reputation, and hope for the best."

"So I think what sets us apart is that we live and die with this business," says Barbara. "This is 100% of our income, right here. There's no trust fund. When we take a person's horse into the ring, our attitude is that we own a piece of that horse. And you'd rather own a piece of a horse that makes \$100,000 than one that makes \$20,000."

"So it's very personal. One of us is always in the barn. When a buyer comes to our sale barn and asks for three horses, we show them six. We'd say, 'We know these people, and we know their kind of horse.' I've often heard Francis say in February that he's going to sell this horse to so-and-so in the fall. And that's just what he does."

Five acres and a mule. The principle's the same, it's just a question of scale. Neither Francis nor Barbara grew up within this industry. Yet the long and the short of it is that the Vanlangendoncks were born to their vocation.

"We love what we do," Barbara says. "Somebody said to me once that all these people at Keeneland, if they weren't selling horses, they'd be out there selling pigs. They would be selling something, because they love that part of it. It's fun. Especially if you've got a good horse."
