APPEALING SPECTACULAR BID SCORE

After winging home by eight lengths in his second start, B L's Appeal (Valid Appeal) finished second to Snuck In in the Affirmed division of the Florida Stallion S. at Calder Sept. 4 and fourth in the Foolish Pleasure S. over a sloppy track Sept. 25. He was second two back in the Gilded Time S. over this surface Nov. 5, then outkicked Rich Celebration (Rizzi) in the Inaugural S. at Tampa Bay Downs in his most recent start Dec. 18. Away well from the two hole, he rated just off the pace cut out by Z Cool (Unreal Zeal) and Dance Master, angling outside that pair after a half in :45 2/5. Gaining command at the eighth pole, the dark bay drew clear and was all out to hold off late-charging American Bullet (Jolie's Halo). "The game plan worked out," said winning jockey Mike Smith. "Larry (trainer Pilotti), told me to get him out of the gate, sit in the pocket and make one run. That's just what happened. I saw the other horse (American Bullet) coming, but I was confident we could hold him off. It's six furlongs, not six furlongs and two jumps." B L's Appeal is automatically nominated to the Florida Derby with his victory, but hasn't caught Derby Fever yet. "Like I said the other day, our two major goals were this race and the Hutcheson (GII, 1-29, \$150,000, 7f), so that's what we'll shoot for now," said Pilotti.

BIANCONE JOINS STRONACH STABLE Trainer Patrick Biancone, who was handed a nine-month suspension in Hong Kong after having several horses test positive for banned substances, is back at work as the manager as Frank Stronach's Ocala, Florida farm. The French-born horseman, who denied administering any illegal substances to his horses, had planned to apply for a trainer's license in New York last October, but withdrew that application. Biancone, a top conditioner in Europe before moving to Hong Kong, guided the filly All Along to the U.S. Horse of the Year title in 1983.

CHURCHILL RELEASES STAKES SCHEDULE

The 126th running of the Kentucky Derby highlights the stakes schedule for 2000 released yesterday by Churchill Downs. The first leg of this year's Triple Crown is slated for Saturday, May 6 at the Louisville oval. The Kentucky Oaks will also be renewed for the 126th time and runs Friday, May 4. Churchill's 53-day spring meet will run from April 29 through July 9 and features 28 added-money events, 21 of those graded, including the newly-named GI Woodford Reserve Turf Classic on Derby Day. The 1 1/8-mile turf feature was formerly known as the Early Times Turf Classic. The spring meet also features the first major stakes events for juveniles, with the GIII Debutante for two-year-old fillies July 8 and the GII Bashford Manor July 9. Older horses have their turn in the spotlight in the GII Stephen Foster H. June 17, a race won last year by Victory Gallop. The fall meet runs from Oct. 29 through Nov. 25 with 11 stakes events, highlighted by the GII Clark H. Nov. 24. "Horses that compete in the stakes program at Churchill Downs have distinguished themselves in major races at tracks across the U.S. and abroad and we expect our stakes races to continue to attract the brightest stars in racing in 2000," said Don Richardson, Churchill Senior Vice President of Racing.

FIRST FOAL FOR SKIP AWAY Five-year-old mare Electorate (Ire) (Caerleon) dropped the first foal, a filly, from the first crop of 1998 Horse of the Year Skip Away this past Tuesday at Doninga Farm near Lexington, Kentucky, according to Blood-Horse Online. It is the first foal for the mare, who herself is a half sister to GSW Aquaba. Skip Away stands at Hopewell Farm near Midway, Kentucky.

Falkenburg flashed his speed yet again for his fourth victory in five career starts. The bay gelding captured his belated debut last March over the inner track, then resurfaced in October with an allowance score at Belmont. Shipped to Gulfstream for the Eillo S. Breeders' Cup weekend, the homebred suffered his first defeat when seventh after a wide trip. Back in the Big Apple, he led every step, romping home by six lengths, in an Aqueduct allowance Dec. 5. Heavily favored to continue that form, he broke sharply from his outside post, put a head in front after a half in :46 and gamely fought off Greek Tycoon for a narrow score.

