A MOMENT IN THE SUN?

Enjoy The Moment (Slew's Royalty) has always shone brightest at Santa Anita. The five-year-old mare has won five of her seven starts over the track, and she will try to add a Grade I to her resume in today's Santa Monica H. The Cal-bred mare suffered her only off-theboard effort at Santa Anita in last year's Santa Monica. setting a sharp pace before fading to sixth. She was also briefly in front in the Nov. 6 Gl Breeders' Cup Sprint in her last start, but stopped badly and finished 14th. "She loves it here, but she just can't handle deep tracks," trainer Bill Spawr said. "Gulfstream Park is a very sandy track. In the Breeders' Cup, she ran down behind so bad that she went right through two layers of her padding and got torn all up. (Jockey David Flores) said that she just cannot handle the going when it is deep and cuppy like that." Facing the likes of La Brea winner Hookedonthefeelin (Citidancer) and third-placed Kalookan Queen (Lost Code), who dueled through serious fractions in that Grade I event, Enjoy The Moment will not be alone on the lead in the Santa Monica. But Spawr insists, "She's faster than all of them." Flores, who will be aboard Hookedonthefeelin for the Santa Monica, has no intention of gunning his filly out of the gate. "The key is to get her comfortable and relaxed," he said. "She can be too fast, and if you get her rattled early, then she's gone. You can't get after her to be in front because she'll win the speed duel, but maybe lose the race. The La Brea worked out perfectly for us. She broke running from the outside, so I let her stay out wide away from the other horses and just relax and she was very cooperative. If she can relax and run like that again, I don't think they can beat her."

THE EMPIRE STRIKES BACK

Single Empire (Ire) (Kris {GB}) started last season with wins in the GII San Luis Rev S. and the GI San Juan Capistrano H., then came back after a fivemonth break to be second in the GI Man o'War S, at Belmont Park. He ended the campaign with a seventh in the GI Turf Classic in October and a third in the Dec. 4 GI Hollywood Turf Cup, and tries to get back to the winner's circle in today's GII San Marcos H. "After the Turf Classic in October, he came up with an abscess in his foot and needed a little time. trainer Neil Drysdale said. "In his last race, there was no pace at all. They were just walking and Lazy Lode (Arg) went all the way. My horse was shuffled back and then finished well, but the race was over. He's training very well now. The distance of the San Marcos is a bit short for him, but I think he'll run well." Public Purse (Private Account), winner of the Oct. 31 GIII Carleton F. Burke H. and runner-up in the Hollywood Turf Cup in his two U.S. outings, is a perfect one-for-one at the San Marcos route of 10 furlongs. The six-year-old captured the G3 La Coupe at the distance at Longchamp at four and trainer Bobby Frankel said, "Public Purse and Chester House (a fast-closing fourth in the '99 GI Breeders' Cup Classic) are two of the best true distance horses Juddmonte Farms has sent over in recent years."

GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies winner Cash Run makes her three-year-old bow. The filly was second in the GIII Golden Rod S. at Churchill Downs in her final start last year. "It's time to get going with her, and she's training very well," trainer D. Wayne Lukas said. "She looked very good running second last time after the Breeders' Cup. She really didn't get a good trip that day and it wasn't her fault. The Santa Ynez going seven furlongs is a good spot for her to begin this year. It will set her up nicely to graduate to the two-turn races later in the year."

Saturday, Feb. 5, Gulfstream Park **DONN H.-GI**, \$500,000, 3yo/up, 1 1/8m

Golden Missile (A.P. Indy), third in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic in his latest effort, may make his return to competition in the Donn. "I let up on him after the Classic and sent him here to the farm (in Ocala, Florida)," trainer Joe Orseno said. "He's been in light training ever since. We worked him six furlongs in 1:16 here on Monday and he went OK. My plans now are to ship him down to Gulfstream (Jan. 24). We'll work him, and if all goes well and it looks like he is fit enough, then we'll run him in the Donn."

Trainer D. Wayne Lukas may ship the lightly raced four-year-old Cape Canaveral (Mr. Prospector) from California for the Grade I event. "If Wayne decides to run him in the race, then he would fly him in around the 30th of the month," Lukas' assistant Barry Knight said. The colt, a full brother to champion Golden Attraction and a half to GISW Cape Town, has started just four times, winning three of them. He broke his maiden in the December of his two-year-old year and won the GIII San Miguel S. last January, then was off nearly 11 months before resurfacing to get third in an optional claimer at Santa Anita the day after Christmas. He returned to the winner's circle after his latest, an optional claimer going seven furlongs, which was his longest test to date. He would be making his two-turn bow if he goes in the Donn.

