NEAR-RECORD KEENELAND SALE

Buoyed by the \$5 million sale of Mackie (Summer Squall) and the continuing reduction of the Brookside Farm broodmare band, Keeneland's January Horses of All Ages Sale ended Friday afternoon with the second-highest gross and average in the history of the auction. In all, 1,239 horses and two stallion shares were sold at Keeneland for \$60,951,200. It was topped only by the \$66,694,900 for 1,327 horses and 12 shares at the 1988 sale, which featured the dispersal of Nelson Bunker Hunt. Average price at the auction was up over 39 percent to \$49,183 at the five-day sale. During the final session on Friday, Keeneland sold 215 horses for \$2,117,500, an average price of \$9,849. Friday's session topper was the 11-year-old broodmare Tension Point (Danzig), purchased for \$150,000 by Cape Thoroughbreds, as agent, from the consignment of Taylor Made Sales Agency. Tension Point, dam of graded-stakes placed Marigalante (Silver Ghost), was sold in foal to Tactical Advantage.

'CAT, 'CHALLENGE MEET ONCE AGAIN

The enigmatic Cat Thief (Storm Cat) has defeated General Challenge (General Meeting) in each of their three meetings, and the chestnuts will face off today for the first time as four-year-olds. Cat Thief battled gamely down on the rail when defeating the Baffert trainee by a head in the GI Swaps S. at Hollywood in July, then gave a rousing effort when landing the GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Gulfstream, with General Challenge finishing a lackluster 10th. Most recently, Cat Thief was third in a blanket finish of the seven-furlong GI Malibu S. Dec. 26, finishing a head behind Straight Man (Saint Ballado), and has been working well since the Malibu, most recently showing a five-furlong drill in 1:00 3/5. "The San Fernando is going to be one tough race," said assistant trainer Randy Bradshaw. "You've got some real quality four-year-olds in there, and our colt is going to be competitive. The distance absolutely fits him better than the Malibu." General Challenge rebounded with a victory in the GIII Native Diver H. at Hollywood Dec. 12, but was life and death to get past 45-1 Moore's Flat for the neck score. The homebred gelding has shown a distinct fondness for the Santa Anita surface in four starts, with only a neck loss to Budroyale in the GII Goodwood H. mar- rying a perfect record. Cliquot (Bertrando), breaking from the outside post, may be in a position to knock off the top pair. Unbeaten in four starts against Cal-breds, the dark bay also performed well in open company, capturing the GIII El Camino Real Derby over Charismatic. In his last out, the 505 Farms colorbearer trounced subse- quent Malibu winner Love That Red by 4 1/2 lengths in the On Trust H. for state-breds at Hollywood Dec. 4. He will meet General Challenge for the first time since they made their debuts in a Cal-bred maiden at Hollywood, where General Challenge prevailed by a nose.

ANEES, FILLY TRIO TOP EXPERIMENTAL GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile hero **Anees** (Unbridled) is the highweight at 126 pounds in the male division of the Experimental Free Handicap released Friday. The female division is topped by the triumvirate of **Cash Run** (Seeking the Gold), **Chilukki** (Cherokee Run) and **Surfside** (Seattle Slew, all at 123 pounds. The Experimental Free Handicap, published annually by The Jockey Club since 1933, is compiled for a hypothetical race of 1 1/16 miles on dirt. This year's weighting committee of racing secretaries was comprised of Howard Battle of Keeneland, Michael Lakow of the New York Racing Association and Thomas S. Robbins of Del Mar. In all, the committee weighted 91 males and 88 fillies. Eligible for weighting were all two-year-olds of 1999 who finished in the first four in graded or other unrestricted races with an added value of \$50,000 or higher, run in the continental United States. Storm Cat, Leading General and Juvenile Sire of 1999, headed the list of sires represented with six juveniles weighted.

ALYSHEBA TO SAUDI ARABIA Alysheba (Alydar--Bel Sheba, by Lt. Stevens), the GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness winner in 1987 and the GI Breeders' Cup Classic hero and Horse of the Year in 1988, has been sold and will head to Saudi Arabia to continue his stud career, it was reported yesterday. Neither the buyer nor the purchase price was revealed. The 16-year-old, who captured nine Grade I races and earned \$6,679,242 during his three seasons on the track, retired to Lane's End near Versailles, Kentucky in 1989 and had remained a part of the farms' stallion roster as the property of Dorothy and Pamela Scharbauer. His 2000 stud fee had been set at \$5,000. From eight crops to race, Alysheba has sired 17 stakes winners, including Canadian Horse of the Year Alywow. His progeny have earned more than \$12 million to date.

