



SHADAI ACQUIRES WORKFORCE

Reports from Japan state that Juddmonte Farms have sold **Workforce (GB)** (King's Best--Soviet Moon {Ire}, by Sadler's Wells) to the Shadai Group. Last year's G1 Epsom Derby and G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe winner will stand alongside recent British acquisition Harbinger (GB). "The sire-line of Kingmambo is enjoying success in Japan, as seen in the favorable

result achieved by King
Kamehameha (Jpn)," Teruya
Yoshida commented. "The
maternal line of King's Best is
also very good. His performance
as a racehorse was also
extraordinary. Not only the
record-breaking victory at the
Derby, but also the fact that he
drew clear of the runner-up in

the race, were the keys to deciding the purchase." Campaigned by Sir Michael Stoute, the immediate relative of fellow luminaries Sea Moon (GB) (Beat Hollow {GB}) and Brian Boru (GB) (Sadler's Wells) earned **O** "TDN Rising Star" **O** status on debut at Goodwood on his sole 2-year-old start in September 2009. After a second-place finish behind Cape Blanco (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in York's G2 Dante S. the following May, Workforce recorded an emphatic seven-length success in the blue riband at Epsom. Only fifth in the G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. at Ascot in July, he rebounded to beat Nakayama Festa (Jpn) (Stay Gold {Jpn}) by a head in the Arc on his only other sophomore start. Brought back from the Breeders' Cup without a run after the much-discussed decision to bypass the GI Turf due to the state of the ground at Churchill Downs, the homebred kicked off his 4-yearold season with an impressive win under a maximum penalty in the G3 Brigadier Gerard S. over 10 furlongs at Sandown in May before finding only So You Think (NZ) (High Chaparral {Ire}) a half-length too strong in the G1 Eclipse over the same track and trip in July. Second again to Nathaniel (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in an eventful and falsely run renewal of the King George back at Ascot later that month, he bowed out with a 12th placing in this year's Arc after suffering early interference. Juddmonte's racing manager Teddy Grimthorpe told the Racing Post, "He was an exceptional 3-year-old and was one of only six horses to have completed the Derby and Arc double since the war. He has a wonderful temperament and winning the Derby in record time was an extraordinary achievement." Workforce was the winner of four of his nine starts and over £3.2million in prize money.

GOFFS STAGE NOVEMBER FEAST

Goffs hosts its traditional November Sale over the next five days, with the first three days consisting of foals, followed by a Thursday evening session of yearlings and two days of breeding stock. All eyes will be on Thursday's action, when the first foals by Sea the Stars (Ire) go under the hammer. The initial offering is the star turn, Al-Eile Stud's daughter of the champion

Finsceal Beo (Ire) (Mr. Greeley). Consigned as hip 581, the February-foaled chestnut is the second foal out of Jim Bolger's brilliant G1 English and Irish 1000 Guineas heroine and should attract the big-hitters. In recent times, the Richard Hannon stable has almost single-handedly advertised the auction, with former

graduates Canford Cliffs (Ire) (Tagula {Ire}), Paco Boy (Ire) (Desert Style {Ire}) and Dick Turpin (Ire) (Arakan)—who totaled just €76,000—all winning multiple Group 1 races. This term, Hannon trainees Lilbourne Lad (Ire) (Acclamation {GB}), Harbour Watch (Ire) (Acclamation {GB}), Crius (Ire) (Heliostatic {Ire}) and Coupe de Ville (Ire) (Clodovil {Ire}) have all made their mark in significant company to further bolster the foal sale. Other Goffs November graduates of note include Kingsgate Native (Ire) (Mujadil), Bushranger (Ire) (Danetime {Ire}), Lahaleeb (Ire) (Redback {GB}), this year's G1 Prix du Moulin hero Excelebration (Ire) (Exceed and Excel {Aus})--who fetched just €15,000 three years ago--and the 2010 G1 Racing Post Trophy winner Casamento (Ire) (Shamardal). Alongside the mighty Sea the Stars, other first-crop sires with representation include Aqlaam (GB), the aforementioned Bushranger, Fastnet Rock (Aus), Intense Focus, Red Rocks (Ire) and Yeats (Ire). Today's action starts with a low-key feel as the momentum builds towards the latter part of the book, but of note are Knockatrina House Stud's hip 30, a Marju (Ire) half-sister to the 2007 G3 Amethyst S. winner and G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup fourth Danak (Ire) (Pivotal {GB}); Springfield Farm's hip 151, a Footstepsinthesand (GB) granddaughter of the listed winner Birdie (GB) (Alhaarth {Ire}) from the immediate family of Ballydoyle's new 2-year-old sensation Camelot (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}) and Cottage Stud's hip 229, another filly by Shadwell's Tamayuz (GB) who descends from the amazing Park Express (Ire) (Ahonoora {GB}), a G1 Phoenix Champion S. winner and dam of a plethora of high-class runners headed by New Approach (Ire). Goffs Chief Executive Henry Beeby commented, "We have targeted the best-bred foals in Ireland and believe our 'Focus is the Horse' ethos is evident throughout what we believe is an exceptional catalogue. RAGS TO RICHES KIN TOPS KEENOV MONDAY

