WISE DAN: HORSE FOR THE COURSE

Given his piping hot 1-5 odds in Sunday's GI Ricoh Woodbine Mile, not many in attendance at the Toronto-area oval were overly concerned that **Wise Dan**'s (Wiseman's Ferry) eight-race winning skein might be in

jeopardy. After crossing the wire 3 1/2-lengths clear of runner-up Za Approval (Ghostzapper) in course record time of 1:31.75, the flashy chestnut left no doubt as to his divisional superiority with a repeat win in Woodbine's marquee event for turf milers and continued his march toward a title defense in the Nov. 2 GI Breeders' Cup Mile at Santa Anita. Settled back in third as pacesetter Excaper (Exchange

Rate) carved out an opening half mile in :45.44, last year's champion turf male and older horse kept the front rank insight as **Dimension (GB)** (Medicean {GB}) moved to the front through three quarters in a snappy 1:08.50. Accelerating instantly when asked for more by Johnny Velazquez heading into the final turn, the gelding kicked on all boosters in the stretch as his rider peeked back merely as a precaution and crossed the wire the comfortable winner. **Cont. p3**

MAX POWER

Already successful four times at Longchamp, including in the G1 Prix d'Ispahan over an extended nine furlongs May 26, TDN Rising Star" Maxios (GB) (Monsun {Ger}) showed abundant speed at a mile to score in yesterday's G1 Prix du Moulin. Racing ahead of the main group early behind rabbit Sage Melody (Fr) (Sageburg {Ire}), the Niarchos homebred extended his advantage over his chief rivals as he passed the pacemaker inside the final quarter mile. Kept rolling to the line by Stephane Pasquier, the 3-1 second choice was five lengths over the labored 9-10 favorite Olympic Glory (Ire) (Choisir {Aus}). "He has never been as good as he is now, and to have him at the top of his game at five is a tribute to his trainer and all his staff," Niarchos Racing Manager Alan Cooper said. Cont. p4

TREVE ON TOP

Trying a mile and a half for the first time, the G1 Prix de Diane heroine **Treve (Fr)** (Motivator {GB}) showed yesterday that the Arc trip holds no fears with a

smooth success in Longchamp's G1 Qatar Prix Vermeille. Off since that June 16 Chantilly Classic, Sheikh Joaan bin Hamad Al Thani's acquisition was anchored towards the rear by Frankie Dettori early and had traffic to deal with as Wild Coco (Ger) (Shirocco {Ger}) glided to the front at the top of the stretch. Handing that rival three lengths at the quarter pole, the 4-5 favorite cut her down under hand riding with 150 meters remaining en route to a decisive 1 3/4-length score. "She is a fantastic filly," trainer Criquette

Head-Maarek commented. "I don't have many in training with that kind of class. I was not scared when she was on the inside with nowhere to go, as I knew she is capable of quickening like she did. All being well, she will be supplemented for the Arc." Cont. p6

STRONG KEENELAND SALE CONTINUES

Figures continued far ahead of 2012 levels during Sunday's sixth session of



the Keeneland September sale. At the close of business Sunday, 1,116 yearlings had sold for \$216,922,000. The average was up 32.8% to \$194,375 and the median was up 45% to \$145,000. At this same point a year ago, \$180,269,000 head had grossed \$180,269,000 for an average of \$146,322 and a median of \$100,000. Heading Sunday's selling was Hip 1397, a colt by Medaglia d'oro purchased for \$385,000.

Coming into this year's Mile, Wise Dan represented the first reigning Horse of the Year to compete at Woodbine since 1995 champion Cigar competed in the 1996 Breeders' Cup Classic. Yesterday's final time of

1:31.75 bettered Royal Regalia's mark of 1:31.84 set July 1, 2004. "The only thing that kind of concerned me a little bit, I think I did a little too much with him in the post parade," admitted winning rider John Velazquez. "He was kind of quiet and then he broke well and I put him right behind the other two horses [Excaper and Dimensionl and he got rank with me behind the other two horses and I thought, 'Come on buddy, please come off

the bridle a little bit.' Once he did that I waited until the five sixteenths pole and let him easy out from those two horses and as soon as he saw the wire he just went on."