HOLLYWOOD SETS STAKES SCHEDULE Hollywood Park's \$8.95-million stakes calendar for the 2000 Spring/Summer Meeting will offer the newly Grade I Shoemaker Breeders' Cup Mile as well as a new day showcasing California-bred runners with purses exceeding \$1 million. The Inglewood, California track's meet will kick off Friday, Apr. 28 with the GIII Seniorita S. and will run through Sunday, July 23. With the upgrade of the Shoemaker Mile, Hollywood will now host eight Grade I events at the 66-day meeting. In all, there are 30 graded races, including 12 Grade IIs. The GI Sempra Energy Hollywood Gold Cup has been moved two weeks to Sunday, July 9. The 1 1/4-mile test, which will be televised nationally as part of the "NTRA Champions on Fox," was moved to accommodate the \$750,000 GII Stephen Foster H. at Churchill Downs June 17, which precedes the Gold Cup in the series. The inaugural California Gold Rush Day will be held Apr. 30, the first Sunday of the meeting, and links five existing Cal-bred stakes with the newly-created Quicken Tree S.

DUBAI MILLENNIUM POINTS FOR 2000 DEBUT

The once defeated Dubai Millennium (GB) (Seeking the Gold {USA}), winner of the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. and G1 Prix Jacques le Marois last season, could make his 2000 debut in the second or third leg of the Maktoum Challenge at Nad Al Sheba in Dubai. "Last winter he showed us he could handle the dirt surface," Godolphin Racing Manager Simon Crisford said of the four-year-old, who trained in Dubai last year. "The Dubai World Cup is his target and we may run him in one of the later legs of the Maktoum Challenge." The second race in the series will be run 10th Feb., while the third is set for 2nd Mar. The \$6 million G1 Dubai World Cup will be held 25th Mar. Unraced at two, Dubai Millennium won six of his seven starts last year, missing out only when he finished ninth in the G1 Epsom Derby. He ended the campaign with a six-length score in the Queen Elizabeth on 26th Sept.

OLYMPIANS VS. JOCKEYS IN CHARITY RACE

Olympic athletes will compete against champion jockeys past and present in a special relay race at Ascot today for the launch of the Betting Industry 2000 Appeal for Charity. Those expected to line up include gold medalists Garry Herbert and Gillian Clarke, who will run against jockeys Tony McCoy, Richard Dunwoody, Peter Scudamore and Gee Armytage. Raffle tickets, costing £1, will give each of three winners the chance to select a two-year-old at the Doncaster Breeze-Up Sales in March. A target of £500,000 has been set for the appeal, which benefits the Racing Welfare Millennium Fund, the British Olympic Appeal and the National Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Children.

TOTE'S SCOOP6 BONUS RACE SET:

The seven-bettor syndicate based in Germany which last week won a record £917,021 in the Tote's Scoop6 bet today have the chance of picking up a bonus prize of £1,084,422 if selecting the winner of the 3.10 p.m. race at Warwick. "It's going to be an exciting day and we're looking forward to them coming to Warwick," said Tote PR Director Rob Hartnett. "They are going to be wined, dined and entertained in the run-up to the race. The selection for the big race must be made at least an hour before the scheduled off-time at 3.10 p.m. The choice has to be made on a secret telephone line and once it is made there is no reason why it should not be made public. But we are discussing exactly when this will be done with them and with Channel 4. I'm sure punters will be interested in the horse and it might well be that the starting price will be a lot shorter than you would have expected."

LANDO IS "HORSE OF THE CENTURY" IN GERMANY:

Gestut Ittlingen's champion Lando (Ger) (Acatenango {Ger}) has been voted Germany's "Horse of the Century" by members of the public, who voted through the German daily racing paper *Sport-Welt*. He won with 41.4 percent of the vote from his sire and the legendary racemare Schwarzgold (Ger). Lando was the undisputed leader of his generation from his juvenile season through to racing as a five-year-old. His 10 victories included the G1 Japan Cup, G1 BMW Deutsches Derby, G1 Gran Premio del Jockey Club, G1 Gran Premio di Milano as well as back-to-back runnings of the G1 Grosser Preis Von Bachen. Lando is the all-time leading money earner in German racing history with a total of DM5,657,828 and a total of 10 victories.
