THORO-GRAPH ANALYSIS

by Jerry Brown

One of the most important premises in handicapping with performance figures is that the winner is not necessarily the best horse, and sometimes not even the best horse that day.

MISSIONARY RIDGE has earned as much as the best of this field combined, but he is not as good now as he was earlier this year. Additionally, he will be the heavyweight in a handicap this time, spotting serious weight to rapidly developing horses. In short, Missionary Ridge is a vulnerable favorite. In the spring of 1991, Thoro-Graph recommended the purchase of a three-year-old in Florida who had done nothing more than break his maiden, but his figures and graph were good. MICHELLE CAN PASS has gone on to earn 10 times his purchase price since then, and should add to that in the Brooklyn. He's in form, favorably drawn and weighted, has tactical speed, and the longer they go, the better he likes it. The competition should come from LIVING VICARIOUSLY and PROSPECTOR'S FLAG, two three-year-olds who are moving towards being serious handicap horses, but for both of whom the distance of this marathon are uncharted waters.

The field for the Remsen was reduced yesterday morning by the scratch of Arthur Appleton's DEFENSE WITNESS, winner of his two prior races at Thistledown. "He's sick," explained trainer Billy Badgett. "He shipped in yesterday with a temperature of 103 degrees. We're going to keep him here and try to run him in the Nashua." Robert Perez' WARN ME (Warning), a 3-time winner in France, takes on the favored entry of Condren, Cornacchia & Paulson's MALMO (Jade Hunter) and GO FOR GIN (Cormorant), who has won his last two by a combined margin of over 20 lengths, including a 9 3/4-length win of the Chief's Crown Stakes last out. "I hope he can duplicate his last two starts," said trainer Nick Zito. "If he does, he'll be tough. I think, for a two-year-old, he's hit his best stride. If he comes away with a victory in the Remsen, I'll be thrilled, but I believe he's hit his potential as a two-year-old. If he continues to move forward as a three-year-old, look out."

Harbor View Farm's FLAWLESSLY, unbeaten in five starts on Hollywood Park's turf course, looks for a third straight Matriarch victory Sunday. The race will be televised nationally by ESPN. Flawlessly, a five-year-old KY bred daughter of Affirmed, finished an uncharacteristic ninth in the Breeders' Cup Mile (G1), where she was buffeted about entering the first turn. "She emerged with a few scratches," said trainer Charlie Whittingham, "but her pride was hurt more than anything else." A winner of 14-of-23 career starts, Flawlessly has lifetime earnings of \$2,004,038. TOUSSAUD has never lost on Hollywood's grass course either, posting consecutive wins during the '93 spring/summer meet in the Wilshire, Gamely, and American Handicaps.


