MILLENNIUM YEARLING SALES BEGINS

New Zealand's Millennium Yearling Sales get underway today at Karaka, just outside Auckland. The sale features 49 lots from Australasian champion sire Zabeel (NZ) as well as the first New Zealand crop of European racetrack stars such as Carnegie (Ire), Pentire (GB) and Rodrigo de Triano. International sires like Bluebird, Danehill, Thunder Gulch and Woodman should make for a world-class sale. Australians are expected to be the strongest bidding force, but there will also be a number of buyers from Hong Kong, Singapore, Malaysia, Macau, England, Japan and South Africa to compete with the local bench. Potential sales toppers include a Zabeel--Diamond Lover (Aus) colt offered by Patrick Hogan's Cambridge Stud. The colt is by New Zealand's champion sire and from a Group 1-winning daughter of Eight Carat (GB), the dam of five Group 1 winners, including Octagonal (NZ), whose first crop of yearlings are also on offer. Another lot likely to feature among the top sellers is the Nureyev--A Goodlookin Broad colt offered by The Oaks Stud. The colt is the first Nureyev ever to go up for auction in New Zealand. Last year, the Premier Sale grossed NZ\$37,062,500, an average of NZ\$94,067 for the 394 lots sold. The top-price was NZ\$850,000, paid by Bart Cummings for a Danehill--Taareeck (Aus) filly. The previous year the sale saw the highest priced yearling ever sold in Australasia go through the ring when a Zabeel--Eight Carat (GB) colt sold for NZ\$1.6 million. The premier sale runs through Thursday, and is followed by the Colts Sale Feb. 4, Fillies Sale Feb. 6, Festival Select Sale Feb. 7-8 and Festival Sale Feb. 8.

Second Coming got the second Group 1 win he had just missed when a close second to Able Master (NZ) in the Jan. 3 Auckland Cup. The five-year-old got trapped three-wide mid-race this time, but jockey Michael Coleman chose to push forward and took the lead with about 2000 meters to run. Eventual runner-up McDa Knife went by with about 1200 meters to go, but Coleman knew he still had a lot of horse under him and put the race away as they turned for home. Mike Moroney, who trains the gelding in partnership with Andrew Scott, was quick to heap praise on the jockey. "It was an intelligent ride on the most intelligent horse I've ever trained," he said. Second Coming, who won the 1997 Victoria Derby at Flemington, will be rested and prepared for a third tilt at the Melbourne Cup in November. He finished seventh in the race in 1999.

She was trapped for a long time down the long Trent-ham straight, but when she found running room, Pace Invader made it clear that this was her Thordon Mile and posted her second Group 1 win. She looked very classy last season, winning the New Zealand 1000 Guineas, but it wasn't until her most recent start, which she won by two lengths, that she showed her best this campaign. Trainer Alvin Clark plans to take her to Australia, with the Apr. 22 AJC Doncaster H. the main objective. Pace Invader's dam Grey Invader won the 1989 Hong Kong Cup and was a multiple Group 1 place-getter in New Zealand and Australia.

"He's a likeable horse and I think he will get better next year," said trainer John Hills after he had sent out The Deputy to win an ordinary maiden race at Epsom last September.

This comment is proving to be a typical piece of British understatement. Hills himself went very close to landing a very big prize with The Deputy when he returned the colt to the track just five days later for the £200,000 St Leger Yearling S., a race confined to horses sold at the Doncaster St Leger Yearling Sales. The Deputy was unlucky not to take the first prize of over £150,000, failing by two short heads to snatch victory after being squeezed out early in the race.

Now the Irish-bred son of Petardia appears to have made enormous progress in the warmth of California, where he has won his first two starts for Jenine Sahadi. He inflicted the only defeat of Promontory Gold's three-race career in the Hill Rise H. on turf and then made a highly successful switch to the main track in the GII Santa Catalina S., in which he defeated High Yield and Captain Steve, two colts who ranked among the top nine males on the Experimental Free Handicap.

The Deputy's defeat of these highly accomplished American colts is all the more surprising because he was produced very cheaply in Ireland. His dam, Manfath, was culled from Hamdan Al Maktoum's operation for only 4,200 guineas at Tattersalls' 1994 December Sales, and he is the result of Manfath's mating with Petardia, a stallion who commanded a fee of IR£2,500 in 1996. When The Deputy was sold by breeder John McEnery as a yearling, he realised only 14,000 guineas.

As so often, though, there is another dimension to The Deputy's background. The mere fact that his dam was bred by Shadwell Estate Co. tells us that he comes from a very good female line. His fourth dam, Khazaeen, was a half-sister to Runaway Bride, the dam of Blushing Groom, and no fewer than three of Khazaeen's daughters produced important winners. Beaming Bride is well known in North America as the dam of Simply Majestic, Alwuhush and Husband, while Kazadancoa is the dam of the graded winners Jacodra, Jacodra's Devil and Changing Ways, as well as being the second dam of the Kentucky Derby runner-up Tejano Run.

The Deputy's links to Khazaeen are through her third successful broodmare daughter, The Dancer. This sister to Kazadancoa was good enough to finish third in the G1 Oaks and went on to produce the listed winners Mack The Knife, Pilot Bird and Pretty Lady. Pilot Bird became a stakes winner over 1 1/2 miles on her three-year-old debut and she was bought by Shadwell for 250,000 guineas at the end of the season. As Pilot Bird was bred to stay very well (her sire, the Derby winner Blakeney, was once second over 2 1/2 miles), she was mated mainly with sprinter milers, such as Manfath's sire Last Tycoon. Manfath, though, possessed very little speed and ended her career racing over two miles.

