HEATING UP IN THE HUTCHESON

Racing fans got their money's worth as More Than Ready (Southern Halo) and Summer Note (Notebook) came to wire together in a swiftly run Hutcheson. More Than Ready, top-ranked juvenile for much of 1999, went to the sidelines after a fifth in the GI Champagne and returned with a game effort here in his three-yearold bow, while Summer Note, unbeaten in two starts at Hawthorne, answered the graded stakes question in his first try. Breaking from the rail, jockey John Velazquez was forced to send More Than Ready from the start, where he was joined immediately by Summer Note. The pair opened up on the field, and after six furlongs in 1:09, the Southern Halo colt held a length advantage. In the final furlong, however, Summer Note inched closer until they were on even terms. The final time of 1:21 3/5 was the fastest seven furlongs thus far of the Gulfstream meet. "I'm delighted with his (More Than Ready's) race," said trainer Todd Pletcher. "My horse was coming off a hundred and something-day layoff. He was giving that other horse (Summer Note) 10 pounds, and that horse is obviously a very nice horse. I couldn't be more pleased." John Velazquez was not quite as upbeat: "He ran good, but he really ran green, I guess because he hadn't run in so long," he said. "I thought we got beat." The connections of Summer Note were thrilled with their colt's performance. "He won it in racehorse time, so that says something," said winning trainer Randy Morse. "He hasn't started in a couple of months and he was stepping up in company and running against a graded winner. I think he should improve off this race. This is a real nice horse, and I've never had a three-year-old like him before. I'd like to run him in the Fountain of Youth S. next because I think he'll get the distance."

WESTERN ROAD TO LOUISVILLE STARTS

HERE California's series of prep races to the Triple Crown will kick off with the Santa Catalina, the first graded route for newly turned three-year-olds. Captain Steve (Fly So Free) closed out his juvenile season with daylight victories in the GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. at Churchill and the GI Hollywood Futurity, and was weighted at 125 pounds on the Experimental Free Handicap, one pound below Eclipse champion Anees. Mike Pegram's colorbearer stormed home by four lengths over High Yield (Storm Cat) in the Hollywood Futurity, stamping him as one of the top contenders for the Run for the Roses. Before that, he was an impressive 5 1/2length winner of the GII Kentucky Jockey Club, with 7-5 favorite High Yield 10 1/4 lengths back in sixth. High Yield did win the GI Hopeful S. Sept. 4 at Saratoga, but that was the last time he visited the winner's circle. The Deputy (Ire) (Petardia {GB}) had a first, second and three thirds in five British starts, and trainer Jenine Sahadi captured the Hill Rise H. on the turf with him Jan. 2 in his U.S. debut. This will be his first try on dirt and first test past a mile.

Kona Gold was last seen doing what he does well, finishing second in a big race. He was second to Sprint Champion Artax in the Breeders' Cup Sprint Nov. 6, his fourth consecutive runner-up finish in a graded stake. His last win was way back on Jan. 3, 1999, when he downed Big Jag in the El Conejo H. Seconds to that rival in last vear's GII Palos Verdes H. and GII San Carlos H. led to an extended seven-month layoff, and he came back second again, this time to Lexicon, in the GII Ancient Title H. Oct. 17, his last race before the Breeers' Cup. This year's El Conejo winner, Freespool, took the field through fractions of 21 4/5, 44 1/5 and 56 1/5 for five furlongs, chased by Kona Gold on the rail and Big Jag on the outside. Kona Gold proved his worth here, collaring the leader at the eighth pole and drawing off to a two-length win as the field finished in odds order. "I was fortunate today that I got to save ground," said winning rider Alex Solis. "I was concerned about letting Freespool get away because he can be very tough to catch." Trainer Bruce Headley said that Santa Anita's GII \$150,000 San Carlos H. at seven furlongs March 4 may be next for his six-year-old. Tim Pinfield, who conditions runner-up Big Jag, has the same race in his sights. "The San Carlos is seven furlongs and I think that will only help him anyway."

Nakatani will be the new rider for Greenwood Lake (Meadowlake), the early winter-book favorite for the Kentucky Derby, trainer Nick Zito announced yesterday. He replaces Jean-Luc Samyn, who was two-for-four aboard the colt, with victories in the GI Champagne S. and the GII Remsen S. Samyn most recently rode Greenwood Lake to a sixth-place finish in the colt's 2000 debut, the Jan. 15 GIII Holy Bull S. at Gulfstream. The three-year-old is scheduled to make his next start in the GI Fountain of Youth S. Feb. 19 at Gulfstream. "Obviously, the change is not due to anything Jean-Luc Samyn has done wrong," said Zito. "Samyn is a top rider. We just had the chance to obtain the services of one of America's premier jockeys, and part of the reason for the change is that we are looking in terms of what's down the road." Nakatani is currently enjoying a comfortable lead in the Santa Anita jockey standings.

