### SIMULCAST AGREEMENT FOR GULFSTREAM AND OJC

Gulfstream Park and the Ontario Jockey Club have reached an agreement for Gulfstream to send its simulcast signal to Canada for the Jan. 4 through March 16 dates of the '94 meet at the Florida track. The Ontario Jockey Club and its affiliate locations wagered a daily average of \$1.2 million Canadian dollars on Gulfstream's races last season.

### CALIFORNIA COMINGS AND GOINGS

KOTASHAAN will return to the States after his troubled 2nd in the Japan Cup, but it looks like he will soon be back in Japan to stand stud, rather than continue to race. "He's retired, from the sound of it," said trainer Richard Mandella. Official word is expected shortly from members of the Lex Syndicate, which purchased Kotashaan before the Breeders' Cup. Mandella does have another BC winner in his barn, Classic champ ARCANGUES; the 5-year-old French-bred has been vanned to Santa Anita and is nominated to the Santa Anita H. BC Distaff runner-up PASEANA is back in training at Santa Anita and worked 5 furlongs in 1:01 1/5 Friday; plans for her future are still undecided. Top 2-year-old BROCCO is scheduled to work 6 1/2 furlongs tomorrow, and trainer Randy Winick said, "He'll work a couple more times before we decide, but there's still a good chance that he'll run in the Hollywood Futurity." BC Sprint winner CARDMANIA will pass the Dec. 11 Vernon O. Underwood at Hollywood and will instead wait for the San Carlos. Probable starters for the Underwood are Arches of Gold, Arrowtown, Bahatur, Davy Be Good, Meafara, Memo and Slerp.

### ADDITIONAL FULL-CARD SIMULCASTS AT LOUISIANA DOWNS

In addition to simulcast wagering on the meets from Fair Grounds and Delta Downs, Louisiana Downs will begin simulcasting the full card from Hollywood Park Wednesday, Dec. 8 through closing day, Dec. 20. The Bossier City track will take the racing from Santa Anita starting Dec. 26 through Jan. 20, then will switch to take the entire meet from Oaklawn beginning Jan. 21. Additional simulcasts will be added to the schedule in the upcoming months, allowing fans to watch and wager on a maximum of 2 tracks simultaneously through their off-track betting season.

Saturday's feature at Hollywood contains a field of middle-distance older horses and while there are no stickouts, there is an attractive wagering opportunity. CASUAL LIES (Lear Fan) got a lot of press throughout his 3-year-old campaign but this year is a forgotten horse, a situation which may change quickly. His effort on Breeders' Cup Day was decent enough, but more importantly it was his first start in 4 months and this one has a history of going forward in his 2nd start after a layoff. Having drawn a reasonable weight assignment and the rail, and looking like he will be a square price, Casual Lies is your basic, meat and potatoes kind of good bet.

Early favorite REPLETION (Alydar) has been on the board in 8 of his 9 career starts; his lone off-the-board performance came in his only stakes start, the '92 Peter Pan. "He was a bit unseasoned and he threw in a clunker," said trainer Bill Mott. "He hasn't met this kind of competition recently, but we're taking a chance in the Queens County." The 4-year-old took back-to-back allowance races earlier this fall, but comes into this race after a month-and-a-half layoff for a bruised foot. He will also try a distance beyond a mile for only the 2nd time Saturday. His most recent win came at a flat mile. "We'll take it one step at a time," said Mott. "He gets a little anxious, so getting him to stretch out is going to be a chore." Highweight VIRC... RAPIDS (Riverman) won the '93 Peter Pan, but trainer Allen Jerkens considers a 2nd-place finish his best effort to date. "His Jim Dandy was probably his best race; he was game right down to the wire," said the Hall of Famer. The 3-year-old was beaten by Miner's Mark in a photo in the Jim Dandy. He was sent from his barn at Belmont to Aqueduct for a half-mile work Thursday, getting the distance in :46.63. "When a horse has never run on the inner track, we like to send them over it. The work was kind of fast, but he's doing well and feeling good." The Queens County will be the colt's last race this year. "I hope he finishes on a good note," said Jerkens. "We're probably going to run him on the grass next year." Owner/trainer Murray Ga... is hoping his Queens County runner, JACKSONPORT (Vigors), keeps a straight path through the stretch. "He's got a habit of lugging in; he's had it all his life," said Garren. "He has the size, he has the ability, but that lugging gets him beat in a lot of close races. From the 1/16 pole on home, it's a tough deal.

RE TOSS (Egg Toss) will be starting highweight for the Silver Belles after a solid 3rd-place finish in the Breeders' Cup Distaff; she also has a win in the GI Vanity at Hollywood and the Run for the Roses Stakes this year. The 6-year-old Argentine-bred mare has earned over \$800,000 since coming to the U.S. in 1991; she was also a Group I winner in her native country. Second highweight SENATE APPOINTEE (Storm Cat) comes into the race with a perfect 8-for-8 record this year. The Bobby

Frankel trainee has won 20 of her 28 career starts; wins this year include the Las Madras H. and E.B. Johnston Stakes at Fairplex and the Milady H. at Exhibition Park. Four-year-old PACIFIC SQUALL (Storm Bird) makes her 4th start of the year in the Silver Belles; she ran twice in January and then came back to be 4th after a 9-month layoff in an allowance at Santa Anita at the end of October.

**KINGMAMBO TO LANE'S END** Multiple Group 1 winner KINGMAMBO, a three-year-old son of Mr. Prospector out of Miesque (8xChp. wnr of \$1,971,485 by Nureyev), will stand the 1994 breeding season at Lane's End near Versailles, KY. William S. Farish has purchased an interest in the classic winner. KINGMAMBO won 5-of-13 starts in U.K. and France, including three G1's in '93, placed in five other group events, and earned \$727,735. He will stand for \$45,000, live foal.

Even-money favorite HAVE YOU TESTIFIED (Deputed Testimony) was last of 7.

**7th-FG, \$21,000, 3yo/up, a8.5f, 1:44 1/5, fm.** John Franks' FL homebred SERGEANT HAWK (c, 3, Silver Hawk—Secretariat Flag, by Secretariat), saddled by Bobby Barnett, dropped out of graded stakes company to get his 1st win since capping a 3-race win skein in the Bossier City H. in August; record now at 8-4-1-1.
