NY RACING BILL PASSED A bill which will allow the New York Racing Association, on an experimental basis, to conduct cards including 7 live races and 5 simulcast races from Gulfstream Park, has been passed by both houses of New York's Congress. The bill needs only the signature of Gov. Mario Cuomo, who has been in favor of this legislation, to become law; it would then take effect Jan. 1 through March 31. NYRA will change its dark day to Monday to match its schedule with Gulfstream's. Take-out on the simulcast races only will increase to 20 percent for multiple bets (doubles, exactas and quinellas) and 25 percent on other exotics (Pick 3, Pick 6, triples).

JEFF LUKAS "VERY CRITICAL" As of

10:15 a.m. PST, the condition of trainer Jeff Lukas had been downgraded to "very critical", according to Peggy Yost, business manager for the D. Wayne Lukas Racing Stable, who added that another CATscan was planned for Friday afternoon.

TRAINER NAMED IN KY CRUELTY CASE

Humane Society Director John Bodie has identified trainer James Howard as the target of Thursday's raid on the Kentucky Training Center in Lexington. The Director alleged that Howard abandoned 7 horses under his care, and said, "Thanks to the horse people and the news media who got involved, we have found the owners of all the horses. They were not in bad shape, just a little dehydrated, but if somebody hadn't gotten involved it could have been worse."

ONTARIO RACING COMMISSION TO TAKE

OJC TO COURT According to Frank Drea, chairman of the Ontario Racing Commission, his organization will take the Ontario Jockey Club into High Court (Canada's version of the Supreme Court) Monday, Dec. 20. The dispute is over funds the OJC is receiving from the Hollywood Park simulcast. As the result of a Racing Commission hearing Dec. 1, the OJC was instructed to split revenues from all future simulcasts 43-57, with the Canadian HBPA and the Ontario Harness Horse Assoc. sharing 57 percent. The OJC contends the split should be 50-50, as it was in '92.

The turned-down hind shoes have already been banned in states including New York, Maryland and Pennsylvania. In related news, the Massachusetts State Racing Commission ruled Wednesday to make the use of flak jackets by jockeys mandatory effective Jan. 1, 1994.