Glen Hill Farm's Craig Bernick has spent the last two weeks away from his Florida home, first at the Breeders' Cup, then working both the Fasig-Tipton and Keeneland November sales. Glen Hill's president and




CEO hopes his perseverance, and his Hyatt reward points, will pay off in the form of yesterday's session topper, Onenightin Beijing (Indian Charlie--Goldminess, by Mr. Prospector). Bernick landed the 4-year-old, selling in foal on a Mar. 5 cover to Forestry, for \$130,000 offer. Taylor Session-topping Onenightin Beijing Made Sales Agency consigned the big bay

mare as hip 2837.

Bernick indeed may have plucked a genetic gem from Book 4. A full-sister to the stakes-placed Underground, Onenightin Beijing is a daughter of Goldminess, an undistinguished broodmare who nonetheless hails from one of the best family's in the stud book. Goldminess's second dam Best in Show (Traffic Judge) was named Broodmare of the Year in 1982, while her half-sister Better Than Honour (Deputy Minister) earned the distinction in 2007 following the GI Belmont S.-winning exploits of daughter Rags to Riches (A.P. Indy) and son Jazil (Seeking the Gold). Both Goldminess and the Grade II-winning Better Than Honour, as well as their group-winning siblings Smokensk (Danzig) and Turnberry Isle (Ire) (Deputy Minister), were produced by GI Kentucky Oaks heroine Blush With Pride (Blushing Groom {Fr}) .

"This mare got hurt on the track--she messed up her ankle--but she has a Book 1 pedigree, and if you could

get a good colt out of her, he could be a stallion," said Bernick, who did his bidding in the front of the pavilion as the action wound down Monday. "I think if she was catalogued earlier in the sale, she'd have brought a lot more money. It's the family of Best in Show and Better Than Honour, and she's by Indian Charlie, who has every right to be a good broodmare sire."



Onenightin Beijing


Bred by Hill Legend and Richard Nip and originally bought back at the 2008 Keeneland September Sale for \$60,000, Onenightin Beijing debuted as the favorite in a six-furlong Hollywood Park special weight on the turf last July, were she ran a good third to subsequent GSW Malibu Pier (Malibu Moon). She aired by five lengths in a Fairplex maiden two starts later, then ran third--with Grade II winner Vision In Gold (Medaglia d'Oro) in second--in a Del Mar allowance before being hurt. Bob Baffert trained her.

Bernick said a mate for Glen Hill's latest purchase would be decided on later. Asked about sticking around through Book 4, he said. "There are a lot of horses that people don't want here, but you do your homework, and there's a mare like this. She just seemed like a nobrainer to me."

Glen Hill's strong 2011 continued over the weekend when the operation's Marketing Mix (Medaglia d'Oro) beat a salty field in the GII Mrs. Revere S. at Churchill on Saturday. Just six days before that, at the Fasig-Tipton November Sale, Glen Hill sold Cat Dancer (Storm Cat), a \$120,000 purchase just a year before, to Stonestreet Thoroughbred Holdings for \$1.4 million. Cat Dancer is the dam of this year's Grade I-winning juvenile Drill (Lawyer Ron).

Smart Money On Dixie Union Mare...

The second-highest-priced horse during Monday's eighth session of the Keeneland November Sale came just into the second hour of selling. That's when **Southern Scholar** (Dixie Union--Tutorial, by Forty Niner), an unraced 5-year-old full-sister to GIII Arlington-Washington winner Dixie Band, came into the ring as hip 2500 and brought a bid of \$90,000 from Lavin Bloodstock. Lane's End consigned the mare, who sold in foal on a Feb. 26 cover to champion juvenile Midshipman (Unbridled's Song). Southern Scholar is a daughter of stakes winner Tutorial, herself a half to three stakes horses, including Grade II winner Seeking Regina (Seeking the Gold) and Liberty School (Pine Bluff), dam of Grade II winner Just Jenda (Menifee). Southern Scholar was offered at this sale last year carrying her first foal, a filly by Henny Hughes, but was bought back for \$37,000.





