REAL QUIET IN KENTUCKY

Champion Real Quiet (Quiet American--Really Blue, by Believe it), unraced since his half-length score in the June 27 GI Hollywood Gold Cup, has arrived in Kentucky and may start his stud career at Vinery this season. The 1998 GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness winner, who also captured the GI Pimlico Special last year and the GI Hollywood Futurity at two, was expected to race one more season and had recently returned to training, breezing for the first time Tuesday, but he was shipped to Hill 'n' Dale Farm in the Blue Grass State Saturday. Hill 'n' Dale, where Real Quiet was laid up after his three-year-old campaign, is right next door to the new Vinery, located near Lexington. The deal which would see the five-year-old stand at Vinery beginning this year is in the process of being finalized. Real Quiet, who missed his bid for the Triple Crown when he finished a nose behind Victory Gallop in the GI Belmont S., compiled a record of six wins, five seconds and six thirds from 20 starts and earnings of \$3,271,802. A stud fee has not yet been announced, but Vinery Director of Operations Bates Newton told the Thoroughbred Times, "\$25,000 has been talked about, but as far as I know it hasn't been confirmed yet."

MR. LIVINGTON, I PRESUME

Never off the board in five prior turf tries, Mr. Livingston (El Prado {Ire}) was let go at 5-1 in yesterday's GIII Palm Beach S. at Gulfstream Park, but led every step en route to a 2 1/4-length score. "This horse has a lot of speed and they gave him pretty easy fractions," trainer Bill Kaplan said. A well-beaten third in the Rhythm S. over Breeders' Cup weekend, the gray switched to the turf in his next try and wired the field to take a Calder allowance Dec. 12. Second after setting the pace in the Jan. 2 GIII Tropical Park Derby, he came back to post a front-running Gulfstream allowance score in his latest Feb. 3. "He's learning to relax better each time," Kaplan said. "This horse still doesn't quite know who the boss is. We're still negotiating that point." As for the future, Kaplan offered, "I think this horse will run on the dirt...but for the time being we'll stay on the grass." The 7-2 favorite, Tropical Park Derby winner Go Lib Go (Septieme Ciel), was an even sixth. GISP Cosine (Cozzene), making his turf bow at 5-1, pressed the pace, but tired to be last of 11. FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH S.-GI, \$200,000, 3yo, 1 1/16m Summer Note (Notebook), undefeated in three starts after finishing the Jan. 29 GII Hutcheson S. on even terms with More Than Ready, is injured and will miss the Fountain of Youth as well as the Kentucky Derby. "He suffered a slight tear in his tendon in the left front leg," trainer Randy Morse said. "I'm not sure how he did it, but I noticed some swelling in his leg (Monday) morning just before I was getting ready to work him. (Dr. Foster Northrop) did an ultrasound on him and the tear was noticed. On a grade of 100 percent, it's only about a five-percent tear, but he's too good a horse to take a chance with. It'll knock him out of action for about 90 days and then he should be as good as ever."

High Yield (Storm Cat), winner of the GI Hopeful, runner-up in the GI Hollywood Futurity and third in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile at two, zipped five furlongs in a bullet:59 at Gulfstream Park Monday morning. "It was an excellent work," Barry Knight, assistant to trainer D. Wayne Lukas, said. "It was even better than I expected. He really liked the track and he should be set for Saturday's stakes." The colt made his 2000 bow in the Jan. 30 GII Santa Catalina S., finishing second.

Trainer Elliott Walden confirmed vesterday that Elite Mercedes (Mercedes Won), last out winner of the Nov. 7 Rhythm S. during Breeders' Cup weekend, will make his 2000 bow in the Fountain of Youth. Purchased privately at the end of his two-year-old season, the colt is the son of the 1989 Florida Derby winner.

Several three-year-olds, weighing a run in either the Fountain of Youth or Saturday's Unbridled, a \$75,000 allowance at the same distance, worked Monday. Polish Miner (Danzig), second in the GIII Nashua S. and third in the GII Remsen S. last season, went five furlongs in 1:00 3/5. Also mulling their options are the connections of More Than Ready (Southern Halo), dead-heat winner of the Jan. 29 GII Hutcheson S., and Tahkodha Hills (Prospector's Halo), winner of the GIII What a Pleasure S. in his '99 finale and first in a Gulfstream allowance on his seasonal debut Jan. 15. More Than Ready went five furlongs in 1:01 3/5 at Hialeah, while Tahkodha Hills got the same distance in 1:00 4/5 at Calder.

