SAME DATE, SAME FACE, DIFFERENT RACE

Dixie Dot Com (Dixie Brass) blossomed at the tail end of his three-year-old campaign, running second in the Indiana Derby and the GIII Laz Barrera, before finishing a good second in the GI Hollywood Derby in his first foray into grass racing. Rested for the second leg of Santa Anita's four-year-old Strub Series, the Jan. 16 GII San Fernando Breeders' Cup, the bay, dismissed at 5-1, dismissed a good field including Event of the Year, by 4 1/2 lengths, marking himself a serious threat in the West Coast handicap division. Injury struck during his San Fernando victory and 'Dixie' did not resurface until Sept. 11, when he was a closing fourth in the Bay Meadows Breeders' Cup Sprint. Back on the lawn for his final two starts of 1999, he was sixth in the GIII Oak Tree Breeders' Cup Mile and eighth in the GII Citation H. Nov. 27. **Six Below** (Seattle Sleet), making only his second start against winners, and third of his career, laid down ambitious fractions of :46 and 1:09 2/5 as Dixie Dot Com, with blinkers added, raced only a length off that runner in third and Breeders' Cup Classic runner up **Budroyale** (Cee's Tizzy) just another length back in fourth. Six Below actually extended his advantage rounding the far turn, but Dixie Dot Com never let him out of his sight, taking command inside the final eighth and inching away to the victory while drifting out late. "We were due for a little luck. We've been a little unluck in a couple of his races lately," said winning trainer Bill Morey. "I hope we don't have to wait another year for his next win." Reformed claimer **Budroyale**, making his first start since the Breeders' Cup, gave "110 percent" according to regular rider Garrett Gomez. "I was really happy with him. Everybody expected more from him because of the last race, but he's been off a month and a half and he's shortening up to 1 1/16 miles from 1 1/4." Trainer Ted West indicated that the seven-year-old would stretch out a bit for the nine furlong GII San Antonio H. Feb. 6. Morey was a bit more clandestine about his plans for the winner. "Last year...we were talking about all the big things we had planned for him. I'm going to be a little more conservative now until we see how he is. You probably have a good hunch where we're pointing to," likely referring to the GI Santa Anita H. Mar. 4.

ENCINO'S A CHARMER

Olympic Charmer (Olympio), given some time off following an out-of-character 10th-place finish as the favorite in the seven-furlong GI Test at Saratoga last July 31, made her two subsequent outings in grassy routes, a 2 1/2-length, front-running conquest in the one-mile Possibly Perfect S. Oct. 3 and a gritty neck victory in the Harold C. Ramser Sr. H. Oct. 24. Kept away for another two months, the homebred resurfaced to be a game second to Hookedonthefeelin in the GI La Brea S. Dec. 27. The bay came into this effort without a main track victory going a distance of ground, but was favored to fill that void in the El Encino. Her **She Kisses** (Dehere), making her second start for trainer D. Wayne Lukas and making her first start at two turns, set strong fractions of :22 4/5 and :46, as Olympic Charmer was rated along in third while three deep down the backside. Turning into the stretch, jockey Chris McCarron aboard Olympic Charmer began to turn up the heat on Her She Kisses, took a short lead inside the eighth pole and prevailed. Said winning trainer Ron McAnally, "She's rating really well now. She's never been in back of a bunch of horses early, but she's fine in back of one or two." McAnally named the GII La Cañada at nine furlongs as a next start for the winner. "She likes this main track better than the others for some reason so hopefully she can get the 1 1/8 miles." Mountain Top zoomed through allowance conditions this past summer at Belmont Park, but turned the corner when a good fourth at boxcar odds in the GII Forego at Saratoga Sept. 6. The dark bay returned 19 days later to be a solid third to Artax in the GI Vosburgh before scoring his first stakes victory in the Dancing Spree S. at Gulfstream Nov. 7. Ninth over a muddy track in the GI Cigar Mile two back, the five-year-old was most recently a neck second in the Dec. 15 Kenny Noe Jr. H., caught on the line by Thrillin Discovery. Making his first start since a life-threatening hock infection, Kelly Kip on the wood and Lifeisawhirl raced as a team down the backstretch as Mountain Top monitored their progress a few lengths back in fourth. Turning for home, Jose Santos was all over Mountain Top trying to motivate him, but once he kicked in, he closed powerfully to overtake a stubborn Lifeisawhirl for his first graded stakes success. "This horse has been doing pretty good for a long time," said winning trainer Bill Perry. The race did set up pretty good for him." Of Kelly Kip, jockey Jean-Luc Samyn commented "I guess it took its toll," referring to the 10-month layoff. "He tried and he came back good...that's most important." The winner goes next in the GIII Deputy Minister H. Feb. 6 or the GII Gulfstream Breeders' Cup Sprint Mar. 10.

With his extreme outside draw of 16, and starting third favourite at 6-1, Captain Al, running for the first time at this distance, maintained his unbeaten record as a three-year-old when finding a little more than joint-favourite Glamour Boy in the closing stages of this important contest. Badger's Coast, favored with Glamour Boy, disappointed and finished in seventh, some four lengths behind the winner.

