BAND IS PASSING ON KEY AT GULFSTREAM

Band is Passing (Pass the Line), who could have been haltered for \$50,000 from his first win back in December of 1998, hit a high note as he captured yesterday's GII Appleton H., the opening day feature at Gulfstream Park. The four-year-old was coming off back-to-back daylight victories at Calder, most recently taking the Nov. 13 Pete Axthelm H. by 5 1/4 lengths. Off at 6-1, he stalked the early lead of longshot Ray's Approval (With Approval) before gaining command on the far turn and drawing off to a 2 3/4-length triumph. "I was very happy to win this race because...it is named after Arthur Appleton, who is a close friend of mine," said winning owner/trainer Stanley Ersoff. "We were partners on the sire of this horse." Ersoff added, "I think (Band is Passing) will go a longer distance. His father ran a mile and a half." Hibernian Rhapsody (Ire) (Darshaan {GB}), the second choice in the full field of 11, was forced to steady in the stretch, but got up late to grab the runnerup spot from Shamrock City (Slew City Slew). The thirdplace finisher had tossed jockey Edgar Prado in the paddock and then stepped on his right foot. Prado shook off the incident and rode the race, but said afterward, "It didn't hurt much to ride, but it hurts a lot to walk." He took off his last mount on the card and was taken to Hollywood Memorial Hospital for X-rays.

TOP BROODMARE SPECIAL DEAD

Special (*Forli), the dam of champion miler and champion sire Nureyev and the granddam of superstar sire Sadler's Wells, was euthanized at Claiborne Farm near Paris, Kentucky on Dec. 28, the *Thoroughbred Times* reports. The 30-year-old mare, who produced her last named foal in 1988, had not been bred since 1992. Unplaced in just one career start, Special was sent to the breeding shed in 1973. Her second foal was Fairy Bridge, who was named champion two-year-old filly in Ireland, then went on to produce both Sadler's Wells and Fairy King, as well as Group 1 winner Tate Gallery. Nureyev, the champion miler in France and sire of champions such as Miesque, Peintre Celebre, Spinning World, Theatrical (Ire) and Zilzal, was the mare's third foal. She was also the dam of MGSW Number and SW Bound.

Seattle Slew's exceptional feat of winning the 1977 Triple Crown now seems to belong to another era, but this magnificent veteran is still a major force. He will command a fee of \$150,000 this year, in his 22nd season as a stallion, and he again reminded us of his enduring influence during the New Year's celebrations. First the GIII Monrovia H. went to his great-grand-daughter Show Me The Stage (by Slew The Surgeon, by Slew The Bride) and then the GIII Tropical Park Derby fell to his grandson Go Lib Go, a son of Septieme Ciel.

When Go Lib Go was offered at Keeneland's September Sale, he fetched only \$21,000, his modest price probably owing more to the turf nature of his pedigree than to any lack of quality in his bloodlines. Maybe buyers didn't notice that he is inbred 4x4 to the brilliant Nijinsky II.

Seattle Slew, of course, made his name on dirt and many Europeans still wrongly regard him as purely a source of dirt performers. But no dirt specialist could have sired winners of such important Group and Grade I turf races as the Prix de la Foret, Prix de la Salamandre, Coronation S., Hollywood Derby, Washington D.C. International and Carleton F. Burke H.

Septieme Ciel, the sire of Go Lib Go, had every right to be at home on Europe's turf courses. His dam, Maximova, won the G1 Prix de la Salamandre and his second dam, Baracala, was a half-sister to Nonoalco, an American-bred winner of the English 2000 Guineas.

Septieme Ciel inherited a generous measure of his family's ability, as he demonstrated with Group 2 and Group 3 victories as a juvenile. With his family renowned more for its speed than its stamina, he raced mainly at around a mile at three. His finest victory came when he dropped back to seven furlongs in the G1 Prix de la Foret, but he also looked to have the 1990 GI Hollywood Derby in his pocket until Itsallgreektome caught him close home.

The intention was for Septieme Ciel to continue his career in the U.S. after his fine effort at Hollywood Park, but an injury in his first start at four forced his retirement to Walmac International.

Septieme Ciel experienced fluctuating popularity during his years in Kentucky. It peaked in the 1995 season, when he attracted more than 100 mares on the strength of some promising first-crop performers, but his 1997 book fell to 29 mares and he was transferred to Haras d'Etreham. His departure coincided with some fine efforts by his progeny in 1997. Sixieme Sens took the GII San Gorgonio H. and another of Septieme Ciel's daughters, Vivid Angel, won the GII Del Mar Debutante S. and the GI Oak Leaf S. He also made his mark in 1999, especially with a juvenile crop that contained Jokerman (a Group 3 winner in France before taking the GIII Generous S.), Contexte and Go Lib Go.