STRONACH AND SANTULLI JOIN BREEDERS'

CUP BOARD Frank Stronach and Richard Santulli have been elected to the Breeders' Cup Board of Directors, it was announced vesterday. Stronach, the Eclipse Award winner as top owner in 1998 and again in '99, heads Magna International Inc., which owns and operates five tracks, including Gulfstream and Santa Anita Parks. Santulli is a partner in Jayeff B Stables, which campaigned 1989 GI Breeders' Cup Sprint winner and champion sprinter Safely Kept, and co-owner, with James Tafel, of champion Banshee Breeze. Santulli has been a leading owner for 20 years and is also a major player at the Thoroughbred sales, purchasing blue hen broodmare Korveya for \$7 million at the 1998 Keeneland November Sale, "We are delighted that Mr. Santulli and Mr. Stronach have agreed to serve as members of the Breeders' Cup Limited Board of Directors," said D. G. Van Clief, Jr., president of Breeders' Cup Ltd. "An experienced, strong and diversified boards is an essential asset to the ongoing success of corporations such as Breeders' Cup, and these two gentlemen bring to the table both in-depth experience and a commitment to our industry. We look forward to their input and participation in the years to come."

WINTER FREEZES RACING Bitterly cold conditions following Thursday's snowfall caused the cancellation yesterday of live racing at Aqueduct in New York, Turfway Park in Kentucky, the Meadowlands in New Jersey and Philadelphia Park in Pennsylvania. Laurel ran two races, but cancelled races three through nine due to extreme cold and high winds. Aqueduct has scheduled 10-race cards for Saturday and Sunday in an effort to make up for three days of missed racing this week. Suffolk Downs cancelled racing for today and postponed the preliminary round of its annual winter handicapping contest.

MENIFEE TO STAND FOR \$15,000

Various sources reported that Menifee (Harlan) will stand at Arthur Hancock III's Stone Farm in Paris, Kentucky for a fee of \$15,000, live foal. The bay colt, who raced for the partnership of Hancock and James Stone, was retired Wednesday because of nagging ankle problems. The Kentucky Derby and Preakness runner-up, bred by Hancock, was expected to arrive at his birthplace yesterday, where he will have the same stall and paddock formerly occupied by his deceased sire. "The worst thing that ever happened to me in the horse business was Harlan dying," Hancock told the Daily Racing Form. "It was a blow emotionally to me and financially to the farm. So it's a warm feeling to have Menifee here."

The most useful feature for most participants is that they now have an e-mail address on the site. The Kildare Horse office will manage this 'virtual Post Office' for Kildare's horse industry." Doras, the website rating group, have awarded the site "four shamrocks," being "professionally presented with a good style throughout. Navigation is simple and the color and images are well presented."

£10 MILLION CALL FOR MARKETING

A sub-committee of the Levy Board has recommended that a minimum of £10 million be allocated to marketing racing and betting over the next three years. Targets include boosting racecourse attendances by one million before 2004, sponsorship by 20 percent per annum and achieve yearly growth in betting turnover. Three marketing executives representing the British Horseracing Board, betting industry and Levy Board, will be shortly appointed to develop a detailed marketing plan by the end of April. Levy Board deputy chairman Sir John Robb, who chaired the marketing sub committee, said, "It is widely recognized ... that a more co-ordinated and focused marketing effort is needed."

ZETLAND: CLOSE REDCAR, OPEN A NEW COURSE

The Marquess of Zetland has proposed a new race-course in Northern England, closing Redcar, which he is the chairman of, or any of five others, according to a story in the *Thoroughbred Times*. "I would like to build the best racecourse in Europe," he said. "It is very exciting and the dream of my life to create a really top-class racecourse. Every new racecourse needs fixtures and the obvious place to get them from is to switch them from Redcar."

