BOND PAIR BREEZE FOR DONN

Trainer Jim Bond worked both of his candidates for the Feb. 5 GI Donn H. at Gulfstream Park this past Saturday. Behrens (Pleasant Colony), the runner-up for the 1999 Eclipse Award as champion older horse, and Pleasant Breeze (Pleasant Tap) worked separately at Payson Park, but both were clocked going six furlongs in 1:16. Bond still hasn't decided which will represent the stable in the Donn, but said of GII Meadowlands Cup winner Pleasant Breeze, "He's pretty legitimate. He's not second page to anybody." Behrens, second in the '99 Donn, has not been out since running seventh in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic. The Donn is the first race in the "NTRA Champions on FOX" series and will be televised live on FOX from 4 to 5 p.m.

HORSE CHESTNUT TO GULFSTREAM

South African champion Horse Chestnut (SAf) (Fort Wood), injured during a workout at Calder Saturday, is scheduled to be moved to Gulfstream Park this afternoon so that attending veterinarian Dr. Stephen Selway can keep a close eye on him. "I have to be flying back to South Africa to look after our operation at home, and I'm leaving Horse Chestnut here in the care of Dr. Steve Selway," trainer Michael de Kock said. Added Selway, "My main headquarters is at Gulfstream. Because of the extent of Horse Chestnut's injury, he requires daily attention and this way I will be able to see him every day, and several times a day should it be necessary." As for the five-year-old's course of treatment, the vet said, "Right now I keep a ski boot on him to help keep the weight off the injury (a fractured splint bone and suspensory damage in his left front leg). I'll tranquilize him before we put him on the van and I have a van with a low ramp to make it even easier for him." Whether Horse Chestnut will run again or not has not yet been decided.

If you were in the enviable position of owning a mare in foal to the great Seattle Slew, would you prefer her to produce a colt or a filly? With many stallions the automatic answer would be "a colt," but with the 1977 Triple Crown winner the decision isn't nearly so clear cut. While no one would object to their mare producing another Slew o'Gold, A.P. Indy, Swale or Capote, the idea of a daughter of Seattle Slew holds considerable appeal.

The Three Chimneys veteran had 52 graded-stakes winners to his credit (including three in Japan) to the end of last year and it is a revealing exercise to divide them between the sexes. While the colts predominate, with a total of 29, the fillies are hot on their heels with a highly respectable total of 23.

Increase the sample to include all of Seattle Slew's stakes winners and you find that 10 percent of his sons and nine percent of his daughters have won stakes.

Add in the fact that Seattle Slew's daughters have twice earned him the title of champion sire of broodmares and it is easy to see why breeders are generally more than happy for their mare to produce a filly by this son of Bold Reasoning.

Juddmonte Farms, in particular, has every reason to welcome any new filly by Seattle Slew. The homebred Sleep Easy did very well in 1995, when she numbered the GI Hollywood Oaks among her four successes, and now Juddmonte has a second Grade I-winning daughter of Seattle Slew following Honest Lady's overdue success in the Santa Monica H.

These two high-class fillies have more in common than just their sire and their Grade I wins. Sleep Easy's dam Dokki is by Northern Dancer out of a Buckpasser mare, whereas Honest Lady's dam, Toussaud, is by El Gran Senor--a horse sired by Northern Dancer from a Buckpasser mare. Buckpasser has played a significant role in Seattle Slew's success story, with his daughters producing the graded winners Slew o'Gold, Fast Play and Serious Spender, and Buckpasser mares figure as the second dams of A.P. Indy and Anguilla, as well as Sleep Easy.

Honest Lady has every right on pedigree to be a Grade I winner. Toussaud was a smart performer in England, where she won the G3 Criterion S., and she developed into an even better performer after her transfer to trainer Bobby Frankel in California, where she won the GII Wilshire H., the GI Gamely H. and the GII American H. Another of her admirable efforts was her fourth-place finish behind Lure in the 1993 GI Breeders' Cup Mile.

Toussaud is arguably proving even more effective as a broodmare. Her first foal, the Mr. Prospector colt Chester House, rallied to finish an excellent fourth after stumbling at the start of last year's GI Breeders' Cup Classic. Honest Lady is her second foal and her third is Decarchy, a three-year-old Distant View colt who is considered an exciting prospect following his seven-length win over seven furlongs on his only appearance at two. Next comes a two-year-old colt by Gone West and a yearling colt by Woodman.

Although Frankel predicted last year that Honest Lady would "run all day long," both her graded-stakes wins have come over seven furlongs. There is no reason why she should not be as effective over a mile and 1 1/8 miles, though, especially if she continues to settle as she did in the Santa Ynez. Toussaud won at up to 1 1/8 miles and Toussaud's dam, Image of Reality, won the GII Milady H. over a mile. Toussaud's sister Navarra won the GIII Vineland H. over 1 1/8 miles and Honest Lady's half-brother Chester House stays well for a son of Mr. Prospector.