Septieme Ciel clearly has the ability to sire smart performers, given a good enough mare. Hopefully French breeders will utilize fully the talents of one of the few high-class sons of Seattle Slew to stand in Europe.

Go Lib Go's dam Liberia certainly qualifies as a good enough mare. Although this daughter of Miswaki failed to win, she comes from an outstanding European female line. Go Lib Go's fourth dam, Lighted Lamp, was a half-sister to Crocket, a champion English juvenile, and Lighted Lamp upheld the family's honor by producing the French group winners Lighted Glory and King Luthier, as well as the Classic-placed Torus.

Lighted Glory kept up the excellent work by breeding three Group winners, one of which--the Artaius filly Liastra--is the second dam of Go Lib Go. This well-connected colt could well make further improvement and it will be interesting to see whether he can transfer successfully to dirt.

STRONACH TRACKS TO REMAIN WITH NTRA

The five tracks owned by Frank Stronach's MI Entertainment Corporation--Golden Gate Fields, Gulfstream Park, Remington Park, Santa Anita and Thistledown--will not drop out of the National Thoroughbred Racing Association, according to a press release that the NTRA issued vesterday. According to the statement, the two organizations met and the MI tracks will stay through 2000 as long as the NTRA reviews "ways the board of the NTRA can be more democratically constituted and perhaps expanded" and establishes "a task force to review how free enterprise (e.g. reduced regulation and taxation) can be better achieved in the industry." After meeting with Tim Smith of the NTRA yesterday, Stronach said, "We asked for a mandate to reform the organization. I'd like to see the board of directors elected by a democratic process. I would like my tracks to be a part of the NTRA. Hopefully we'll stay in for many years to come."

SPECIAL ECLIPSE FOR PINCAY Laffit Pincay, Jr., who recently moved past Bill Shoemaker to become racing's winningest rider, will be honored with a Special Eclipse Award at the Jan. 17 Eclipse Awards dinner in Beverly Hills, California. Jockey Russell Baze, honored in 1995, was the last person to receive a Special Eclipse Award. Other jockeys to have received the award include Bill Shoemaker (1976), Eddie Arcaro and John Longden (both in 1994). The finalists for the 1999 Eclipse Award for Outstanding Breeder have now been named. They are: William S. Farish and Partners, Mr. and Mrs. John C. Mabee, and Harry T. Mangurian, Jr.

Parade Ground will stand for \$7,500, live foal, in 2000.

Graded Bonus for Artax:

Paraneck Stallions will be offering a bonus to the breeder of the first graded-stakes winner by GI Breeders' Cup Sprint champion Artax (Marquetry--Raging Apalachee, by Apalachee). If the foal is a registered New York-bred, the bonus will be \$250,000. If the foal is not a registered New York-bred, the bonus will be \$100,000. The bonus is only applicable to breeders who pay their stud fee within 30 days of its due date.

NYRA and NYCOTB Merger Quashed:

A "Memorandum of Understanding" which would have paved the way for a possible partnership between the New York Racing Association and the New York City Off Track Betting Corporation and was drawn up by representatives of NYRA and New York City last May, has been rejected by the city, it was reported yesterday in a statement released by NYRA. NYRA Chairman and CEO Kenneth Noe, Jr. reacted to the veto by saying, "It has now become apparent that the city's position has dramatically changed concerning the acquisition. The Executive Committee of the NYRA's Board of Trustees regrets this action by the city and therefore can no longer consider the Memorandum of Understanding as valid." He added, "NYRA is still of the opinion that a business combination between NYRA and NYCOTB is in the best interests of the racing industry in New York."

Zen Dead:

Zen (Damascus), the winner of seven of his 13 career starts including the 1976 GII Gotham S., died Dec. 26 and was buried at Hill n' Dale Farm near Barrington, Illinois. The stallion, who stood at Hill n' Dale for two decades before being pensioned after the 1996 breeding season, was 26; the cause of death was listed as the infirmities of old age. The all-time leading sire in Illinois, Zen produced 28 stakes winners from his 19 crops, headed by Grade I winner High Alexander, who captured the 1984 GI American Derby at Arlington. His progeny have earned more than \$14 million.
