NO IDLE THREAT IN THE VERY ONE

An overflow field of 12 fillies and mares and six also eligibles were entered for today's GIII The Very One H. at Gulfstream. Idle Rich (Sky Classic) was off four months after winning the GIII Glens Falls H. at Saratoga and returned with a bang-up second to Coretta (Ire) in the Dec. 26 GII La Prevoyante H. last time out. Irish invader Lisieux Rose (Ire) (Generous {Ire}), winner of the 1998 G2 Blandford S., makes her first American start off a third-place effort in the 1999 edition of the race last September. Trained in Ireland by Dermot Weld, the five-year-old chestnut has joined the American barn of Christophe Clement. Crystal Symphony (Red Ransom) won the Dec. 4 GIII My Charmer H. at Calder before running a troubled sixth in the La Prevoyante.

Undefeated 2 Year Old by Storm Gat

NEVER SO BOLD DEAD Never So Bold (Ire) (Bold Lad {Ire}), European champion sprinter of 1985, died yesterday morning of an apparent heart attack at Wood Farm Stud in Shropshire, England. The 20-year-old stallion is one of only five horses to have swept the Group 1 triple of the Kings Stand at Royal Ascot, the Norcros July S. at Newmarket and the William Hill Sprint Championship (Nunthorpe S.) at York in 1985. Never So Bold sired graded stakes winners Character (GB), Venture Capitalist (GB) and stakes winners Eaton Lad (GB) and Bold Jessie (GB). He has recently been represented as the broodmare sire of graded stakes winners Abou Zouz, Easycall (GB), Circle of Gold (Ire) and Nadwah.

THE MOST UNDERRATED SIRE ON THE PLANET

As always, I've enjoyed having the opportunity to offer my opinion on a few sires that have maybe been a bit overlooked, especially as racehorse sires or sire prospects, in my columns the last couple of weeks. I'd like to wrap this series up by talking a little bit today about a stallion I consider right now to be the most underrated sire on the planet. Maybe you've heard of him. His name is Danzig.

I don't mention this because I think anybody is going to rush out and buy a season to the venerable 23-year-old: they're surely completely unavailable now at any price. I mention it because, as we move from the Mr. Prospector Era to the Storm Cat Era, there's just a little risk that it slips our minds just how important a sire Danzig has been. That shouldn't happen.

A table in the Jan. 29 *Blood-Horse* (p. 734) reminds us that Danzig is the leading active sire with a 4.97 cumulative average-earnings index. He has sired 150 SW (18.5 percent of foals), 84 Graded SW, and 41 Grade 1 winners in 16 crops to date. In terms of the analysis that I use myself, he's sired 120 individual 'A Runners' since 1983 (second only to Mr. Prospector's 125), and is currently the second leading sire on 1993-99 A Runner Index, which is a similar standard of measurement to the average-earnings index. Here are a few comparative numbers with his own sire, Northern Dancer--the greatest sire of the last fifty years; Northern Dancer's other three greatest sons, Nijinsky, Nureyev, and Sadler's Wells; and their greatest contemporary, Mr. Prospector:

Northern Dancer - 146 SW (23.0 percent of 635 foals), 5.14 cumulative AEI

Nijinsky - 155 SW (18.2 percent of 850 foals), 4.76 AEI Danzig - 150 SW (18.5 percent of 810 foals), 4.97 AEI Nureyev - 111 SW (16.6 percent of 667 foals), 4.10 AEI Sadler's Wells - 133 SW (17.0 percent of 779 foals),

4.21 AEI

Mr. Prospector- 163 SW (16.1 percent of 1015 foals), 4.35 AEI

Because I have this list handy, can I just run through, to refresh your memory, some of the 120 individual 'A Runners' sired by Danzig. For each crop, his number of individual A Runners is in parentheses, followed by the names of his most prominent of sons, nearly all of whom have gone to stud (with varying success), including a few who were never A Runners or SW--which, I'm sure you remember, Danzig himself was not.

I guess it just bugs me a little bit that in this 'Rush to Storm Cat' (gotta have one, everybody's gotta have one)--79 SW to date (14.8 percent of 532 foals), 4.11 AEI, an incredible 24 SW in 1999, 15 Graded, and seven Grade 1 winners--there is just a little bit of a loss of perspective. He's a terrific sire, Storm Cat, hands-down, not-open-to-debate, no-doubt-about it. But one of the ways we can assess his stature is by comparing him to some of his best recent contemporaries--nearly all of whom are relatives of some description. So, just before we all move on to the next Great Sire, let's concede a tip of the hat and a last little bit of recognition to Danzig--the most underrated sire on the planet.

WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

The weekend was a good one for the burgeoning Relaunch sire line. Not only did Cee's Tizzy take the GII San Antonio S., but Bertrando (by Relaunch's son, Skywalker) was also represented by Scholars Studio and Smooth Player the first and second home in the GII La Canada S. and the Pro or Con H. winner Here's To You. Add to this the fact that Relaunch's young son Slew Gin Fizz has made a terrific start in Argentina, and that Waquoit has been a very serviceable regional sire in Maryland, it is clear that the Relaunch sons have made the most of their opportunities. This also bodes well for his best supported son Honour and Glory, who has his first runners this year.

Cee's Tizzy is certainly an overachiever. Winner of a maiden event at Hollywood Park, and a pair of allowance contests at Del Mar, he also placed third in the GI Super Derby from just six starts. From 97 foals in his first four crops, he has sired four stakes winners, including not only Budroyale, but also the GI Milady Breeders' Cup victress, Gourmet Girl.

Budroyale's ability may stem from an accumulation of genetic relatives by Mahmoud, a horse who has a very significant influence in Relaunch's pedigree. Cee's Tizzy is out of a mare by Lyphard (which, incidentally, means he is bred on similar lines to Honour and Glory, who is out of a mare by a son of Lyphard). This brings together The Axe II (broodmare sire of Relaunch) and Almahmoud (granddam of Lyphard's sire, Northern Dancer). The Axe II and Almahmoud have very similar backgrounds, since both are by Mahmoud out of mares strongly featuring Chicle, Broomstick and Peter Pan.

Budroyale's dam Cee's Song is out of Lonely Dancer, who is by a son of Northern Dancer (Almahmoud again). Her dam Sleep Lonely is by Pia Star, and his dam Inquisitive is a Mahmoud daughter who has strong pedigree links to both The Axe II and Almahmoud.

PEDIGREE SHORTS

Note another one for the pattern of inbreeding to the broodmare sire of a sire. Winner of the Bucharest S. at Sam Houston on Saturday was No Limit Soldier (c, 3, War Deputy--Foxy Canadian, by Golden Reserve). His sire is out of a mare by Sir Ivor and the dam is by a son of Sir Ivor, giving No Limit Soldier a 3x3 cross of Sir Ivor. Another first time stakes winner inbred to the broodmare sire of the sire was Profit Option, who took the Fair Grounds Breeders' Cup H. He is by Alleged, who is out of a Prince John mare, and he has Prince John 3x5. Note that the second dam is by Halo, whose own broodmare sire Cosmic Bomb is a half brother to the dam of Prince John.

Archer City Slew (c, 3, Slew City Slew--I'm Yours Joe, by Miswaki), who arrived on the three-year-old scene with a win in the GII San Vicente S., is another multiple *La Troienne triumph. His sire is a son of Seattle Slew (dam inbred to the sisters Striking and Busher) and his dam has Buckpasser (out of Busanda, a three-quarters sister to Striking and Busher) 3x3. This is also another score for the very successful Seattle Slew/Mr. Prospector cross.

Another son of Seattle Slew, Seattle Sleet, is turning into a very useful inexpensive sire. He was represented by his fourth stakes winner when Silver Stockings (f, 3, Seattle Sleet--Parmilla, by Silver Deputy) ran off with the Gasparilla S. at Tampa at the weekend. This is a filly with a very clever pedigree. Seattle Sleet's dam Snow Blossom is by The Minstrel and is inbred 3x2 to The Minstrel's broodmare sire, Victoria Park. Silver Stocking's dam is by a grandson of Vice Regent (by Northern Dancer, sire of The Minstrel, out of a half sister to Victoria Park). Looks like it is worth getting Vice Regent and The Minstrel togther whenever possible.

The weekend was a good one for Gilded Time, who seems to be on something of a roll at the moment. His daughter Di's Time (m, 5, Gilded Time--Yallah Miss, by Yallah Native) took the Correction H. at Aqueduct, and his son Gilty Moment (c, 3, Gilded Time--Doris's Secret, by Nikoli {Ire}) captured the Turf Paradise Derby. Gilty Moment has an unusual pedigree. We don't imagine that we will see Gilded Time crossed with many mares from the male line of Honeyway--grandsire of Gilty Time's dam Doris's Secret--but it does make for a clever mating. Gilded Time's granddam is by Luquillo (by Princequillo out of a mare by a son of Fairway). Honeyway is by Fairway, and his dam is three-parts related to the dam of Princequillo.

