HOLD THE ROCKING CHAIR; STEVENS MAY

RIDE AGAIN Gary Stevens, who announced his retirement from riding just a few weeks ago, has decided to forestall his transformation to jockey agent and rehabilitate his aching knees in preparation for a return to the saddle. Speaking on The Racing Network, Stevens said, "I announced earlier in the week that I was going to become a jockey's agent, but that did not last very long. It seems like (my mind) changes every day. I've had a difficult time handling the retirement. I've been used to doing the same thing for 21 years and to have it come to a halt has been a shock to my system and difficult for me to handle." After consulting with several doctors around the country, Stevens is optimistic his arthritic knees will recover enough for him to resume his riding career and, in the meantime, he will continue working with The Thoroughbred Corporation.

CAVONNIER BACK IN TRAINING Cavonnier

(Batonnier), the oft-sidelined runner-up in the 1996 Kentucky Derby, has been returned to training yet again, this time with trainer Ron McAnally, according to Thoroughbred Times. The seven-year-old gelding had previously been trained by Bob Baffert who saddled the gray to wins in the GI Santa Anita Derby and GIII El Camino Real Derby. Cavonnier was injured in the Belmont S, and returned two years later to win the 1998 Ack Ack S. He was unplaced in four 1999 outings and was not expected to race again. To date, Cavonnier has won seven of 21 starts and has earned \$1,201,664.

SANTA CATALINA S.-GIII, \$100,000, 3yo, 1 1/16m

The Deputy (Ire) (Petardia {GB}), who defeated Promontory Gold to win the Jan. 2 Hill Rise H. in his only U.S. start, worked four furlongs yesterday in :49 4/5 around the dogs on a Santa Anita turf course labeled good. The bay colt will be making his first start on the dirt Sunday. "We're curious about how he'll handle the dirt," said trainer Jenine Sahadi. "This is not our first choice to be running against a horse like Captain Steve (Fly So Free), but we don't really have many options. He's doing really well."

High Yield (Storm Cat), second to Captain Steve in the Dec. 18 GI Hollywood Futurity last time out, drilled a bullet six furlongs in 1:12 1/5 yesterday.

Woostershear (Tabasco Cat), coming off a win in a Dec. 31 Fair Grounds allowance, worked three furlongs vesterday in :37.

FIRST FOALS FOR GOLD, SUBORDINATION

Multiple Grade I stakes winners and millionaires Formal Gold (Black Tie Affair {Ire}) and Subordination (Mt. Livermore) were represented by their first foals this week. Seven-year-old Formal Gold is the sire of a colt out of Morgan Springs (Java Gold), a stakes-placed half sister to GSW Lemhi Go, who foaled Jan. 24 at Audley Farm in Virginia. "We have a very correct colt with above average size and quality, which appears to resemble Formal Gold," said Dr. Von Lepel of Audley Farm. Six-year-old Subordination sired a filly out of stakesplaced Magic Fan (Lear Fan), born on the grounds of Gainesway Farm in Lexington, Kentucky, Jan. 25. "Subordination's foal is a good type with plenty of leg and bone. It's the kind of foal you hope to see right out of the gate in a stallion's first crop," said Michael Hernon of Gainesway. Formal Gold and Subordination are standing their second season at Gainesway for \$15,000 and \$10,000 respectively.

LUCKY ROBERTO RETIRED The 1998 GI Hopeful S. winner Lucky Roberto (Belong to Me--Roberto's Gal {GB}, by Roberto) has been retired from racing and will stand the 2000 breeding season at Gus Schoenborn, Jr.'s Contemporary Stallions in Coxsackie, New York. The stallion will be syndicated and will stand for \$5,000 live foal. In addition to his Hopeful victory, Lucky Roberto ran second in the 1998 Tremont S. and third in the 1999 GIII Swale S. He retires with three wins in 13 starts and earnings of \$214,684.

DONCASTER JANUARY SALE CLOSES QUIETLY

Doncaster's January Sales finished yesterday with a low-key auction of predominantly jumping horses in training. Looking at the sale in general, particularly the sections for flat mares and yearlings Tuesday and Wednesday, Doncaster's managing director Henry Beeby voiced concerns about the ever-increasing number of racehorses being bred. "Trade at this week's sale clearly illustrated the problems facing the industry at present and continued the trends I highlighted following last year's October Sales," he said. "Overproduction means that buyers are increasingly selective and the market mirrored sales throughout last autumn across Britain and Ireland."
