MENIFEE RETIRED

MGISW **Menifee** (Harlan--Anne Campbell, by Never Bend), who hadn't started since finishing second in the Oct. 2 GI Super Derby, has been retired and will stand at stud this season, the *Daily Racing Form* reports. "He came up with some filling in his right ankle two weeks ago," trainer Elliott Walden told the *Form*. "We X-rayed it and there was nothing there but wear and tear--no chips or anything like that. But we've given it a bit of time and it's not responding. I talked it over with (co-owner Arthur Hancock III) and we were faced with a decision to either give him some extensive time off, like three months, or retire him." The four-year-old will stand at Hancock's Stone Farm in Paris, Kentucky. "Right now, we have no plans to syndicate him," Hancock told the *Form*. "We're in the process of determining a stud fee." He added, "We'll breed our best mares to him and there were already people who said, 'Put us down for a season when he goes to stud.' He'll probably be bred to 45 to 50 mares the first year." A \$35,000 Keeneland September yearling, Menifee was a perfect two-for-two as a juvenile. He made his stakes debut when second in last year's Tampa Bay Derby, then came back to take the GI Blue Grass S. by 1 1/4 lengths over Cat Thief. Second by a neck behind Horse of the Year Charismatic in the GI Kentucky Derby, he was the 2-1 favorite at Pimlico two weeks later, but finished as the runner-up again in the GI Preakness, then was a disappointing eighth in the final leg of the Triple Crown, the GI Belmont S. The bay took the measure of Cat Thief once again in his next start, winning the GI Haskell Invitational H. by a half length, ran third in the GI Travers and ended his career as the runner-up in the Super Derby. His overall record was five wins, four seconds and a third from 11 starts for earnings of \$1,732,000.

END SWEEP COLT TOPS OBS FINALE A yearling colt by End Sweep out of the unraced Ann Margot (Gate Dancer) brought a final bid of \$50,000 to top yesterday's final open session of the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's Winter Mixed Sale in Florida. The dark bay's dam is a half sister to SW Aly Mar (Alydar), and his third dam, Mon Ange, is a full to Tim Tam and a half to On-and-On. The colt was consigned by Green River Farms, Inc. and purchased by Tampa Thoroughbreds. Green River also consigned the day's top-selling broodmare, How Suite She Is (Bates Motel). The seven-year-old, in foal to Storm Creek, was purchased by Abracadabra Farms, agent, for \$28,000. She is a half sister to SW Park's Policy (Tell) and GSP All Hands on Deck (Topsider). Overall, the aggregate for the four-day sale was up 18 percent, while the average dropped 3.5 percent from last year's three-day event. "It went about the way we expected," OBS General Manager Tom Ventura said. "The more attractive individuals among the yearlings sold well, as did broodmares in foal to some of the promising young stallions. Now it's time to get ready for our sale at Calder and the beginning of the two-year-old sales season."

OLD MAN WINTER KOS RACING Racing was called off at Aqueduct in New York and Laurel Park in Maryland yesterday afternoon due to the snowstorm and at Turfway Park in Kentucky yesterday evening due to bitter cold. "Once the temperature and wind chill reach below zero, it's just not feasible to race," Turfway President Robert Elliston said. "When you have winter racing, these things happen."

No Go For Race 2:

The second race, a \$20,000 claimer, at Gulfstream yesterday was cancelled after jockeys refused to ride because of what they perceived was a dangerous track condition. Dennis Testa, Gulfstream's director of operations said, "Waves in the track developed from the harrow bouncing over the surface. When the jockeys came out to ride the second race, they saw the waves and said it was too dangerous." Jockey Mike Smith said, "It's very strange. I've never seen anything like it. There were waves in the track." The problem developed in the seven-furlong chute. A crew worked for several hours to correct the problem, and the rest of the day's races went off as scheduled, including two 6-1/2 furlong races run out of the chute later on the card. Gulfstream paid out a consolation daily double and consolation Bet 3's.

PRIZE MONEY HITS RECORD LEVEL

Prize money for British racing established a record last year at more than £69 million, the British Horseracing Board announced. However, the BHB has renewed its call for increased contributions from the bookmaking industry to further improve returns to owners. BHB Chief Executive Tristram Ricketts said, "Prize money is crucial to the prosperity of the entire racing industry so the figures are good news, but racing still needs to secure a fair price from the betting industry."

ROYAL ASCOT THURSDAY SOLD OUT

Grandstand tickets for the Thursday of Royal Ascot, June 22, have sold out, the Berkshire racecourse announced yesterday. This is the first year that bookings have been taken over the Internet and Danny Homan, Ascot's sales and marketing director, believes that this is the way forward. "The Internet is sure to become one of the principal means of sale in the future and we are very pleased with the level of use this year," he said. "Our system is quick and safe, the two essential criteria when it comes to making transactions on the 'net. It also enables our customers from around the world to book tickets with us at a convenient time to them." Royal Ascot 2000 runs from June 20-23.

PIPE GETS FASTEST £1 MILLION

Champion jump trainer Martin Pipe added further to his entry in racing's record books yesterday when setting a new benchmark for the fastest £1 million in prize money amassed in a season. Pipe passed the seven-figure mark when his Seebald (Ger) won at Taunton. He said, "It's fantastic to get to £1 million as early in the season as this, so it's another landmark for myself and the yard and I couldn't be more delighted."

BRITAIN GETS AN EXACTA

The Tote's new Exacta bet is to be launched at Britain's three race meetings this afternoon. The Exacta requires punters to select the first and second in the correct order and replaces the dual forecast. Deductions on the new bet will be 24 percent compared to 29 percent for its predecessor.

WOHLER MAY MOVE SOUTH

There is speculation that trainer Andreas Wohler is planning to move his yard from Bremen in the north to Dortmund, which is situated much closer to the racing headquarters in Cologne. Wohler, whose father Adolf conditioned the German Derby winner and leading sire Surumu (Ger) for Gestut Fahrof, is the trainer of the 1999 G1 BMW Deutsches Derby victor Belenus (Ger) (Lomitas {GB}), who went on to capture the G1 Europa-Preis at Cologne later in the season. Wohler, who also trained the outstanding racehorse and young sire Lomitas (Niniski {USA}) as well as the ill-fated German Derby winner Pik Konig (Ger) (Konigsstuhl {Ger}), has always occupied a prominent position on the trainer's table.

The four-year-old is also entered in the 10-furlong Hong Kong Derby at Sha Tin March 5.
