JEUNE HOMME RIGHT BACK IN HOLLYWOOD TURF CUP GII Citation H. winner Jeune Homme, who captured the race just 7 days after running 2nd in the GI Hollywood Derby, is scheduled to wheel right back in the GI Hollywood Turf Cup Dec. 12. The 3-year-old son of Nureyev, who was purchased for \$2.6 million as a yearling, will get 14 days off between the Citation and the Turf Cup. The horse had been scheduled to return to France; he will now face last year's Turf Cup winner Bien Bien, Hollywood Derby winner Explosive Red, '92 Breeders' Cup Turf victor Fraise, Know Heights, Jahafil, Nonproductiveasset and possibly the Australian champion mare, Let's Elope in the \$500,000 event.

HONG KONG BOWL UPDATE Karinga Bay, who was scheduled to represent the United Kingdom in the Dec. 12 International Bowl at Sha Tin Racecourse in Hong Kong, has been withdrawn due to a cough. His place will be taken by Marina Park, trained by Mark Johnston; Lanfranco Dettori is tentatively named as rider. Also, with the defection of America's Now Listen, New York-bred millionaire Fourstardave will make the overseas trip. Trained by Leo O'Brien and to be ridden by Richard Migliore, the gelding was 2nd reserve, but America's 1st reserve, Megan's Interco, declined the invitation.

TATTERSALLS RESULTS The 3rd session of Tattersalls' broodmare sale Wednesday showed another increase over last year; the Dec. 1 session saw 176 lots sold for an average of 28,465 gns compared with 172 lots which sold for an average of 25,413 gns in 1992, an increase of 12 percent. The high-priced broodmare Wednesday was Steel Habit, a 14-year-old daughter of Habitat-Ampulla (Crowned Prince) from Mount Cootie Stud, Ireland, who sold for 310,000 gns to BBA (Ireland) Ltd; she is the dam of SW's Batshoof and Regular Guest and is in foal to Sadler's Wells. Second highest price of 220,000 gns was paid for Mary Linoa, a 7-year-old daughter of L'Emigrant from International Bloodstock, France, in foal to Machiavellian; 3rd high at 190,000 gns was Swan Heights, a 4-year-old daughter of Shirley Heights from Glenvale Stud, Ireland, in foal to Sadler's Wells. Both were bought by BBA, Ltd.

Blinkers off: Have Fun
SLEW OF DAMASCUS (Slewacide) will be the starting highweight for the Native Diver; the 5-year-old Tennessee-bred gelding was purchased for \$4,500 as a yearling and as recently as last year raced for a \$16,000 tag, but since joining trainer Craig Roberts' stable, he has won 7-of-12 starts and earned better than \$330,000. He earned top weight with back-to-back wins in the GIII Tanforan and GII Bay Meadows H.; he also owns the 1:34 mile course record over the Del Mar turf, set during the Wickerr H. last July. "To tell the truth, I didn't really know much about the horse when I got him," said Roberts. "He did have a large patch on one of his feet, and that's usually indicative of a serious quarter crack. So I figured this horse might just take to the turf, that grass would be easier on his feet. I would say that, and the fact we've almost exclusively raced him in routes, have made the difference. When you stop and think about it, he really has been a remarkable story." The Native Diver will mark Slew of Damascus' first main track start since he finished 4th in the Triple Bend H. at Hollywood in July. "I won't say he's as good a dirt horse as he is a turf horse, but there really isn't anything up here on the turf," said his conditioner. Second highweight in the race will be LOTTERY WINNER (Apalachee), winner of the '93 GII Goodwood H. The 4-year-old makes his 12th start of the year Saturday, and has 3 stakes wins and \$253,325 in earnings this year. Chilean champion L'EXPRESS (Callantsky) comes into the Native Diver off a strong 2nd-place finish in the Skywalker H. on Breeders' Cup Day, when he was beaten just a head by Region. His lone win this year came in a 7 1/2f allowance at Hollywood in July.

The morning line favorite for the Queens County will be REPLETION (Alydar), who is looking for his 1st stakes win. The 4-year-old comes into the race off a pair of allowance wins at Aqueduct; the Queens County is just his 6th start—and his 1st stakes start—of the year. Starting highweight will be 3-year-old VIRGINIA RAPIDS (Riverman), who earlier this year took the GII Peter Pan and Halo Stakes, both at Belmont. Last out, he finished 4th in the Happy Thanksgiving at Aqueduct. Shipper PRIMITIVE HALL (Dixieland Band) was a good 2nd to Michelle Can Pass in the GIII Stuyvesant H. at Aqueduct in his most recent start; the 4-year-old took the GIII Norristown at Philadelphia Park 2 starts back. New York-bred LOCAL PROBLEM (Restless Native) takes on open company after winning the restricted Gen. Douglas MacArthur H. at the Big A in his latest try. The Alfred Vanderbilt runner is 2-for-7 this year.

