HORSE CHESTNUT OFFICIALLY RETIRED

Horse Chestnut (SAf) (Fort Wood--London Wall {SAf}, by Col. Pickering (SAf)), who suffered a splint and suspensory injury during a routine work at Calder Jan. 22, has been retired from racing, according to trainer Michael de Kock. "He's too nice a horse to take any chances with," de Kock said yesterday. "We'll send him to stud once he heals from his injury." The winner of his last seven races in his native South Africa, including the Triple Crown, the five-year-old was brought to the United States to prepare for the Dubai World Cup Mar. 25. As a stepping stone to that race, the chestnut was an impressive 5 1/2-length winner of the GIII Broward H. at Gulfstream Park Jan. 8 and was expected to make his next start in the Feb. 5 GI Donn H., before the injury cut short those plans. Under the supervision of Dr. Steve Selway, Horse Chestnut was transferred by van to Gulfstream Tuesday. "He had no trouble at all in shipping from Calder," de Kock continued. "He's doing fine and he won't be needing any kind of surgery." De Kock indicated that a decision on whether to stand the horse in South Africa or in the United States will be made over the course of the next two to three weeks. Horse Chestnut retires with nine wins from 10 starts and earnings of \$475,661.

A FOAL FOR SHARP CAT

Seven-time Grade I winner Sharp Cat (Storm Cat) produced her first foal yesterday at 9:40 a.m., a chest-nut filly by A.P. Indy, at Mill Ridge Farm in Lexington, Kentucky. Prince Ahmed Salman, owner of The Thoroughbred Corporation, which owned and campaigned Sharp Cat, has named the new arrival A.S. Cat, and plans to retain her for racing. Sharp Cat was a Grade I winner in each year she raced from two to four, concluding her career with an 11-length score in the 1998 GI Beldame S. at Belmont. The winner of 14 of 21 starts, she earned over \$1.9 million. She will be bred back to A.P. Indy.

Royal Highlander (Ire) (Foxhound), recently purchased by American-based Team Valor and Gary Garber for a reported \$650,000, has been turned over to John Hills in Europe for an attempt at the 2000 Guineas at Newmarket May 6, the *Daily Racing Form* reports. The winner of a Doncaster maiden in his only racetrack appearance Nov. 5, he was originally scheduled to ship to trainer Jenine Sahadi in the U.S. who was to aim the sophomore for the May 6 GIII \$100,000 added Will Rogers H. at Hollywood Park. WHAT'S DOING DOWN UNDER

INCENTIVE RACES CATCHING ON

Our infatuation with precocious two-year-olds was given full rein at Randwick Saturday with a successful third annual \$610,000 San Miguel Inglis Classic (1200m) which threw up a worthy winner in Pembleton (Marauding {NZ}). Trouble is, even if he was nominated for the nation's premier juvenile race, the \$2.5 million Golden Slipper Apr. 15, there's not an awful lot of time for him to be freshened and set for the race, and he's achieved what connections set out to do, taking home a \$300,000 first prize on revered turf.

It was interesting to note Bill Oppenheim gave the incentive race held at Newmarket in October by Tattersalls' to promote its autumn sale the thumbs up in a TDN column not so long ago, because they're absolutely all the rage here.

And without a doubt, Saturday's glamour race really set an upbeat mood for the Classic sale, as well as exposing a couple of future Group winners.

Inglis has fully embraced the concept of incentive races with the Classic, the \$1 million San Miguel Heroic Championship (1300m) at Randwick Apr. 22 for graduates of any Inglis yearling sales, a \$200,000 Scone Winter Challenge and Melbourne's \$650,000 Premier Race to be launched Australia Day 2001.

Rival company Magic Millions pioneered incentive races with its inaugural \$1 million race at the Gold Coast in 1987, won by \$22,000 yearling Snippets (Lunchtime {GB}) who is now an Australian stallion stalwart with 30-odd stakeswinners.

Now Magic Millions offers almost \$A3 million prize money with races in Perth, Tamworth in country NSW, the three-year-old Magic Millions over 1500 metres held at Rosehill last year, a \$500,000 all-aged race over 1400m and a \$A200,000 three-year-old race in Singapore.

Then there are various triple crown bonuses and a myriad of breeder bonus schemes including Victoria's SuperVOBIS scheme which will pay an estimated \$5 million with more than 800 races carrying bonuses from \$4,000 to \$30,000 per race.

