KEENELAND SALE POSTS 14.6% INCREASE

The seven-day Keeneland November Breeding Stock sale ended yesterday with an overall average of \$43,345, up 14.6% than the 1992 sale's average of \$37,832. Median price of \$20,000 was 17.6% higher than last year's \$17,000 median. In all, 2,072 horses brought an aggregate \$89,810,500, while a year ago, 1,929 lots sold for \$72,977,900. An additional 28 shares brought \$1,583,900, compared to last year when nine shares sold for \$251,000. Yesterday's session sold 266 horses for an average of \$9,528, up 42.9% from the comparable '92 segment when 170 hips averaged \$6,669. The final session was topped by a weanling colt by NORTHERN FLAGSHIP out of the IT'S FREEZING mare ANYTIMEATALL, which sold for \$70,000 to Richard Kaster. Wooden Shoe Farm, agent, consigned the colt.

Michael Lee, injured in a spill at Calder Friday, is showing improvement at the Jackson Memorial ICU in Miami. According to a hospital spokesman, Lee suffered a bruised spine, but there were no apparent fractures. The rider is able to move all four limbs and is listed in stable condition. He was to begin physical therapy Sunday, and there is cautious optimism for full recovery.

CHURCHILL DOWNS BENEFIT RAISES MONEY FOR BACKSTRETCH Saturday night's "Benefit for the Backside", a charity event held at Louisville's Sports Spectrum and attended by 450 people, has raised more than \$20,000—and counting—for the Churchill Downs backstretch. The money was raised through a live auction of racing memorabilia, led by auctioneer and Hall of Fame trainer Jack Van Berg; there was also silent bidding on some items. A Churchill Downs guarter pole, dating from the 1930's, attracted the highest bid of \$4,000 from Gwyn Lavin, whose father, Doc Lavin, served at one time as the Churchill Downs Racing Secretary. The event was co-sponsored by Hickory Bark Thoroughbreds, a group of owners who race at Churchill, and Churchill Downs. The proceeds will be shared by Metro United Way, which serves the Churchill backstretch, and trainer Ed Reynolds, who was severely injured in an accident in October.



`SENSATIONAL' EYES LA CANADA SERIES

Sensational Eyes, who finished sixth and last as the 3-5 favorite in Saturday's Grade III Linda Vista Breeders' Cup at Santa Anita, will be freshened and return to the Arcadia, California oval for the La Canada Series this winter. Explaining her disappointing performance in the Linda Vista, trainer Gary Jones said, "She bled, and there was mucous in her throat.
