JAPAN CUP: KOTASHAAN UPSET AS **DESORMEAUX MISJUDGES FINISH** It seemed Kotashaan had Legacy World measured; after nearly falling on the turn into the backstretch, the Japan Cup favorite was gaining on the lead with every stride, but jockey Kent Desormeaux's unfamiliarity with the course may have cost him the win. As he had in the day's 3rd race (his 1st ride in Japan), Desormeaux misjudged the finish line and eased up on Kotashaan at the 1/16 pole as Legacy World went on to a 1 1/4 length victory. After the race, Desormeaux said, "I know an apology is not enough, but I am sorry, especially to the fans, for my riding." The japan Racing Association fined the rider 50,000 yen or \$4,600 which is the maximum; the next step would be suspension. Legacy World became the 4th Japanese runner to take the race; the U.S. has also produced 4 winners, while England, Ireland, France, New Zealand and Australia have 1 victory aplece. The 4-year-old gelding was making his 3rd start of the year after finishing 2nd in a pair of Group II races, one in Jan. and one in Oct. The '93 Japan Cup produced a record handle of \$323 million for a single race; the day's total handle was also a record for Japan Cup Day, \$467 million. The on-track

Looking for her 2nd consecutive Eclipse Award as top grass mare, 5-year-old FLAWLESSLY gave voters something to think about as she took her 3rd consecutive Matriarch Stakes. It was the champ's 4th win in 5 Grade I starts this year, her only loss coming after a rough trip against the colts in the Breeders' Cup Mile. Under Chris McCarron, the odds-on favorite came up the rail to take the lead in the stretch, and had just enough left to hold off the late-closing TOUSSAUD. "The filly on the lead (ELIZABETH BAY) was lugging out; I just had to hope she was going to do the same thing on the 2nd turn. For me to stay on the rail was a calculated risk," said McCarron. "Once I got to the 3/8 pole, though, I was confident I was going to get through on the leader." When I got to the lead, I knew TOUSSAUD was coming, and then I started rooting for the wire. Thank goodness, we got there." Commented trainer Charlie Whittingham, "This is a great one to win with the Eclipse Awards coming up. 1 just told Chris to try to have somewhere to run, because she's foolproof. She's in a class of her own." As for future plans, Whittingham said, "I wouldn't be surprised (if she raced next year). She's a very sound mare." Making her final start, TOUSSAUD trailed the field early but came flying at the finish to miss by a neck; she will now be retired and bred to Mr. Prospector. According to jockey Gary Stevens, the often temperamental filly was on her best behavior for her last race. "She was really good going to the gate, and she was a pleasure to ride. I'd never been on her before, and she was real nice all the way."

LEGACY WORLD, ridden by Hiroshi Kawachi, stalked the pace setter, MEJIRO PALMER, until the head of the stretch, took over from the weakening frontrunner and held on to beat favored KOTASHAAN after his rider, Kent Desormeaux, misjudged the finish. The winner was 4th in the '92 Japan Cup for trainer Tameo Toyama; when Toyama died this spring, his assistant of 12 years, 34-year- old Hideyuki Mori, took over the gelding's training and saddled the 4-year-old to victory in '93. Future plans call for a possible trip to the U.S. for LEGACY WORLD, who could make his American debut in the San Luis Rey at Santa Anita; he will now point for the GI Arime Kinen in Japan in Dec. Runner-up KOTASHAAN will return to the U.S. to fulfill quarantine obligations, but his racing future is undecided. Japanese Derby winner WINNING TICKET closed for 3rd, nearly catching Kotashaan; he is likely to remain in training for '94. PLATINI will retire to stud in Germany, but plans for STAR OF COZZENE are still up in the air. Trainer Mark Hennig was pleased with his race, and sald, "Unless he is retired to stud in Japan at the end of the season, I am aiming to come back (for the '94 Japan Cup) with this horse." MISIL will go to Charlie Whittingham's barn in California next year. Second choice WHITE MUZZLE will retire to stud at Shadai Farm in Japan; on his disappointing 13th-place finish, jockey John Reid said, "He travelled happily in mid-division for most of the race and just collapsed in the straight."