Mixed Results for Tropical Meeting:

Despite a 11-percent decline in total on-track attendance and 17-percent drop in on-track handle, gross receipts from all sources managed a 2.3-percent increase during the recently concluded Tropical at Calder meeting. Total handle from all sources on the Calder product was up four percent while the corresponding figure on full card simulcasting was up over six percent.

Improvements to Lone Star Park:

Lone Star Park will add 1,500 cubic yards of pine bark to its main track ahead of its 2000 racing season which begins April 13. The project triples the amount of the same substance added to the track in 1999 and is intended to add more bounce and resiliency to the racing surface. "The addition of bark to the main track at this time of year should allow the additive to become more effective by the start of the season," said track superintendent Ron Moore.

Status Quo at Houston:

Handle and attendance figures for the 1999 fall Thoroughbred meeting at Sam Houston Park remained substantially the same as compared to 1998. Average attendance at the track was up by two percent, though live handle was off by roughly two percent. Money wagered on races from Sam Houston from racetracks and simulcasting facilities around the country increased by two percent as well.

TTA Board of Directors Adds New Members:

Four new members have been added to the Texas Thoroughbred Association Board of Directors at elections held this past Dec. 27. These include Leland Ackerley of Ackerley Brothers' Farm; James Helzer, owner of JEH Stallion Station; John T.L. Jones III, son of Walmac International's John T.L. Jones Jr; and Bill Tracy, manager of Oak Tree Ranch near Bandera.

The favorite despite the long layoff, El Cielo jumped a bit at the start before settling on the outside. He came five wide into the stretch, hit the front at midstretch and held sway while drifting in a bit towards the finish.

Surfside Eyes Santa Ysabel:

Surfside (Seattle Slew), smashing winner of the GI Hollywood Starlet S. Dec.19, will make her seasonal bow in Sunday's GIII Santa Ysabel S. at Santa Anita. Originally scheduled to return in the GI Las Virgenes Feb. 12, the bay filly has trained forwardly since her seven-length Starlet romp. "The Starlet was a breeze for her," said assistant trainer Randy Bradshaw. "And this filly just looks so good, even since a month ago. She's always been kind of tall and willowy, very elegant. Now she's really coming into herself." Nominations for the Santa Ysabel came up a bit light, with possibly only four runners. Starlet runner-up She's Classy (Boundary) is expected to take on Surfside once again.

SIS Chairman Resigns:

Chairman Denis Cassidy has announced his resignation from the board of SIS (Holdings) Limited, which broadcasts live racing to Britain's 8,000 betting shops and owns the Racing Channel. He took over in January last year after a long search for a replacement to John Morgan, who left after 16 months for the same reason as Cassidy has given. Cassidy said yesterday, "I have resigned, with regret, because I have been unable to reach a consensus with the Board on fulfilling the terms of the agreement reached prior to my acceptance of the chairman's role. I have, however, been able to restructure SIS in a way appropriate for the future and I wish the company well." The present contract that SIS has with Britain's 59 racecourses runs out in 2002 and there are signs that it will not secure a new contract with its various interests split over strategy, especially as racecourses want a huge uplift in the contract price. Bookmakers hold a significant SIS shareholding as do media companies with the Racecourse Association having 10 percent.

Gestut Erlenhof Ends German Run:

Gestut Erlenhof, one of the country's most successful studs of the last 50 years, has closed its German operations. The stud now keeps all its broodmares at Audley Farm in Virginia. Founded by the Countess Batthyany, the farm bred and raised outstanding sires Ticino (Ger) and his sons Neckar (Ger) and Orsini II (Ger) and top runner Nebos (Ger). In the 1990s, the group winners Twen (Ger) and Ladoni (GB) were its leading performers.
