NEW MARKS FOR NEW ZEALAND SALE

History was made as the New Zealand Bloodstock Limited's 2000 Premier Sale at Karaka concluded yesterday after setting records for average, aggregate and for a yearling sold at auction in Australasia. The average for the three-day sale was a record NZ\$128,013, up 36 percent from last year, while the aggregate rose an eye-catching 49 percent to NZ\$55,173,500 and the median was up 21 percent to NZ\$72,500. The clearance rate was better than 87 percent. After the electricity generated by the bidding duel for Wednesday's record-smashing NZ\$3.6 million Zabeel (NZ) colt, the stallion was in the spotlight once again yesterday as trainer Bart Cummings outbid Dr. Alan Bell, agent for Gary Moore of Sydney, for the NZ\$1.5 million session topper. The colt, by Zabeel out of the unraced mare Foreign Copy (NZ) (Bold Venture {NZ}), is a full brother to G1 Adelaide Cup hero Cronus (NZ) and the G1 New Zealand Oaks runner-up Pravda (NZ). He was consigned by Esker Lodge. Yesterday's session also saw Zabeel take honors as the sire of the top-priced filly at the sale, with his daughter from the G1 New Zealand 1000 Guineas winner Merry Maiden (NZ) (Crested Wave) bringing NZ\$650,000. Consigned by Windsor Park Stud, the good-looking yearling was purchased by Kieran Moore, a bloodstock agent from New South Wales.

Kudos in Karaka...

After going home with the sales topper, Eduardo Cojuangco's Gooree Stud was the leading buyer, followed by New Zealand Bloodstock which, as agent for several clients, bought 23 yearlings for a total of NZ\$3,353,500. Japanese buyers purchased seven lots for NZ\$1,610,000, while Sheikh Hamdan al Maktoum's Shadwell Estates picked up two yearlings for a total of NZ\$860,000. Cambridge Stud led all consignors with 60 offered--and 60 sold--for an average of NZ\$227,500 and an aggregate of NZ\$13,650,000. After selling the sales topper, Esker Lodge boasted the highest average, selling four yearlings for an average of NZ\$468,750. Zabeel ended the sale with 46 sons and daughters sold for an average of NZ\$357,391, while Danehill's 11 lots brought an average of NZ\$391,364. The first crop by Carnegie (Ire) was very well received, with 28 sold for an average of NZ\$186,875, making the freshman stallion the third-leading sire. (Thursday's top lots, p2)

THE RISE AND RISE OF ZABEEL

For the last two seasons, Danehill has relinquished his title in the Australian sires championship to serious rival Zabeel (NZ). Now Zabeel is gaining on him in the sales ring as well.

Last season, Zabeel became the first Australian stallion ever to reach A\$10 million in progeny earnings when he toppled Danehill for the second consecutive year with purses of A\$11,103,032, ahead of Danehill at A\$10,103,014.

The previous season, only A\$22,000--about first prize money for an average Saturday race--separated Zabeel, from Danehill.

And while Danehill still dominates in the sale ring in Australia, averaging A\$318,404 last year to Zabeel's A\$207,500, across the Tasman, it's a different story.

Eduardo Cojuangco's purchase of the record-breaking Zabeel--Diamond Lover (Aus) colt (who is out of a sister to Australian Horse of the Year Octagonal {NZ}, champion Mouawad {NZ} and Group 1 winners Kaapstad {NZ} and Marquise {NZ} and their NZ\$1.6 million sale-topping brother Colombia {NZ}) at Karaka Wednesday doubled the previous Australasian yearling record of A\$1.5 million for a Biscay (Aus) colt in 1989.

Cojuangco, whose company San Miguel will sponsor this year's A\$8 million Doncaster Derby day at Randwick Apr. 22, also came away with Easter's sale-topping A\$1.2 million Thunder Gulch filly last year.

Zabeel brought his tally of individual Group 1 winners to 14 last month with New Zealand Derby winner Hades (NZ) and Auckland Cup winner Able Master (NZ), still some 30 short of his sire Sir Tristram, who died in May 1997, leaving a capable squadron of sire sons.

Not surprisingly, Cambridge stud master Patrick Hogan, who stuck by Sir Tristram when potential shareholders scorned him back in 1976, has ended up with the best of them in Zabeel.

"I can only say I had always planned to stand a son of Sir Tristram, but never in competition with the horse himself so I decided I wouldn't stand a sire son of his until he was 20 and once he reached that age I would seek to purchase one," Hogan says.

"I guess it is uncanny. Meant to be. I don't say that I don't pinch myself occasionally. And what is even more uncanny is that I don't think since we purchased Zabeel that I have seen a son of Sir Tristram that would have satisfied me. So if I had missed Zabeel we would not have a son of Sir Tristram at all."

