GALPIN EXTENDS MIDAS TOUCH EARLY

Renowned bloodstock agent Richard Galpin made the first big splash of the day at Keeneland January, and the biggest of the session as it turned out, going to \$330,000 for the six-year-old racing or broodmare prospect Royal Alchemist (GB) (Kingsinger {Ire}--Pure Gold, by Dilum). It was the top price paid for a horse on the third day of selling at the Horses of All Ages Sale, which suffered modest declines on Wednesday. Sitting alongside his daughter and an associate just under the press box, Galpin saw off a challenge from a trio of men sitting a section away. The men reluctantly bid \$320,000 and Galpin, on the phone with a client, implored for one more bid, was given the green light and launched the winning salvo. "She's beautiful," said Galpin. "She was the best mare today, and one of the best in the sale. We obviously had some very good Irish bidding against us." Galpin declined to name the operation for whom he was buying, but said, that she would be retired to its broodmare band. "She's for a lovely farm in Ireland," said Galpin. "We're delighted to get her for them. They stand some excellent stallions, and their manager will work out who'll she'll be bred to." Cataloged as hip 784, Royal Alchemist was consigned by Bluewater Sales LLC, for Sheikh Mohammed's Godolphin. The bay mare put together a solid race record on the track. She won a pair of stakes races, including the Balanchine S. in Dubai last February, and placed in no fewer than four group events. She went out a winner, having taken an allowance at The Meadowlands in November, and banked \$282,283 in her career. Galpin added that he might purchase a few more mares for his client, but said that he'd been shut out on a few. "It's been very difficult," he said. "But there's another four days to go!" Described by Dermot Weld as "the greatest living judge of a racehorse," Galpin has purchased some 57 Group/Grade I winners in his lifetime. One of his more notable successes was David Junior, a \$175,000 juvenile purchase at Fasig-Tipton Calder who went on to capture the G1 Dubai Duty Free, G1 Eclipse S. and G1 Champion S.

Day Three Wrap-Up...

Day three of the Keeneland January Horses of All Ages sale failed to build on the momentum of Book 1, suffering double-digit declines in average and median from a year ago. In all, 233 head sold yesterday for \$7,772,400, an average of \$33,358. The median was \$20,000. In 2007, 255 horses sold for \$9,709,800, an average of \$38,078 and a median of \$23,000. That represented a 12.4-percent dip in average and a decline in median of 13 percent. Keeneland Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell said he wasn't overly concerned about the figures. "From year to year, you're not going to have the same quality in Book 2, and so, actually, for what we had here today, I thought we sold very well," he opined. There was a significant drop--36.4 percent-in six-figure horses from 2007. Last year, there were 22 horses which sold for \$100,000 or more, including one that sold for \$200,000 and two that made \$310,000 and \$350,000, respectively. By way of comparison, there were 14 horses in 2008 which eclipsed the six-figure mark. There were four horses that sold for \$200,000 or more. They sold for \$200,000, \$205,000, \$320,000 and \$330,000 respectively. Jill Robin L Spendthrift Bound...

Jill Robin L (Precocity), in foal to Bluegrass Cat, will be joining the broodmare band at B. Wayne Hughes's Spendthrift Farm after selling for \$320,000 yesterday at Keeneland January. "She's a mare with a lot of ability and had a good-looking foal here at the sale," explained Spendthrift General Manager Ned Toffey.

"She's got good conformation, not a ton of pedigree, but an awful lot of ability." Jill Robin L captured the 2005 GII Bonnie Miss S. and was third in the GII Davona Dale S. The sixyear-old's yearling by Successful Appeal followed her into the ring and sold for a bid of \$80,000 to Lobo

Farm. According to Toffey, a 2008 mating has not been decided. "I'm not sure who'll she go to next. But we thought she was a good mare and she'll become part of the broodmare band. We are buying mares for our own stallions, but she won't necessarily be for one of our own." Action This Day, Don't Get Mad, Malibu Moon and Teton Forest stand at Spendthrift. Meg Levy sold the mare on behalf of Erik and Pavla Nygaard's Thor-Bred Stables, which purchased Jill Robin L, in foal to Successful Appeal, for \$240,000 at the 2006 Keeneland November Sale. "We liked the mare--we actually liked her very well--but she was in foal to Bluegrass Cat, and she had a beautiful foal, so we decided to take her to the marketplace and capitalize on how well the Bluegrass Cat mares are selling," Levy said. "She didn't need to be sold." Toffey admitted the covering stallion likely affected the mare's final price. "It was a little more than I thought we'd need to pay," he said. "But she's in foal to Bluegrass Cat, who I think will be well-received and so I thought that might add on a little bit. So, I wasn't entirely surprised, but it was a little more than we were hoping to pay."

Courtney Sells His Last Horse...

