GULFSTREAM REDUCES TAKEOUT

Douglas Donn, president of Gulfstream Park, announced yesterday that the track will reduce the parimutuel takeout for its 1994 meeting. Gulfstream's effective takeout will be 20.8 percent, as compared to 22.1 percent in 1993 and 21.4 percent in 1992. "I strongly believe a reduction in takeout is necessary to start a beneficial cycle," said Donn. Gulfstream's takeout for 1994 will be as follows: Win, Place and Show bets, 18% (.1% less than 1993); Perfectas, 20% (4% less); Daily Double, 20% (4% less); Trifectas, 25% (1% more); Bet Threes, 25% (1% more); Pick Six, 25% (no Pick Six wagering in 1993).

JUDGE RULES 55/45 SPLIT ON OJC

SIMULCASTS In a decision handed down Tues., the Toronto High Court ordered the Ontario Jockey Club to follow a ruling issued by the Ontario Racing Commission Dec. 1. In his decision, Mr. Justice Blenusl Wright told the OJC to set aside 55 percent of all simulcasting money to be divided by the Ontario HBPA and the Ontario Harness Horse Association. The other 45 percent will go to the OJC for operating expenses. The recent court decision will clear the way for the OJC to take races from Florida as well as California. The OJC currently has a contract to take Santa Anita from opening day Dec. 26 through the end of the year. They have also agreed in principal to a contract from Gulfstream Park, but it is as yet unsigned.

FAIR GROUNDS MOVES TOWARDS

REOPENING Bryan G. Krantz, president of Fair Grounds, said Mon. that the fire-ravaged track is "moving confidently" towards a Jan. 5 reopening. In conjunction with Festival Productions, Fair Grounds plans to erect temporary, climate-controlled structures that will include a tented clubhouse with seating for 500, a tented grandstand with bleachers seating 3,000 and a tent-covered paddock. Trailers will be brought in to house temporary administrative offices and the jockeys' quarters. Approximately 120 mutuel machines will be in use. Fair Grounds will move up its post-time to 12:30 P.M. CST due to the lack of lights for the racing surface.

GII \$100,000-added Malibu Stakes, 3yo's, 7f A probable field of 5 is shaping up, headed by 1992 Juvenile Champion Gilded Time and River Special. Gilded Time (Timeless Moment) breezed 5 furlongs vesterday on Santa Anita's main track in :59 4/5 with regular jockey Chris McCarron up. Jockey Pat Valenzuela will fill in for the suspended Kent Desormeaux on Golden Eagle Farm's River Special (Riverman). "I would say the distance is perfect for him as far as his progression back to where he wants to be, and for his career," said trainer Bob Hess Jr. of River Special. "I'm just not sure it's his best distance for winning. I think Gilded Time will be very tough to beat." Trainer Ron McAnally will enter D'Hallevant (Ogygian), winner of 4 of 14 lifetime starts including the Phone Trick H. at Hollywood May 31. Corey Nakatani has the mount. Other probables for the Malibu include Jack Van Berg trainee Cimply A Winner (Gate Dancer), who will be ridden by G.F. Almeida, and Mike Mitchell trainee Pharaoh's Heart (Persevered), no rider. Possibles for the race are Stuka, Diazo, Concept Win, Mister Jolie, Fort Chaffee, Pricelessly, Bat Eclat, Daggett Peak, Goldigger's Dream and Tinners Way.

SANTA ANITA TO OFFER ONLY 'SELECTED' SIMULCASTS Santa Anita will offer only selected races as simulcast wagering events when the track opens for its '93-'94 racing season Sun., Dec. 26. While current law allows Santa Anita to offer betting on all races from Northern California with a purse of \$20,000 or more, Santa Anita will begin the meet offering only 1 such race per day when available, in addition to stakes and other races of particular interest. The Northern California race will be offered after the last live race from Santa Anita.

HOLLYWOOD MEET LEADERS Harbor View Farm's Flawlessly was voted 1993 Hollywood Park Autumn Festival Horse of the Meeting. The 5-year-old mare won her 3rd consecutive Matriarch Nov. 28 to remain undefeated in 6 starts over the Hollywood turf. Madeleine Paulson's Fraise finished 2nd in the voting. Jockey Alex Solis took his 1st Hollywood riding title with 28 victories. Trainer Sandy Shulman led the standings with 16 wins.

JEFF LUKAS REMAINS IN CRITICAL

CONDITION Jeff Lukas remains in "very critical" condition, according to Peggy Yost, business manager for the D. Wayne Lukas Racing Stable. The 36-year-old Lukas suffered fractures at the base of his skull when knocked down by a loose horse at Santa Anita last Wed. "They are continuing to monitor his condition and he is still in a very critical state," said Yost. "There has been no change at all. He hasn't gotten any better, he hasn't gotten any worse."

BLUE RIBBON SHOWS GAINS IN HANDLE AND ATTENDANCE Blue Ribbon Downs in Sallisaw, Oklahoma ended its 1993 meet Sun. with increases in both attendance and handle. Total handle was \$35,251,399 during the 161 live and 39 simulcast cards of the meet, up 6.3 percent from 1992; average daily attendance was 1,251, up 1.7 percent over last year. John Long led all trainers with 48 wins at the meet. The leading jockey was Mike Harvell with 128 wins.

OHIO NAMES RACING OFFICIALS FOR 1994

Racing officials for the upcoming season have been named by the Ohio State Racing Commission. Herb Clark will serve as state steward at Beulah Park and Thistledown for half of the season, with Allen Fairbanks serving at Thistledown for the other half. Sydney Gendelman will serve as state steward at River Downs. The commission also approved requests by Ohio State University for \$100,000 from the Ohio Thoroughbred Race Fund to be used for research and by the Ohio Thoroughbred Breeders and Owners for \$145,000 to be used for promotion and advertising of the Ohio Thoroughbred Race Fund program.

SCHEDULE Garden State Park will run 12 stakes worth \$715,000 during its upcoming 79-day meet, to begin Jan. 13. The meet's highlight, the May 28 \$150,000 GII Jersey Derby for 3-year-olds, will be