Robert Sangster planned the mating which produced Zabeel, sending his mare Valderna to Nureyev. She foaled twins--with the surviving foal Lady Giselle (Fr) packed off for a date with Sir Tristram.

Zabeel was in utero when Arrowfield purchased Lady Giselle and subsequently sold the colt to Sheikh Hamdan al Maktoum for a sales-topping NZ\$650,000 at Karaka in 1987.

Prepared by Colin Hayes for most of his career, Zabeel won the Australian Guineas and four other stakes events and Hogan secured him in 1991 for stud duties, with just A\$50,000 separating his winning sealed bid from that of Hayes, who wanted the horse for Lindsay Park.

"I got the nod by just \$50,000. Colin was in the middle of restructuring Lindsay Park and he didn't want to step out too far, he held back a little and that was to my advantage because the horse slipped through his fingers."

Zabeel's easygoing temperament has enabled Hogan to pioneer a Northern Hemisphere breeding program and the stallion is currently filling his second northern-time book.

"I am doing it in reverse to everyone else, letting the mares come to him, and it looks like it is working. It would be lovely if just one of them could do what his progeny have done here and win an Oaks or a Derby."

All horses in the International *TDN* were bred in North America unless otherwise indicated.

AN IRISH TOUR DE FORCE Irish-bred horses reinforced their position at the top of the European Flat Pattern Race statistics during 1999, accounting for nearly 30 percent of the winners of the 746 European black-type races run up to 8th December, according to recent research carried out by Hyperion Promotions and commissioned by Irish Thoroughbred Marketing. This domination was particularly apparent in the outstanding performance of Irish-foaled horses in Group 1 company. The presence of such stars as Emirates World Series Racing Champion and the International Classification's Champion Older Horse **Daylami (Ire)** (Doyoun {Ire}), Epsom Derby winner **Oath (Ire)** (Fairy King {USA}), French 2000 Guineas winner and champion middle distance three-year-old in the 1999 International Classifications **Sendawar (Ire)** (Priolo {USA}) and French Oaks winner **Daryaba (Ire)** (Night Shift {USA}) contributed to the final tally of 27 Irish-bred European Group 1 wins (36.48 percent). The Irish were well clear of the runners-up, the American-breds, who notched 17 European Group 1 wins, followed by the British with 15, the French with eight, the Germans with six and the Japanese with one. Further analysis of the European Pattern race success of Irish-bred horses reveals that this success greatly outweighs the statistical advantage in foal-crop terms enjoyed over some of the other main Thoroughbred-producing countries.

SADDLERS' HALL FILLY TOPS TATTERSALLS **Silver Grey Lady (Ire)** (Saddlers' Hall {Ire}), a two-year-old full sister to MG1SW Silver Patriarch (Ire), made 170,000 guineas at yesterday's inaugural Tattersalls February Sale in Newmarket, England to set a record at Tattersalls for an untried two-year-old. Joss Collins of the British Bloodstock Agency and John Needham of Elmhurst Bloodstock were the main protagonists for the well-bred filly, with Needham, acting as agent for Nicholas Cooper, coming out on top. The two-year-old, who was bought by Cooper for his wife Philippa, will return to trainer John Dunlop. She was one of six horses forming the dispersal of the late Peter Winfield's bloodstock interests. Needham said: "It was a rare chance to buy a sister to a Classic winner and we're delighted to get her. Her name is very appropriate because Nicholas Cooper has bought her as a silver wedding anniversary present for his wife." Silver Grey Lady will retire to the Cooper's Normandie Stud in Sussex at the end of her racing career. Dunlop said: "I'm obviously thrilled that she is coming back to us. She's a sweet, athletic filly and we've been pleased with what she has done so far. She is similar to her brother, although not quite as big as he was at this stage, but she has plenty of time to grow." The second-highest price of the draft and the sale was the 50,000 guineas paid for a two-year-old Woodman (USA) colt that Winfield had bought for 55,000 guineas at the Houghton Sales last year. He was knocked down to the Dunlop's son Ed, also a trainer, but will return to Castle Stables for an existing owner. The others in the dispersal made 18,000 guineas, 10,000 guineas, 9,000 guineas and 950 guineas. At the end of the first-ever February Sale, Tattersalls Chairman Edmond Mahony commented: "The impetus for a new February Sale came very much from breeders and consignors and we are delighted that the sale has made such an encouraging start. Vendor support has enabled us to attract buyers from all over Europe, with French, German, Italian and Scandinavian buyers all making their mark, and strong British and Irish demand also helping the sale to make an immediate impact. The highlight of the day was always going to be the dispersal of the late Mr Peter Winfield's bloodstock; although tinged with sadness, we were extremely pleased to see the six horses generate such interest and to learn that Silver Grey Lady...will continue to be trained by John Dunlop who enjoyed so much success with her Classic-winning own brother Silver Patriarch." GLOBETROTTER AT GULFSTREAM

