MAGIC MILLIONS SALE SET FOR TODAY

Australasia's first yearling auction of the new year will kick off today at Australia's Gold Coast with the fourday Magic Millions sale, with 800 lots to be sold. There are 477 colts and 323 fillies catalogued in a sale widely expected to exceed last year's, which averaged A\$66,175. The offering features 565 lots in the premier sessions, Jan. 7, 8 and 9. The 89 stallions represented include 48 shuttle sires, among them 21 first-crop sires, and it is these freshmen generating plenty of anticipation on sale eve. About 20 stallions who had drafts at major Kentucky and European sales in 1999 will be represented. The young Danzig stallion Anabaa, who made a splash at Deauville earlier this year with his first yearlings fetching around A\$325,000, and freshman Octagonal (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}) are expected to figure prominently. Other freshman sires who will debut include Ashkalani (Ire) (Soviet Star), Hennessy (Storm Cat), Celtic Swing (GB) (Damister) and Hector Protector (Woodman). Barathea (Ire), absent from the shuttle ranks this season, is well represented and expected to capitalize on the success of his first Australian crop of two-year-olds which yielded a dozen winners. The glorious black stallion Charnwood Forest (Ire) (Warning {GB}) is another expected to make a memorable debut. Magic Millions, now in its 16th year, has yielded more than 40 Group 1 winners and 3,000 winners overall, including Testa Rossa (Aus), Australian stalwart Snippets (Aus) and Australian Derby winners Mahogany (Aus) and Nothin' Leica Dane (Aus).

SALE OF SAINTS CUP IN DISPUTE

Peter J. Callahan and Barry Golden, who purchased the then two-year-old Saints Cup (Saint Ballado) for \$850,000 from the Robert and Bea Roberts dispersal at Keeneland in November, filed suit in Fayette County (Kentucky) Circuit Court on Dec. 15 to have the sale voided. The suit alleges that the Roberts were aware of the fact that the colt had a "core lesion of the main flexor tendon" in his left front leg at the time of the sale, and that the injury will prevent him from competing successfully. Saints Cup, who topped the 185-horse Roberts dispersal, broke his maiden by 9 3/4 lengths at Saratoga at the end of August but had not raced since. Stan Hough, who was the trainer and also the consignor for the sale, is also named in the suit, which states Hough "specifically and affirmatively denied any tendon problem" when trainer Bill Badgett, acting as agent for Callahan and Golden, inquired about the layoff which followed the maiden win. The Blood-Horse reports that the Roberts filed a countersuit Jan. 4 which denies all charges and seeks payment of the purchase price, plus interest, as well as for the expenses for a possible trial and for taking care of Saints Cup, who remains in the Roberts' possession.

WHAT'S DOING DOWN UNDER

Magic Millions 2000, a four-day sale that will show-case the first Southern Hemisphere crops of promising stallions including Octagonal (NZ), Anabaa and and Charnwood Forest (Ire) as well as established big guns such as Danehill--kicks into glitzy gear Friday on Queensland's Gold Coast.

It is three years since Gerry Harvey, Australia's newest billionaire whose retailing empire Harvey Norman was the best performer of the last decade with a 3500 percent share increase--and his two mates John Singleton and Rob Ferguson purchased the once-ailing sales company for A\$6.5 million.

Now, money won't buy Magic Millions and Harvey's aim is to exceed the Sydney's blue ribbon Inglis Easter sale as the premier yearling auction in the Southern Hemisphere.

"It was doing A\$23 million turnover two-and-a-half years ago and that has doubled. Magic Millions is worth more than double what we paid--A\$20 million would not buy it," says the 59-year-old Harvey.

"But Magic Millions is not for sale, it is part of our lives. You get to a certain stage where there are things you like owning. And Perth and Adelaide will be wonderful.

"I still believe we can surpass Easter. They all said I was only dreaming. But it is not going as I would like because the nature of the business is that vendors traditionally send their better horses to Easter.

"Here I am saying send half to Easter and half to Magic Millions--in the past if a vendor had 20 good yearlings, he'd send 17 to Easter and three to Magic Millions. Now we are getting people to change their view."

Last year's 15th edition of the sale enjoyed a 67 percent increase with turnover of A\$26.5 million and an average of A\$66,289 for 400 lots, compared with Inglis' Easter gross of A\$54.6 million and average of A\$108,033. Danehill averaged A\$200,000 for 10 sold at Magic Millions and A\$318,000 for 47 sold at Easter.

Magic Millions was the first company to offer incentive races. This year, there's more than A\$3 million in prize money on offer and Singleton, a high profile advertising guru, has plans to make the Gold Coast a January racing mecca that will ultimately rival Melbourne's spring carnival.

Harvey owns 50 percent of Magic Millions, while Singleton (who raced Strawberry Road {Aus}) and Ferguson, the chairman of Banker's Trust, own 25 percent each. The trio all have substantial breeding and racing interests.

Last July, Harvey gave A\$4 million for Baramul Stud in the Hunter Valley and plans to spend the same again restoring the property made prominent as the home of Star Kingdom (Ire) in the 1950s.

"There are few showplace properties around and I would like to make Baramul one of them," he says. "As far as I am concerned it is not a lot of money in terms of my total portfolio; I only paid A\$4 million for it, and I will spend maybe two, three or four million over a period of time. And that's not the end of it because you have got to have the horses."

