### HONG KONG RUNNERS CARRY THE

DAY Two full fields of international horses gathered at Hong Kong's Sha Tin Racecourse yesterday for the Hong Kong International Bowl and the International Cup, but it was 2 local runners taking advantage of the homefield to win. In the 1400-meter Bowl, the 5year-old favorite Winning Partners (Take Your Partner) edged England's Marina Park (Local Suitor) by a neck, with Malaysian Giltedged III (Phone Trick) 3rd. The winner was bred in New Zealand by Helen Alexander. U.S. runners Journalism (Publicity) and Fourstardave (Compliance) were 5th and 12th, respectively. In the 1800-meter Cup, Hong Kong's Motivation (Egg Toss) stalked the early pace and took the lead in the stretch to win by a length at 10-1, with the French filly Verveine (Lear Fan) 2nd, a nose in front of Stark South (Dixieland Band), who had the best showing for the U.S. Adam Smith (Sadler's Wells), also running for the U.S., was 8th. Approximate purses for the 2 Hong Kong events were \$517,464 for the Bowl and \$646,831 for the Cup. On-track attendance was 69,053; the day produced a Hong Kong record total handle of \$145 million.

### BIEN BIEN SCRATCHED FROM TURF

CUP Bien Bien (Manila), defending champ and the early favorite for yesterday's Hollywood Turf Cup, was scratched after Saturday's rain produced a yielding course for the race. "The condition of the track is not what he likes, and there's no point in forcing things," said trainer Paco Gonzalez. "We'll give him a little rest and point him to the races at Santa Anita."

### NY RACING CANCELLED AFTER THIRD

Racing at Aqueduct was cancelled yesterday after the 3rd race due to the track condition. Rain checks were issued and the entire Pick Six pool was paid out to handicappers who had the winner of the 3rd, My Only Hope, on their tickets. The \$100,000a Tempted has been rescheduled for Saturday, Dec. 18.

RECORD PURSES AT SANTA ANITA The 1st condition book of the 1993-94 Santa Anita meet features the highest daily purses in the track's history. The purses will average over \$260,000 per day at the 90-day meet, which opens Dec. 26.

Without his nemesis from the '92 Hollywood Turf Cup in the race, Fraise was sent of the 7-5 favorite and proved worthy of the odds, cruising to the lead in the stretch and drawing off to win as he pleased. Jockey Chris McCarron, who was scheduled to ride Bien Bien, picked up the mount on the Bill Mott trainee when Pat Day was unable to fulfill his commitment. "I was thrilled when I learned I had the mount on Fraise," said McCarron. "He handled the ground very well. The ground has been very, very soft; guite frankly, he handled it better than any horse I rode all week." Said Mott, "Naturally, there was concern about the late change in riders. I think we were fortunate to get Chris. I think we were lucky that his horse scratched. Fraise will go back to Florida now; we'll consider the races at Santa Anita this winter, and we've also got the Pan American at Gulfstream." Owner Madeline Paulson indicated she would like to race Fraise into his 6- and 7-year-old years.