The winner of last year's G1 Dubai World Cup, **Almutawakel (GB)** (Machiavellian) ended 1999 as the world's leading money earner for the season, taking home \$3,290,000 in purses. The well-travelled bay, who is also a Group 1 winner in France and a Listed stakes winner in Britain, gets a start on his Y2K bankroll in today's \$500,000 GI Donn H. at Gulfstream Park. Seventh in the Aug. 17 G1 Juddonte International S. at York in his first start after a game three-quarter length score over Malek (Chi) in the Dubai World Cup, the Shadwell Stable colorbearer was beaten just a nose in his American debut--and only previous try at the Donn distance--the GI Woodward S. The five-year-old tired in his two subsequent outings, running third in the Oct. 10 GI Jockey Club Gold Cup and fifth in the Nov. 6 GI Breeders' Cup Classic, but he has had a three-month freshening and makes his first start for trainer Mark Hennig. **Stephen Got Even (A.P. Indy)** held his own against his elders with a third-place finish in the Woodward and a fourth-place effort in the Gold Cup, his latest appearance. A perfect two-for-two at Gulfstream and two-for-three at the Donn distance, he is making his four-year-old debut today. **Behrens (Pleasant Colony)** was a consistent performer last year at five, running first or second in eight of nine starts, all graded. The bay has not started since running a dull seventh as the favorite in the Breeders' Cup Classic, but was the runner-up in the 1999 Donn and came back to post a 2 1/2-length victory in the GI Gulfstream Park H.

CAPE CANAVERAL READY FOR LIFT-OFF

Cape Canaveral (Mr. Prospector) won the GIII San Miguel S. in only the second start of his career in January '99, but it has taken him more than a year to return to the graded-stakes ranks. The four-year-old makes his third start following nearly 12 months on the sidelines, and his first at two turns, in today's \$500,000 GII Strub S. at Santa Anita. Third in a Dec. 26 optional claimer off the extended layoff, the four-year-old made it back to the winner's circle after a three-length tally going seven furlongs last time out Jan. 15. "This colt won impressively last time," Randy Bradshaw, assistant to trainer D. Wayne Lukas, said. "He finished up like the mile and an eighth is within reach and he has trained super. It looks like his speed will suit him very well in this spot... we feel this colt fits well here." The dark bay could have company on the front end in the Strub. **Saint's Honor (St. Jovite)** generally sits close to the lead, although he came from third and capitalized on a bumping match between **General Challenge (General Meeting)** and GI Breeders' Cup Classic winner **Cat Thief** to post the first graded-stakes win of his career in the Jan. 15 GII San Fernando Breeders' Cup S. in his most recent try. **General Challenge**, an impressive winner of the GI Pacific Classic last summer, returned from a disappointing 10th-place effort in the Breeders' Cup Classic to narrowly win the Dec. 12 GIII Native Diver H. After encountering traffic trouble, the gelding managed only fourth in the San Fernando Breeders' Cup last time out. **Luftikus (Meadowlake)** makes his stakes debut after coming off a seven-month vacation due to illness to take a Jan. 8 allowance going a mile and a sixteenth at Santa Anita. The \$200,000 Saratoga yearling purchase has been first or second in all five career starts. "He's doing great, just fantastic," trainer Vladimir Cerin said. "We don't really know how good he is yet, and I hope we still don't after Saturday."

The 1 3/16-mile test, third of the five events in the "NTRA Champions on FOX" series, will now be worth a total of \$750,000. Wayne Wright, executive secretary for the Maryland Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association, said, "The MTHA board discussed the proposed purse at length and by majority vote increased the purse with the hope that the Pimlico Special's position in the FOX series would attract the top handicap horses in the country."

IT'S OFFICIAL: HORSE CHESTNUT TO CLAIBORNE The deal which will send South African champion **Horse Chestnut (SAf)** (Fort Wood) to Claiborne Farm for the 2000 breeding season has been finalized, *The Blood-Horse* on-line reports. 

