DUBAI DEFEAT FOR WORLDLY MANNER

Worldly Manner (Riverman), purchased privately for a reported \$5 million by Godolphin following his victory in the 1998 GII Del Mar Futurity, ran a creditable seventh in the 1999 Kentucky Derby, but disappointed when 12th of 13 in the Preakness last May 15 in what would be his final start of the year. With a berth in the Dubai World Cup on the line, Sheikh Mohammed entered the four-year-old in the second round of the Maktoum Challenge Series last night at Nad al Sheba. The dark bay, clearly the class of a field which also included 1998 GII Remsen S. winner **Comeonmom** (Jolie's Halo), was in contention the length of the stretch while fully extended for jockey Frankie Dettori, but could not get by the fashionably bred **Get Away With It (Ire)** (Last Tycoon {Ire}). Following the race, stewards launched an inquiry into interference caused by **Worldly Manner** against fourth-place finisher **Comeonmom**, but ruled that no infraction took place. Plans for the World Cup are now up in the air, according to Crisford. "(Worldly Manner) needed to win and win well to earn his ticket to the Dubai World Cup," he said and mentioned the Listed Godolphin Mile on the World Cup undercard as a possible alternative spot for **Worldly Manner**.

MORE THAN READY LOUISIANA BOUND? More Than Ready (Southern Halo) may skip next Saturday's GI Fountain of Youth S. at Gulfstream Park in favor of the Mar. 12 GI Louisiana Derby at Fair Grounds. The three-year-old, winner of the GI Sanford S., Gill Tremont S., Flash S. and WHAS-TV S. at two, came back after nearly four months off to dead-heat for the win in the Jan. 29 GI Hutcheson S. at Gulfstream. "We're happy with the way he came out of the Hutcheson," said owner James Scatuorchio. "It didn't take anything out of him. But the three weeks may be too close. The Fountain of Youth is still possible, but it's less than 50 percent. We're looking at the Louisiana Derby as his other option." Scatuorchio noted that he will talk it over with trainer Todd Pletcher after the colt works early next week.

HASKELL HIGHLIGHTS MONMOUTH STAKES SCHEDULE The \$1 million GI Haskell Invitational H., which will be run Sunday, Aug. 6, is the centerpiece of a 2000 Monmouth Park stakes schedule worth \$3.65 million. The program features 17 stakes, 15 of them graded, during the 73-day meet. The calendar includes the \$350,000 GI United Nations H. (up from \$250,000 last year), set for July 1, and the \$100,000 Gill Jersey Derby, slated for Memorial Day, May 29, which were run at the Jersey Shore track for the first time last season, and the Aug. 27 \$350,000 GI Philip H. Iselin H. Six of the stakes, including the June 24 Gill Jersey Shore Breeders' Cup S., will be part of the Mid-Atlantic Thoroughbred Championship series. The overnight stakes program will offer 51 races with purses ranging from \$45,000 to \$75,000. The 2000 Monmouth meet runs Saturday, May 27 through Sunday, Sept. 3.

The runner-up, winner of the GI Matron and Gill Tempted S. at two and of the Gill Nassau County S. at three, was making her second start since running second in the June 26 GI Mother Goose S. She was seventh trying turf in her return off the layoff, a Gulfstream allowance test Jan. 14.

Ecton Park Makes 2000 Bow Tomorrow:

GI Super Derby winner **Ecton Park** (Forty Niner), off since finishing 12th in the Nov. 6 GI Breeders' Cup Classic, will make his seasonal debut in tomorrow's sixth race at Gulfstream, a \$45,000 allowance test going 1 1/16 miles. The four-year-old also captured the GII Jim Dandy and the Risen Star S. last season, and finished second in the GII Ohio Derby and third in the GIII Louisiana Derby. Trained by Elliott Walden, he will be ridden by Jerry Bailey.

