MEADOWLANDS ADDS A RACE A NIGHT ON WEEKENDS

The Meadowlands will card an extra race both Fri. and Sat. nights for the next 2 weekends. That will bring the total to 11 live races on the card on weekends through the Dec. 11 closing of the meet. "The number of entries that we've been getting in the entry box warrant adding those races," said Racing Secretary Mike Dempsey. "The number of entries is up substantially because of our purse increases, and we're delighted to be able to provide horsemen with additional opportunities to run their horses."

TATTERSALLS DECEMBER BROODMARE

SALE UP The highest-priced broodmare from the first 2 sessions of the Newmarket sale was IVY, a 12-year-old daughter of Sir Ivor-Durga (Tatan) in foal to Nureyev. Ivy was consigned by Kiltinan Castle Stud, Ireland and was purchased for 450,000 gns by BBA Ltd. The 2nd highest-priced broodmare was Ivy's 4-year-old daughter IVYANNA, who is by the Mill Reef stallion Reference Point. Ivyanna, who is in foal to Arazi, was also purchased by BBA Ltd. for the sum of 410,000 gns. The 3rd highest price of 370,000 gns was brought by NICER, a 3-year-old daughter of Pennine Walk-Everything Nice (Sovereign Path). Nicer, who is still in training, was purchased by Anthony Penfold Bloodstock. Through the first 2 sessions of the sale, 355 lots were sold for a gross of 9,780,800 gns, compared with 300 lots for a gross of 4,050,620 gns in 1992. The average for the 1st session was 21,715 gns and for the 2nd session 33,287 gns. This represents more than twice the average brought in 1992, when the 1st session averaged 10,595 gns per lot and the 2nd session 16,294 gns per lot.

FINGER LAKES CONCLUDES 1993 SEASON

The 1993 season ended with Finger Lakes Race Track reporting declines in daily average attendance and on-track mutuel handle. The daily average attendance declined 2.8% from 1992, while daily average on-track wagering dropped 4.3%. At the same time, off-track daily average wagering increased 3.4% from 1992. The daily average total wagering on Finger Lakes racing, combining on-track and off-track handle figures, increased 1.5% in 1993. Paul Nicol, Jr. earned his 1st Finger Lakes riding title with 171 victories. Ed Perdue picked up his 3rd straight training title with 83 victories.

NATIVE DIVER HANDICAP, Grade III, \$100,000-added, 3&up, 1 1/8 miles, Hollywood Park, Saturday.

SLEW OF DAMASCUS, a 5-year-old Slewacide gelding, shipped from Bay Meadows to Hollywood yesterday for the race. Before 1993 he had never run in a stakes, but now has won 6 of them and placed in 3 others this year. His trainer, Bay Meadows-based Craig Roberts, has had the gelding since Jan. According to Roberts, "I think the turning point came with running him in longer races, because the people who had him before had been sprinting him. He also had a quarter crack that was bugging him a little bit. But as far as the dramatic turnaround, the horse was just probably getting good and I just got him at a lucky time." Four of Slew of Damascus' 6 stakes wins have come on turf. "Because of the foot and because of what I had heard about the horse I tried to switch him to the turf, and that seemed to give him a lot of confidence," said Roberts. "He took to the turf really well, although he's a very good dirt horse also. He's been training very well. He worked 3/4 last week in 1:12 and change. Then I blew him out over a muddy racetrack today and he worked 1/2 mile in :49. He's set 4 new track records this year. He's a real Cinderella horse and I hope he continues that way." **CASUAL LIES'** owner-trainer Shelley Riley reported that her horse tied up after jogging yesterday, but is now fine and ready for Saturday's race. "We're entering tomorrow and planning on running," said Riley. "We galloped him today and he's fine. We'll probably breeze him an easy half tomorrow in about :50." Other probable starters for the Native Diver are **JULIANNUS**, **L'EXPRESS**, **RAVENWOOD** and **TERTIAN**. Nominees **MEMO** (Chi) and **STUKA** will not run. Trainer Richard Mandella said that Memo (CHI) will start instead in Hollywood's Gr. III Vernon O. Underwood at 6 furlongs Dec. 11. "He sprinted so well Breeders' Cup day that I wanted to try it a few times," said Mandella. "I think he's a better sprinter than he is a router." Trainer Gary Jones said of Stuka's status, "I have to talk to Mr. Paulson about it, but I don't think he will run at this point. He had three hard races over there at Oak Tree and I want him good for the Santa Anita meet."

SILVER BELLES HANDICAP, Grade II, \$100,000-added, f/m 3&up, 1 1/16 miles, Hollywood Park, Sunday.