Two Weanlings at \$70,000...

A Tiz Wonderful filly from the family of champion Proud Spell (Proud Citizen) was one of two fillies to bring \$70,000 to share top billing amongst weanlings yesterday. From her sire's second crop, hip 2702, a daughter of the unraced Fiona (Cuvee), was purchased by K.M.C.F. Stable. Fiona is a half-sister to the respective dams of J P's Gusto (Successful Appeal), winner of the 2010 GI Del Mar Futurity; and Proud Spell, whose wins include the GI Kentucky Oaks and GI Alabama S. The GI Santa Anita Oaks heroine Imaginary Lady (Marfa) is under the third dam. The Tiz Wonderful filly was consigned by Dapple Stud on behalf of breeders Rose Retreat Farm and Nellie Mae Cox.

Also realizing \$70,000 was hip 2840, a filly by Northern Afleet out of Pacific Ocean, by Unbridled's Song. Consigned by Charlton (Mr. & Mrs. Rick Abbott), the filly, produced by a half to SW & MGSP Lethal Instrument (Gulch), was hammered down to Lucky Six Racing. Dam Pacific Ocean was purchased by Carlos S.E. Moore last year at November for \$32,000 while carrying this filly, who was bred by Jaime Allende-Marin.

A Curlin half-sister to Rapid Redux (Pleasantly Perfect), the popular gelding who recently tied North America's consecutive win record at 19, went through the ring yesterday at Keeneland November and was hammered down to Allied Bloodstock's Clark Shepherd for \$57,000. From the second crop of the two-time Horse of the Year, the daughter of Thiscatsforcaryl

(Storm Cat) sold from the draft of Lyn Burleson's Burleson Farms as hip 2534. "Rapid Redux doesn't hurt in terms of notoriety, but we she just liked this filly," Shepherd said after signing the ticket in the front of the sales pavilion. "I think we just caught her at the right time; I think she's going to be a goodlooking, good-sized filly. We've seen a lot of the Curlins that we

really liked." According to TDN Insta-Tistics, Curlin was the leading North American freshman sire by yearling average, with a 2011 average of \$136,780 from 41 sold. His median of \$95,000 also led all North American sires.

Shepherd, who owns and runs Allied Bloodstock with Bert Welker, also noted that Thiscatsforcaryl has a potentially promising 2-year-old colt in training: Katmango (Indian Charlie), purchased by Fox Hill Farm for \$275,000 at the 2010 Keeneland September Sale. Katmango has three published workouts, the latest a three-furlong move in :37 3/5 at Keeneland Oct. 24.

Lyn Burleson purchased the 18-year-old Thiscatsforcaryl in partnership with Becky Thomas from last year's Keeneland November sale for \$50,000. Carrying this Curlin filly, she sold from the Gulf Coast dispersal being handled by Taylor Made. This catsforcaryl is also the dam of Be Like Mike (Unbridled's Song) and GSP Sacred Journey (Unbridled's Song). The mare is back in foal to Unbridled's Song.

WinStar Runners Head Racing Prospects...

Horses-in-training from the WinStar Racing consignment dominated proceedings during session nine of last year's Keeneland November Sale, accounting for the top five lots and 17 of the top 23.



Whisper Hill's Funny Sunny A Coglianese

Today's corresponding session once again features a broad array of racing prospects--selling primarily toward the back of Book 5--and Kenny Troutt's operation is back with another strong group.

They include hip 3247, the 3-year-old colt Fire With Fire (Distorted Humor-Cosmic Fire, by Capote),

who earned a big 101 BRIS figure winning a first-level allowance at Saratoga Aug. 25 before running third in the off-the-turf Kent S. at Delaware Sept. 24. He's currently trained by Bill Mott.

"He's a nice horse who I think will improve from three to four," said WinStar President/CEO Elliott Walden of the half-brother to MGSW Cosmonaut (Lemon Drop Kid). "When you look at him, he's had a long year and he needs to fill back up. But when he does, I think he could come on next year and be a really nice horse."