Wise Dan won five of six starts in 2012, including the GI Woodbine Mile, GI Shadwell Mile and GI Breeders's Cup Mile en route to championship honors in the older horse and turf male divisions as well as a Horse of the Year title. Without the services of regular rider John Velazquez, who was sidelined because of injury, Wise Dan was victorious in Keeneland's GI Maker's Mark S. Apr. 12 before adding another score in the nine-furlong Turf Classic at Churchill Downs. With Velazquez back on board, the gelding took the June 29 GII Firecracker H. back at Churchill and the Spa's GII Fourstardave H. Aug. 10.

"He's a great horse," said winning trainer Charlie LoPresti. "I mean he is a dream come true. He makes us very proud. What he does for the fans and what he does for us, all my team that's worked with him, Mr. Fink is the breeder, the mare, all the awards we got for breeding and the mare. He is just a dream come true. What a wonderful horse."

A graded stakes winner on turf, Polytrack and dirt, Wise Dan became the shortest-priced winner (\$2.50) of the Woodbine Mile since its inception in 1997, eclipsing his own payoff of \$3.10 in 2012.

"I don't have the right words to tell you how much it means to me," said winning owner Morton Fink. "He is a super horse but he's there because Charlie takes care of him," said Fink. "When you handle a horse that can run like this the temptation is to run him every couple of weeks. He is a money machine. It will never happen as long as Charlie and I have anything to do with him."

John Velazquez, who missed the gelding first two starts of the season because of injury, was recording his record fourth Mile following victories with Riviera in 2000, Leroidesanimaux in 2005, and last year with Wise Dan.

"I compare it to the horse I sat on, Leroidesanimaux, when he won over here, but I always said he was a freak," said Velazquez. "[Wise Dan] is a much bigger freak than the other one. He's a much better horse, always wins. Horse of the Year, you can't change that."



There was a spell when Maxios looked unlikely to justify his **O** "TDN Rising Star" **O** tag following his first black-type success in the G3 Prix Thomas Bryon at Saint-Cloud in October 2010, but the half-brother to Bago (Fr) (Nashwan) was pieced back together by Jonathan Pease and started to show more last summer. Successful in the G3 La Coupe de Maisons-Laffitte in September, he signed off after a sixth in the G2 Prix Dollar here and returned to this circuit to annexe the G2 Prix d'Harcourt over 10 furlongs Apr. 7 and run second to Pastorius (Ger) (Soldier Hollow {GB}) in the G1 Prix Ganay three weeks later. Back to winning ways in the Prix d'Ispahan, he was sent to Royal Ascot for the G1 Prince of Wales's S., but was unable to land a blow on fast ground and finished sixth in that June 19 feature prior to a well-earned holiday.

Stephane Pasquier was keen to use his inherent staying power as a weapon against his reluctant rivals, who sat far off the pace carved out by Sage Melody for her stable companion Flotilla (Fr) (Mizzen Mast). Steered around that runner passing the quarter pole, the dark bay was still full of run and kept up the relentless gallop as Frankie Dettori managed to drag Olympic Glory into second having never looked happy on the favorite at any stage. "We decided to shorten him up to a mile, mostly on the advice of his jockey but also due to the impression he gave when appearing not to stay the ten furlongs of the Ganay and Prince of Wales's," the winning trainer explained. "He is better ridden from the front end like that, and the soft ground helped a lot." Connections have a range of options open to the 5-year-old now. "He could run in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. [at Ascot Oct. 19], or head to the Breeders' Cup or even run in the G1 Cox Plate [at Moonee Valley Oct. 26]," Alan Cooper said. "He has an invitation to that and we have to tell the racing authorities whether he is going or not very soon, so we will discuss it and see." Olympic Glory's jockey Frankie Dettori reported that the runner-up was unable to handle the turns, as he had when flopping in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains over this track and trip May 12.

