NABLA TOPS QUIETER KEENELAND SESSION

Nine-year-old Nabla (Theatrical {Ire}--Prankstress, by Foolish Pleasure), in foal to Jade Hunter, brought a final bid of \$280,000 to top a more subdued Wednesday session of the Keeneland January Sale at Lexington, Kentucky. Consigned by Lane's End on behalf of Allen Paulson's Brookside Farm, the 1/2 to GISP Adel (Strawberry Road (Aus)) and full sister to GSP Striesen was purchased by Walnut Green Bloodstock of Kennett Square, Pennsylvania. The session topper continues a string of sales successes for Brookside, which sold three of the top four lots Tuesday for \$8.3 million. The second highest lot of the afternoon was hip 1009, Indian-foaled Super Supreme (Ind) (Zafonic--White Wisteria {GB}, by Ahonoora {GB}), who was hammered down for a winning bid of \$250,000 to the Kern/Lillingston Association of Berkshire, England. The four-year-old filly, sold as a racing or broodmare prospect, is a full to Bodyguard (GB), a stakes winner in England and the U.S., and a 1/2 to Italian stakes winner White Gulch (Gulch). She was consigned to the sale by Newgate Stud Farm, Inc. The day's top selling yearling was Boston Twist, a filly from the first crop of 1996 Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner Boston Harbor. She was purchased by Blackwater Investments for a bid of \$110,000 and was consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency, the afternoon's top consignor. At the midway point of the five-day sale, gross receipts total in excess of \$54 million, with a healthy average of \$73,808 for 737 head sold. The January sale's penultimate session begins this morning at 10 a.m. (Keeneland Top Lots p2)

HURRICANE TOPS 'VALE IN FIRST LADY

Hurricane Bertie (Storm Boot) captured the GIII Prioress H. as a sophomore, but hadn't tasted graded success since. Disqualified from an apparent victory in the GIII Vagrancy H. at Belmont last June, the chestnut was placed second for interfering with Gold Princess (Propector's Halo). She also deadheated for third with Catinca in the GI Ballerina H. at Saratoga Aug. 22. The chestnut ended 1999 with a pair of stellar efforts, going down by only a nose in the GIII Princess Rooney H. at Calder Oct. 23 before romping home by 4 3/4 lengths over Vegas Prospector (Crafty Propector) in a Churchill allowance Nov. 12. Favored off the two-month layoff, she vied for the lead with Lucky Again (Wild Again), getting a head in front after a half in :45. The battle was then joined by GI Test S. winner Marley Vale (Forty Niner), who collared Hurricane Bertie turning for home. The pair raced as a team the length of the stretch, with the favorite remaining stubbornly in front by a nose. "She's a very game little filly," said winning jockey Pat Day. "I only knew who won when I came back and saw the number first on the board." Assistant trainer Steve Flint said, "She's put on about 250 pounds, which she needed, because she's a slight filly. I knew it was going to be a tough race, but I trained her kind of light, with the purpose being [to save something for] the next few races. We'll probably go in the Shirley Jones H. (GIII, Feb. 2, 7f, \$100,000)".

Shipped to Kentucky in the fall, he scored for a \$50,000 tag at Keeneland in October before capturing a Turfway allowance Dec. 17. Making his first start in New York for new trainer Howie Tesher, the second choice raced forwardly from his inside post, came through a narrow hole on the rail in the stretch and drew clear for his third straight victory.