Walden also likes the chances of hip 3203, the Todd Pletcher-trained 2-year-old colt **Space Traveler** (Malibu Moon--Silver Impulse, by Silver Charm). Out of a SW & GSP mare, the colt won at first asking at Monmouth July 24 and came back two starts later to be fourth to GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile S. winner Hansen (Tapit) in the Kentucky Cup Juvenile S.

"Obviously, there's great upside anytime you have a promising young 2-year-old," said Walden. "He has his conditions, he's a very nice horse, and I think he'll sell well."

Topping session nine last year was the WinStar-bred Funny Sunny (Sharp Humor), who was hammered down to Mandy Pope's Whisper Hill Farm for \$380,000 with just a Hoosier Park maiden win to her credit. For Pope, Funny Sunny came back to romp by 10 3/4 lengths in a Gulfstream first-level allowance in February, and just missed by a head when second in the Lucy Scribner S. at Saratoga in August.

Crystal Moment (Distorted Humor), a \$205,000 graduate from the WinStar Racing draft last year, won a pair of Churchill allowance races this summer and finished third in the Evangeline Downs Mile H. in August, while \$200,000 grad Keep Me Informed (A.P. Indy) recently won a Belmont allowance Oct. 21.

The WinStar horses aren't the only horses-in-training that figure to be popular today. Claiborne Farm offers the 5-year-old **Grassy** (El Prado {Ire}--High Savannah {GB}, by Rousillon) as hip 3251. A Grade II winner at four, Grassy won the GII Bowling Green H. and finished third in the GI Turf Classic at Belmont since the catalogue and has been a consistent performer in the handicap turf division for the past two seasons. Grassy is owned by breeders Adele Dilschneider and Claiborne Farm and is currently trained by Christophe Clement. He is catalogued as a racing or stallion prospect.

Lane's End, on behalf of the Edward P. Evans dispersal, offers this year's GI Arkansas Derby third-place finisher **Dance City** (City Zip--Ballet Colony, by Pleasant Colony). The sophomore colt, another trained by Pletcher, was an 11-1 chance in the GI Preakness S. in May and ran a credible fifth of 14, and has not raced since. He is catalogued as a racing or stallion prospect as hip 3241.

'Colonel' Keeps Train Rolling for WinStar...

Speaking of WinStar, the Versailles-based nursery can be said to be firing on all cylinders right now. The farm's 4-year-old **Drosselmeyer** (Distorted Humor),

winner of the 2010 GI Belmont S., upset the GI Breeders' Cup Classic 10 days ago, and at Keeneland November, weanlings from the first crop of the newly arrived **U S Ranger** (Danzig) are averaging a strong \$75,428 (7 of 8 sold) off a \$10,000 fee (note: numbers before yesterday's session).

That, however, is only good for second on the freshman sire list by average. First-place honors go to his barnmate, WinStar's homebred Grade I winner **Colonel John**.

On a stud fee of \$15,000, 10 of the 14 Colonel John weanlings on offer at November have sold for an average of \$105,900. Maybe even more impressive is the son of Tiznow's weanling median of \$102,500, which speaks to the consistency of his foals. A total of five Colonel John weanlings eclipsed the six-figure mark.

"At the November Sale, the pinhookers and the other guys looking at weanlings have been very enthusiastic about what they've seen from the Colonel Johns, and it just reinforces what we've seen looking at his foals all year," said WinStar's Elliott Walden. "They really have that two-turn look, with a lot of leg and a lot of presence. They have a long shoulder and a long back, and are very correct--they look like horses that will just continue to improve as they get older. A lot of the guys who buy weanlings, they're not looking for them to be their best today, they're looking for them to be their best next year."

Topping the Colonel John weanlings at November was https://doi.org/10.10/ a colt produced by Crystal Shard (Mr. Prospector) who sold to Walnut Hill Stables for \$170,000. Bluewater Sales consigned the youngster.

Conditioned by Eoin Harty, Colonel John won the GI Santa Anita Derby and GI Travers S. as a 3-year-old of 2008. As for the most recent WinStar colorbearer to garner a Grade I victory, Breeders' Cup hero Drosselmeyer, Walden said the farm has yet to make a decision on his future. "We're still discussing things and bouncing ideas back and forth, and should have a resolution by the end of the week," he reported. "He's jogging a little bit, and he's been turned out in the round pen some, and we've been showing him to breeders. He's feeling great."