John Meriwether's DANCING HUNTER (g, 3, Jade Hunter—Nijinsky's Beauty, by Nijinsky II), a 5-2 shot out of Willard Freeman's barn, made it two straight with a front-running, 4 1/2-length victory under Robbie Davis; the Robert Berger KY-bred extends record to 7-3-1-2 and \$64,860, while favored HICKORY LAKE (Meadowlake) finished a distant 5th.

7th-Aqu, \$28,000 Alw., 3yo/up, f/m, 6f, 1:11 4/5, ft. Shug McGaughey sent out Ogden Mills Phipps' KY homebred OPTION CONTRACT (f, 3, Forty Niner—Infinite, by Majestic Light) to win by 5 1/2 after just missing in her last start; the Jose Santos mount has now won 2-of-5 starts by a combined 16 1/2 lengths, and increases her bank account to \$41,700.

5th-Aqu, Mdn., 2yo, 6f, 1:11 4/5, ft. Making his second career start, Edward Anchel's MR. SHAWKLIT (c, 2, Afleet—Shawklit, by Groshawk) pressed the early pacesetter until the top of the lane, then found his best stride late to win by 1 1/2; bred in KY by Treasure Hill Farm, Inc. and conditioned by Frank Labocetta, he is a 1/2-brother to both HER SHE SHAWKLIT (\$284,358) & SHAWKLIT WON (\$230,266).

3rd—Aqu, Mdn., 2yo, f, state-bred, 6f, 1:12 4/5, ft. Dr. Patrick Barry's homebred TENSIE'S PRO (f, 2, Distinctive Pro—Weird Combination, by Tri Jet) came from just off the pace and scored

by 5 in her second career start for trainer Richard Destasio.

Favored DAVE IN A FRENZY (g, 3, Hello Gorgeous—Paul's Cathy, by Tri Jet), claimed by Jewel E Stable last out for \$20,000 and now under trainer Juan Serey, charged from last and just got up in the final jump to edge 31-1 longshot TRAPANI by a neck for 2nd straight win; record for Timberland Farm-bred runner now 14-5-1-1 and \$58,569.

7th-Med, \$27,700 Alw., 3yo/up, state-bred, 6f, 1:10 4/5, ft. IS IT BLINKING (c, 3, Crafty Prospector—Ditto Burns, by Big Burn), bred by his trainer Anthony Cicalese and racing in the colors of Long Hill Stable, nursed his early lead the entire distance and persevered by a head after just missing in his last outing; the 7-5 favorite improves to 3-2-1-0 and \$33,615.

John Sharpel's 7-1 outsider XTREMELY RED (f, 2, Rare Brick—Mostly Quiet, by Silent Dignity), bred in KY by William Thompson and saddled by Dravo Foley, was on top from the start and coasted in to win by 3 under Tracy Hebert; record now 2-of-4 and \$20,806. Heavily favored PROMISING PREVIEW (Rare Brick) was 2nd.

6th-Lrl, \$20,300, 2yo, 8.5f, 1:45 4/5, ft. Returning off a 3 3/4-length alw. win at Med., Robert E. Meyerhoff's MD homebred LOOMING (c, 2, Broad Brush—Native Derby, by Master Derby), out of Richard Small's shedrow, overcame a slow start and won by a 1/2 with Andrea Seefeldt aboard; the 8-5 choice has now won 3-of-5 and \$33,450.

9th-Crc, \$19,200, 3yo/up, f/m, 7f, 1:25 2/5, ft. MY ANGEL MARYON (m, 5, Morning Bob—Assuntina, by An Eldorado), claimed by Joseph Raffa for \$25,000 in April and now training under Richard Root, caught 3-2 favorite IRISH COCO at the wire to win by a head...her 1st victory since July; the 2x'93SW of \$131,220 has now won 7 this year.

1st-Crc, \$19,200, 3yo/up, 8.5f, 1:46, ft. Jack Talbert's FL homebred JACK'S HOPE (c, 3, Rexson—Would Wendy, by Crimson Falcon), the 1-2 chalk conditioned by Nicolas Galati, made it two straight with a facile, 8-length triumph; the 2x'93SP wnr of \$71,885 improves to 16-3-3-3.

8th-Haw, \$19,000, 3yo/up, 8f-70yds, 1:43 1/5, sy. Rickey Harris' trainee BROOKSHIRE (c, 4, Floating Reserve—Flying Linnet, by Inverness Drive), bred in KY by R. E. Hibbert and racing in the colors of Bruce Harris & Palenchar Racing Stable, seemed to enjoy the added distance and went wire-to-wire for his 1st tally of the season; record improves to 35-4-8-8 and \$97,031.

9th-FG, \$17,500, 3yo/up, f/m, 6f, 1:10 1/5, ft. JIVIN' JESSICA (f, 3, Groovy—Ahsoloud, by Explodent), claimed for \$10,000 by 831 Racing Stable, Ltd. two starts back and now in training with George Savage, returned from an 8-length romp to win in similar fashion, leaving her six opponents 8 1/2 lengths behind for 3rd career win.
