IT'S WINTER AT KEENELAND JANUARY

Winter's Gone (Dynaformer), in foal to Coronado's Quest, brought \$410,000 to top vesterday's opening session of the Keeneland January Sale in Lexington. The four-year-old filly, herself unplaced, is a half sister to MGISW Bien Bien (Manila), GSW Dr. Schwartzman (Fluorescent Light) and SW Fantasy Lover (Raja Baba). Consigned by FitzGerald/Keogh and carrying her first foal, she was bought by the heavy-hitting bloodstock team of Ken Troutt and Bill Cassner, who just completed their acquisition of Prestonwood Farm on Friday. "That was as high as we were going to go," said Troutt, who signed the sales slip on the mare. "That was the last tick. She RNA'ed for \$360,000 in the (November Breeding Stock Sale) and we figured that we would have to go to \$400,000. But \$410,000 was the last move." When asked what he liked about the mare, Troutt said, "We're looking for mares with black type in the first dam and this mare had that. It was graded black type, too, and we really liked that." Troutt and Casner have been major buyers at the bloodstock sales in the last few months and now that they have purchased a major farm, the team is looking to add a few more to their broodmare band. "When we're done, we'll have 30 to 40 mares. All of them will be in the high end. This will be about as low as we go," said Troutt. "We think the Thoroughbred business is on the upswing. We see a lot of new money getting in the game. There seems to be a lot of successful people looking to get into the game. There are a lot of people out there right now who are looking to relax and have some fun. Sports teams are attracting a lot of attention. But basketball teams, baseball teams and things like that are really out of the price range. Horse racing is a great opportunity. Our philosophy is to bring our business plan to the horse business. We were in the horse business once before and now that we are back in, we want to have a sound business plan to go along with it. We're very excited about how things are going right now." But not everyone was as enthusiastic after the January opener. "It's tough to get them sold today," consignor Dan Kenny told the Thoroughbred Times. "Last year with this kind of mare it was a slam dunk, but there's nobody here. I don't understand it because none of the elements in the market have changed." The five-day auction continues at 10 a.m. today.

A long memory is required to recall that South Africa has produced an occasional star on America's racetracks, starting with Colorado King, winner of the Hollywood Gold Cup, American H. and Sunset H. in 1964. Hawaii did even better in 1969, when his win in the Man o'War S. secured him the title of champion turf horse, but potentially the best flag-bearer for the South African breeding industry must be Horse Chestnut, who got his American campaign off to an impressive start in Saturday's GIII Broward H.

Although Horse Chestnut was bred in South Africa, nearly all of his bloodlines originate from north of the Equator. In fact, he comes from an exceptional European female line, his fifth dam being Sanlinea, one of the first good horses owned by the late Lord Howard de Walden. This daughter of Precipitation justified her substantial price as a yearling by winning the 1000 Guineas Trial over seven furlongs and finishing third in the 1950 St. Leger.

She then wasted little time in proving herself as a broodmare, her third foal being Nearco's top-class but temperamental son Amerigo. Sanlinea's previous visit to Nearco provided Lord Howard with Rosario, who became the dam of Almiranta, a top-class Alycidon filly who won the Park Hill S., the so-called Fillies' St. Leger.

In the year that Rosario foaled Almiranta, she visited Alycidon's brother Acropolis. This mating produced another filly, Antalya, who now figures as Horse Chestnut's third dam.

Although above average on the track, Antalya wasn't nearly so talented as Almiranta and she was considered surplus to requirements. However, Lord Howard must later have regreted selling her to Harry F. Oppenheimer, because while Almiranta proved a nightmare as a broodmare, consistently failing to get in foal, Antalya produced the smart English colt Attalus.

She was then sent to South Africa, in foal to Grey Sovereign, a very good sprint stallion. The Grey Sovereign foal was a filly, Nalatale, and both she and Antalya produced Group 1 winners in South Africa. Nalatale's main achievement as a broodmare was to produce Bodrum, a winner of the G1 South African Guineas.