PROBLEMS FOR PLEASANT COLONY? *The Blood-Horse* on-line reports that 22-year-old stallion **Pleasant Colony** (His Majesty--Sun Colony, by Sunrise Flight) may be forced to miss the start of the breeding season due to problems related to his age. The 1981 GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness winner stands at Lane's End Farm in Versailles, Kentucky; his 2000 fee is listed at \$75,000 live foal. "It's more libido than anything else," Lane's End owner William S. Farish told *The Blood-Horse*. "When stallions get over 20, some react differently. We're working with the vets and doing some test breeding, but nothing has proved conclusive. It's a real challenge to work through it. We'll know more in a couple of weeks." A champion at three, Pleasant Colony has himself sired champions St. Jovite, Pleasant Tap and Pleasant Stage and a total of 65 stakes winners. According to *The Blood-Horse*, he was bred to 54 mares last year.

The 5-2 second choice off the three-month vacation, the gray sped right to the front, came into the stretch with a daylight lead and splashed home an impressive eight-length winner. Nasal Strips OK'd in California:

The California Horse Racing Board Friday approved the use of nasal strips for racehorses in the state. The strips will be allowed beginning Mar. 1, which will give the California tracks and the Board time to devise a plan for making the information available to the public. Horsemen will be required to indicate at the time of entry if a horse will be wearing a nasal strip.

CHRB Lends Support to Footgear Study:

The California Horse Racing Board Friday gave its support to a study of the types of shoes worn by Thoroughbreds in the state. The study, which was devised following discussions regarding a ban on front toe grabs, will correlate the style of shoes used with information on track condition as well as other factors, with the goal of reducing the number of injuries in race horses. According to the CHRB, an initial study in 1996 by the Postmortem Program of the California Veterinary Diagnostic Laboratory System at Davis suggested a connection between front toe grabs and the increased risk of catastrophic injury. The results of a second study are due to be released in 60 to 90 days. Trainers Bob Baffert and D. Wayne Lukas, the winner and runner-up, respectively, for the 1999 Eclipse Award, both spoke in support of the toe grabs in front of the CHRB Friday, but Lukas added, "If we do the final study and determine that using toes grabs truly is detrimental, you won't have to pass a rule because everyone will stop using them on their own." The final study, set to begin Apr. 1 and run for one year, is expected to be funded by Dr. Greg Ferraro's Center for Equine Health at the University of California at Davis, with likely support from the Grayson-Jockey Club Research Foundation.

The Jockey Club 2000 Fact Book Available on Line:

The Jockey Club 2000 Fact Book, a statistical guide to the Thoroughbred industry, is now available on the Internet at <http://home.jockeyclub.com>. The 1999 statistics offered in the Fact Book include the annual foal crop, number of races, gross purses, pari-mutuel handle and gross sales in all categories. Highlights include a record \$1.1 billion in purses as well as record handle of more than \$14.1 billion, up four percent from 1998. This is the second year the Fact Book, which is traditionally published during Kentucky Derby week, has been accessible on line. "We have given the on-line Fact Book a completely new look this year and continue to use the flexibility of the Internet to expand in-depth analyses and regular updates in ways which just aren't practical in any other medium," Fact Book Editor Jim Peden said.

The results of an Event Measurement Index study, commissioned by Breeders' Cup Limited, indicate that the 1999 Breeders' Cup attracted an upscale audience to Gulfstream Park. The survey, supervised by the Breeders' Cup agency SFX Sports Group and executed by Marketing/Media/Directions, Inc., polled 1,062 visitors to the track during the three-day Breeders' Cup festival and found that the average household income of those interviewed was \$94,000. Seventy-one percent were home owners, 68 percent owned one or more personal computers and 25 percent owned luxury cars. The average age of those responding was 48.3 years; 59 percent were male. Those surveyed represented 36 different states and 16 foreign countries. "The survey confirms our belief that the Breeders' Cup audience is a highly attractive one for potential sponsors," Breeders' Cup President D. G. Van Clief, Jr. said. "We plan to use these results to attract new sponsors to the Breeders' Cup and to Thoroughbred racing."