He patronizes top stallions such as Woodman in bulk deals and has no plans to stand a stallion at Baramul.

"I live in hope of getting the blue hen. John's a great sentimentalist, he went to Keeneland recently and jumped into the Strawberry Roads," he says of Singleton's buying spree at the record Keeneland November Sale. "At the time Strawberry Road went to stud I thought he would not make it. I thought he was a joke. But he went to the U.S. and what a fantastic stallion he turned out to be."

Magic Millions has ferociously purchased major bloodstock auction firms and selling outlets in Perth and Adelaide with an eye on the Singapore market.

Harvey shrugs off suggestions a buyers' market will prevail here soon owing to vast numbers of freshman stallions.

"I think that prediction is right, except that we have such strong growth in Australia," he said. "We have a fantastic future because foreign buyers are realizing they can buy the same pedigrees here that they can in Europe or the U.S. and we are cheaper. A big percentage of our horses are going to end up in Asia. There's not enough people in Australia to buy horses. Race clubs are increasing prize money and that is encouraging owners, but there'll be an increasing Asian influence. I think Asian buyers currently account for about 25 to 30 percent of our sale, but that may rise to 50 percent in coming years."

PRESTONWOOD FARM TO BE SOLD Ken Troutt and Bill Casner are buying Prestonwood Farm, it was revealed yesterday. The two have been partners with Art, J.R. and Jack Preston, but will buy out the Preston brothers' interest in the Versailles, Kentucky farm. Casner first trained horses for Troutt, the founder and CEO of the telecommunications company Excel Communications, 20 years ago, but now works for Excel. The two were major players at the 1999 Keeneland November Sale, purchasing the broodmare Dance Swiftly, in foal to Gone West, for \$2.4 million; Amizette, in foal to A.P. Indy, for \$1.4 million; and Princess Mitterand, in foal to Mr. Prospector, for \$1.05 million. In an agreement which should be completed today, the businessmen will acquire the 400acre property as well as the broodmare band and shares in stallions which stand at the farm. It was reported that Prestonwood's management will remain in place after the sale is completed, and that the stallion roster, which includes Kris S. and 1998 GI Belmont S. winner Victory Gallop, is expected to remain unchanged. The Preston brothers, who owned Victory Gallop and two-time GI Breeders' Cup Mile hero Da Hoss, will continue to race in the Prestonwood Stables colors.

Kipper Kelly Back on Track:

Top sprinter Kipper Kelly (Kelly Kip), unraced since taking the GIII Bold Ruler H. at Aqueduct last April, worked six furlongs in 1:13 2/5 at Gulfstream Park Wednesday and is scheduled to make his return in the GIII Hallandale Beach H. at Gulfstream Jan. 16. The six-year-old is a track-record holder at Aqueduct, Belmont Park and Finger Lakes and has won 14 of his 26 career starts, numbering the GII DeFrancis Memorial Dash, GII Forest Hills H. and GII A Phenomenon H. among his 10 stakes wins.

New Jersey Loses Racing Bill:

The New Jersey Assembly, which holds its final session of 1998-99 today, will not vote on a bill which would have legalized off-track and telephone account wagering in the state. The bill, which passed the senate in July, was the subject of a battle between Thoroughbred and harness horsemen over the split of potential revenue. The horsemen finally agreed to divide the revenue 65-35, with the larger portion going to the Thoroughbreds, but the bill was allowed to die. The entire process will have to begin from scratch if the issue is to be considered during the next session of the legislature, which begins in the spring.

The British government is set to make an announcement later this month about the future of the Levy Board, but speculation yesterday was that the funding body for British racing will go if both racing and bookmakers can agree on an alternative funding method. The Levy Board is responsible for collecting and distributing levy deductions paid by off-course bettors, worth an estimated £61 million next financial year.

JOCKEY CLUB DISHES OUT FINES AND SUSPENSIONS

Jockey Jason Tate was found guilty of using his whip with excessive frequency on Failed To Hit (GB) in the Easal Handicap S. at Lingfield Dec. 22. The disciplinary committee suspended him from riding for 16 days, four of which will be deferred until June 30. Trainer Peter Harris was fined £600 after a test found the prohibited substances phenylbutazone and oxyphenbutazone in the urine of El Curioso (USA) (El Gran Senor {USA}) after the colt had finished first in the European Breeders Fund Queenpot Maiden S. last July 10 at Salisbury. Pacino (GB) was placed first, Father Juninho (Ire) second, Muhaajim (Ire) third and Muchana Yetu (GB) fourth. Trainer Ed Dunlop was fined £600 after admitting that the urine of Jet Age (GB) (Danehill {USA}) contained a prohibited substance, dihydromorphine, after a race at Chester last June 23 in which the gelding finished third. Jet Age was disqualified and Mattan (GB) and Alexander (GB) were placed third and fourth, respectively. Trainer Nick Littmoden has been fined £1,500 after admitting that he made a false response and false statements regarding the ownership of Southgate Stables in Newmarket.

RIKKI MORSE COMING HOME

Jockey Rikki Morse will return to England from Germany, where he has been riding since 1990. The 34-year-old has accepted an engagement from trainer Conrad Allen, who has 40 horses stabled at Newmarket.