New York Report cont. Strong 1999 Figures for NYRA:

Significant increases in handle and purses led to a strong showing for New York racing at Aqueduct, Belmont and Saratoga in 1999. Buoyed by a 15.1-percent increase in daily average commingled handle, daily average purses and average per overnight were up 13.6 percent and 15.7 percent, respectively, in 1999 as compared to 1998. The daily average purses were \$413,925, up 14 percent from \$364,398 the previous year. "This was a good year for both business and purses," said Terry Meyocks, president and COO of the New York Racing Association. NYRA put up a total of \$107,620,469 in purses in 1999, a 14-percent increase from the '98 total of \$94,379,192. Of the 1999 total, \$27,299,229 went to stakes purses, while \$80,321,240 went to overnight purses. Total commingled handle for the '99 season rose 15.5 percent to \$2,688,534,442 for a daily average of \$10,340,517, compared to '98's figures of \$2,328,224,864 and \$8,989,285, respectively. On-track attendance was 2,516,946; total attendance in 1998 was \$2,534,093, a dip of 1.1 percent on a daily-average basis. "While we will never 'settle' for being down even a bit in on-track attendance, there are realities which must be faced and overcome," added Meyocks. "The real weakness came in the fall. Weather is an important factor at any race meet. Good weather helped contribute to our success earlier in the year, and hurt us this fall. Also, we have to realize that the picture was in-home in New York City for the entire year, which was not the case in 1998."

Turfway Wrap-Up:

Final numbers have been tabulated for the recently concluded Holiday Meet at Turfway Park. On-track attendance for the 23-day meeting was 36,396. Ontrack handle was \$11,018,105. The average on-track attendance was 1,582--down 5.6 percent from last year's figure of 1,677. The average on-track handle was \$479,048--up 3.7 percent from 1998's \$462,118. "The meet totals are strong," said Turfway Park President Robert Elliston. "However, we must keep these increases in perspective considering our total 1999 ontrack handle (\$49,263,461) is more than 42 percent less than where we were in 1995 (\$85,737,350) prior to the existence of riverboat gaming in the Greater Cincinnati/Northern Kentucky market."

The seven-year-old had his last pre-race preparation Tuesday morning, going four furlongs in an easy :49. Trainer Ted West's original plan was to give the multi-millionaire considerably more time away from the races following the Breeders' Cup, but altered that plan after seeing his pupil train. "We wanted to back off on him for this year, but he kind of wouldn't let us," West said. "He's just so strong and aggressive in his gallops and didn't want to let down at all. He just loves it."

WRITERS UP

STYX & TIX

With so many cutbacks going on in every department at Gulfstream Park this year, the joke around the track last weekend was that after the '70s rock group Styx played the opening weekend concert at the track Saturday, Jan. 8, they would have to be renamed Stick.

But there wasn't anything stingy about the people attending the concert or their enthusiasm. A crowd of 19,965 poured into the track to see the GIII Broward H., the Old Hat S., and Styx. A year earlier, on the same weekend, a crowd of 13,042 came for traditional rockers Jefferson Starship. The weather on both days was the same, the advertising budget was about the same, so why were there 6,923 more people this year?

Maybe it was the vouchers.

The South Florida Thoroughbred Marketing Corporation, consisting of Gulfstream, Calder and the Florida Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association, came up with the idea of hiking the price of grandstand admission on Saturday/Sunday concert days from the traditional \$3 per person to \$5, which would include a \$2 voucher. The adjustment from the free concert idea developed a couple of years earlier to a \$2 charge was in response to complaints from some FHBPA members.

The Marketing Corporation was formed when Gulfstream, Calder and horsemen signed agreements to go into revenue sharing, splitting all proceed from wagering 50-50. The two tracks would contribute one-quarter of one percent, while the horsemen would contribute one-half of one percent of their money to attracting new players. The concerts at Gulfstream and family days at Calder are the results of the join efforts.

The idea that the tracks and the horsemen can use revenue-sharing plans to fund marketing initiatives is spreading. The Thoroughbred Owners of California have a similar 50-50 split with the Southern California tracks.

There, the marketing money goes into running National Thoroughbred Racing Association commercials and print ads.

Maryland started an agreement on Jan. 1 with the Maryland tracks and off-track betting outlets and the Thoroughbred and harness horsemen. Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association Chief Executive Officer Alan Foreman said, "We are the first group in the country to enter into a revenue sharing agreement between Thoroughbred and harness horsemen and the tracks. We'll split revenues 80/20, with the Thoroughbreds getting 80 percent. Of our 80 percent, the horsemen get approximately 50 percent and the tracks get 50 percent.