No matter whether you are a farm owner standing a young stallion or one of the breeders using an unproven horse, these activities are as risky as navigating treacherous waters. For the stallion owners, whether the horse sinks or swims depends greatly on his being pitched at the right fee over the first four years, and even then they can expect to see support steadily drifting away.

The Jockey Club's recently released figures help illustrate the size of this problem. Among the stallions which covered their first mares in Kentucky in 2009 were First Defence, whose first three books stood at 86 mares in 2009, 76 in 2010 and 41 this year. Others in a similar boat were Harlington (61, 57, 23), Heatseeker (82, 57, 22), Horse Greeley (83, 47, 34), Midnight Lute (159, 114, 96), Nobiz Like Shobiz (100, 70, 45), Run Away And Hide (101, 78, 52), Spring At Last (115, 92, 65), Street Boss (153, 120, 87) and Student Council (107, 76, 47).

Mare owners' aspirations can also rapidly hit the rocks if their timing is off. For example, if the young stallion in which they are interested did not shine at two, it might be better to support him in his third year, rather than his second. That way his first crop at least has a better chance of establishing its merit before the third-crop yearlings reach the sales ring.

The stallion which prompted these musings was Manduro, one of Darley's European team. He has to be considered to have made a very promising start now that his son, the TTDN Rising Star" Mandaean, has won the G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud. That victory came just 13 days after another of his sons, Bonfire, was highly unlucky not to win the G1 Criterium International. November has also seen Manduro score with his daughters Trois Lunes in France, Miss Manduro in Italy and Madgenta in England. So he is enjoying a hot streak which can reasonably be expected to continue next spring, when more of his progeny get the chance to tackle distances longer than a mile.

However, the picture looked much less rosy a matter of weeks ago. When Bonfire won his maiden in fine style at Salisbury at the end of September, he became only the third winner for his sire and his first in England. Even now, Bonfire and Madgenta rank as the only winners among Manduro's first 24 runners in Britain and Ireland from a crop of around 128. Fortunately his figures in France--where he did much of his racing--stand at a much healthier total of three winners from eight lightly raced runners.

In the circumstances, buyers could have been forgiven for being wary of Manduro's second-crop yearlings at the major sales in August, September and October. The presence among these yearlings of a filly which made \leqslant 400,000 to the bid of Demi O'Byrne helped raise the average to \leqslant 41,100--just over double Manduro's 2009 fee of £20,000. However, his median was a less healthy 25,500gns. The breeders who made a loss must be wishing that the sales could have been delayed a couple of months.

The question they have to ask themselves is whether it was a fair bet that Manduro would have plenty of first-crop winners by the time the 2011 yearling sales came around. The fact that he established himself as Germany's champion 2-year-old of 2004 is a little deceptive. He ran only twice as a juvenile. After making an impressive winning debut over seven furlongs at Munich on September 12, he won the G3 Preis der Winterfavoriten over a mile by five lengths on October 17.

These highly encouraging performances earned him a figure of 112 on the European 2-year-old rankings, 11lbs behind Shamardal and 10lbs behind Dubawi.

Manduro's development into a top-flight performer was delayed by a setback which kept him off the course until the September of his sophomore season, which he ended with a Timeform rating of 118. That figure improved to 123 as a 4-year-old, his first season under the care of Andre Fabre in France, but his record that year stood at one win from eight starts, which hardly suggested he was a star. That assessment underwent a rapid change in 2007, when the German-bred son of Monsun reeled off five successive group victories to earn a Timeform rating of 135. His figure of 131 on the World Thoroughbred Rankings made him the year's top performer and Fabre went so far as to describe Manduro as the best he had ever trained.

Manduro's four annual Timeform ratings stood at 115, 118, 123 and 135, a progression which suggests he was no certainty to make a quick impression with his first juveniles. I am pleased that he finally has done so, because his pedigree, which contains just one line of Northern Dancer, could prove very valuable to the European industry.

It is worth adding that older stallion sons of Monsun include the German-based Samum, who has four Group 1 winners to his credit, including a winner of the Deutsches Derby. Then there's Shirocco, who has the encouraging total of six first-crop 3-year-olds with Racing Post ratings between 111 and 119.

As Manduro stood his first season at a substantial fee of €40,000, he is sure to have covered some very well-bred mares. A fine example is Mandaean's dam Summertime Legacy, who now has two 2011 Group 1 winners to her credit, the other being her Prix Saint-Alary winner Wavering (Ire) (Refuse to Bend {Ire}).