Starting out over a mile, Treve showed glimpses of what was to come with fluent successes in conditions events at Longchamp in September and at Saint-Cloud May 15, but the emphatic nature of her Prix de Diane triumph took many by surprise. Breaking the track record by two seconds there, the form was given ballast when the four-lengths runner-up Chicquita (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) went on to take the Irish Oaks, and only the trip was a concern entering this competitive affair. Keen early positioned on the rail as she had been at Chantilly, the bay was always traveling strongly, but Tom Queally had taken the initiative on Wild Coco after the final turn and she had abundant ground to make up on that strong-staying mare. As soon as she was into daylight halfway down the stretch, she was able to reel in that rival in a matter of strides without feeling the whip to record a faster time than the two Arc trials on the card. "That was so exciting," Sheikh Joaan bin Hamad Al Thani said. "To own such a filly is great, and I hope she is able to do as well in the Arc." Breeder Alec Head was also on hand to relish the victory. "This is a really sweet victory," he said. "She has a tremendous turn of foot, but I was a little bit anxious when she was blocked in. When she came through, she gave a great impression." Dettori, who was riding his first Group 1 winner since parting ways with Godolphin and being sidelined by a six month suspension, told PA Sport, "She's the first decent horse I've ridden for a while. The Arc will be a different type of race, so I just hope I'm drawn on the fence so I can get some cover. It was always the plan to ride her like that, as I knew she had a great turn of foot." Lady Cecil was delighted with the performance of Wild Coco and told the Racing Post, "She was three and a half lengths in front of the rest, she loved it round here and she loved the ground. We'll have to talk to the owners and see where we go next."

Impressive when upped to two miles last term when recording a brace of successes by a cumulative margin of 18 lengths at the Galway Festival and in the Irish





Cesarewitch H. here in October, the bay returned to be second in a conditions event over 1 9/16 miles at Limerick Apr. 11 before annexing the Listed Vintage Crop S. over this trip at Navan May 19. Like many trained in this country, she was forced to sit out the fast-ground events of much of the summer and had conditions against her when third on her comeback in

the G3 Curragh Cup over this course and distance June 30 before improving to second in the Aug. 24 G3 Irish St Leger Trial. Racing towards the back early before making her move wide at the end of the back straight, she was committed on the front end by Chris Hayes at the top of the stretch and drew away to score with authority. "She was awesome," her rider said. "We were going quick and it was taking her a while to find her feet, but I had to keep taking her back. These are the days you dream of and it's great that I'm able to repay Lady O'Reilly for all she has done for me." Her trainer added, "She's very straightforward and a model of consistency. She ran a cracking trial here last time and I knew she would improve for that. I will try and encourage Lady O'Reilly to keep her in training, as I think she will be a high-class Cup mare at five." The runner-up's trainer Saeed bin Suroor commented, "Ahzeemah ran a huge race, but was beaten by a better horse. There is no plan at the moment--we will see how he comes out of this race--but I am just pleased he ran so well."

LEFT WANTING MORE

Sent off the even-money favorite for yesterday's G1 Goffs Vincent O'Brien National S. on the back of his impressive success in the July 31 G2 Vintage S., Middleham Park Racing's Toormore (Ire) (Arakan) justified that confidence by making all to extend his unbeaten record at The Curragh. Quickest away and keen on the lead as Richard Hughes used all his finesse, the bay veered steadily left from the quarter pole but was always in control and hit the line with 2 3/4 lengths to spare over **Sudirman** (Henrythenavigator). "He was very impressive," his rider said. "I didn't want to be stuck in behind in a slowly-run race, so I jumped off as fast as I could and he lengthened well. The Curragh is a lonely place when the track is so wide and it's very windy, and he was loafing for the last 300 yards. He's probably the only 2-year-old that we have got away with winning a Group 1 with that was so much a 3-year-old in the making--most of ours are precocious, but he's as far away from that as you can get. He's a big shell of a horse and can only get better."



Toormore began with a fluent score against the impressive subsequent winner and highly-regarded Ertijaal (Ire) (Oasis Dream {GB}) on debut over six furlongs at Leicester May 28, but was quickly moved up a furlong for the Vintage at Glorious Goodwood. In that event, he was able to cut down Outstrip (GB) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) with a sharp turn of acceleration and that form had received a boost on Saturday when the runner-up was the authoritative winner of Doncaster's G2 Champagne S. Straight into the lead here, he was able to dictate his own fractions, and it was not until Sudirman loomed up on his flanks approaching the final quarter mile that he started to feel any pressure. Drifting left as he went through the gears, he may have been idling in front as that G1 Phoenix S. winner and Ballydoyle's highly promising Giovanni Boldini sprinted in his wake. "Last year, we came to The Curragh and won the Moyglare with Sky Lantern, who went on to win the 1000 Guineas, so why could Toormore not go on to win next year's 2,000?" Richard Hughes said. "I rode him at home on Wednesday morning and he moved beautifully, so we decided to come here and then draw stumps for the season, so now we can enjoy a Classic dream through the winter." Tim Palin, racing manager to the Middleham syndicate, added, "It was a pleasant surprise that nothing took us on in front, and the further Toormore goes the better. That will be it for the season now and he could go straight for the 2,000 Guineas next year, as he is a very clean-winded horse and he also has such a great attitude."

