**ONTARIO JOCKEY CLUB INCREASES PARI-MUTUEL TAKE-OUT** The Ontario Jockey Club, facing record losses from Thoroughbred and Harness Racing operations, announced that, effective November 26, the rate of take-out from pari-mutuel wagering will be increased 2% to 14.6% and will be shared equally by the OJC and horsemen.

**MICHAEL LEE STABLE AFTER SURGERY** Jockey Michael Lee was listed in stable condition after undergoing surgery for two compressed vertebrae Tuesday. A spokesman for Jackson Memorial Hospital said the rider was still in ICU, but was awake and alert; while the prognosis was still favorable, doctors will know more about Lee's condition after the post-surgical swelling diminishes.

**MEADOWLANDS JOINS EXTRA HELPING PROGRAM** The Meadowlands and its Pegasus Restaurant have joined the Community Foodbank of New Jersey in the fight against hunger by becoming a member of the Extra Helping program. Launched in 1989, Extra Helping picks up prepared food from corporate food operations, caterers, hospitals, restaurants, airlines and institutional kitchens and distributes it to numerous programs throughout New Jersey. Pegasus will make its first food donation in early December.

**SATURDAY, AQUEDUCT'S HOLIDAYFEST**  
**STRATEGIC MANEUVER** (Cryptoclearance) prepped for Saturday's GII Demoiselle with a 4-furlong breeze Tuesday, going the distance in :48.90. "She came out of the work real good," said trainer Scotty Schulhofer. "As long as there are no problems between now and Saturday, we'll be ready to run." The 2-year-old filly will go for her 4th stakes win in the 9-furlong Demoiselle. Also slated for the race is **SOVEREIGN KITTY** (Sovereign Dancer), 3rd behind Strategic Maneuver in the GI Matron in September. According to trainer Rick Schosberg, "she is doing just super." New York-bred **GREAT TRIUMPH** (Lejoll), winner of the restricted East View Stakes last time out, will take on open company in the Demoiselle. Two-year-old colts will go 9 furlongs in the Remsen Saturday; Robert Perez' stakes winner **WARN ME** (Warning) arrived safely from France for the race and was scheduled to breeze this morning. Ogden Mills Phipps' **PERSONAL ESCORT** (Mr. Prospector) breezed a half-mile in :47.05, handily, Wednesday for the GII event; he comes into the Remsen off a mile allowance score. Trainer John Kimmel will saddle **ARROVENTE** (Badger Land) for the race and commented, "He's doing fine. I've been giving him longer, slower breezes. He should be pretty relaxed for Saturday." **BARON DE VAUX** (Val de L'Orne) will be starting heavyweight for the \$250,000 Brooklyn H. with Jean Cruguet up. Owner/trainer Murray Garren will send out the entry of **FEDERAL FUNDS** (Settlement Day) and **JACKSONPORT** (Vigors) for the 11-furlong Brooklyn; both are scheduled to work Thursday. The 10-furlong Ladies H. will be headed by **TURNBACK THE ALARM** (Darn That Alarm), who blew out through the stretch Wednesday morning; the 4-year-old is scheduled to be retired after this race. Amherst Stable's **BOLD AS SILVER** (Nasty and Bold) will make her stakes debut in the Ladies.

### SUNDAY, HOLLYWOOD'S MATRIARCH

**FLAWLESSLY** (Affirmed) comes into the \$400,000 Matriarch with a decisive edge: she's never been beaten on the Hollywood turf course. Trainer Charlie Whittingham expects a top effort from her and says, "We have no excuses." He describes Flawlessly's personality as, "Beautiful. She's like having an old saddle horse around."

Favored **TESTY TRESTLE**, a full sister to **CLASSY CATHY** (G1, \$537,970) and **MS. MARGI** (\$247,915) and 1/2 to **SPORTS VIEW** (G3, \$915,952), defeated two other entrants to become the fifth SW out of the 16-year-old mare **TRESTLE**. She is her sire's 39th SW.

**7th-Aqu, \$30,000 Alw., 3yo/up, 6f, 1:11 2/5, ft.** David P. Reynolds and trainer Frank Alexander's NY homebred **RICHMOND RUNNER** (g, 3, Personal Flag—You Snapped, by Lord Gaylord) snatched the lead from front-running favorite **LUKIE'S POP** in the stretch and went on to win by 3 lengths to remain unbeaten (3-for-3) over the Aqueduct surface.

**6th-Aqu, \$30,000 Alw., 3yo/up, 9ft, 1:50, gd.** Returning off a 4-month layoff, Bicycle Stable's KY homebred **JOHNNYS GLORY** (c, 3, Dixieland Band—Smoke the Queen, by Sir Ivor) moved up in class and won for the first time since May, defeating 11 others by 1 3/4 lengths. The 11-1 shot from John Hertler's barn headed a \$305.20 exacta with his second career tally in 11 outings.

**3rd-Aqu, Mdn., 2yo, 6f, 1:12 4/5, ft.** **SLEWPY SALUTE** (c, 2, Slewpy—River Flag, by Riverman), a KY bred running in the colors of Edward Anchel from Frank Labocetta's barn, had the win wrapped up when the gates flew open, destroying his opposition by 19 lengths in his 5th career start. The other 10 starters were separated by some 7 lengths.

**5th-Aqu, Mdn., 2yo, f, 6f, 1:13 4/5, ft.** Loblolly Stable's **POTENTILLA** (f, 2, Trapp Mountain—Sniglets, by Graustark), bred in KY by Hillbrook Farm and Terry McBrayer and trained by Tom Bohannon, became the 7th wnr for her Freshman sire with a wire-to-wire, 3-length victory in her second career start.

