Said McAnally of the decision, "The owner was not too happy with the way she ran in the Yellow Ribbon, even though she bled." The six year old, who runs for Dennis and Margaret Marks of Victoria, Australia, was treated with Lasix for that race. Let's Elope has not yet arrived in his barn, but Whittingham has said he will not run her in next Sunday's Matriarch at Hollywood.

HOLIDAYFEST NOTES Aqueduct will feature four Grade II events next Saturday, dubbed HolidayFest. Getting ready for the \$200,000 Remsen for 2yos are Arrovente, Go For Gin, Malmo, Personal Escort and Warn Me. Robert Petrin's Arrovente breezed a mile Saturday in 1:44.02 over the Belmont training track; Chief's Crown Stakes winner Go For Gin stepped a speedy five furlongs in :57.62 yesterday. Robert Perez' Warn Me is expected to ship from France for the race. "We acquired him a couple of months ago. He has won five of seven, and won a mile-and-a-guarter race last time out. But there's the air strike in France, so we're running into problems," said Perez. Definite for the \$200,000 Demoiselle for 2yo fillies are Bunting, Princess Tru, Sovereign Kitty and Strategic Maneuver. GI winner of the Spinaway and Matron Stakes. Set for the \$200,000 Ladies H. are Bold As Silver, Fadetta, In Her Glory, Silky Feather, Star Guest and Turnback the Alarm. Multiple Grade I winner Turnback the Alarm worked six furlongs in 1:13.24 Saturday at Belmont. 

According to her agent, Richard Ancona, Russ was taken to Pines Hospital as a precautionary measure; she is likely to be on the sidelines until Tuesday. Another Calder rider, Michael Lee, remains in stable condition at Jackson Memorial Hospital. Ruth Salathe, his personal nurse, reports that the rider came out of traction Friday and the swelling in his spine has been reduced. Doctors are still optimistic for a full recovery.