CAMELOT SPARED LONGCHAMP TEST

I didn't hesitate in bringing a 3-year-old here, as the weights in the Arc favor them, and he has a lovely temperament and traveling is not a problem for him." Khalid Abdullah's Flintshire had been at the top of the antepost lists for the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe since his win in the G1 Grand Prix de Paris July 13, but the fast ground he enjoyed on that occasion has disappeared, and he may miss the main event if the surface is not in his favor. "He doesn't like soft ground and can't quicken on it," the owner-breeder's Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe said. "He has run a good race, but we'll have to see what the weather is like in the days leading up to the Arc and make a decision then, as it is essential that he has good ground."





STRONG KEENELAND SALE CONTINUES

For Sunday's final Book 2 session, 290 yearlings sold for \$28,229,000. The average was up 26.5% to \$97,341 and the median rose 33.3% to \$80,000. During last year's sixth session, 281 horses grossed \$21,625,000. The average was \$76,957 and the median was \$60,000. "I think the weekend was very good, was strong, with very good sessions both days," said Keeneland's Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. "Last year, we had 21 horses over \$250,000 and 83 over \$150,000. This year we had 42 over \$250,000 and 162 over \$150,000. So, I think that tells you what this weekend was like. It was very impressive."

Doug Cauthen, bidding on behalf of Roy and Gretchen Jackson's Lael Stables, purchased the day's highest-priced yearling, going to \$385,000 for a son of Medaglia d'Oro. The purchase was one of seven to top the \$300,000 mark Sunday. Last year's session's top price was \$370,000 and that topper was one of four horses to sell for \$300,000 or over.

Book 3 gets underway Monday at 10 a.m.

"He's a heck of a nice physical," Cauthen said. "How couldn't you like him?"

It was Lael Stables's third purchase of the September sale. The operation also acquired a son of Curlin (hip 40) for \$170,000 and a filly by Eskendereya (hip 635) for \$220,000.

Cauthen admitted bidding at

the September sale has been contentious.

"It's very difficult, the market is very, very strong," he said. "I was actually surprised we were able to get this colt. I thought he was going to bring \$500,000 or more and we couldn't have been there at that. I think that is a fair price for him, but the way the market is, I thought he might bring more."

The dark bay colt was consigned by her breeder Anderson Farms.

Anderson Farms purchased Loving Vindication for \$180,000 out of the 2011 Keeneland January sale.

Dave Anderson knew he was leading a popular commodity up to the sales ring. "We ran out of cards Saturday and we still have horses to sell in Book 3, so we knew we had a lot of people looking at him," Anderson commented yesterday.

Of Loving Vindication, he added, "She looked like she was a young mare who could be a long-term investment."



Shortleaf's Anthony Ramps Up at KEESEP...

When hip 1372, a son of Super Saver from the family of Any Given Saturday, stepped out of his stall at Hidden Brook's consignment at Barn 14, Shortleaf Stable's John Ed Anthony wrote just one thing at the

top of his catalog page: "Top colt."

"Some colts present themselves in such a way that you don't have to discuss it any further," Anthony, an Arkansasbased lumberman, explained.

That assessment spurred Anthony to go to \$360,000 to acquire the colt yesterday at September, the second-highest price of the session. The colt is a son of Karla's Number (Polish Numbers), a half-sister to GSW Second of June (Louis Quatorze)

and to the dam of GISW Any Given Saturday (Distorted Humor) and GSW Bohemian Lady (Carson City). Hidden Brook was consigning on behalf of McMahon & Hill Bloodstock, which acquired the Jan. 24-foaled chestnut for \$110,000 last year at Keeneland November.

John Ed Anthony, 74, might be better known to some as the former head of powerhouse Loblolly Stable, which, in early '90s campaigned the back-to-back GI Preakness S. winners Pine Bluff and champion Prairie Bayou.