Horse auctions may not typically be sentimental affairs, but there was a notable exception yesterday prior to the sale of hip 958, a weanling filly by Maria's Mon. The filly was the last horse from the Keeneland January draft of Robert E. Courtney, Sr.'s Crestfield Farm, and marked the last horse to be sold by Courtney before the 86-year-old retires. To commemorate the moment, auctioneer Ryan Mahan and his crew briefly halted the proceedings to recognize Courtney. "This is the end of an era," said Keeneland announcer John Henderson. The auctioneers then gave Courtney a warm round of applause, which quickly spread through the pavilion. Courtney, who earlier admitted to being surprised that he should garner any extra attention, sat behind his family in the pavilion and offered a modest wave. Bidding got underway and hip 958 was knocked down to Hy Pointe for \$29,000. Asked directly afterwards what was going through his mind during the sale, Courtney, ever the professional, laughed, "I was hoping she'd bring more, like always." But Courtney admitted that it was an emotional moment. "It was hard to go," he said. "But I've done all that I can do, and it's time to quit." Courtney was joined by his two sons Tom and Robert, Jr., who remains a prominent figure in the breeding business in his own right, as well as Tom's wife Kathy and their two children, Courtney's grandson Brooks and granddaughter Clark. Robert, Jr.'s daughter Caitlain is in college in North Carolina and was unable to make the sale. Robert, Jr. added that he'd like to carry on under the Crestfield banner, but said there might be a few obstacles that would prevent him from doing that. "If not, I'll just sell under my name and keep the name out there," he said. Robert Courtney, Sr.'s career stretches back to October of 1941, when he purchased his first mare. Since then, he has been involved with the breeding and sale of such champions as Action This Day and Meadow Star.

When asked by *Daily Racing Form*'s Glenye Cain Oakford if a lot of great memories were going through his mind as hip 958 sold, Courtney put his arm around the reporter and said, "Honey, you don't have time to listen to 'em. Us old men have got loads of memories. But I've never lived in the past, I've always lived for the future." So what happens now for Courtney? "I'm going home," he said. "I'm going to buy my wife dinner."

What They're Saying At The Sales...

Trainer Tim Ritchey:

"I'm very pleased, obviously, with my results. But I got some horses that I thought were some very good buys. It's typical of the market I've seen over the last couple of years. Good horses sell very, very well. But you can still look for horses that fall between the cracks and make some good purchases. They're out there. You just have to beat the bushes, you have to do your homework and follow everything up and make sure you're getting the right horse. All the horses that I bought, I thought actually would bring more than I bought them for."

Frank Stronach:

"It's as always, the ones with more pedigree, conformation bring a reasonable. Every year is the same. The good ones bring more money and the ones that are not that bring less."

The retiring Robert Courtney, Sr., when asked if he is glad he chose a career in the horse business:

"It beats the hell of a lot more fun than banking, I can tell you that."

Keeneland Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell, on the retirement of Robert Courtney, Sr.:

"He is truly a jewel. I'll miss him greatly. When I first came to this country in 1982, he was one of the first few people I met, and he's always been available to give free, sage advice, and always good advice, both here and when I was at Fasig-Tipton. He's a wonderful man and I'm glad he'll be around the community and we'll get to see him on a regular basis. But we'll miss him selling with us."






Albert the Great to Pin Oak Lane:



MORE FIXING CHARGES DROPPED

Race-fixing charges faced by trainer Alan Berry and his former farrier Steven O'Sullivan will be dropped after Britain's Crown Prosecution Service (CPS) decided to offer no evidence against the two defendants, it was revealed yesterday. The pair were accused of conspiring to defraud users of Betfair and other punters in a charge specifically related to the running of the Berry-trained filly Hillside Girl (Ire), who pulled up lame during a race at Carlisle in June 2003. Berry and O'Sullivan, who pleaded not guilty to the charge, were due to face trial at London's Old Bailey next week, but both will be formally discharged instead. "It is important that the CPS keeps all cases under review, particularly where there has been an unsuccessful trial on a linked matter," a CPS spokesperson told PA Sport. "After careful review, it has been concluded that there is no longer a realistic prospect of conviction for either Mr. Berry or Mr. O'Sullivan. All parties have been formally notified of the decision."

TAX CHANGE BENEFITS BUYERS



As part of Public Law 110-28, passed last year, Congress authorized an increase in the small business expensing limits. The maximum amount of qualifying personal property placed in service for the taxable year increased from \$100,000 to \$125,000.

The new provision is effective for taxable years beginning after December 31, 2006 and ending on December 31, 2010. The new \$125,000 maximum will be indexed for inflation each year through 2010. Qualifying property is defined as depreciable tangible personal property that is purchased for use in the active conduct of a trade or business. Consult your tax advisor for additional details.

The benefits extend to a range of purchases, including bloodstock and farm implements.