Nalatale produced Horse Chestnut's dam, the minor winner London Wall, to a mating with Col. Pickering. Although he was bred in South Africa, Col. Pickering had a European pedigree, his sire being Wilwyn, an English-trained winner of the 1952 Washington D.C. International, and his dam being the Shantung mare Julie Andrews, a South African Oaks winner conceived in England. Col. Pickering's wins included the Dingaan's Plate over a mile, and he was also second in the South African Derby over 1 1/2 miles.

London Wall's bloodlines made her well qualified to visit Fort Wood when this exceptionally well-bred son of Sadler's Wells was purchased from Sheikh Mohammed to stand at the Oppenheimer-owned Mauritzfontein Stud. Fort Wood contributed handsomely to the brilliant record of his dam, Fall Aspen, by defeating a quality field in the G1 Grand Prix de Paris over 1 1/4 miles.

Although seven of Fall Aspen's eight group winners (Northern Aspen, Elle Seule, Mazzacano, Colorado Dancer, Hamas, Fort Wood and Bianconi) won on the European turf, it mustn't be forgotten that her other major winner, Timber Country, excelled on dirt, winning the Breeders' Cup Juvenile and the Preakness S.

Fall Aspen was herself a Grade I winner on dirt in the Matron S. and both of Fort Wood's grandsires, Northern Dancer and Pretense, gained their main victories on dirt. In view of this background, it isn't so surprising that Horse Chestnut appears to have adapted very well to dirt. It is going to be fascinating to see how this exciting colt fares when he steps up to Grade I competition for the first time in the Northern Hemisphere.

BAFFERT LOSES AARON JONES STRING Owner Aaron Jones has taken his horses from Bob Baffert and sent them to Eduardo Inda, who will be his private trainer, it was reported yesterday. The Jones string includes GII Del Mar Futurity winner Forest Camp (Deputy Minister), who was beaten a nose in Saturday's GIII San Miguel S., and GII San Felipe S. winner Prime Timber (Sultry Song), who was fourth in this year's GI Kentucky Derby and most recently fifth in the Dec. 26 GI Malibu S., as well as a Mr. Prospector two-year-old named Mr. Jones which was the second highest-priced yearling last year, selling for \$3 million at the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Sale. Baffert also conditioned GISW Forestry (Storm Cat), who was retired after running fourth in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint, for Jones. "Mr. Jones wanted to go with a private-type trainer," Baffert told The Blood-Horse, "He wants his horses to be the best horses in the barn, and had trouble dealing with the fact that I had some nice horses for other owners. Our draft picks were pretty damn good. I bought four nice horses for him at the yearling sales, and I'm really going to miss them. Now I know how Jimmy Johnson felt when he won the Super Bowl, and the Dallas Cowboys fired him anyway."

BEHRENS WORKS Behrens (Pleasant Colony) continued preparations for a possible start in the Feb. 5 Gl Donn H. with a work Saturday at Payson Park. The six-year-old, second in last year's Donn, breezed five furlongs in 1:03. Stablemate Pleasant Breeze (Pleasant Tap), winner of the 1999 Gll Meadowlands Cup H., went the same distance in 1:03 2/5. "I'm pointing both of them toward the Donn H., but only one of them will go," said trainer H. James Bond. "I'm going to try to keep them separate as long as I can this season. We'll see how each one comes out of this work, then we'll see how the race sets up and see what the weights are and things like that before we make a final decision."

PARIS MAYOR WANTS TO CLOSE LONGCHAMP

Jean Tiberi, Mayor of Paris, has threatened to close Longchamp Racecourse, according to a story published Friday in the French national daily newspaper, Le Parisien. Following the storms that have devastated the Bois de Boulogne, where Longchamp stands, with thousands of trees having being felled by strong winds, the mayor has estimated that Longchamp, where only 30 days of racing are staged every year, is underused and could be opened most of the time to Parisians as a recreational park. According to Claude Comiti, who is in charge of major projects as the Paris City Hall, "Vincennes Racecourse would be kept strictly for racing, as it is the only place in Paris where trotters can run. We then set flat and jumping races on the same course." Which means that Auteuil (also in the Bois de Boulogne) or Longchamp would have to be closed. The City of Paris, owner of both tracks, has a lease with France Galop for Auteuil until 2023, but the one for Longchamp expired last year and racing has been going on a yearly lease. "At France Galop, we have not been contacted by the City Hall about this project," said Jacques Bouchara, vice president of France Galop. "It seems to be a political manoeuver."

