RED BANDANA TOPS KEENELAND WITH \$85,000 BID Yesterday's session of Keeneland's November Breeding Stock sale was topped by the four-year-old graded stakes-placed FRED ASTAIRE filly RED BANDANA, which sold, third from the end of the day, to James B. Keogh, agent, for \$85,000. Walmac Int'l, agent, consigned the half sister to XENOMANIA (\$223,096) (out of the MAJESTIC PRINCE mare XENIA). Average price for the 288 sold was \$11,416, up 34.9% from last year's Saturday session when 204 horses averaged \$8,461. Median price of \$9,000 posted a 38.5% jump from \$6,500. Cumulative totals: 1,806 sold for \$87,276,000 to average \$48,326 with median at \$23,000.

JOCKEY MIKE LEE CRITICAL Jockey Mike Lee, who fell when his mount, Ace's On Top, broke down following friday's eighth race at Calder, is listed in critical but stable condition with a probable spinal cord injury at the Jackson Memorial Hospital Neurosurgery and Intensive Care Unit. Lee was airlifted via Metro/Dade fire and rescue helicopter from Calder to Jackson Memorial in Miami; according to ICU charge nurse Stan Lash, the rider is expected to remain in ICU for at least another week, but the prognosis is favorable at this time. His agent, Chip Spencer, reported Saturday that Lee had some sensation in all four limbs with limited mobility.

HOLIDAYFEST AT AQUEDUCT Aqueduct Racetrack will feature four Grade II stakes November 27, the Saturday following Thanksgiving. Dubbed 'HolidayFest', the program will include the \$250,000 Brooklyn Handicap at a mile and three-eighths, \$200,000 Ladies Handicap, \$200,000 Demoiselle for two-year-old fillies and \$200,000 Remsen for two year olds. Michelle Can Pass, second in the Grade I Meadowlands Cup, is being pointed for the Brooklyn, while top older filly Turnback the Alarm is readying for the Ladies; the roan four year old breezed five furlongs in :58 4/5 Saturday over the Belmont main track. Strategic Maneuver, winner of the Grade I Spinaway and Matron Stakes, will try to avenge her last-place finish in the Frizette last time out with a win in the Demoiselle. Trainer Scotty Schulhofer said of her lackluster Frizette effort, "She had a virus.

#### THORO-GRAPH ANALYSIS

Stakes-level turf figures are generally more evenly matched than those on the main track, and when the field is large, the winner is often the one who parlays a good post and a clever ride into a trouble-free, ground-saving trip. The Yellow Ribbon will be run over the same course that hosted the two Breeders' Cup grass events, however, and in those events the best horses won despite drawing terrible posts in big fields.

Over the last few years, Thoro-Graph has begun to develop figures for foreign racing. Verveine appears to have a comparable ability to Flawlessly, which puts her a few lengths ahead of the others in this field. Mike Smith found a way to minimize Lure's traffic problems in the Breeders' Cup Mile; he should be able to get Verveine home here.

The live longshot is Possibly Perfect, who is not quite as good as several of these, but has a couple of big advantages—she gets a weight pull as a three year old, and since she could be the only speed in the race, figures to save ground in a race which could see several fillies have their chances compromised by traffic trouble.