At its height, Loblolly had some 150 horses in training. It also campaigned Temperence Hill, the 1980 3-year-old champion whose wins included that year's GI Belmont and GI Travers S.; and the Arkansas Derby winner Demons Begone. In 2001, Anthony was inducted into the Arkansas Sports Hall of Fame.

Anthony owned Loblolly with his former wife Mary Lynn. The couple amicably continued to race after divorcing in the late '80s, but decided to disperse their holdings in 1994. The combined dispersal at the July and September yearling sales and the November bloodstock sales grossed over \$5.2 million. Among those who sold was the \$525,000 broodmare Angel Fever (Danzig), who would go on to fame as the dam of Fusaichi Pegasus.

Anthony's ties with Keeneland go back much further, he points out. "I first came here in 1975, I think, and one of the very first horses I purchased was Cox's Ridge," said Anthony.

A \$35,000 September acquisition, Cox's Ridge became Loblolly's first star, winning five stakes in 1977 and four more in '78, including the GI Metropolitan H. The son of Best Turn became an excellent sire, too. Among his 49 stakes winners were 12 Grade I winners, included the champions Life's Magic, Cardmania and Loblolly's own Vanlandingham.

After the Loblolly dispersal, Anthony maintained a small stable of homebreds, and a few years ago began to ramp up his involvement through his new racing incarnation, Shortleaf Stable.

"Loblolly is a species of pine tree," Anthony explained. "That was the first stable. When it came time to naming the second, I named it after another species of tree, Shortleaf, which is a smaller tree, but of more quality. That's basically what we're trying to do."

Shortleaf enjoyed success on the Triple Crown trail a year ago with the Istan colt Atigun, who ran third to Union Rags (Dixie Union) in the 2012 GI Belmont S.

"He's kind of a bridesmaid kind of horse," said Anthony. "He was third in the Belmont S., fourth in the Travers, and second in the Louisville H. He always gets a little piece of it."

A \$42,000 KEESEP purchase, Atigun is trained by Ken McPeek, who conditions the majority of Shortleaf's runners. Shortleaf has another horse with Classic aspirations in the form of the 2year-old homebred colt Arctic

Slope (Van Nistelrooy), who ran a strong second to Bashart (War Front) on debut at Saratoga Aug. 18 before breaking his maiden in a two-turn maiden special at Churchill on Saturday (video).

"I think Kenny's planning on sending him to the GI Breeders' Futurity S. [at Keeneland Oct. 5]," said Anthony.

Anthony estimates he has about 15 horses in different phases of training, including five at Churchill Downs with McPeek. But that number will soon swell.

In total, Shortleaf has signed for nine horses at September--all but one are colts--for a total of \$1,775,000 (\$197,222 average). Among his purchases was a \$300,000 Tiznow son of GSW Our Khrysty (Newfoundland), herself a half to GISW Bullsbay (Tiznow); a \$285,000 colt by Colonel John; and a \$190,000 Bernardini half-brother to multiple-course-recordsetter Starfish Bay (Elusive Quality). "We're looking for two-turn Classic horses," he confirmed.

With three Classic wins already on his resume, Anthony's a good bet to find them.

From \$85k to \$335k, a 'Smart' Pinhook...

Kentucky-based Irishman Ben McElroy teamed with fellow ex-pat Archie St. George for one of yesterday's better pinhooks. The latter's St. George Sales sold hip 1633, a Smart Strike colt from a half-sister to Hard

Spun, for \$335,000. That after McElroy had purchased the colt for \$85,000 at last year's Keeneland November Sale. Calumet Farm's Eddie Kane won the battle for the son of the unraced 5-year-old mare Bethan (Giant's Causeway), a half-sister to the leading young Danzig sire and to SW Our Rite of Spring (Stravinsky). The colt was bred in Florida by Sienna Farms, which purchased Bethan with this one in utero for \$250,000 at the 2011 Keeneland November Sale.

St. George was quick to credit McElroy. "He picked this one out last year, this was his thing, and I was just lucky enough to be along for the ride," said St. George. "The horse has a stallion's pedigree. He was always a nice foal. You wouldn't expect him to be that big [as a weanling], being by Smart Strike, and he grew and got stronger. Probably we didn't expect [that price], but we thought he'd do well. Obviously, thanks to Calumet, and best of luck to them. They've put a lot of money into this game and it's great to see them having success. Hopefully, this will be their next star."