Keeper Hill is back on the grass, where she has recorded a win, a second and two thirds in four starts, including a third-place showing in the GI Beverly Hills H. last July. The five-year-old has been competing on the main track since, running third in both the Aug. 27 GI Personal Ensign H. in the slop at Saratoga and the Sept. 18 GI Ruffian H. on a fast oval at Belmont Park before notching a 2 1/2-length score in the Oct. 16 GI Spinster S. at Keeneland. The well-traveled mare was fourth in the Nov. 6 GI Breeders' Cup Distaff last time out. **Potrizaris**, a two-time Group 1 winner in her native country, makes her U.S. debut. The five-year-old mare beat the boys in the G1 Grand Premio Seleccion at 1 1/4 miles and again in the 1 9/16-mile G1 Argentine Derby, but has not been out since finishing fourth in a Group 1 race in Peru Mar. 21. She gets first-time Lasix. **Spanish Fern**, winner of the Oct. 2 GI Yellow Ribbon S. in her only other start over this course, bore out badly during the stretch run of the Nov. 6 GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf, but rebounded somewhat in her latest, rallying to be third in the Nov. 28 GI Matriarch S. at Hollywood.

SMITH VOTED WOOLF AWARD WINNER Two-time Eclipse Award-winning jockey Mike Smith has been voted the winner of this year's George Woolf Memorial Jockey Award by his fellow riders. Smith, 34, beat out Anthony Black, Patty Cooksey, David Flores and Edgar Prado. The winner of more than 3,800 races and purses totaling over \$128 million during his 18-year career, the native of Roswell, New Mexico has won eight Breeders' Cup races and logged a record 66 stakes victories in 1994. "It's a great honor to win the Woolf Award," said Smith. "It's something I'll always treasure because my peers voted for me." The Woolf Award is named for the jockey who won the inaugural Santa Anita H. in 1935, but was killed in a riding accident at Santa Anita in 1946. It honors that rider "whose career and personal character reflect positively on themselves and the sport of Thoroughbred racing" and is prized as one of racing's most prestigious awards. Smith will be honored at Santa Anita Mar. 19.

MIGLIORE BACK IN ACTION Jockey Richie Migliore, who broke his arm in a spill at Belmont Park July 17 and has been on the sidelines since, will get back to work Wednesday at Gulfstream Park. The 35-year-old rider will be aboard French import Affiliation for trainer John Kimmel in the 10th race, a 1 1/8-mile \$32,000 turf allowance. "I had two operations and underwent a lengthy rehabilitation process," Migliore said. "The first operation was right after the accident. My right forearm was completely broken and the bones were showing through. They put in two steel plates and 16 screws and they'll be with me the rest of my life. The second operation was Oct. 4. They had to go in and take away scar tissue...and this time I wore a cast for about six weeks. I was able to get on horses about a month ago. I've been exercising horses here at Gulfstream since Friday. I haven't felt any pain...and I feel as strong as ever."

OBS MIXED SALE STARTS TODAY The Ocala Breeders' Sale Company's Winter Mixed Sale gets underway this morning in Florida, with a total of 1,115 horses to go through the sales ring over the course of the four-day auction. During the preferred portion of the sale today and tomorrow, 626 lots will be on offer, including 318 yearlings and 290 broodmares. Open sessions are scheduled for Wednesday and Thursday. The sale will feature yearlings from Forest Wildcat, End Sweep, Hennessy and Holy Bull, as well as first-crop sires Helmsman and Siphon (Brz). Buyers will also find broodmares in foal to young stallions Cherokee Run, Honour and Glory and Unbridled's Song, and new sires Awesome Again, Formal Gold, Grand Slam and Tale of the Cat. Bidding begins daily at 10:30 a.m.

Bear Likely for Donn:

Sir Bear (Sir Leon), unraced since a seventh-place finish in the GII Meadowlands Cup Oct. 15, is likely to return to the races in the GI Donn H. at Gulfstream Park Feb. 5, according to trainer Ralph Ziadie. "He bled through Lasix in the Meadowlands Cup. That was why I let up on him and gave him a brief rest," the conditioner commented. "I didn't take him out of training, but just backed off him and gave him leisurely gallops. I've started to pick up his training and the idea is to train him up to the Donn." The winner of the GI Met Mile and GI Cigar Mile in 1998, the seven-year-old won Gulfstream's GIII Broward H. in his first start of 1999 and was third in the 1998 Donn.

Takhoda Hills Heading for Florida Derby:

Takhoda Hills (Prospector's Halo), who captured the GIII What a Pleasure S. in his final start at two and added an allowance victory at Gulfstream Saturday, will now point for the GI Florida Derby Mar. 11. Trainer Ralph Ziadie said, "I'll bypass the Fountain of Youth (GI, Feb. 19)...he's a young horse that is still learning how to run. Should a condition race come up that fits him before the Florida Derby, then I might run him in it. Otherwise, I'll train him up to the Florida Derby."

The filly, born at Coolmore Stud in Ireland, is out of the unraced broodmare Brief Lullaby (Ire) (Brief Truce {USA}), herself a half sister to Wait Till Monday (Ire) (Maelstrom Lake {Ire}), a graded-stakes winner in the U.S. and twice group-placed in Ireland; and G3 C.L. Weld Park S. heroine Token Gesture (Ire) (Alzao {USA}). Desert Prince, now five, stands at the Irish National Stud and shuttles to Woodlands Stud in Australia.

BRITISH ATTENDANCE ON THE RISE:

The total attendance at British racecourses in 1999 came to 5,175,490, the highest figure for 34 years. Attendance was up from 4,988,118 in 1998. There were 1,151 fixtures at the 59 racecourses last year and average attendance was 4,497, the highest in 10 seasons.

Much of that sum is expected to come from the sale of £1 raffle tickets, with each of three raffle winners getting the chance to select a two-year-old at the Doncaster Breeze-Up Sales in March.