The Florida efforts began in June 1997. After two years of concerts at Gulfstream, many horsemen were complaining, and rightfully so, that their money was going to attract people to concerts who only came to listen and not wager. Trainer Ralph Ziadie echoed the thoughts of many horsemen when he said, "We are the Florida Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association, not the Florida Horsemen's Concert Association."

The response from FHBPA President Scott Savin was the \$2 voucher. The reasoning is that, if people received a voucher, hopefully they would go to a window and play, instead of redeeming the voucher for cash.

Handicapping seminars are conducted from the concert stage starting at 12:30 p.m., one-half hour before the first race. The seminars stop six minutes before the first and second race so people can go watch and wager. A giant matrix screen next to the stage displays the races and results. After the second race a recap by the hosts finishes up the seminar, and the concerts begin a 2 p.m.

The price increase is only on the grandstand side, and people not entering to hear the concerts will have a \$2 voucher and won't be any the worse off. The vouchers are only good on the day they are issued.

The results are in on the Styx concert vouchers and they are mixed. For a crowd of 19,965, Gulfstream issued 9,200 vouchers. That means 10,765 people entered through the clubhouse, if all the figures are correct. Of the 9,200 vouchers 6,950 were cashed, leaving 2,250 to be claimed as breakage, which the horsemen and the track split. Of the vouchers put through the windows, 2,000 were used at two windows nearest the concert stage. Another 485 were redeemed with a mutuel clerk walking through the concert area carrying a portable ticket machine.

A total of \$2,498,000 was wagered on track this year as opposed to \$2,348,000 last year, an increase of \$150,000. Of that increase, \$18,400 came from vouchers. Hopefully people won and returned to the windows to bet again.

PRINCE OF WALES UPGRADED Royal Ascot will have a Group 1 race on each of its four days for the first time this year after the promotion of the Prince Of Wales's S. from Group 2 status by the European Pattern Committee. The 10-furlong race will be worth £100,000 more than last season, with a purse of £250,000, and moves from the first day, Tuesday, to the following day, with the G1 Coronation S. in turn going to the Friday. In future, the Prince of Wales's will not be open to three-year-olds so as not to impact on the Grand Prix de Paris (three-year-olds only) and the Coral-Eclipse (all ages). For the past three years, the Prince Of Wales's has been returning ratings of 120, five pounds ahead of the Group 1 minimum.

PURSE BOOST FOR KING GEORGE The total purse for the G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Diamond S., the only British race in the Emirates World Series Racing Championship, will be raised by 25 percent this year, Sporting Life reports. Run for £600,000 in 1999, the 1 1/2-mile race will carry a purse of £750,000 (approximately \$1.25 million) for this year's renewal, set for 29th July at Ascot. "High prize money is a vital factor in building the international profile of a race," Ascot Chief Executive Douglas Erskine-Crum told Sporting Life. "In partnership with De Beers, who have been such an outstanding sponsor of the race for 28 years, we are delighted to add another £150,000 to the value...and so further enhance its appeal both at home and abroad." Last year's King George was won by European Horse of the Year and U.S. Horse of the Year candidate Davlami (Ire).

FIRST FOAL FOR PEINTRE CELEBRE European Horse of the Year Peintre Celebre (USA) (Nureyev {USA}--Peinture Bleue {USA}, by Alydar {USA}), who went to stud last season after winning the G1 Prix du Jockey Club, G1 Grand Prix de Paris and G1 Prix de l'Arc Triomphe, was represented by his first foal Jan. 12. The bay colt is out of Dinka Raja (USA) (Woodman {USA}), a winner in France who is herself out of a half sister to Irish Champion Kostroma (Ire) (Caerleon {USA}) and G1SW Grise Mine (Fr) (Crystal Palace {Fr}).