In recent months there's been debate over the worthiness of incentive races with Racetrack magazine editor Peter Falconer going on the attack, pointing out that Golden Slipper winner Catbird resumed much earlier than was traditional so he could target, ultimately unsuccessfully, the inaugural \$1 million three-year-old Magic Millions race. Catbird's connections eschewed the usual early season stakes races in favour of the

Magic Millions race and the colt was winless in five attempts before the plug was pulled on an inglorious three year old campaign. "The reigning Golden Slipper champion resumes in a relatively nondescript juvenile contest run at the end of one of the bleakest weeks in the heart of a Sydney winter and is beaten out of sight by horses who won't even register on the two-year-old classifications," Falconer wrote. "Evidently the Australian racing calendar we were once so familiar with no longer has any relevance."

But while Tattersalls chairman Edmund Mahoney is lamenting English racing is hamstrung by stagnant prize money, Australia is booming. Prize money for British racing for 1999 was \$A172.39 million compared with \$A284 million here (over 22,108 races with average stakes for a city race being \$34,500) in 1998-99.

Last May, San Miguel, Inglis and the Australian Jockey Club announced a sponsorship deal that has resulted in an \$8 million Doncaster-Derby day. The purse for the G1 Galaxy (1100m), for example, has jumped from \$A350,000 to \$A1 million. The Doncaster (1600m) has risen from \$1 million to \$2.5 million, the AJC Derby from \$1.2 million to \$2 million.

Owners don't have to chase incentive riches, there's nothing to stop them pursuing a more prestigious traditional path toward black type, but for owners like Wagga Wagga couple Peter and Joanne Pascoe, who have had just three city winners in 10 years in racing, a \$300,000 first prize for their odds on favourite was the realisation of a dream. I don't think they minded that the race isn't black type, and neither did a particularly festive crowd drawn to the spectacle by astute promotion including a barrier draw at Coogee Beach.

And there's nothing to stop these horses going on to black type; the Classic sale has yielded four or five G1 winners including inaugural race winner Laurie's Lottery, while Magic Millions has yielded some worthy winners.

No Magic Millions winner has captured the Slipper and it's obviously difficult to have a juvenile peak in January then come back and earn a berth in the Slipper, keeping in mind that money earned in incentive races doesn't count in the ballot.

Anyway, the Slipper in recent years has been dominated by Easter graduates, the most elite bunch of all, with six of the last 10 Slipper winners going through the ring at Newmarket at Easter, and few people believe the Heroic race will impact on the Slipper field.

Incentive races may be scorned by the purists and count for less in terms of residual stud value than winning a classic, but for a slew of owners and racegoers they are great fun. And isn't that, ultimately, what it's all about?

The second day of Doncaster's January Sales yesterday was dominated by pinhookers looking for yearlings to re-sell later in the season. Several speculators were attracted by the Piccolo (GB) (Warning {GB}) colt offered from Lostford Manor Stud. Newmarket agent Dwayne Woods beat off the opposition, headed by John Dunlop's traveling head lad Robert Hamilton, to get this prize for 14,500gns. "He was really the only horse here today," said Woods. "He'll be coming back for the St Leger Sale." That price was beaten when Jimmy Byrne paid 16,000gns in a private sale for a Bigstone (Ire) (Last Tycoon (Ire)) filly from Dandy's Farm. Byrne had offered 15,500gns for her in the ring but she was knocked down for 500gns more to one of her partners. Her year-older Night Shift (USA) half sister made 125,000gns at the Tattersalls Houghton Sale and is in training with Roger Charlton. American Sean Magee, whose CV includes spells with Brookdale Farm and Vinery, and several years in Britain with Ted Voute, is setting up as a consignor under the Egerton Sales banner. One of his first offerings will be the Millkom (GB) (Cyrano de Bergerac) colt knocked down to him for 11,000gns, set to reappear at the St Leger Sales. "I am establishing a new all-purpose sales agency offering yearlings, two-vear-olds and broodmares," said Magee. Britain's second largest bookmaker William Hill yester-day became the first major bookmaker to offer tax-free off-shore betting via the Internet. The group's website is www.willhill.com. According to the Harness Tracks of America newsletter, takeout for William Hill's clients will be three percent, rather than the the current standard nine-percent betting tax in English betting shops and on telephone wagering. "We must reemphasize that we have taken this step because our case for reducing betting duty in the UK has, as yet, gone unanswered by the government," William Hill spokesman Graham Sharpe told the HTA. "We cannot afford to stand by and see our business ebb away."