PACIFIC SQUALL, a 4-year-old daughter of Storm Bird, was given 9 months off this year due to sickness. According to trainer Paco Gonzalez, "She had an infection in her throat and a high temperature. She was ready to run at Hollywood Park this summer but got sick again so we had to stop and give her plenty of time to make sure she was going to be okay. We don't know why she got sick. Even the vets don't know." Pacific Squall returned to the races Oct. 21 in an allowance at Santa Anita, in which she finished 4th. "She got a lot out of her last race," said Gonzalez. "She hadn't run in 9 months and we knew she was going to need that race. She's been training beautifully. She worked yesterday an easy 5/8 because she's going to run Sunday." Gonzalez considers the high point of Pacific Squall's career so far to be the Hollywood Oaks. He said that as long as she remains healthy, she will continue to race next year. That does not hold true for the Richard Mandella-trained **SACRAMENTADA** (Chi). Mandella said of the 7-year-old daughter of Northair-Sembrada (Chi) (El Oriental), "She's training really well up to the Silver Belles and I think she's going to run really well. She'll probably get bred this spring." Sacramentada's biggest North American victory came over the Hollywood Park track in the 1992 Gr. II Hawthorne Handicap.

NOW LISTEN INJURED, TO MISS HONG KONG BOWL

Now Listen, who was heading to Hong Kong for the Hong Kong International Bowl Dec. 12, suffered an injury and will miss the race, trainer Bobby Frankel said Wed. morning. "He got hurt this morning," Frankel said. "It's a cannon bone. I don't know whether he'll race again or not. If he were younger, I would say there's a chance they would try to keep him racing. But at his age, I would hope they don't race him again." Now Listen, a 6-year-old gelding, is a winner of 9 races in 23 career starts, with earnings of more than \$577,000.

HONG KONG RACES TRULY INTERNATIONAL

A field of 14 is scheduled to go postward in the Hong Kong International Bowl at 7 furlongs. The list of probable starters, including the country where each horse is based and the jockey, is as follows: **CAPESTAD**, Australia, Mick Dittman; **DANJIKI**, New Zealand, Bruce S. Compton; **LODORE LADY**, New Zealand, Lance O'Sullivan; **KARINGA BAY**, United Kingdom, Brian Rouse; **SWING LOW**, United Kingdom, John A. Reid; **VOLERIS**, France, Cash Asmussen; **JOURNALISM**, U.S., Corey Nakatani; **TOMOE REGENT**, Japan, Yasuhiro Nemoto; **GILTEDGED III**, Malaysia and Singapore, no rider. Horses representing Hong Kong in the Bowl are **FASTABOB**, **HAPPY GUY**, **SOUND PRINT** and **WINNING PARTNERS**. Twenty-two alternates were listed for the Bowl, and at least 1 will draw in because of Now Listen's injury. American alternates are **MEGAN'S INTERCO**, trained by Jenine Sahadi; **FOURSTARDAVE**, trained by Leo O'Brien; and **SUPERSTRIKE** (GB), trained by Bruce Jackson. The Hong Kong International Cup, to be run at 1 1/8 miles on the same day, has also drawn a

field of 14. Scheduled to run are **DARK KSAR**, Australia, Mick Dittman; **SILK ALI**, Australia, Grant L. Cooksley; **KIWI GOLFER**, New Zealand, Lance O'Sullivan; **ALFLORA**, United Kingdom, Michael Kinane; **MARILDO**, France, Guy Guignard; **VERVEINE**, France, Olivier Peslier; **ADAM SMITH** (GB), U.S., G. Mosse; **STARK SOUTH**, U.S., Corey Nakatani; **NARITA CHIKARA**, Japan, Yutaka Take; **NAVAJO II**, Malaysia and Singapore, Lanfranco Dettori. Representing Hong Kong in the Cup will be **FORTUNE LEADER**, **MOTIVATION**, **RIVER VERDON** and **WIND DANCER**. Twenty-four alternates were listed for the Cup, including Americans **NEWTON'S LAW** (IRE), trained by Bobby Frankel, and **BEYTON**, trained by Richard Mandella.

TURF STARS' FUTURES STILL UNDECIDED

Trainer Mark Hennig said **STAR OF COZZENE**, who was purchased by Tomaeato Farm before finishing fifth in Saturday's \$3.6 million Japan Cup, might be kept in training after all. "We had a meeting Monday, and there's a chance he'll continue his career as a racehorse," said Hennig. "He is scheduled to arrive back from Japan on Dec. 6, and after he clears quarantine he'll undergo a complete physical. If everything checks out, they want to continue racing him." **KOTASHAAN** (FR), who was recently bought by Yasutane Suoma, also may stay in training next year. "It's up in the air right now," said trainer Richard Mandella. "The horse was bought to be retired as a stud, but there's still a little bit of hope that he might continue racing. We should know something before long."

DID YOU KNOW?

Trainer Richard Mandella's first cousin, Rudy Reutiger, is the former Notre Dame football player on whom the current movie "Rudy" is based. "Actually, his name is Dan, but they call him Rudy," Mandella said. Rudy is the son of Mandella's father's sister. Mandella's parents attended the movie's premier.
