### FAIR GROUNDS RESCHEDULES STAKES: PREPARES FOR REOPENING

Four stakes races originally scheduled to be run between Dec. 26 and Jan. 2 at the New Orleans Fair Grounds have been cancelled. They are the Woodchopper, Truly Bound, Sugar Bowl H. and Louisiana H. In addition, 5 stakes have been rescheduled. The Louisiana Futurity will now be run Jan. 8, the Futurity filly division Jan. 9, the Elge Rasberry and Andrew Erwin Memorial Stakes Jan. 29 and the Crescent City Derby Feb. 15. Meanwhile, work is progressing rapidly towards the resumption of live racing at Fair Grounds Wed., Jan. 5. The tent that will cover the administration offices, clubhouse and grandstand is being shipped in from Brussels, Belgium. Fair Grounds President Bryan G. Krantz anticipates that the assemblage of the temporary facilities will begin by the middle of this week. If all goes as planned, the track will resume operations only 19 days after its grandstand and half its clubhouse were destroyed by fire. Several years may elapse, however, before new permanent structures are built. To give a comparison, Arlington Park was destroyed by fire in 1985 and reopened in its new building in 1989, and Rockingham Park burned down in 1980 and reopened in 1984. "Our focus now is to move forward and get Fair Grounds operational again as soon as possible," said Krantz. "We want to get our 2,800-employee family working again, restore Fair Grounds' rightful role as the center for quality winter racing in the South and continue our contribution as a vital component to the New Orleans-area economy."

#### NO CHANGE IN JEFF LUKAS' CONDITION

California trainer Jeff Lukas is still in critical condition. according to Peggy Yost, business manager for the D. Wayne Lukas racing stable. "At this point, they're still worried about the pneumonia and the fever," said Yost. "He's still in a coma."

A full brother to Gone West, Lion Cavern resided in trainer Bill Mott's stable throughout his 1993 American campaign. "He was an aggressive horse," said Mott. "He was big and strong and a little bit tough to train. He was quite an attractive horse as well." What Mott misses most about the chestnut horse is, "The chance to win a graded stakes." Mott considers the chestnut's best American race to be the GII True North H. at Belmont, although he did win 2 Group 3 races in England as well. Mott believes Lion Cavern has what it takes to be a good sire. "He's marvelously bred," said Mott. "He's a son of Mr. Prospector and his mother Secrettame is, I think, one of the better mares around. He had enough speed to win going 6 furlongs, yet he was effective up to a mile. I think what a lot of people look for in a stallion is a horse that is a good miler, and that might have been his cup of tea."

Robert Acton, Director of Stud Farms for Sheikh Mohammed, said Lion Cavern was brought to Darley Stud Management Ltd.'s Dalham Hall Stud in Newmarket, England because, "We have a need, with Sheikh Mohammed's mares, for an outcross stallion of Northern Dancer." As far as the reception of breeders to Lion Cavern, Acton said, "We have taken our normal maximum of 50 mares, and we have turned down 30 mares."