Calumet, purchased by Brad Kelley in 2012, campaigns this year's GI Preakness S. winner Oxbow (Awesome Again), as well as turf standout Optimizer (English Channel).

St. George Sales has been enjoying a strong September, led by a \$600,000 War Front--Biblical Point filly who sold to Live Oak Plantation and a \$460,000 Unbridled's Song--Miss Kilroy filly who went to Borges Torrealba Holdings/TCF.

"The market's been excellent," said St. George.
"We've had a great day today, and we had a great Book
1. We've been very busy at the barns, and the new
format seems to be working very well. We've seen
some new faces and a lot of international buyers. Hats
off to Keeneland and the buyers out there."

Baffert Nabs Another Lookin At Lucky...

Bob Baffert guided Lookin At Lucky (Smart Strike) through two championship seasons, and the Hall of Fame conditioner likes what he sees from the freshman sire's first crop. Sitting alongside client Bernie Schiappa, Baffert was on hand at Keeneland yesterday to secure hip 1708, a filly by the five-time Grade I winner out of Elissa Beethoven (GB) (Royal Academy), for \$320,000. That was the top price paid for a filly Sunday. Consigned by Paramount Sales, the filly is a half to two stakes horse, including GSW Golden Sonata (Mr. Prospector).

"She reminds me of Lookin At Lucky--she's a very elegant filly and she looks like she'll go two turns," said Baffert. "We've seen a bunch from the sire we like."

The filly was a blockbuster pinhook. She was acquired by Horse France for \$45,000 as a 2012 Keeneland November weanling.

Earlier in the sale, Baffert bought another Lookin At Lucky on Schiappa's behalf, a half-brother to GSW Western Smoke (Smoke Glacken) and GSP A Shin Harbor (Cozzene) who went for \$490,000--the toppriced Lookin At Lucky of the sale.

"They all seem to have great minds--and he had a really great mind," Baffert added. "He's throwing a lot of class. We'll have a lot of homebreds out of really nice mares, too, so we're excited."

Buchanan on the Docket

Jane Buchanan, who currently serves as racing manager for trainer Graham Motion, brings a wealth of experience to the sales scene, and her name will likely appear more frequently on the sales sheets in the

future. Buchanan signed the ticket at \$190,000 on hip 1467, a son of Bellamy Road. She was bidding on behalf of a new owner with Motion.

A native of Northern Ireland, Buchanan was brought up in a racing family. Her father breeds and races and her brother is a jumps jockey. After working at Darley operations in England and Ireland, she relocated to the U.S. in 1998, initially working at Juddmonte. From

there, she spent time working with trainers John Kimmel and Wally Dollase, as well as with several track veterinarians. In 2007, she started working with Starlight Racing.

"I helped them with their partnerships and I helped them at the sales and managing their partners and interaction with owners and trainers," Buchanan recalled Sunday. "I was with them about four years. And then I realized I could probably do a little more for myself and I wanted to do a little bit more in the bloodstock business. Graham and Anita are very good friends of mine and they needed someone to help them with their stable. They employed me as a racing manager."

While based in Lexington, Buchanan helps identify potential races for the Motion stable.

"Basically, I read all the condition books for Graham and we're on the phone numerous times a day," she explained. "I line up jockeys, make entries and do nominations."

At the same time, she is able to focus on her own bloodstock business.

"As a sideline, I have my own bloodstock business and Graham's been a huge supporter of me and I help him at all the sales now, too," Buchanan said. "Especially with losing Team Valor, we've gained a lot of nice new owners. We have more of a presence at the sales now."

Asked what she looks for in a sales horse, Buchanan quickly said, "A walk, without a doubt." She added, "I was brought up with Starlight and Frankie Brothers and I don't think the sire is as important. For us, we're looking for racehorses, I'm not looking to pinhook right now, and I just think the horse has to be an athlete. I take the pedigree into consideration for sure, but I'll buy more on how athletic the horse is, as opposed to pedigree."

The colt she purchased Sunday fits the bill, according to Buchanan. "The Bellamy Road had one of the best walks in the sale," she said.

Echoing the sentiment of many, Buchanan termed the market at Keeneland, "very strong."

