#### **READY FOR REDEMPTION?**

More Than Ready (Southern Halo) spent much of 1999 at the top of every poll, but two sub-par efforts at the end of the season left him off the list of Eclipse Award candidates. A 9 3/4-length romp in the GII Sanford S. at Saratoga left racing writers scrambling for adjectives. He returned with a game third in the GI Futurity at Belmont in September and closed out his juvenile year with a fifth in the GI Champagne S. in October. Given a freshening, the seal brown colt has been working bullets at Hialeah Park and enters the Hutcheson off a five-furlong drill in 1:00, the secondfastest time of the day. Giving away three to 10 pounds to the rest of the field, he has drawn the rail against some talented rivals, including B L's Appeal (Valid Appeal) and American Bullet (Jolie's Halo). This duo fought it out in the six-furlong GIII Spectacular Bid S. over this strip Jan. 5, with B L's Appeal holding off the late charge of American Bullet by a head. Advanced Edition (Bertrando), second in the Hawthorne Juvenile S. in November, cuts back to seven furlongs after placing second in a two-turn Gulfstream allowance Jan. 15. The Kentucky-bred has done his best running on the front end, a definite advantage on the speed-favoring Gulfstream surface. Summer Note (Notebook), unchallenged in two starts at Hawthorne as a juvenile, including a 5 3/4-length allowance score Dec. 12, gets Lasix for his stakes debut.

### **JAG VS. GOLD: ROUND FIVE**

With the retirement of 1999 champion sprinter Artax and the uncertain status of 1998 champion sprinter Reraise, the fifth meeting between Big Jag (Kleven) and Kona Gold (Java Gold) takes on added significance. A victory by either runner will give him first crack at being leading sprinter. The two geldings have met four times in their careers, splitting the decisions. In their most recent encounter, they chased home Artax in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint when that runner equaled the track record at Gulfstream. Kona Gold finished 2 3/4 lengths ahead of Big Jag that day and returns for the first time since that effort. In the first round of their rivalry, he was beaten a head by Big Jag in last year's renewal of the Palos Verdes. Kona Gold, second in four of his five 1999 starts, was scheduled to make his 2000 debut in the El Conejo H. Jan. 2 at Santa Anita, but scratched out due to an unfavorable weight assignment. Big Jag closed out his season with a trip to Hong Kong, finishing third in the listed Hong Kong Sprint at Sha Tin Dec. 12, a race which marked his turf debut. "It's going to be some kind of horse race," said Bruce Headley, trainer of Kona Gold. "It's great to see this horse and Big Jag hold their form for so long. It's a great rivalry, and they're the best sprinters anywhere." The late-closing Big Jag should have a fast pace to run at, with the speedy Freespool (Geiger Counter) and Kona Gold up front. Freespool led every step when capturing the El Conejo H., but will have to outgun Kona Gold from his rail post. Old Topper (Gilded Time) returned from nearly a year off to finish third in the El Conjejo, and shows two strong works since that outing. The five-year-old landed the GIII Pat O'Brien H. at Del Mar as a sophomore.

Highweight Captain Steve zipped five furlongs in 1:00 4/5 over a good main track Wednesday at Santa Anita. He was originally scheduled to work Tuesday, but rain forced the change of plans. "I didn't want to move the work up to Monday, because it was too close to his last work," said trainer Bob Baffert. "So we waited until Wednesday, and it went fine. He's ready." High Yield, hero of the GI Hopeful at Saratoga and second last out to Captain Steve in the GI Hollywood Futurity, will sport blinkers for the first time. The Deputy, winner last out of the Hill Rise S. on the Santa Anita lawn, will make his first start on dirt in the Santa Catalina. Hasty Kris may still scratch out of this 1 1/16-mile test, according to trainer John Sadler.

### O'Brien Nominates Seven to American Classics:

Leading Irish trainer Aidan O'Brien has nominated seven three-year-olds to the 2000 Triple Crown, according to the *Thoroughbred Times On-Line*. The septet is headed by G1 Prix de la Salamandre winner **Giant's Causeway** (Storm Cat), currently second favorite for the G1 2000 Guineas. Unbeaten Giant's Causeway the first foal of multiple graded stakes winner Mariah's Storm (Rahy). The other nominees from Ballydoyle are **Mull of Kintyre** (Danzig), G2 winner and fourth in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile; **Brahms** (Danzig), multiple G1-placed and seventh in the Breeders' Cup; **Bach (Ire)** (Caerleon), listed winner; **Bernstein** (Storm Cat), G3 winner; **Rossini** (Miswaki), multiple group winner; and **Asanovo** (Nureyev), third in the G3 Norfolk S.

Fair Grounds will offer future wagers on the 126th Kentucky Derby on three separate weekends beginning next month. Each weekend will consist of a separate pool. The Kentucky Derby Future Wager is a \$2 minimum wager which is a win bet only. The field of horses in each pool consists of 24 betting interests, which include 23 horses and a 24th interest that is a mutuel field that contains all other three-year-old Thoroughbreds. The first pool kicks off Feb. 17-20, the weekend of the Risen Star S. The second pool is slated for Mar. 9-12, with the final day corresponding with the GII Louisiana Derby. The third pool will be held Apr. 13-16. Wagering in each of the pools begins at 11 a.m. CST Thursday, and concludes 3:30 p.m. Sunday.

### **Executives Depart NTRA:**

Two executives will be leaving the National Thoroughbred Racing Association soon, various sources reported yesterday. Joseph Bailey III, NTRA deputy commissioner and chief operating officer, will leave to return to Russell Reynolds Associates, where he worked prior to joining the NTRA. Robert Garry, senior vice president for finance and administration, has declined an offer from the NTRA to relocate to Lexington from New York. ### **BOOKMAKERS SHOW REDUCED TAX WORTH BILLIONS**

British bookmakers yesterday reiterated their calls for the government to rapidly reduce the rate of betting duty, claiming that there will be job losses unless there is a cut from 6.75 to three percent because of the growth in off-shore tax-free betting. They have sent the Treasury independently commissioned reports that show that a three percent rate of duty could generate between £5 billion and £15 billion in additional turnover for UK bookmakers.

Representatives of the Thoroughbred industry in Co Kildare, Ireland's principal equestrian county, have made a submission to the Bord Pleanala Oral Hearing to protest against a proposed toxic waste incinerator in Kilcock, close to several stud farms. Shane Dolan, representing the Kildare Horse Development Company, told the hearing, "The proposed site, like almost every other part of Kildare, is close to stud farms of major international importance. The incinerator is an issue, not simply for its immediate environs, but one of countrywide importance. If even one breeding establishment in the vicinity of the incinerator site had to close or relocate because of the proposed development, there would be a 'domino effect' on the other establishments in the county."