ASCOT HOSTS SHERGAR CUP, DIAMOND DAY


Ascot's "Summer of Racing" is to have a radical shake-up this year to help maximise the potential of the Royal Racecourse during the prime summer months and focus world attention on racing in Britain. The rights to the Shergar Cup, staged at Goodwood in its inaugural year in 1999 when it was owned by Mark McCormack's sports management company IMG, have been bought outright by Ascot Racecourse and will move permanently to Ascot's August Saturday, this year Aug. 12. Peter Savill, the BHB Chairman, said, "I am delighted that the Shergar Cup will take place again this year and I'm sure that Ascot will build on the excellent foundations laid by Goodwood." Ascot's Chief Executive Douglas Erskine-Crum added, "This year we are committed to making the Shergar Cup a resounding success. It got off to a great start at Goodwood last year and the long-term aim has to be to build it into a major event in the racing calendar." As part of the deal, Goodwood Annual Members will be able to gain free admission to Ascot for this year's event. Europe's second most valuable flat handicap, the £150,000 Tote International (only the Tote Ebor at York is worth more), moves from what will now be Shergar Cup Day to De Beers Diamond Day July 29, where it will help to create Britain's second £1million raceday (Vodafone Derby Day at Epsom being the other). The Tote International will support the feature race on Diamond Day, the G1 £750,000 (up from £600,000 last year) King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S., making Diamond Day one of the most internationally important events in the European calendar. The addition of the Tote International to the card can only enhance that position still further. "Crucially, from Ascot's point of view, they will enhance the revenue-earning potential of our 'Summer of Racing', which in the past has had to rely too heavily on the popularity of the Royal meeting in June," Erskine-Crum added. "Higher revenue is essential to the funding of the major redevelopment of which the racecourse is becoming so much in need. With £1 million in prize money and a key place in the Emirates World Series, De Beers Diamond Day is now one of the truly great international racedays."

CAERLEON MARE TOPS AT DEAUVILLE

Five-year-old **Magic Dawn (Fr)** (Caerleon {USA}) brought a final bid of FF250,000 to top the Agence Francaise February Mixed Sale yesterday. Consigned by Haras d'Etreham, Magic Dawn is out of 1991 G1 Prix Vermeille winner and G1 Arc de Triomphe runner up Magic Night (Fr) and was purchased by Axel Donnerstag Bloodstock. The session's second highest lot was hip number 28, 19-year-old Listed stakes winner **Reine d'Egypte (USA)** (Val de L'orne {Fr}). She is the dam of six winners, including multiple stakes winner Egyptown (Fr) (Top Ville {Ire}) and the stakes winning and graded-stakes placed Sand Reef (GB) (Reference Point {GB}). She is in foal to Green Tune (USA). A total of 48 horses went through the ring for a gross total of FF2,377,000, a decrease of six percent against 1999. The average was FF49,521, off 10 percent against the corresponding figure from a year ago.

AN APPRENTICE FOR ALL WEATHER

Neil Callan, the 21-year-old apprentice attached to Karl Burke's Newmarket stable, currently sits proudly at the top of the jockeys' leaderboard for the 1999-2000 all-weather winter season. In doing so, he heads off some more illustrious names such as Michael Hills and Pat Eddery as he bids for his first major accolade in what is a fast-blossoming career.

One of last season's leading apprentices in Britain, Callan was born in Dublin but found himself based at Kevin Prendergast's Kildare stables in his mid-teens on the recommendation of his father, who was also on the payroll at Erindale. He had his first ride, an unsuccessful one, at The Curragh at the age of 16, and a further 18 rides in his native land failed to provide him with a trip to the winner's circle.

He then decided to try his luck across the Irish Sea and the move has paid dividends as he has gone from strength to strength, cemented by his appointment as Burke's stable apprentice, riding out his claim with a total of 101 winners to date. The young Irishman leads the all-weather table with 26 wins compared to nearest challenger Michael Hills' tally of 21, and his powerful style in the saddle has seen him likened to champions of the past.

He clearly has drive and ambition, saying: "Obviously I want to continue to work hard and do as well as I can for Mr Burke. Hopefully one day I can emulate Kieren Fallon by becoming champion jockey."

Callan still has a long road to travel before fulfilling his target, the acid test being to secure decent rides now that he can no longer claim his allowance. With his five rides for four different trainers yielding a second place and four thirds at Lingfield on Wednesday and an unplaced effort on his only ride at Wolverhampton yesterday, the correct attitude is certainly in place for him to have a decent crack of the whip.

Leading All-Weather Jockeys in Saturday's TDN-Euro