Manfath's new owner has continued to try to inject speed into her and his choice of the good-looking Petardia was obviously a very good one. Petardia was bred for speed, with the sprinters Petong and Mummy's Pet as his sire and broodmare sire. This speed became apparent very early in Petardia's career, when he won the G3 Coventry S. over six furlongs at Royal Ascot, and he collected a second important prize in the G2 Laurent-Perrier Champagne S. over seven furlongs. He also ran well when fourth in the G1 2000 Guineas. The Deputy is his third group or graded winner, following the 1997 juvenile Group 3 winners Halmahera and Name of Love, from his first three crops.

NEW FILLY AT PHILLY PARK When trainer Donald Reeder recently bought **Speak Compelling** (Compelling Sound) for owners Linda and William Gallagher, he had no idea he was getting two for the price of one. The three-year-old filly was purchased from Randy Bradshaw, assistant to trainer D. Wayne Lukas, who had himself bid \$7,500 for the Maryland-bred bay at the 1998 Fasig-Tipton Maryland October Yearling Sale. **Speak Compelling** had been out three times in California last fall, running third once against maiden claimers, and Reeder had started her just once. He was disappointed with her distant eighth-place finish against \$25,000 maiden claimers at Philadelphia Park Jan. 19. "I couldn't get any muscle tone built up in her hips," he said. "She wasn't tucking up." Reeder discovered the reason for the filly's weight problem when he arrived at the barn yesterday morning to find she had given birth overnight. "Fortunately for her, I wasn't able to put her to harder training because of the bad weather," he said. Both mother and baby, a dark bay filly, are doing fine and were shipped to a farm in Concordville, Pennsylvania yesterday. The new arrival seems a total surprise to both the new owners and the old, and the sire of the foal is still a mystery.

OBS-CALDER PREVIEW SET FOR TODAY The 260 juveniles catalogued for the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's Annual Selected Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Training will be on the track today for the Under Tack Show Preview at Calder Race Course in Florida. The preview gets underway at 10:30 a.m.; it will also be taped and shown via satellite on the DISH Network's Channel 901 on Thursday, Feb. 3 at 10 p.m. EST. The sale's regular Under Tack Show will be held Sunday, Feb. 6. The results of both shows will be available on the OBS website at www.obssales.com approximately one hour after the conclusion of each event. The sale is set for Tuesday, Feb. 8, with bidding beginning at 10:30 a.m.

MORE THAN READY ON FENCE FOR FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH Trainer Todd Pletcher said yesterday that while **More Than Ready** (Southern Halo) came back from his hard-fought dead-heat win in Saturday's GI Hutcheson S. in good order, a return engagement in the Feb. 19 GI Fountain of Youth S. at Gulfstream Park is still up in the air. "I was very pleased with his race in the Hutcheson, but it was a hard race and the Fountain of Youth in three weeks may be a little bit quick to bring him back," Pletcher said. "I think I'm going to play it by ear for a while and let him tell me when he's ready to go again."

MUTUEL PROBLEM CANCELS SUFFOLK CARD Live racing was called off after the second race at Suffolk Downs Monday because of problems with the pari-mutuel system. "The system was inadvertently switched into a refund mode and we couldn't recover from it," Chief Operating Officer Robert O'Malley explained. "We're examining the nature of the problem so it won't happen again. We fully expect to have things up and running when live racing resumes on Wednesday." The Massachusetts track was able to issue refunds for wagers made on the balance of Monday's program. Simulcasting continued without interruption.

Illinois Thoroughbred Handle Shows Slight Gain:

The total handle on Thoroughbred racing in Illinois showed a small increase last year, rising 1.87 percent, from \$676,659,865 in 1998 to \$689,292,456 in 1999. Wagering on Illinois racing in-state was off 7.67 percent, but the simulcast handle grew 6.21 percent and the out-of-state handle on Illinois programs rose .63 percent. The ratio of live racing, which was 44 percent when Arlington International was last open in 1997 and dropped to 31 percent last year, showed another decline last season at 28 percent.

Cecil Calls For Later Derby:

Nine-time champion trainer Henry Cecil yesterday called for the G1 Vodafone Derby to be run later in the season. Writing for kickon.com, Cecil, who has saddled four winners of the premier classic--most of any active trainers--said that he believed many horses were not ready for the race at its present date. The race is generally run on the first Saturday in June. "If we had another three weeks, we wouldn't be forcing animals like we are currently and the end product would be far better. The BHB would have to reorganize a lot of major races, but I think with our winters, we are pushing the breed and it is becoming more backward. If you had another three weeks you would give a late-maturing Derby horse more chance. If we give them more time, in the end we'll have a better horse. The breed is getting slower and we are losing a lot of the really precocious blood; it's not there anymore. If we moved the Derby to a later date, I think we'd probably get a better result."

Sponsors Withdrawl Wake-Up Call to BHB:

The British Horseracing Board yesterday stated that attracting younger racegoers was a priority, following the news the day before that the sport's longest-standing sponsor, the drinks and leisure group Whitbread, was pulling out of racing. Whitbread said that horse race sponsorship was no longer relevant to its target market of 18 to 24-year-olds. Teresa Cash, the BHB's marketing consultant, said yesterday, "It is always sad to see such generous and long-serving sponsors leave the sport. The BHB can only comment on Whitbread's reported reasons which suggests they believe that racing cannot currently deliver the young audience they are now seeking. The BHB's own recently published independent study identifies this younger audience as a key target in order to promote racing's value to sponsors and TV. Whitbread's decision reinforces the need for precisely the sort of urgent action which the recent welcome news of the Levy Board's intention to fund marketing to £10 million over three years now makes possible."
