FAIR GROUNDS GRANDSTAND DE-

STROYED BY FIRE The grandstand at Fair Grounds Race Course in New Orleans was destroyed by a 7-alarm blaze Friday night. Racing had concluded for the day, but the track was open for off-track betting and video poker; the building was evacuated and no injuries were reported. This was the 2nd time the historic track has been devastated by fire. The original grandstand was destroyed in 1913. Reports indicated that the fire began in the jockey's room; it swept through the grandstand but did not spread to the stables on the backstretch. "There's not much left on the frontside," said Richard Mocklin, Fair Grounds director of publicity. "Half the clubhouse and the turf club are still standing, but we haven't made an assessment of the damage yet. It's pretty devastating." As to the track's future, Mocklin said, "Bryan Krantz, the track's president and general manager, had a meeting with the horsemen Saturday morning; he hopes to resume racing Jan. 5. The plan is to bring in temporary buildings and tents for the placing judges, the stewards, the temporary mutuel machines. The horsemen seem receptive. The main track and the turf were untouched, so it's a matter of clearing debris and getting the temporary buildings in place." The cause of the fire is under investigation.

RUSSELL BAZE REACHES 400 Russell Baze became only the 3rd rider in history to win 400 or more races 2 years in a row when he guided Flying Spur to victory number 400 in the 8th race at Bay Meadows Friday night. Baze, who won 433 races in '92 to claim his 1st national riding title, has wrapped up the races-won title for 1993. He joins Chris McCarron (546 wins in '74 and 468 in '75) and Kent Desormeaux, who managed the feat 3 years running (450 in '87, 474 in '88 and 598 in '89).

MIKE SMITH ONE CLOSER TO RECORD

Jockey Mike Smith moved 1 win closer to Pat Day's record of 60 stakes win in a year with his victory aboard Michelle Can Pass in Sat.'s Gallant Fox H. Smith now has 58 stakes wins on the year; he rides Fabersham in the Gravesend at Aqueduct today.

When Corey (Nakatani on Tricky Code) finally pulled out of there, he was about three-quarters of a length behind.My filly, coming down to the wire, she was just looking around. She relaxed well today and rated good." Nakatani countered, "I definitely think the incident cost me a placing. I thought McCarron's horse (Princess Mitterand) was coming out a little and I brushed with her. Meanwhile, Delahoussaye's horse was bumping me back in. I had nowhere to go and clipped heels. It definitely cost me a placing."

BAY MEADOWS Two-year-old filly **Meadow Rendezvous** was found dead in her stall at Bay Meadows Saturday morning. "We don't know what caused it," said her still-shaken trainer and part-owner, Tony Diaz. "I checked her last night at 9 o'clock and she had a little temperature, but it wasn't bad." The daughter of Meadowlake made her last start in the BC Juvenile Fillies, where she finished 8th; in Sept. she took the \$110,000 Barretts Debutante at Fairplex. The filly was uninsured, and an autopsy is scheduled.

But both Brocco and Blumin Affair do fit the bill, and must be taken seriously as Derby prospects.