FOREST WILDCAT FILLY TOPS OBS SALE A

filly by Forest Wildcat out of the Deputy Minister mare Epistolary brought a final bid of \$550,000 to top yesterday's Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's Selected Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale at Calder Racecourse. The bay two-year-old, sold as hip 167, was consigned by Ocala Stud Farms and C. T. Grether, Inc. made the sale-topping bid. A multiple graded stakes winner, Forest Wildcat's first foals are twoyear-olds of 2000. Epistolary is the dam of graded stakes placed Texturizer (On to Glory). The sale average rose 6.8 percent from the 1999 average.

JURY FINDS CALUMET DUO GUILTY A federal jury in Houston, Texas has found J. T. Lundy and Gary Matthews guilty of bank fraud, conspiracy and bribery, according to The Blood Horse. The panel of 12 took under three hours to return the guilty verdict against the former Calumet Farm officers. Dan Cogdell, Matthews's attorney, said the verdict would be appealed. "I don't lose cases where the evidence was clear I should have won," Matthews commented. "If I was less politically correct, I would say you never put your trust in 12 people who are not smart enough to get off jury duty." Lead federal prosecutor Julia Tomala said that the government will continue to investigate practices which led to the Calumet Farm bankruptcy, including the November 1990 death of leading sire Alydar. Lundy and Matthews will be sentenced on Apr. 27 and are facing up to 30 years in prison.

Keeneland Purchases Kentucky Horse Center:

Keeneland has entered into an agreement with Churchill Downs to purchase Kentucky Horse Center, a Thoroughbred training and boarding facility in Lexington. The sale's price is \$5 million. Churchill acquired the property when it purchased Ellis Park in 1998. The 245-acre Kentucky Horse Center has two training tracks and stabling for 1,100 horses. The facility has accommodations for meetings and larger special events, including a 920-seat auditorium.

Kasters Purchase Half of Wafare Farm:

Richard and Nancy Kaster have purchased a 50-percent interest in Wafare Farm, Inc. near Midway, Kentucky from Nathan and Shelley Fox. The two couples have raced horses in partnership, including multiple graded stakes winner Richter Scale (*Habitony). The Kasters previously campaigned champion Countess Diana (Deerhound). Wafare Farm currently stands 12 stallions, and will be joined for the 2000 breeding season by Deerhound (Danzig), who previously stood at Brookdale Farm. Nathan Fox, president of Wafare Farm, stated, "My wife and I have been good friends with the Kasters for years and have had a good deal of success racing horses in partnership with them. Rick (Kaster) and I think a lot alike when it comes to the horse business, and I know that their involvement in Wafare Farm will help strengthen the operation and carry it on another level of success."

GROSSER PREIS SPONSORSHIP IN DOUBT

Everything was looking so well after the company FLOW-TEX agreed to sponsor the Group 1 Grosser Preis von Baden, the most prestigious prize in German racing. Currently, though, things are looking fairly insecure as the company's managing directors Manfred Schmieder and Klaus Kleiser have been arrested by police, accused of tax evasion as well as forgery of documents. The financial damage is said to amount to hundreds of million Deutschmarks. FLOW-TEX announced last week that they had taken over sponsorship of the race from Mercedes-Benz and announced that the value of the race would be more than tripled. A spokesman for the International Club, which conducts racing at Baden-Baden told the Racing Post, "We aren't sure how the race will be affected, but we're hoping that any charges prove unfounded.

YOUNG KENNY HEADS GRAND NATIONAL WEIGHTS

Trainer Peter Beaumont's two star steeplechasers Young Kenny (GB) (Ardross {Ire}), with 168 pounds, and Bobby Grant (GB) (Gunner B {GB}), with 166 pounds, head this year's list of weights, along with dual runner-up Suny Bay (Ire) (Roselier {Fr}) on 166 pounds, for the £500,000 G3 Martell Grand National at Aintree Apr. 8, which were announced in London yesterday. Other notable weights allotted were 160 pounds for last year's Irish-trained winner Bobbyjo (Ire) (Bustineto {GB}) and 153 pounds for the 1997 winner Lord Gyllene (NZ) (Ring The Bell {NZ}). Of the 99 qualified entries, 66 have been given weights within the handicap proper (140 pounds and above) which bodes well for a possible maximum field of 40 which was last seen when Party Politics won in 1992. Champion trainer Martin Pipe has a typically strong entry numbering twelve of which the highest weighted is Tresor De Mai (Fr) (Grand Tresor (Fr)) with 165 pounds.