Summertime Legacy was herself third in the Prix Saint-Alary, having won the G3 Prix des Reservoirs at two. Summertime Legacy's dam Zawaahy was a three-parts-sister--by El Gran Senor--to Nijinsky's Derby winner Golden Fleece and her third dam is the celebrated Rare Treat. This is also the family of Be My Guest, a high-class miler and champion sire who fathered Manduro's dam Mandellicht. This means that Mandaean is inbred 5x4 to Rare Treat via her daughters What A Treat and Exotic Treat.

When What A Treat came on the market in February 1972 as part of the George D. Widener Estate Dispersal, this champion American 3-year-old of 1965 sold for \$450,000, some \$55,000 above the previous record price for a broodmare. What A Treat's racing-age daughters Bendara and Treat Me Fair also sold that year, for the world record sums of \$410,000 apiece. What A Treat and Bendara both bred important winners for their new owners. Let's hope that the breeders who invested so heavily at last week's Evans dispersal enjoy similar good fortune.





FAMILY ONE SELLS FOR 400K

France's star 2-year-old of 2011 Family One (Fr) (Dubai Destination) is heading to Hong Kong after selling for €400,000 during the horses-in-training session of Argana's Autumn Mixed Sale yesterday. Hip 122, who was offered by trainer Yann Barberot on behalf of Ecurie Ascot, has few domestic peers in his category after authoritative wins in the G3 Prix du Bois and G2 Prix Robert Papin at Chantilly and Maisons-Laffitte, respectively, in July and a second to Dabirsim (Fr) (Hat Trick {Jpn}) in the G1 Prix Morny the following month. He was reported to have traveled badly to Newmarket when unplaced--beaten less than five lengths--in the G1 Middle Park S. in October and that will be the last European start for the son of the listed winner Ascot Family (Ire) (Desert Style {Ire}). Marie Yoshida's Asian Bloodstock outlasted Herve Barjot to get the colt. According to the Racing Post, the bay will race in the colors of Chinese owner Edmond Yue. Yoshida told the trade daily, "It was the owner's dream to have a horse of this quality. I came over especially from the United States to buy him. He has good experience, but still appears to have plenty in the tank. The colt looks ideal for racing in Hong Kong, as he has a lot of class and is very quick." Other flat-based purchases during a session which was largely dominated by the national hunt brigade, were headed by Chris Richner Bloodstock's securing of the wild card entry Kadyny (GB) (Zamindar) for €160,000. Third in the G3 Prix des Chenes at Longchamp in September, the Thierry Lemer-consigned hip 125 has since won again at Maisons-Laffitte. He will join the Czech trainer Frantisek Holcak. Most of the draft of His Highness The Aga Khan fell to the jumps buyers, but Damon Gabbedy's Belmont Bloodstock Agency snapped up hip 153, the 3-year-old colt Caroun (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}), for €150,000. Successful in a 12-furlong conditions event at Saint-Cloud last month, he is a half-brother to the 2005 G1 Criterium International hero Carlotamix (Fr) (Linamix {Fr}) and was bought for trainer John O'Shea. Sylvain Vidal was buying for Gerard-Augustin Normand again and he was on hand to pay €75,000 for David Smaga's hip 184, the 2-year-old filly Dont Teutch (Fr) (Country Reel). Having captured the Listed Prix des Reves d'Or at Vichy in July, she ran third in the G2 Criterium de Maisons-Laffitte at the start of the month. Pegasus Farms had earlier paid €55,000 for hip 10, the 2-year-old filly Gulsary (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) who is a three-parts sister to Ballydoyle's Pattern-race performer Be My Queen (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) and half to the 2001 G1 Prix de l'Abbaye heroine Imperial Beauty

(Imperial Ballet {Ire}).



John Hammond bought hip 38, the Wertheimers' 3-year-old colt Next Round (Fr) (Monsun {Ger}), who is a half-brother to the group-winning Goldwaki (Ger) (Dalakhani {Ire}) from the immediate family of Goldikova (Ire) (Anabaa) and was third behind Caroun in the aforementioned Saint-Cloud race when last seen. His price of €45,000 was later matched by Chris Richner for hip 172, Jonathan Pease's 3-year-old colt Songster (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}), who is a full-brother to the 2006 G1 Prix Royal-Oak winner Montare (Ire).