TRIPLE CROWN FOR EUROPE? Louis Romanet, director-general of France-Galop and chairman of the International Federation of Horse Racing Authorities and the International Cataloguing Standards Committee, has proposed running the English, French and Irish Derbies at three-week intervals to create a Triple Crown-like series in Europe, the *Racing Post* reports. "We have three principal Derbys in Europe of which two, the English and French, are run within the same weekend," Romanet told *Racing Post*. "Why not try to have the races staged three weeks apart? We could have one in early June, one on the fourth weekend and the third three weeks later, in mid-July. Horses would probably run in two out of three, but it would give more chance for the three-year-old who matures later." Romanet also suggested restricting the G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. to older horses and moving the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe forward on the calendar. "We could reconsider whether to keep the three-year-olds in the King George and make it a top race for four-year-olds and up," he said. "A lot of our trainers are bypassing the King George--Montjeu (Ire) and Peintre Celebre (USA) are examples--because they consider the race too testing for three-year-olds at that time of the season. Also, we've wondered whether the Arc should be a week or two earlier because of problems with the ground. I think anything can be studied. The key is how trainers respond." The *Racing Post* quoted four-time Epsom Derby-winning trainer Henry Cecil as saying he felt the Derby series was, "a very good idea, if you could do it." But he added, "But I do think the King George should be a race where the two generations meet." Romanet concluded, "We have to carefully consider building up the championship programme for three- and four-year-olds in Europe. If we don't, other races will take their place and the horses will leave the country, and that is not our duty."

PIPE DREAM Martin Pipe yesterday became the most successful British trainer of all time when Through The Rye (GB) (Sabrehill {GB}) won the opening race at Folkestone. This was the 2,989th success of his training career and enabled the Somerset-based handler to pass the record set by the late Arthur Stephenson in a 46-year training career. Pipe watched the race from his Somerset stable and said: "It's a great thrill to get there. I'm very excited. I've just watched it live now, I'm still on a high. Arthur Stephenson was a fabulous trainer. I met him several times and he really was a genius. I followed his career--he was very shrewd."

RODRIGO DE TRIANO YEARLING TOPS COLTS SALE

With no offspring of Zabeel (NZ) in the catalogue, a colt from the first Southern Hemisphere crop by G1 English 2000 Guineas winner Rodrigo de Triano (USA) brought a final bid of NZ\$125,000 to top yesterday's New Zealand Bloodstock Millennium Colts Sale in Karama. Consigned by Glenmoragn Farm, who shuttled Rodrigo de Triano from the Japanese Bloodhorse Breeders Association in 1997 and 1998, he was purchased by New Zealand Bloodstock for a New Zealand-based client. The chestnut is out of stakes-placed Lady Tristana (NZ) (*Sir Tristram), who has produced five runners to date, all winners. Volksraad (GB) was the leading sire at the sale, with his eight lots averaging NZ\$67,313, followed by freshman Pentire (GB), who averaged NZ\$61,313, and Rodrigo de Triano at an average of NZ\$60,000. The average for the one-day auction was up an eye-opening 72 percent from 1999, while the aggregate increased 17 percent.

GODOLPHIN LISTS HORSES-IN-TRAINING

Godolphin have released the lists of their horses currently in training at three of their four worldwide bases. At their Grandstand Stables base, the crop of 32 juveniles (24 colts and eight fillies) contains progeny of top stallions such as A. P. Indy (USA), Danzig (USA), Gone West (USA), Mr. Prospector (USA), Red Ransom (USA), Seattle Slew (USA), Storm Bird (Can), Storm Cat (USA) and Woodman (USA). There are 138 housed at the Al Quoz Stables in Dubai, which will be streamlined down to the 60 or so who will make the journey to Moulton Paddocks in Newmarket towards the end of April. The older horses based in Dubai include Diktat (GB) (Warning {GB}), High-Rise (Ire) (High Estate {Ire}), Aljabr (USA) (Storm Cat {USA}) and Dubai Millennium (GB) (Seeking The Gold {USA}), Godolphin's main hope of winning the World Cup in March. David Loder has 86 horses listed in his care at Evry in France, including Beautiful Canyon (USA) (Gulch {USA}), the first filly to run for the Godolphin French operation. Of the 74 two-year-olds there is a team of choicely bred individuals including the FF4,500,000 purchase at last August's Agence Francaise Deauville Sale, a Kingmambo (USA) filly.

TV DEAL IN THE WORKS FOR BRITISH TRACKS

Britain's top 12 racecourses--Aintree, Ascot, Cheltenham, Doncaster, Epsom, Goodwood, Haydock, Kempton, Newbury, Newmarket, Sandown and York--yesterday entered into exclusive television negotiations with a consortium of the BBC, Channel 4 and Premium TV, a subsidiary of cable company NTL, for a 10-year deal worth over £200 million for worldwide rights. The rights include terrestrial television, interactive TV and the Internet. This will guarantee continued coverage of Britain's premier races on the main television channels. In addition, the television companies will provide marketing support worth £25 million over the contract.
