## THE VERY ONE--MINUS 12

In a field ravaged by defections after the race came off the turf, **My Sweet Westly** (West by West) rallied from last to first to win GIII The Very One H. in a driving finish at Gulfstream Park. The chestnut filly, who recorded two of her three previous career wins on the main track, was coming off a fifth-place finish in the grassy Jan. 19 GIII Joe Namath H. The field for The Very One was whittled down to six from the overflow entries of 18 fillies and mares and My Sweet Westly settled at the rear of the pack early. She moved up along the inside on the backstretch and got up late for a one-length victory. "She came away well, and then backed away from there, which is her style," said winning rider Pat Day. "Then she started to come on about the three-eighths pole when I called on her and got the job done." Winning trainer Dale Romans added, "I wanted to run her on the turf, but I'll take a win however I can get it. Now I know she's a versatile sort that can run on either dirt or turf. I'm not sure where we're going to run her next. We're just going to savor this win."

## SEATTLE SLEW'S SEASON ON HOLD

Those holding seasons and shares in **Seattle Slew** (Bold Reasoning) received a letter Tuesday from Three Chimneys Farm owner Robert Clay informing them that the 26-year-old stallion "continues to exhibit an intermittent neurological deficit," and that his scheduled test breeding the previous day had been cancelled. The letter also said that a decision on the size of his 2000 book would be made after he bred his first mares, but that the farm would not schedule a breeding until "we are more comfortable with his condition...If Seattle Slew continues to improve and breeds his first mares without incident, it is entirely possible that he covers his full book of mares. If, on the other hand, there is a delay in his improvement or he indicates trouble in breeding his first mares, then we may need to reduce his book." Three Chimneys Manager Dan Rosenberg said that the problem was first detected by the stallion's groom, Tom Wade, approximately four weeks ago, and described it as "a mild incoordination." "He appears uncoordinated at times and fine at other times," Rosenberg said, adding that a general improvement in his condition had led to the scheduling of Monday's test breeding. "For all intents and purposes, he had appeared normal until the middle of last week, but it's not unusual to have a few bumps with this type of situation and he had a little bit of a hiccup over the weekend," he explained. "We're planning on breeding him when he's ready."

### Worldly Manner Returns in Dubai:

**Worldly Manner** (Riverman), a two-time graded stakes winner in the U.S. before joining team Godolphin late in his juvenile campaign, makes his first start since last year's GI Preakness tonight in Dubai. The four-year-old faces a field of seven in round two of the Maktoum Challenge, a nine-furlong listed event over the Nad al Sheba dirt track. Also in the field is 1998 GII Remsen winner **Comeonmom** (Jolie's Halo), eighth in the opening round of the Maktoum Challenge series while making his Emirates debut, but improved to second last time out. All eight runners in the field carry 123 pounds.

Northern Prospect entered stud at Aisco Farm in Florida and moved to Hermitage in 1987.

"It was an excellent work for him," commented trainer Randy Morse after the move. "It looks like we'll be running him in the Fountain of Youth and Shane (Sellers) will ride him again. They fit well together." Shug McGaughey sent out possible Fountain of Youth contender **Polish Miner** (Danzig) to work five furlongs Tuesday. Twice graded stakes placed at Aqueduct last winter, the colt accomplished his Tuesday drill in :1:02 2/5.

**Surfside Scares Off Las Virgenes Foes:**

A compact field of four three-year-old fillies is expected when entries are drawn today for Saturday's GI Las Virgenes S. at Santa Anita. The small field is due in large measure to the ominous presence of **Surfside** (Seattle Slew), an easy eight-length winner of the GIII Santa Ysabel S. in her seasonal debut Jan. 9. Eclipse Award winner **Chilukki** (Cherokee Run) will bypass the race in favor of the Feb. 19 GIII Davona Dale S. at the Fair Grounds, a race won last year by stablemate Silverbulletday. Chilukki worked six furlongs yesterday in a bullet 1:26 at Santa Anita. Other probables for the Las Virgenes include **Rings A Chime** (Metfield), **Spain** (Thunder Gulch) and **Strike Back** (Strike the Gold).

