**MIKE SMITH: THREE TO TIE, FOUR TO BREAK STAKES RECORD** Mike Smith, currently the nation's leading jockey in earnings, this weekend moved 4 wins closer to Pat Day's record of 60 stakes wins in a single year. The 28-year-old brought his '93 stakes total to 57 with 3 added-money wins on Saturday and another on Sunday. Smith started the streak with a victory aboard Rizzi in the Perpetuate S. at Aqueduct, then doubled up with Repletion in the Gill Queens County H. He made the trip across the Hudson to take the Phoenix S. at the Meadowlands Saturday night, then returned to Aqueduct Sunday to win the Joe Palmer with Preporant. Smith remarked, "I'm going to try for the record, if it's meant to be. I hope I'm fortunate enough to get it." Smith's agent, Steve Adika, will be doing all he can to make it happen. "I wasn't concentrating on it until now, but the record becomes very important when you're close. I have a horse in the stake here (New York) Thursday for Scotty Schulhofer, then there are 3 stakes at the Meadowlands Friday night. I have a call in the New York stake Saturday, but there are 3 at Laurel and if I can get live mounts, we'll go. It's all up in the air now, all last-minute decisions. We're hoping to win the Eclipse Award, and if we can break the record I think they'll vote for Mike. I hope we get lucky." Adika added that while there are 26 more riding days 'til the end of the year, there's added pressure to break the record early. "Mike says he wants to go on vacation on the 20th, so we've got to try to do it before then."

**BROCCO BREEZES AT SANTA ANITA** Breeders' Cup Juvenile champ BROCCO breezed a sharp 6 furlongs in 1:11 2/5 Sunday at Santa Anita, the fastest time for the distance on the day's tab. The undefeated 2-year-old could make his next start in the Hollywood Futurity Dec. 19.

**UPDATE ON JAHAFIL** SW JAHAFIL, who pulled up lame after a workout for the Hollywood turf Saturday, suffered an injury to his right knee. "Fortunately, it's the least possible injury," said trainer Sandy Shulman. "It's too small to even insert a screw, so we'll just give him rest for about 60 days, take our time with him until he recovers. Funny thing is, Ron (owner Ron Charles) just put up \$2,000 for an early bird payment to the Santa Anita H. We'll make sure he's right, but he still might make the race."

Making only her 4th start in the U.S., longshot GOLDEN KLAIR sat just off the pace until the middle of the stretch, then came out for running room and wore down PACIFIC SQUALL in the final yards to win under jockey Chris McCarron. It was the 1st stakes victory for the 3-year-old, who was 2nd in the Gill Linda Vista last out. "She's a filly that likes to settle and make one run," said McCarron. "It was just a case of when I could build up enough speed and make a run at the fillies up front. At the 3/8's pole, she just took off." Trainer Darrell Vienna said, "She had run well on dirt in Great Britain. I was a bit concerned in this race, because she was a little more forwardly placed than usual, but she still had her kick. I told the owners that she had to reach a different level now, and I think she's done that." Jockey Corey Nakatani, aboard favored RE TOSS, said only, "It just wasn't her day."

**NOTE:** Jockey Chris McCarron arrived in Los Angeles from Japan at 1 p.m. Sunday afternoon after riding in the World Super Jockey Series, which was held over the weekend at Tokyo Racecourse. Japan's Yukio Okabe took top honors in the series as Americans Kent Desormeaux and Chris McCarron placed 4th (in a tie) and 8th, respectively.

## THE LURE OF ANOTHER YEAR

When the Breeders' Cup was conceived 10 years ago, there was the notion that its rich purse structure would prompt owners to keep their best horses in training. There was also the thought that the potential for a large payoff would help maintain the then-sky high stud fees. Neither of those events transpired.

Stud fees at the high levels of 1984 have not been sustained, and, on average, have fallen virtually every year since the inception of the Breeders' Cup. As for keeping the best horses in training, the Breeders' Cup had failed to do that, too. At the end of every year, after the Championship Day is held, off to stud have gone the best horses aged 3 and 4. Few owners were willing to keep horses in training based on the lure of a potential big pay day a year away. That was the case even when the market for stallion syndications began drying up, and owners of potential stallions could not syndicate horses for stud and immediately reap big rewards. Today, however, the economics of the sport have changed and more owners are keeping their horses at the track. After this year's Breeders' Cup, for instance, the owners of such horses as Lure, Star of Cozzene, Arcangues, Paseana and Flawlessly indicated that they may just leave their horses in training.