WAGON MASTER TO FRANCE Wagon Master (Fr) (Rainbow Quest {USA}--Sunny Flower {Fr}, by Dom Racine {Fr}), a multiple graded-stakes winner in England before heading to Chile to begin his stud career, has returned to Europe and will stand at Haras d'Etreham in Etreham, France. The 10-year-old, winner of the G2 Princess Of Wales's S., G3 Bonusprint September S. and G3 Cumberland Lodge S. in 1994, was the champion first-season sire by number of winners in Chile in 1998-99. He is also the sire of G1 Chilean Oaks heroine Washington City (Chi).

NEW BET FOR TOTE:

The Tote is to replace the dual forecast bet with a new straight forecast wager called Exacta, which requires getting the first and second finishers in the correct order. The Exacta will be introduced Jan. 21. Deductions from the Exacta pool by the Tote will be lower than normal at 24 percent of the turnover, compared to the dual forecast deduction of 29 percent. Tote Chairman Peter Jones said, "It is the first time in living memory that the Tote has decided to reduce deductions." If the lower deduction rate generates more betting, the Tote will consider reducing take-outs for other pools, which are currently as high as 30 percent. The Exacta bet, used for straight forecast bets around the world, is part of the Tote's bid to offer pool betting for races at major international meets in conjunction with the tracks or whoever controls pool betting in those countries.

The National Stud's "Shuttle Stallion" Parade at Tattersalls Sales arena, set for 10.30 a.m. on 3rd Feb., will feature new stallions including Cheveley Park Stud's Danzero (Aus) (Danehill {USA}); Plantation Stud's Dracula (Aus) (Quest For Fame {GB}); The National Stud's Golden Snake (USA) (Danzig {USA}), Great Dane (Ire) (Danehill {USA}) and Silver Patriarch (Ire) (Saddlers' Hall {Ire}); and Littleton Stud's Kirkwall (GB) (Selkirk {USA}). Others on show will be The National Stud's Air Express (GB) (Salse {USA}), Bahamian Bounty (GB) (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}) and Hector Protector (USA) (Woodman {USA}); Woodland Stud's new Bijou D'Inde (GB) (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}); and Woodditton Stud's Bin Aiwaad (Ire) (Rainbow Quest {USA}).

NEW STALLIONS FOR FRENCH NATIONAL STUDS:

The French National Studs has added two new stallions to the roster. Balleroy (USA) (Kaldoun {Fr}--Blanche Reine {Fr}, by Nureyev {USA}), with four crops to race, goes to Haras du Lion d'Angers in the Maine et Loire region after standing six seasons at a private stud. A stakes winner and Group 1 placed in France, the 12vear-old has sired three stakes winners, including groupplaced Le Roi Chic (Fr). Arnaqueur (USA) (Miswaki {USA}--All Along {Fr}, by Targowice {USA}), who captured the 1999 Listed Prix Lord Seymour and was twice group-placed, retired with three wins from seven starts. Out of the champion and G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe winner, the five-year-old will stand at the Conde-sur-Sarthe station of Haras du Pin. He replaces eight-yearold G1SW Poplar Bluff (GB) (Dowsing {USA}--Plume Bleu Pale {USA}, by El Gran Senor {USA}), who moves to Haras d'Hennebont in Brittany.

McKnight H. and GIII Mac Diarmida H. in the U.S. The international competitor was also runner-up in the G1 Gran Criterium in Italy as well as the G2 Tripleprint Geoffrey Freer S. and GII Pan American H.; and third in the G1 Italian Derby. Unraced since finishing fifth in the Louisville H. at Churchill Downs last May, he earned \$431,070.

Hip 1389 TARTE AUX POMMES (FR) (m, 7, Noblequest {Fr}--Battle Lady {Fr}, by Persepolis {Fr}).

Winner of the G3 Premio Primi Passi at two and listed stakes-placed in France, the seven-year-old is carrying her second foal. From the first crop of G1 Prix Jean Prat winner Torrential (Gulch), she is out of a multiple group winner in France who was also third in the prestigious G1 Prix de la Foret. The dark bay, a foal of 4th Feb., is a half sister to Borodislew (Seattle Slew), a group winner in France who went on to multiple graded-stakes success in the U.S.