DARK HORSES FOR 2000--Part 1

French-trained horses enjoyed a highly successful 1999 with Montjeu (Ire) (Sadler's Wells {USA}), trained by John Hammond, topping the International Classifications and Alain de Royer-Dupre's Sendawar (Ire) (Priolo {USA}) joint-top of the milers' ratings, four pounds ahead of the Andre Fabre-trained Dansili (GB) (Danehill {USA}). Montieu had won the Listed Prix Isonomy as a two-year-old and thus had made a start on his rise to the top. Sendawar and Dansili, on the other hand, sprung from relative obscurity to become leading lights of their generation. This season will see the likes of young trainers Richard Gibson and Carlos Laffon-Parias looking forward to their star fillies Lady Of Chad (Ire) (Last Tycoon {Ire}), winner of the G1 Prix Marcel Boussac, and Goldamix (Ire) (Linamix (Fr)), winner of the G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud, fulfilling the potential they showed as two-year-olds. In a strong division of fillies, Morning Pride (Ire) (Machiavellian {USA}) will seek to justify her position near the head of the antepost betting for the 1000 Guineas, despite her injuryshortened two-year-old campaign. But what of those individuals who didn't make their mark in the higher class races? Which horses will emerge from the shadows to follow in the path of the likes of Sendawar? Here is a list of 12 dark horses who were trained in France last year and may have that bit of extra spark to go on to better things:

BINTALREEF (USA), f, 3, Diesis (GB)--Solar Star (USA), by Lear Fan (USA). Trainer: Saeed bin Suroor. Lifetime Record: 1-1-0-0, FF90,000.

A product from Godolphin's first season with a French-based juvenile team, Bintalreef was highly impressive on her only start at Deauville in October when trained by David Loder. She led from the gate and was only asked for her effort approaching the final furlong. She responded to her task with enthusiasm and readily quickened clear for a six-length win. This half-sister to Solar Bound (USA) (Boundary {USA}) has a pedigree which suggests she will find a mile, or thereabouts, her optimum trip.

DUBAI TWO THOUSAND (GB), c, 3, Nashwan (USA)--Queen's View (Fr), by Lomond (USA). Trainer: Saeed bin Suroor. Lifetime Record: 1-1-0-0, FF90,000.

He arrived at the racecourse for the first time with a tall home reputation when contesting a Class B conditions event at Longchamp Oct. 10 and showed grit and determination to succeed by a head. In mitigation, he had to make his own pace and was clearly not at ease on the very soft ground. He will almost certainly benefit with come-from-behind tactics and can show greater potential on a sounder surface. Originally trained by David Loder, he may well turn into a possible for the Epsom Derby come June.

HIDALGUIA (IRE), f, 3, Barathea (Ire)--Halesia (USA), by Chief's Crown (USA). Trainer: Jean de Roualle. Lifetime Record: 1-1-0-0, FF90,000.

Hidalguia is another who raced only once as a juvenile and was impressive when winning by an easy 1½ lengths over nine furlongs at Longchamp in October. Hidalguia is trained by Jean de Roualle who, at this time last year, had the promising Comillas (Fr) (Kaldoun {Fr}) in his care. She is the daughter of the multiple-group race winner Halesia and could progress into a worthy performer at distances around 10 furlongs.

INDIAN PROSPECTOR (FR), c, 3, Machiavellian (USA)--Danse Indienne (USA), by Green Dancer (USA). Trainer: Andre Fabre. Lifetime Record: 1-1-0-0, FF80,000.

No dark-horse list would be complete unless it contained at least one trained by Andre Fabre. The champion trainer introduced Indian Prospector to the unsuspecting public at Maisons-Laffitte as the season was winding down in November. This half-brother to the G3 winner and G1-placed Indian Danehill (Ire) (Danehill {USA}) showed he knew his job well when striding clear from the two-furlong marker to record an impressive 2½-length win. If he has progressed as well as his half-brother did over the winter months, he will certainly be one to watch when contesting the early-season mile races.

KUTUB (IRE), c, 3, In The Wings (GB)--Minnie Habit (Ire), by Habitat (USA). Trainer: Freddie Head. Lifetime Record: 1-1-0-0, FF90,000.

He made his debut, and only start, in the Prix Sablonville at Longchamp Oct. 7 in soft conditions and won in clever fashion by a length. This particular race has produced winners such as Sendawar and Croco Rouge (Ire) (Rainbow Quest {USA}) in the past, and if wintering well, Kutub could prove to be another good name to add to the list. He could prove best at distances around 10 furlongs.

MEMORY MAKER (IRE), c, 3, Lure (USA)--Moonlight Dance (USA), by Alysheba (USA). Trainer: Andre Fabre. Lifetime Record: 1-1-0-0, FF90,000.

Memory Maker is another trained by Andre Fabre and is a son of the multiple-G1 winning Moonlight Dance. He made his debut in a Class B conditions race over a mile, in heavy conditions, at Saint-Cloud Nov. 9, and arrived at the course with the high hopes of both connections and punters. He was sent off the odds-on favorite and did not let his supporters down as he quickened clear of his opponents for an impressive success. He may lack the necessary stamina to stay 1½ miles, but he should make his mark at races around 10 furlongs.

Tomorrow: Six More to Watch