"We were here for Book 1," she continued. "We were looking for nice colts, for nice two-turn Derby colts, like everyone else is. I think the Bellamy Road has all the credentials and I was quite surprised we were able to get him for what we got him for. We can get a little closer to them in Book 2, but it's still tough."

Of her plans for the future, Buchanan said, "I'd like to just see where it takes me to. I'd like to do a little bit more at the sales."

Reply from Malcontent Overseas Columnist

In yesterday's *TDN* (p. 28), Donegal Racing's Jerry Crawford said the following:

"There's been a lot of unfair criticism of the American breeding industry, particularly from some malcontents overseas--including a columnist from the TDN--and they've been proven incredibly wrong by the results of this sale and particularly by the strong participation of international buyers".

There are only two TDN columnists, and since Andrew Caulfield isn't a malcontent, by a process of elimination I'm pretty sure Jerry means me. So, I would like to take this occasion to refute this unfair and misguided criticism of what I actually have written. First of all, I have not "criticized", fairly or unfairly, the American breeding industry. What I have said is that European buyers, on the whole, do not want to come to the American sales any more, and do not want to buy American-breds. That's not me trying to be a drama queen, by the way; they are voting with their feet. There are three reasons for this: first, Europe has plenty of its own top-class sires right now, so they don't have to come to America, like they did 30 years ago, to buy the stock by the best sires; second, they don't recognize most of the sires here, nor the dam's sides of the pages; and third, and least important but most talked about, are America's permissive race-day medication rules--I think that's used as shorthand a lot for the other two reasons. Of course, some European-based buyers have come and bought, and they are very welcome. But the fact that Sheikh Hamdan bought 25 yearlings for \$11,300,000, making him the sale's leading buyer, hardly reverses the trend. His brother and some of his pals are very likely going to spend a lot more in Newmarket in three weeks' time, as is the ruling family of Qatar, newer investors from Asia and Australia, and an established Irish operation called Coolmore. There's more there for them than there is here--or at least, they think there is--it's as simple as that. So it's not that this sale hasn't been lights-out--it has been, and any veteran observer of the sales scene like myself is of course delighted for the many breeders and consignors who are having a really seriously good sale for once. But that doesn't mean it couldn't be even better, if European-based operations could be wooed back. Believe me, Jerry, there is no one happier to see American breeders doing well, not just because it's good for business on many levels, but also because many of these breeders and consignors have been friends, colleagues, and constituents of mine for 35 years. I hope readers still believe I'm an essentially objective observer. I'm not a cheerleader, but I'm not a knocker either, and never have been. But there are others, besides yourself, who have said to me that I should lighten up a little bit on what is at least perceived, if not meant as, "anti-American" "criticism".

So let me take this opportunity to clarify what are my personal views about the U.S. Thoroughbred industry. As far as my views on breeding and American-breds, the only thing I have to add is that I have consistently written that they punch above their weight in Europe; I have always said so, and I have assisted in the collection of information which proves it. As far as American domestic industry issues are concerned, I have consistently advocated, it is true, that we pay more attention to what's going on in the rest of the world--mostly because, as I've argued above, it affects our markets. I am completely unapologetic about that. Secondly, I personally believe it is time to turn down the volume. We really are all in this together, we are so lucky--I am so lucky--to be able to work in this business, that there have to be issues which all factions of the domestic industry can agree need to be resolved, which should be resolved, and which we can resolve, if we can only stop shouting at each other. I have one other thing to say. I am an American. I have lived abroad for 20 years, but I still have an American passport, and don't have any others. I grew up in America--in Kansas, as a matter of fact, not very far from Iowa. I've been going to American racetracks for more than 45 years. I think of myself as 100% American, just like you. And here are a few traits which I associate with being American: fair-minded and tolerant; pragmatic, oriented to identifying problems and looking for solutions to them, especially by trying to reach consensus; and, not least, possessed of a somewhat deadpan, ironic, and fatalistic sense of humor. So, I reject your claims. I unreservedly apologize to anybody who has somehow read what I've written as being critical of American breeding or breeders, because it was absolutely never meant that way. But "unfair criticism of the American breeding industry"? No. Overseas malcontent columnist? Ha. "...been proven incredibly wrong by the strong participation of American buyers"? I wish. Now let's get back to the Bill Oppenheim

I'm Already Sexy To QEII...

