TWILIGHT RACING AT HOLLYWOOD A

SUCCESS Hollywood Park's first twilight program at its autumn meeting, Friday, Nov. 26, resulted in the highest single-day total handle of the meet's 13-year history, with the exception of Breeders' Cup Days. Wagering on Friday's special 13-race card totaled \$10,287,770. Only 2 previous programs since the fall meet's inauguration in 1981 produced 7-figure total handles—the record \$14,352,515 wagered on the '87 Breeders' Cup, and \$11,466,941 bet on the first Breeders' Cup in 1984. Friday's program ran from 4-10 p.m. with 33,293 in attendance.

STRONG CLOSING WEEKEND AT CHURCHILL

With strong on-track business Thanksgiving weekend, Churchill Downs ended its 104th Fall Meet with a total of \$58,338,676 bet on 24 days of racing, including \$30,629,280 wagered ontrack, \$20,732,772 at 8 Kentucky sites and \$37,605,904 at 13 outlets across the country. "We are pleased with the level of business during our Fall Meet," said President Thomas Meeker. "Competitive racing and a commitment to the highest levels of customer service have become Churchill Downs trademarks, and both were influential on the success of our Fall Meet." Trainer Tony Reinstedler took both the Brown & Williamson Kool Kentucky Jockey Club with War Deputy and the Churchill training title, while jockey Pat Day led all riders for the 19th time.

CHURCHILL BACKSTRETCH TO CLOSE THIS

WINTER For the first time in several years, the stable area and track at Churchill Downs will be closed for part of the winter for extensive maintenance work. The closing is set for Jan. 10, and the maintenance work is expected to last 6 to 8 weeks.

Second favorite Toussaud is a different story, coming off the best race of her life behind Lure; she may bounce, so the value (from a wagering perspective) may be in playing Flawlessly on top in exactas over the longshots.