Paseana and Flawlessly are mares; they are also owned by people who like to see their horses race. Star of Cozzene and Arcangues are foreign-owned and eventually will stand at stud overseas.

The big surprise came when it was announced that Lure would remain in training. Lure has little left to prove on the racetrack and, more importantly, he is considered 1 of the most appealing stallion prospects to come along in some time. He has all the ingredients desired by breeders: he is by a leading sire, Danzig; he is out of a good racemare, GI winner Endear (by Alydar); he will stand at a leading establishment, Claiborne Farm; and he is a top quality racehorse who was good at age 2 (he set a 5-furlong track record in his 1st start at Belmont Park) and is a great miler.

The latter probably is the most desirable of all traits cherished by breeders. If there is a hole in Lure's credentials, it is that he raced primarily on grass, and American breeders generally prefer stallions who raced on dirt or who have proven to be able to sire good quality dirt runners.

Lure will race another year, according to Claiborne's Seth Hancock, because racing needs a star—and Lure is a star.

The notion that the game needs stars was also one of the goals of the Breeders' Cup. By enticing owners to keep the best horses in competition, the sport would have champions the general public could identify from 1 year to the next. The problem during the breeding stock price boom of the 1980s was that as soon as horses became major stakes winners, the economics of the breeding shed forced them to be retired. During that decade, few of the top horses ever stayed in training beyond age 4; most went off to stud after their 3-year-old season.

So racing has had few stars recently. The biggest name in the 1980s was that of the great gelding John Henry, who raced until age 9 when he was voted 1984 Horse of the Year. He was the exception.

The economics of the breeding shed today are not as compelling. Take, for example, the decision made by the syndicate which owns Breeders' Cup Classic winner Arcangues. Though Arcangues already had been syndicated and was slated to go to stud in France next year, the syndicate voted to keep him in training.

Last spring, shares in the 5-year-old sold for approximately \$11,000. That would put his stud fee at about \$2,750. If 50 mares were bred to Arcangues, he would generate revenues of \$137,500 per year. His win in the Classic was worth \$1,560,000. While his owners could not reasonably expect to win that much money with him when they campaign him on the West Coast next year, the economics of the track argue for another year of racing. Even if the horse's stud fee was raised to \$5,000 for the breeding season, a win in one \$500,000 race would more than cover the revenues he would generate for an entire breeding season.

On the other side of the equation, Kingmambo, the likely champion miler in France this year, is being retired because the immediate returns from the breeding shed far outweigh the potential return on the track. Three-year-old Kingmambo has been sold by owner-breeder Stavros Niarchos and will stand in 1994 at Will Farish's Lane's End Farm in Kentucky for a reported stud fee of \$45,000. By Mr. Prospector out of the two-time Breeders' Cup Mile winner Miesque, Kingmambo will generate \$2.25 million in stud fees if he gets a book of 50 mares. This year, racing in England and France, the colt earned \$628,108 from 6 starts.

Kingmambo was forced to bypass the Breeders' Cup Mile due to illness, but rich opportunities for pure milers in this country are limited. In 1993, for instance, Lure earned \$1,212,323 from 8 starts, and that includes a bonus of \$147,000 for winning 2 out of 3 races in the Early Times series. Given Lure's accomplishments, pedigree and conformation, it would be reasonable to assume Claiborne could stand the horse for a fee similar to Kingmambo's.

But Lure will stay in training for several reasons. One, Claiborne likes to support Kentucky racing (the farm has moved most of its horses out of New York to run on the Kentucky circuit), and the Breeders' Cup will be held at Churchill Downs in 1994. Two, Lure came close to winning the \$1 million Early Times bonus this year, and with a little luck he can take it in 1994. That would go a long way toward covering potential fees he would generate at stud.

Now that stud fees are at lower, more reasonable levels, more owners will have a choice regarding what they want to do with their racehorses. In the long run, the now-stronger correlation between the racetrack and the breeding shed will be good for the game all-around.