Hit The Board Stable's I'm Already Sexy (Ready's Image), winner of Saturday's GIII Pucker Up S. at Arlington, has exited the race in good order and will be pointed to the GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup S. at Keeneland Oct 12. "It was a great day--I'm really happy," said trainer Wayne Catalano. "She came out good. We are taking her home to the [hyperbaric] chamber now. The chamber helps get the bounce out of them; it refreshes them." I'm Already Sexy's victory was one of three stakes wins on the day for Catalano. The other two came at Kentucky Downs with Ken and Sarah Ramsey's Lien on Kitten (Kitten's Joy) in the Kentucky Downs Juvenile Fillies and Coalport (Kitten's Joy) in the Franklin-Simpson Mile. Catalano said of Lien on Kitten, "Hopefully, she's going to be our Breeders' Cup filly. I'll talk to Mr. Ramsey." Of Coalport, he added, "he has overcome his little issues and had a good year."

Shanghai Bobby To Return Friday...

Shanghai Bobby (Harlan's Holiday), last year's champion 2-year-old male sidelined by a pelvic stress fracture, will make his first start in more than five months in the overnight Aljamin S. at Belmont Friday. The Aljamin will be run at 6 1/2 furlongs and is restricted to 3-year-olds. Trainer Todd Pletcher noted that Shanghai Bobby, who will be ridden for the first time by John Velazquez, could use Friday's race as a springboard to lofty fall targets like the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile at Santa Anita or the GI Cigar Mile at Aqueduct. "We're very pleased with the way he has been coming back," Pletcher said. "He's grown up a bit, and it'd be good to get him started on a positive note. The first thing we need to see is a solid run from him on Friday."

Owned by Starlight Racing, Mrs. John Magnier, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith, Shanghai Bobby was undefeated in five starts last year, including the GI Champagne S. and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. He opened his sophomore campaign with a second place effort in the GIII Holy Bull S. at Gulfstream, and was most recently seen finishing fifth in the GI Florida Derby. He was diagnosed with a stress fracture after that race, which forced him to sit out the Triple Crown. Shanghai Bobby has drawn post three for the Aljamin, which has also attracted stakes winners Purple Egg (Lion Heart) and Whiskey Romeo (Forestry).

"Even though it's an overnight stakes, it drew a competitive field," Pletcher said. "There are several nice horses in the race, and I hope [Shanghai Bobby] is not rusty and that he's ready to go."

Alterite Looking Good After Garden City Score...

Saturday's GI Garden City S. heroine Alterite (Fr) (Literato {Fr}) came out of the race in good shape according to trainer Chad Brown. This was the filly's first American win in as many starts for her new connections, Martin Schwartz. "She came out of the race good so far," said Brown. "When you've got a Grade I winner [pacesetter Discreet Marq] getting away from there in a :50 [second] half, it's a little discouraging. Halfway through the race, I wasn't sure we'd be able to kick past her, but she did. I think I have a really nice horse here." Brown gave his Belmontbased assistant Cherie DeVaux the credit for Alterite's progress since arriving in the U.S. "She was in the process of being shipped over, and Marty was keen on the idea of the Garden City with her," Brown said. "It was a little tight for my schedule, getting her over here and adjusted to our program. The only way we could do it was to get her settled into Belmont early. Cherie did a fantastic job with the horse. For most of the Saratoga meet she was here, and it worked. She's a bit of a high-strung horse, and she really is comfortable now with her surroundings. She got to run out of her own stall yesterday. She had plenty of schooling in the paddock. I'm very proud of the way she handled herself, both prior to the race and in the race."

Alterite is currently being considered for a start in the GI Queen Elizabeth II at Keeneland Oct. 12.

New Rising Star Headed to GIII Pilgrim S...

Impressive debut winner and TTDN Rising Star" Shadow Banking (Harlan's Holiday) may return in just over three weeks for a start in the GIII Pilgrim S. Oct. 6. The Klaravich Stables and William Lawrence colorbearer got off to a slow start in a 1 1/16-mile maiden special weight on the Belmont turf Sept. 11, but rebounded to romp home by 6 1/4 lengths. "He came out of his race real well," said trainer Chad Brown. "We're running short on time getting him to the Breeders' Cup. [The timing is] a little tight, but that's what I'm planning on doing. He's another one that didn't look like he was fully extended in his race. He did it pretty easy, so hopefully he'll be OK."
