#### DONN-DY DOZEN READY FOR SATURDAY

The NTRA on FOX Champions Series kicks off with a balanced field of 12 handicap horses going postward in the East Coast's first Grade I of the new year, the Donn H. at Gulfstream Park. The field is headed by 121-pound highweight and 1999 Donn runner-up Behrens (Pleasant Colony), who had his final race preparation yesterday, working five furlongs in 1:02 in company with stablemate and fellow race entrant Pleasant Breeze (Pleasant Tap), who got his five furlongs in 1:03. Trainer Jim Bond will run only one of the two Saturday. Godolphin's 1999 G1 Dubai World Cup hero Almutawakel (GB) (Machiavellian) makes his first start for trainer Mark Hennig. The five-year-old was given a brief rest at Shadwell Farm following his fifth-place finish in the Breeders' Cup Classic, but has trained forwardly at Payson Park for his return. Newly chosen Eclipse owner Frank Stronach is represented in the Donn by Golden Missile (A.P. Indy), who loomed a serious threat deep into the stretch of the Classic in his most recent effort, but weakened slightly to finish third at 75-1. Joining the Florida handicap division for the first time is a trio of prominent 1999 three-year-olds, including GII Galleryfurniture.com winner Stephen Got Even (A.P. Indy), GII Peter Pan winner Best of Luck (Broad Brush) and GIII Flamingo winner First American (Quiet American). Rock and Roll (Cure the Blues) drew the outside post and will run only if the track comes up wet. Post time is set for 4:42 p.m. EST.

#### RECORD SHATTERED IN NEW ZEALAND

Southern Hemisphere record books were rewritten vesterday when a yearling colt by Zabeel (NZ)--Diamond Lover (Aus) (Sticks and Stones (Aus)) was hammered down for a whopping NZ\$3.6 million after a heated bidding war during the second session of New Zealand Bloodstock's Premier Yearling Sale. Out of the 1987 G1 ARC Railway H. winner, herself a half-sister to multiple champion Octagonal (NZ) (Zabeel), the bay colt was purchased by Eduardo Cojuangco's Gooree Stud from the consignment of Cambridge Stud. He broke the previous record of NZ\$1.6 million, given in 1998 for a colt by Zabeel (NZ)--Eight Carat (GB), a three-parts brother to this offering. Cojuangco, a native of the Phillippines, operates Gooree Stud in New South Wales, and outbid His Excellency Nasser Lootah, the Dubai-based owner of Emirates Park Stud. The 30 yearlings by Zabeel have sold thus far for an average of \$356,000. The session's next-highest priced lot went through the ring a bit earlier, when hip 222, a colt by Nureyev--A Goodlooking Broad (Broad Brush) brought a final bid of \$850,000 from Peter Maher of Melbourne, from the consignement of The Oaks. The seven-year-old Illinois-bred mare won four races, including the 1995 Illinois Oaks and was a nose second in the GIII Arlington Heights Oaks that year. The two-day average has climbed to \$122,189 with the aggregate in excess of \$35 million, an increase of over 85 percent against last year's figures. The last of three preferred sessions is on tap for today. (Top Colts and Fillies, p2)

Marley Vale, winner of the GI Test S. last summer, was nosed out of a victory in the Jan. 12 GIII First Lady H. while making her first start in two months. Favored here, the bay filly sat just off the pacesetters, ranged up four wide into the stretch and edged clear late. "I didn't like her giving up the ground when she went wide, but she's the type of filly that's not going to relax for you in behind horses, so I thought (jockey) John (Velazquez) did the right thing," commented winning trainer Todd Pletcher. "I'd love to be able to run her here at Gulfstream one more time, because she likes the track so much here. But there's nothing for her unless I stretch her out and I don't want to do that." Second choice Hurricane Bertie (Storm Boot) raced with the pace early, but tired to fourth.

#### TATTERSALLS FEBRUARY SALE ON TAP

Tattersalls opens for business two months earlier than normal today for its new February Sales at Newmarket. The 260-lot mixed catalogue features mares, yearlings and two-year-olds. #### LEVY BOARD APPOINTS MARKETING EXECUTIVES

The Horserace Betting Levy Board yesterday announced the names of the three marketing executives who will be responsible for developing the detailed marketing plan for racing and betting. There is one each from the British Horseracing Board, the Betting Industry and the Levy Board. The Levy Board-appointed Don Stewart will act as the coordinator to ensure a balance is achieved. The BHB has handed the role to Teresa Cash, who will be responsible for the Racing Industry's input. Andy Walder, Marketing & Development Director at Ladbrokes, has been chosen by the Betting Industry for the initial development of its part of the marketing plan. The planned timescale is that the three marketing experts, helped by the Levy Board's Marketing Sub-Committee chaired by Sir John Robb, will have a detailed plan in place by the end of April. Sir John Robb, who is also Deputy Chairman of the Levy Board and last month outlined the Levy Board's marketing strategy, said: "I am delighted that the appointments of these talented marketing consultants have been made and look forward to them putting together an effective marketing plan, which will provide a major boost to racing and betting over the next three years."