The Inglis Classic Sale reached a poignant first day finale when the one and only yearling of retired stallion Kenmare (Fr) brought A\$145,000 (£58,296), with trainer Kevin Robinson winning a dogged bidding war for the gray colt. The pioneer shuttle stallion retired three years ago at age 23, but covered two mares in 1998, one of which, Mistilite (Aus), was purchased by Bhima Stud staffer Lee Purcell for A\$1,800. The other mare missed, then Mistilite died and Purcell raised the orphan colt, weathering a run of rotten luck as another foal she owned also died. Yesterday's top price exceeded last year's \$100,000 sale topper for a half-sister to Sunline (NZ). Fueled by Saturday's successful A\$610,000 Classic race, yesterday's first session was up 51 percent on last year, with an average A\$27,972 compared with last year's A\$18,572 with a gross of A\$5,678,500. Graeme Rogerson gave A\$100,000 for a Flying Spur (Aus) filly from Broad Reach (NZ), a son of the immensely talented, but sadly subfertile Zephyr Bay (Aus).

A handsome son of an Irish Oaks winner, Beat Hollow looked a shade light on his only juvenile start, but ran out a very easy winner of a mile Yarmouth maiden in September. He handled the prevalent soft conditions in an able manner and went into many notebooks when beating subsequent winner Peacock Jewel (GB) (Rainbow Quest {USA}) by a comfortable three lengths. He is bred to stay more than 10 furlongs so the Derby trip should not herald too many problems.

DELIUS (USA), c, 3, A.P. Indy (USA)--Hot Novel (USA), by Mari's Book (USA).

Trainer: Sir Michael Stoute. Lifetime Record: 1-1-0-0, £4,630.

Despite running green on his only start, Delius, a \$500,000 half-brother to Behrens (USA) (Pleasant Colony {USA}), beat a competitive field in good style when winning a Leicester maiden over a mile in soft conditions at the end of October. Conditioned by Sir Michael Stoute, Delius should excel at distances up to 10 furlongs and will benefit further when racing on a sounder surface.

EMBRACED (GB), f, 3, Pursuit Of Love (GB)--Tromond (GB), by Lomond (USA).

Trainer: James Fanshawe. Lifetime Record: 1-1-0-0, £4,403.

An unfurnished half-sister to French Derby runner-up Nowhere To Exit (GB) (Exit to Nowhere {USA}), Embraced kept up the family tradition when showing a liking for easy conditions by comfortably landing the odds in a Nottingham maiden in early October, taking up the running approaching the final furlong and running on well for the win. She has plenty of scope and could turn out to be an Oaks prospect. It could also be suggested that she may not be tapped for speed should she be campaigned over shorter trips.

FAST TRACK (IRE), c, 3, Doyoun (Ire)--Manntika (Ire), by Kalamoun (GB).

Trainer: Sir Michael Stoute. Lifetime Record: 1-1-0-0, £3,330.

A full-brother to the Group 1 juvenile winner Manntari (Ire), Fast Track looked fit enough, although a touch backward, when making his debut in a seven-furlong maiden at Yarmouth towards the end of October. The easy underfoot conditions posed no problems for this son of Doyoun (Ire), who won in good style, and distances around a mile should suit this progressive-looking sort.

INCHLONAIG (GB), c, 3, Nashwan (USA)--Inchmurrin (Ire), by Lomond (USA).

Trainer: Saeed bin Suroor. Lifetime Record: 1-1-0-0, £166,850.

This compact half-brother to the tough Inchinor (GB) was somewhat unconsidered in the betting when making his debut, under the care of Roger Charlton, in the valuable Tattersalls Houghton Sales S. at Newmarket at the end of September. He belied his odds of 16-1 and, despite a slow start, ran on in determined style to lead well inside the final furlong for a game win. He is now with Godolphin, wintering in the Dubai sun, and may well turn out to be a live Guineas prospect.

INTERLUDE (GB), f, 3, Sadler's Wells (USA)--Starlet (GB), by Teenoso (USA).

Trainer: Sir Michael Stoute. Lifetime Record: 1-1-0-0, £3,859.

Interlude, a leggy sort, overcame a variety of problems to be successful on her only juvenile start when scoring in a mile Doncaster maiden in October. Despite a slow start and enduring traffic problems during the race, Interlude eventually won in good style and has much to look forward to in her three-year-old career. Her trainer, Sir Michael Stoute, is adept at handling the fairer sex and she may well prove to be a candidate for Classic glory at Epsom.

KALYPSO KATIE (IRE), f, 3, Fairy King (USA)--Miss Toot (GB), by Ardross (Ire).

Trainer: Jeremy Nosedo. Lifetime Record: 1-1-0-0, £3,079.

A well-developed full-sister to the very useful Kool Kat Katie (Ire), Kalypso Katie could not have impressed more on her debut in late October. The ease in which she went clear over an extended mile in the soft conditions at Windsor suggests she could well prove to be an ideal candidate for the top races at distances up to 10 furlongs. The apparent lack of quality in depth for three-year-old fillies suggests a crack at the 1000 Guineas is not out of the question.
