A TOUGH ACT TO FOLLOW

Fortunately for Brave Act (GB) (Persian Bold {Ire}), GI Breeders' Cup Mile hero Silic (Fr) was not entered in today's \$150,000 GII San Gabriel H. at Santa Anita. A three-time graded-stakes winner this year, Brave Act followed Silic under the wire in three of his last four losses, but the Ron McAnally trainee came from 10th in the stretch to nip Native Desert (Desert Classic) and Bouccaneer (Fr) (Hero's Honor) for a neck victory in the Nov. 27 GII Citation H. at Hollywood last time out. Just a length covered the top six in that race, with Ladies Din (Din's Dancer) finishing at the back of the sextet. But while the five-year-old gelding is winless in seven starts this season, he was on the board in his first six outings of 1999, all against Grade I and Grade Il company, "He won six races in 1998, but this year he couldn't get lucky," trainer Julio Canani said. Kahal (GB) (Machiavellian), on the other hand, comes into the San Gabriel on a two-race winning streak. Placed in Group company on the grass in England and in Listed company on the dirt in Dubai, the six-year-old finished a distant fifth to Artax in his U.S. bow, the GI Carter H. May 2. Off the board again in the June 27 GII Triple Bend Breeders' Cup H. on the main track, he was freshened for three months, then tired in his return, running sixth over a swampy course in the Oct. 6 GII Keeneland Turf Mile. The bay, disqualified from first to second in the Nov. 6 GIII Morvich H. at 6 1/2 furlongs on the turf, was an easy allowance winner in his last, a one-mile grass affair Dec. 5 at Hollywood.

DANCING GUY WALTZES INTO 2000

The new millennium doesn't begin until 2001, but Dancing Guy (Robyn Dancer) rang in the new year with an emphatic 5 1/4-length victory in yesterday's GIII Fred W. Hooper H. at Calder. First or second in his last four starts, the four-year-old had pocketed the Thanksgiving Day H. at Calder by the exact same margin in his last appearance and added his first graded score this time around. "He's awesome right now," jockey Jose Ferrer said. "He was playful down the lane...flicking his ears and waiting for horses. He always does it--he did it last time--and he can still blow them away." The 15-10 favorite, Dancing Guy was never far from the lead as second choice Key Lory (Key to the Mint) set a moderate pace. The gray gelding moved into second after six furlongs in 1:12 2/5 and left the field in his dust down the lane. The race's namesake, 102-year-old owner Fred Hooper, was on hand to make the trophy presentation. "I'd just like to be around long enough to present a trophy when I'm Mr. Hooper's age," trainer Newcomb Green, 77, remarked. As for future plans, Green said, "Like Horatio (Luro) used to say, 'you don't want to squeeze the lemon dry.' I believe in that. I haven't even thought about where he might run next, but Gulfstream is a long meet and I'd think he'd run there sometime."

Campaigned throughout the East and Midwest, Show Me the Stage had ventured west to Santa Anita just one time this year and came away with nothing to show for it, finishing last in the restricted Boo La Boo S. Feb. 20. Undaunted by the track or the competition, however, the California-bred came back for more in what looked to be a much tougher spot here. When rain forced the race off the turf, however, and the heavy hitters scratched, including GI winner and pre-race favorite Tuzla (Fr) (Panoramic {GB}), said trainer Eric Guillot, "I thought, 'this is pretty sweet.'" It was just that. The winner of the Dr A. B. Leggio H. over the boys in her last Dec. 4 at the Fair Grounds, which also had come off the turf, had also sported wins in the July 31 Turf Sprint H. at Calder and the GIII Azalea Breeders' Cup at six furlongs on the Calder dirt June 12. Sent off the second choice in this four-horse field, she broke third but quickly took the lead and never looked back. "Conditions are everything," said Guillot. "I was going to run in the Grade I (La Brea S.) and try to get her Grade Iplaced, but I think a Grade III win is better. They had been see-sawing back and forth in the racing office about what to do with the race. It was a major decision, obviously. It drizzled this morning, then it stopped, then it rained again. But once they took it off the grass, we were able to get some hind grabs on her just before she came over." Guillot said she would stay in California for the Feb. 20 Gill Las Flores H.

Not So Fast has been claimed no less than three times this year, going for \$20,000 after a third-place finish Apr. 15, for \$25,000 following a fifth-place showing one start later May 1 and finally for \$35,000 after a two-length win July 14. The bay had been on the board in all three prior starts for his latest connections, taking an Aqueduct allowance after a 3 1/2-month layoff and most recently running third vs. open allowance company over the Big A inner track Dec. 3. Testing his luck in the state-bred stakes ranks, the bay showed good speed from the start, drove to the front at the top of the lane and held off longshot Flora'spersonalboy to the wire. "He's sharp as a tack right now," trainer Bruce Levine said.

PIPE ON MILLENNIUM HONORS LIST

Record-breaking jumps trainer Martin Pipe has been honored with a CBE on the New Year's Honors List. The 54-year-old, who this year broke the 20th century record of 2,644 winners held by Arthur Stephenson, has saddled 100 winners every year since the 1986-87 season, winning 230 in 1990-91. His last three main jockeys, Peter Scudamore, Richard Dunwoody and Tony McCoy, have all been champions while riding for Pipe. He joins Jenny Pitman as the only conditioner to have won the Irish, Welsh, Scottish and English Grand Nationals. He won the Welsh Grand National five times, and trained the top four finishers in 1992.