#### **RACE-FIXING TRIAL CONTINUES**

Former leading jump jockey Jamie Osborne, who is now a trainer, appeared yesterday as a witness in an Old Bailey court case and denied being involved in race fixing or making money from bent races. Osborne, 32, is giving evidence against private detective Robert Harrington, who has pleaded not guilty to trying to extort £500 from him by deception and a further £2,000 to bribe a detective. He was also asked about a £20,000 bribe he had turned down when he was 19 to stop two favorites at the Cheltenham Festival and named former jockey Dermot Browne as the man who had made the offer. He said: "This is the first time I have named this man in public. He was a good rider and someone I looked up to." Osborne said he had decided to name Browne because he was answering questions under oath. He earlier told the court that he believed Brian Wright, someone he had never met, was actually behind the offer.

## AN AMERICAN IN NEWMARKET by Martin Pearce

American horsemen tend to arrive in Newmarket, the H.Q. of racing and breeding in Britain, attend the racing and the sales, look around the stud farms, inspect the bloodstock, renew old acquaintances and then head home.

But not 37-year-old Marylander Sean Magee, who is here for the 'long haul,' as they say. He has made the decision to accept an offer from the owners of Egerton Stud to become the Sales Director of Egerton Sales Agency, which makes its sales debut at Tattersalls today and which has given him his first step into 'hands-on' management.

Magee's family hails from County Wicklow in Ireland. His parents emigrated to America in the late 1950s and his father Noel became a trainer in America, then managed various stud farms, notably Liz Tippett's Langolden Farm. Although now semi-retired, Noel still has some horses under his care at the family home in Timonium, Maryland.

Having worked with his father for many years, Magee junior first branched out on his own as a public trainer at Delaware Park racetrack, but it was not long before he was heavily involved in the preparation of horses for public auction.

He has certainly had a first-rate education in the business, having spent several years managing the sales barns at the major auctions in America for Fred Seitz's Brookdale Farm and Ben Walden's Vinery, working with Nick de Meric at the Ocala two-year-olds in training sales in Florida, and, most recently, helping out well-known English sales agent Ted Voute at the major auctions in Europe.

He has particularly good memories of working with Seitz. "He was always meticulous in his attention to detail and I learned a lot from him," he said. "I also enjoyed working with Vinery's sales manager Kitty Taylor at the Keeneland Sales. Both were totally professional and buyer friendly, making the looking and choosing experience for buyers as enjoyable as possible."

Egerton Sales Agency, which has 14 lots catalogued at today's sale, operates out of the world-famous Egerton Stud on the outskirts of Newmarket. The stud's owners have given Magee their full backing, both financially and operationally, giving the agency full use of the stud's boxes, equipment and staff, but at the same time enabling it to operate almost autonomously.

Magee first became involved with Egerton when Ted Voute's agency sold four mares for the stud's previous owner, Count Federico Zichy-Thyssen, at the 1996 Tattersalls December Sales and foals out of those mares at the yearling sales the following year. Only recently he was more personally involved with business at Egerton, playing a major role in the negotiations which brought the 1991 GI Breeders' Cup Mile winner Opening Verse from Maryland to stand at the stud this year, the first winner of that turf event to stand in Britain.

Although he now lives at Egerton, Magee still has a home in Maryland and he fully intends to maintain his American connections.

"I'll try and bring horses over which might fit better here in Europe," he said, "especially those with European-type pedigrees. I also think the American interest in buying horses in Europe is growing, especially at the horses-in-training sales."

Magee's aim is to provide vendors and buyers with the best possible agency service, one which appraises the horses and then positions them in their best possible market.

"Good horses sell themselves. I aim to gain the less obvious horses more attention and get them sold.

"I have major advantages in having the use of great facilities at Egerton and its close proximity to Newmarket. I also love the variety, tradition and ambience of the racing and breeding scene here in Britain. It is unique."