**9th-Aqu, Mdn., 3yo/up, state-bred, 8f, 1:40 1/5, ft.** **EYES OF A BANDIT** (g, 3, Star Gallant—Reason to Be Bold, by Bold Reason), bred by Pond View Stud Farm and racing for Robert D. Rosenthal, took control with 1/4-mile left to run and hit the wire 2 1/2 lengths in front for trainer Dominick Schettino.

**Today's Preview** Boojum Handicap winner Boom Towner (Obligato) heads a field of 9 sprinters in Thursday's Gill, \$75,000a Sport Page H. at Aqueduct. Also in the 6-furlong event is the 5-year-old mare, Raise Heck (Buckaroo), winner of the Gil First Flight H. in her most recent start. First post is 11 a.m. for the Thanksgiving Day card.

**3rd-Hol, \$35,000 Alw., 3yo/up, 8.5ft, 1:42, fm.** Charlie Whittingham's KY homebred **MAN AT WAR** (h, 5, Lord At War (Arg)—Commandress, by Top Command), trained by Michael Whittingham, maintained a comfortable lead throughout and won by 1 1/2 for his second win from his last three starts; has been on the board 6 straight outings and pushes record to 13-3-3-4, \$96,600.

**8th-Hol, \$33,000 Alw., 3yo/up, f/m, 6.5f, 1:14 2/5, ft.** Idle since May after winning 2-of-3 starts, Harmony, Inc.'s **TEMPEST DANCER** (f, 3, Storm Cat—Honor An Offer, by Hoist the Flag) drew off by 3 lengths as the 6-5 choice for her third consecutive victory. The full sister to B.C. Juvenile Fillies (G1) runnerup **SARDULA** (G2, \$393,450) was bred in KY by Overbrook Farm and M & M Stable and is trained by Brad MacDonald.

**4th-Hol, Mdn., 2yo, state-bred, 6.5f, 1:17, ft.** Clement Hirsch's homebred **SMOOTH SHOT** (g, 2, Moscow Ballet—La Pistola, by Riva Ridge), a Warren Stute charge, rallied from far off the pace to win by a length against 9 others.

**6th-Hol, Mdn., 2yo, f, state-bred, 6f, 1:10 2/5, ft.** Sidney Factor's homebred **LOVELY MUSIC** (f, 2, Relaunch a Tune—Don't Be Nervous, by Agitate), ridden by Laffit Pincay Jr. for trainer Pico Perdomo, stalked the pace through the early going, then surged to the front and won by a 1/2 in her career debut.

**9th-Hol, Mdn., 2yo, state-bred, 6.5f, 1:18, ft.** **STONE COUNTY ROAD** (g, 2, Siyah Kalem—Dance Little Sister, by Explosive Bid), owned by Fritz, Irving, and trainer Jack Carava, led nearly all the way and held on to win by a neck. He was bred by Marty Alpert & Steve Young.

**Today's Preview** A full field of 14 California-breds compete for a purse of \$100,000a in the 7 1/2-furlong On Trust H. at Hollywood. J.F. Williams (Broad Brush), 1/2 brother to the top grass horse Star of Cozzene, takes on speedster Tokolosh (Slew's Royalty), winner of 3 out of 4 career starts and SW Native Boundary (Poleax), 2nd in the Cal Cup Classic earlier this fall. Post time for the 1st race is 11 a.m.



**Tomorrow's Preview** Six juvenile colts will face the starter for Friday's \$75,000a (plus \$25,000 from the Breeders' Cup Fund) Hollywood Prevue Breeders' Cup at 7 furlongs. Sunny Slope Stakes winner Subtle Trouble (Native Prospector) meets SW Individual Style (Something Lucky), a winner of 4 of his 6 career starts.

She was bred in KY by the Ned and Bartow Jones Partnership and ups her earnings to \$30,511.

**7th-CD, \$27,080 Alw., 3yo/up, 8.5f, 1:46 3/5, ft.** California-bred LORDLY PROSPECT (g, 4, Prospective Star—Lafayette's Lady, by Young Commander), owned by Joan Hopson and trained by John Hennig, held off fast-closing favorite PATRIOT STRIKE (General Assembly) by a length for first win of year; MSP wnr of \$112,932 extends record to 21-4-7-2.

**3rd-CD, Mdn., 3yo/up, 6f, 1:12 2/5, ft.** John Brenzel's KY homebred BRASS WORKS (c, 3, Dixieland Brass—Workin Girl, by Hard Work), a 22-1 longshot from Phil Thomas Jr.'s barn, held safe another 20-1 outsider by a head to spark a \$1,005 exacta in his third career start.

**Today's Preview** Seven fillies and mares will go 9 furlongs in the Gill Falls City H. at Churchill Downs; SW Gray Cashmere (Relaunch), runner-up in the GI Spinster last out, will carry highweight of 120 pounds against Shug McGaughey's pair of Deputation (Deputy Minister) and Quilma (Semenenko). First post time for the last 3 days of the Churchill meet, Thurs. through Sat., will be 11:30 a.m.

Numerous, owned by Howard B. Keck, is in training in California with Charlie Whittingham. He broke his maiden in his second start Nov. 13 at Santa Anita, just getting up to win by a nose. Whittingham said of the 2-year-old colt, "He's the best I've had in a long time. He does everything right and he's got all the mechanisms to make him good." Regarding his next race, Whittingham said, "Next week or so we'll probably find a race for him. We'll skip the Hollywood Futurity, I'm sure. We don't want to wear him out now. If he runs in a lot of these hard early 2-year-old races then we won't have a 3-year-old."

The SW of \$81,835 picked up her 6th win of the year and improves to 21-7-7-1 overall.
