GUARDED OPTIMISM FOR JEFF

LUKAS Jeff Lukas, who suffered fractures at the base of his skull when he was run down by a loose horse in the Santa Anita barn area last Wednesday, was still listed in critical condition at Huntington Memorial Hospital in Pasadena as of Sunday morning. According to Peggy Yost, business manager for Team Lukas and the media spokesperson on behalf of the Lukas family, "There hasn't been any change in his condition. He's still listed in very critical condition." Yost added, "We feel he is holding his own and he is responding to treatment. Every day that goes by is a plus."

SLEW OF DAMASCUS NAMED NORTHERN CAL'S HORSE OF THE YEAR Slew of Damascus (Slewacide) has been named Northern California Horse of the Year by the Bay Area turf writers. A 5-year-old Tennessee-bred, Slew of Damascus earned more than \$400,000 during 1993 as he climbed out of the claiming ranks to win 6 stakes at 4 different tracks, including the GII Tanforan and Native Diver Handicaps. Owned by the partnership of Harbeston, Losh and Naccarato, Slew of Damascus set 2 course, 1 track and 1 stakes record during his '93 campaign. He will be honored Jan. 23 at the Northern California Awards Banquet.

BEST PAL WORKS FOR RETURN Five-year-old gelding Best Pal (Habitony) worked a strong 6 furlongs in 1:12 4/5 over Hollywood's fast main track Saturday as he prepares for his 1st start since finishing 10th in the Breeders' Cup Classic. The winner of 14 of his 31 career starts took the GI Hollywood Gold Cup and the \$250,000 Cal Cup Classic in '93; his earnings stand at \$4.7 million. Trainer Gary Jones has not yet picked a spot for Best Pal's return.

Favored at 2-5, previously undefeated Brocco suffered his 1st loss as pacesetter Valiant Nature, the 2nd-longest shot on the board, held on to win by three-quarters of a length. The 16-1 shot was making only his 3rd start after breaking his maiden on the grass last out; he was a well-beaten 10th in his debut on the dirt. Jockey Laffit Pincay Jr. rode the winner, who is a full brother to '91 champion turf horse TIGHT SPOT (\$1,566,100) "This horse can run," said Pincay. "To tell you the truth, I thought I had a chance of beating Brocco. I think this horse has a big future. Maybe I've got a Derby horse right here." Trainer Ron McAnally, who also trained Tight Spot, commented, "He has come along very, very well, like his full brother did. He's still a baby, only 3 races. The way he had been training on the dirt, I had a lot of confidence in him. Now we'll just have to wait for some of the races at Santa Anita." Said Brocco's trainer, Randy Winick, "The trouble occurred between the half-mile pole and the 3/8 pole when he had to check. The horse was trying hard at that point and Gary (Stevens) had a ton of horse going into the turn. If he hadn't got into trouble, I think he would have won. I think that incident was the difference. He'll get a couple of months off until Feb., and he'll start all over as a 3-year-old. We'll look at the San Vicente (Feb. 13) or the San Rafael (March 6) and then the Santa Anita Derby (April 9).