FIVE FAIL DRUG TESTS

The Jockey Club yesterday announced that runners in five flat races, among them two winners, have failed tests for prohibited substances. Future Coup (USA), trained by William Haggas, failed after landing the selling handicap at Nottingham Sept. 25, as did Seren Hill (GB), trained by Gerard Butler, after scoring in handicap company the same day. Others who failed were Dangerous Fortune (USA) (second Ascot, Aug. 8), Danger Baby (GB) (third Catterick, Sept. 18) and Diamond White (GB) (unplaced Newmarket, Oct. 14). Enquiry dates have yet to be announced.

HATTAB BACK ON TRACK:

A stakes winner in Britain in 1997, Hattab (Ire) (Marju {Ire}) was on the sidelines for more than two years, but he made his second start after the extended layoff at Jebel Ali yesterday, demolishing a quality field in an eight-length conditions win. "This horse had two operations and was going to be retired, but he is back now and in form," trainer Kiaran McLaughlin said. "I couldn't be happier with him. He'll come back here next month for the Jebel Ali Sprint and then there is the Dubai Golden Shaheen." The Jebel Ali Sprint will be run Feb. 18 and the Listed \$1 million Dubai Golden Shaheen is set for the G1 Dubai World Cup undercard in March.

"NEW" NEWMARKET FOR THE MILLENNIUM by Martin Pearce

One of the major stories of 1999 in Europe was the closing of Newmarket's world-famous Rowley Mile racecourse. For the first time since World War II, all races at Newmarket were staged at the July course, situated a couple of miles from the town center and adjacent to The National Stud, where racing traditionally takes place from late June through the whole of July and August.

Back in the 1940s, the course, situated on the Cambridge road side of the Suffolk town, and where racing has traditionally been held in the spring and autumn, was closed to horses as it was being used as an airfield by the 99th squadron of the Royal Air Force.

In 1999 the course, named after King Charles II's old gray horse "Rowley" was again closed, but for a very different reason, the construction of a new, state-of-the-art facility, now known as the Millennium Grandstand. Costing a reported £20 million, the funding came from a variety of sources, including a £6.5 million grant from the Levy Board, the resources of the racecourse itself, Racecourse Holdings Trust, a subsidiary company of the Jockey Club, and input from the track's major commercial partners.

This construction is the third and final stage in the master redevelopment plan for the Rowley Mile facility, which was initiated back in 1984. The demolition of the famous ("infamous" to many) old stand took two months, a task which was begun in November 1998, soon after the final race meeting of that year.

The all air-conditioned Millennium Grandstand, which covers the same ground area as the old facility, but which is an impressive five storeys high, was designed by the architects at the Goddard Wybor Practice, who were also responsible for the Knavesmire Stand at York racecourse, and built by John Mowlem PLC, whose only problems in the construction were caused by very high winds across the vast open spaces of Newmarket Heath, in particular when the roof canopy was being fitted.

However, the new facility is scheduled to be in use for the three-day Craven Meeting, which starts April 18, and will be officially opened by Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II Saturday May 6, the day of the G1 Sagitta 2000 Guineas. It is certainly an impressive and modern-looking structure, and will no doubt be expected to cater for racegoers for many years to come.

On the ground and first floors, the facility will cater for Tattersalls and Members, offering them a large betting and refreshment hall plus a self-service restaurant for 200 on the ground floor with more refreshment facilities and viewing room for at least 5,000 racegoers on the first floor. On both of these floors are video walls, which will provide viewing of replays of races at the track and also races at other meetings, for which there will no doubt be great acclaim, this is the first time this technology has been used in a racecourse grandstand in Britain.

The second floor, with terraced seating for nearly 900, will cater for members of the Jockey Club, the Jockey Club Rooms, the new Millennium Club and the Press, providing members of the media with new and much-needed high-tech facilities.

There has long been a call for the Rowley Mile course to follow the example set by other racecourses around the world and provide racegoers with the opportunity of hiring a table in a restaurant for the day, one from which they can view the racetrack action and where they will be protected from inclement weather. This requirement has now been met by the introduction of the Champions Gallery on the third floor, which will seat almost 400 patrons behind a glass frontage with air conditioning and a TV set at each table. Also on this floor, tables can be hired for the day in the Guineas Restaurant, with its superb dining, but this does not offer good viewing from all tables. There is also a private dining room for hire, seating 60, overlooking the Parade Ring.

On the fourth floor, there are 12 20-seat private boxes, plus one 40-seat box, each with its own stepped balcony overlooking the racetrack.
