CHESTNUT ROASTS 'EM IN BROWARD

Horse Chestnut (SAf) (Fort Wood) accounted for the South African Triple Crown in 1999, wining the first leg, the G1 Cape Argus Guineas last January by 6 3/4lengths. After his first score against older horses in the G1 J & B Met S. in February, he captured the G1 The Classic S. Mar. 27 before completing the Triple Crown with an easy 10-length win in the G1 South African Derby in his last racetrack appearance Apr. 24. With the Dubai World Cup on the horizon, Horse Chestnut was shipped to the U.S., cleared his 60-day guarantine and began training with vigor at Calder and Gulfstream, where he zipped five furlongs Jan. 5 in :59 3/5. Wouldn't We All (Woodman) showed the way from the bell with Rock and Roll (Cure the Blues) to his inside in second and Horse Chestnut tucked neatly in behind those two. Jockey Mike Smith asked the South African champ to take up the runing nearing the half-mile pole and the homebred responded, collaring the top two while three wide into the lane and drawing easily away to the victory. Calder Derby winner Isaypete (Peteski) rallied late to outfinish Rock and Roll for the place spot. "What can I say, I'm happy," said winning trainer Mike de Kock. "I'm not too surprised he won like that, but I wasn't sure about the horses in another country." The winner goes next in the GI Donn H. Feb. 5.

STRETCH BATTLE PUNCTUATES SAN MIGUEL

A battle between established Classics contender Forest Camp (Deputy Minister) and new kid on the block Swept Overboard (End Sweep) engaged the Santa Anita faithful Saturday afternoon with the latter proving narrowly best after a stretch-long duel. Swept Overboard, second in his career bow at Santa Anita Oct. 9, graduated in his next and most recent start by 3 1/2 lengths Nov. 8, a race in which he earned a 102 Bever. Forest Camp, sixth as the favorite in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile in his last effort, blasted away from the gate, but had Joopy Doopy (Gilded Time) staring into his right eye and Swept Overboard just a length further back. As the field swept into the far turn, the top two were still inseparable with Swept Overboard commencing a threewide move. He locked horns with Forest Camp a furlong from home and the duet battled gamely to the wire, with Swept Overboard finishing a nostril in front. But is the gray a Classics contender? Said winning trainer John Shirreffs, "This is a big step for him. We're not holding any false expectations. We'll let the horse dictate where he wants to go, not where we want to put him." Of the runner up, trainer Bob Baffert commented, "He ran a great race. He ran with Swept Overboard every step." The Feb. 5 Gll San Vicente at seven furlongs is next for Forest Camp.

SLEW FILLY TOPS MILLIONS DAY TWO

The sole offering by Seattle Slew starred at yesterday's second Magic Millions session, going under the hammer to agent Anton Koolman for A\$425,000. The filly from the Miswaki mare Missa Brevis, a half-sister to Breeders' Cup Turf winner Miss Alleged, was offered by Victorian stud Roselands. The night session aggregate was A\$8,650,000 with an average A\$87,373 for 99 sold and the cumulative aggregate was A\$26,008,000 with an overall average of A\$82,828. Magic Millions managing director Don Hancock said the market for fillies was strong in line with increased quality in the catalogue. "The clearance rate tonight was 91 percent, which is terrific. In the first few lots, there were frequent pass in because vendors were misreading the market and getting carried away, but they adjusted their expectations for a good result." While several first-crop shuttle sires are performing only moderately, buyers can't get enough of Australian stalwarts, including Rory's Jester (Aus), Marscay (Aus) and Snippets (Aus). One Southern Hemisphere freshman making his mark is Hennessy, who has had 10 from 11 offered sell for an average of A\$97,750 to date. Of the second-crop stallions, locally-based sire Flying Spur (Aus) (Danehill), who shuttles to the Irish National Stud, is consolidating his first crop average of A\$91,594 for 50 sold at the major sales last year. Flying Spur has had 19 progeny go under the hammer for an average of A\$105,131, with 11 of those fetching A\$100,000 or more. A total of 29 lots broke the A\$100,000 mark yesterday, with triumphant trainer Gai Waterhouse, whose A\$110,000 purchase of Assertive Lad last year, claimed today's \$1 million Magic Millions race, continued her spending spree. Waterhouse gave A\$782,500 tonight for 10 lots, including an A\$110,000 filly by Danzero. Waterhouse, Australia's third-largest buyer last year spending A\$3.8 million on 47 yearlings, has spent A\$1,912,500 on 21 lots to date.

After her date with Danzig, Alborada is expected to return to Rausing's Lanwades Stud near Newmarket, where she will join her dam, who is in foal to Nashwan and will be bred to Selkirk, and her granddam Alruccaba (Ire) (Crystal Palace (Fr)), who is in foal to Green Desert and now visits Alzao.

Buck's Boy makes only his fourth start since winning the 1998 Breeders' Cup Turf. The Illinois bred won a Woodbine allowance before getting upset in the GIII Sky Classic H. two back. In his last start, the seven year old led this year's Turf field to the stretch before finishing third, 4 1/2 lengths behind Horse of the Year candidate Daylami (Ire). Unite's Big Red has been off form of late, but had five board finishes and two graded victories over this lawn, including last year's GII Pan American H. Special Coach was second behind Appleton H. winner Band Is Passing in the Pete Axthelm H. in November and was most recently a pace-setting third, placed second, in the GII W. L. McKnight H. at Calder Dec. 18.