**Big Cap Notes:**

Sunday's GI San Antonio winner and Breeders' Cup Classic runner up **Budroyale** (Cee's Tizzy) came out of his race in good order and in on track for the GI Santa Anita H. Mar. 4 according to trainer Ted West. **Dixie Dot Com** (Dixie Brass), the beaten favorite in the San Antonio, did not bleed in the race, as was suggested by his jockey Corey Nakatani. "I'm sure he gave Corey some of those indications, but the vet said he scoped clean," said trainer Bill Morey Jr., who indicated that the five-year-old is still under consideration for the Big Cap. Juddmonte Farms' **Chester House** (Mr. Prospector), a troubled fourth in the Breeders' Cup Classic in his last start, breezed seven furlongs yesterday in 1:27 and is also expected for the race. Strub runner up **Luftikus** (Meadowlake) came out of his heat in good shape, but is not likely for the Big Cap, according to trainer Vladimir Cerin.

**TCA Receipts Total Near \$1 Million from Auction:**

Thoroughbred Charities of America's 10th Annual Auction of stallion seasons and racing memorabilia was held Feb. 5, the gross receipts from which totaled "just about \$1 million" according to Herb Moelis, president of TCA. Topping the auction was a season to GI Haskell Invitational winner **Coronado's Quest** (Forty Niner), which was purchased by Rosemont Farm for \$125,000. The five-year-old stands at Claiborne Farm for \$75,000. Elizabeth Moran of Brushwood Stables bid \$10,000 for one of two antique chairs donated by Mrs. Allaire duPont, who needlepointed each of them. Mrs. Moran later agreed to match her winning bid and took home both chairs. "The overwhelming response to this event has been extremely gratifying," said Moelis. "Our purpose is simple--to support voluntary organizations which help and rescue horses and people in the horse industry," he added.

### SHERGAR CUP 2000 SET TO GO

After months of negotiations involving several racecourses, the £400,000 Shergar Cup will stage its second renewal in 2000, sources told the *Thoroughbred Daily News* yesterday. Exact details about this year's event are scheduled to be announced at a press conference today, but word is that the event has been moved to later in the season and to a different Grade One racecourse. Goodwood racecourse staged the inaugural event, the first-ever racehorse team competition in which Middle East-owned horses took on their European counterparts. Although the event failed to attract more than 5,000 racegoers to Goodwood, it provided compelling television to those who stayed at home to watch the six-race event, with millions tuning in to see the final race which produced a thrilling last-minute victory for Europe. Some of last year's sponsors have decided to renew their involvement and there will once again be live coverage on BBC. It has been confirmed that Mark McCormack's International Management Group (IMG) will no longer be involved, with the rights to the event having been bought by the racecourse concerned. The event is named for the Aga Khan's superstar racehorse who went missing from his owner's Ballymany Stud in Ireland 17 years ago this week, never to be seen again, after covering just one book of mares at stud.

**AUTOTOTE & ARENA LEISURE IN INTERNET WAGERING VENTURE** Autotote Corporation and Arena Leisure, which owns five racecourses in Great Britain, announced yesterday that they have created a joint venture to operate an Internet wagering service for pari-mutuel betting on horseracing. The service will permit horseplayers to place bets on virtually any race in the world, watch races live through video streaming, and to collect their winnings in real time over the Internet. The service will not accept accounts from American or Canadian citizens pending passage of the Internet Gambling Prohibition Act of 1999 (the "Kyl Bill") by the U.S. Congress, which would permit wagering, where authorized, via the Internet on horse racing. Lorne Weil, Autotote's Chairman and CEO, said, "Our initial marketing focus will be on international jurisdictions where Internet wagering is permitted and where we have an extensive customer base. International sales will take place while U.S. legislation enabling wagering on horse racing is pending."