WANNABE GRAND RETIRED, TO VISIT STRAVINSKY

Group 1 winner Wannabe Grand (Ire) (Danehill {USA}-Wannabe {GB}, by Shirley Heights {GB}) has been retired and will sent to Doninga Farm in Lexington, Ky., where she will be bred to Stravinsky (USA). Coming Up In France

by Claude Beniada

The French flat season started Jan. 5 at Pau, in the southwest of France, with the running of the first-ever dirt race in France, but it is really on Jan. 19 at Cagnessur-Mer that the 2000 French racing season will really start. That day, a full card of seven flat races will be run at the southern track, located just a few miles from Nice on the French Riviera. Two of these races will also be staged on the newly built dirt course as an experiment, as it looks more and more likely that one day there will be year-round racing in France. Cagnes will stage 13 official PMU meetings between Jan. 19 and Feb. 27, highlighted by the Feb. 19 Listed Grand Prix du Conseil General des Alpes Maritimes at 2,500 meters for fouryear-olds and up, and the Prix Policeman, an A conditional event for three-year-olds Feb. 27. Racing in Paris will start March 1 at Saint-Cloud with seven races on the card and March 11, at the same course, the first Group race of the season will be run, the G3 Prix Exbury at 2,000 meters for four-year-olds and up. The first important event for three-year-olds in France will be the 1,600-meter Listed Prix Montenica at Maisons-Laffitte March 14. It is not until April that we will start talking about Classic action. Longchamp will open March 30 with the running of two Listed races, one for three-yearold colts and geldings and one for older horses. The same course will host the 2,000-meter G2 Prix d'Harcourt April 2 and the 2,200-meter G2 Prix Noailles April 9, the first important trial leading to the French Derby, to be run Sunday, June 3 at Chantilly. Threeyear-olds having English Classic ambitions, especially for the Guineas, will prep April 14 at Maisons-Laffitte in the seven-furlong Listed Prix Djebel for colts and the fillies in the Listed Prix Imprudence. It is too early (according to France Galop) to know the exact number of horses in training at Chantilly and Maisons-Laffitte, as trainers are filing presently and two-year-olds don't have to be declared before April 1. Last year, the numbers were up compared to 1998 and there is every reason to believe that they will be up again from last year. Betting on horse racing has gone up 1.82 percent in France (all bets, including trotting races). For the year 2000, the forecast is for another increase, ranging between two and 2.5 percent.

CUMANI FIRES BACK AT AGA KHAN

Luca Cumani yesterday disputed claims made on behalf of the Aga Khan over why the owner has removed his 30 horses from the Newmarket trainer. He said, "HH the Aga Khan's statement as to why he has decided to remove all his horses from my yard is misleading and damaging; and ... I feel it important to put the record straight. HH the Aga Khan wrote to me on Sept. 2, 1999, expressing understandable and justified dismay at the positive test of Zalal (Ire) and quite reasonably seeking assurance from me that 'fail safe' systems would be put in place so that a further repeat of a similar mistake became a virtual impossibility. Specifically, and contrary to what is said in his press statement, he asked me to inform him of all the steps and procedures I had implemented 'within the next six months.' My response was one of total and immediate co-operation. I have kept His Highness informed as to the ways in which his requirements were being met and at no stage have I received any indication that he was other than fully satisfied with the spirit and substance of my reaction to his letter of Sept. 21, 1999." The trainer went on to reiterate that the grounds given for his dismissal were "so fundamentally and misleadingly at variance with the facts."

The Queen will open the new Millennium Grandstand on Newmarket's Rowley Mile racecourse Saturday, May 6, Sagitta 2000 Guineas day, it was announced yesterday. The £16 million stand is due to be completed by the Craven meeting in April. Newmarket's chairman Peter Player said, "This is wonderful news for racing and Newmarket in particular. We hope that this special day will mark racing's celebration of the millennium and signal a very exciting future for the industry."