When Royal Anthem annihilated the opposition in the G1 Juddmonte International last August with one of the most spectacular displays of 1999, his rider Gary Stevens warned: "I wouldn't expect his best races to come until early next year, as he's a late developer."

Judging by Royal Anthem's forceful display of superiority in the GI Gulfstream Park Breeders' Cup H. on Saturday, Stevens' prediction may well be about to come true. There is certainly reason to think that this very tall, good-looking horse is just the type to continue improving with age.

For a start, he is a son of Theatrical, a tall, leggy individual who didn't reveal the full extent of his talent until he was five. Not that Theatrical was a pushover as a younger horse. After winning his only start at two, he established his claims as an Epsom Derby contender by winning his first two races at three. Timeform, though, commented that "he seemed an active, highly strung sort with an awkward style of racing, tending to cock his head."

Sure enough, Theatrical sweated away his chance at Epsom, finishing a well-beaten seventh, and he also disappointed in two of his three subsequent appearances in 1985. However, on the occasion that he did show his form, he confirmed that he was very talented, running Law Society to half a length--after again looking a bit unbalanced under pressure--in the Irish Derby.

Theatrical somehow managed to go through the whole of 1986 without a win, despite being good enough to run Manila to a neck in a very hot Breeders' Cup Turf. Fortunately, we saw a very different Theatrical once he had fully acclimatized to American racing. He passed the post first in eight of his nine starts for Bill Mott in 1987, when the son of Nureyev thoroughly deserved his title of champion turf male.

Considering Theatrical's rangy physique, there was always a good chance that some of his progeny would also improve with age. While this is by no means a hard-and-fast rule, it is noticeable that several of his group or graded winners did not score their first major win until after the age of three, good examples being Yokohama (6), Dahlia's Dreamer (5), Pharma (5), Symphony Lady (5), Apolda (4), Duda (4) and Geri (4).

I don't want to give the impression that Theatrical's progeny aren't capable of very good form at two or three. His 1999 representatives included the two-year-old Group 3 winners Theoretically and Gaily Funky, and Royal Anthem was forward enough as a three-year-old to break a track record on his second start and to win a Group 2 event on his third. It is just that some of the Theatricals clearly appreciate the sort of patient approach that Allen Paulson has often allowed the progeny of Brookside Farms' star stallion.

It shouldn't be forgotten that Royal Anthem's broodmare sire, Ack Ack, was another champion who saved the best until last. His five-year-old campaign brought in more money than his previous three years combined, and he claimed three awards--Horse of the Year, Best Handicap Horse and Best Sprinter.

Royal Anthem also has an award-winning dam, as he is a son of John Franks' In Neon, named 1998 Kentucky Broodmare of the Year. Franks bought In Neon--a stakes winner over 8 1/2 furlongs as a five-year-old--in a private deal after she was bought back for \$160,000 at Keeneland's 1993 November Breeding Stock Sale.

The Storm Cat foal she was carrying at the time proved to be Sharp Cat, a winner of no fewer than seven Grade I events, and In Neon is also the dam of Star Recruit, a three-time Grade III winner by Al Nasr (Fr). Significantly, all three of her graded winners are by grandsons of Northern Dancer.

SURFSIDE, WAR CHANT TOP DERBY FUTURE **POOL** The field for Pool 1 of the 2000 Kentucky Derby Future Wager was announced vesterday, with the undefeated War Chant (Danzig) and top filly Surfside (Seattle Slew) heading the roster. War Chant, a five-length allowance winner at Santa Anita Jan. 16, has yet to make his stakes debut after skipping Saturday's Golden State Mile, while Surfside picked up her third Grade I win in Sunday's Las Virgenes S. Both have been rated at 8-1 by oddsmaker Mike Battaglia. Archer City Slew (Slew City Slew), winner of the Feb. 5 Gll San Vicente S. at 9-1, was a late addition to the list after the undefeated Summer Note (Notebook), dead-heat winner of the GII Hutcheson S., was knocked out by a tendon injury. The first Future Wager pool opens at noon, Thursday, Feb. 17 and runs through 4:30 p.m. on

Tax Cut Could Mean £10 Billion to UK Racing:

The Levy Board's Bookmakers' Committee presented a plan to Chancellor Gordon Brown which would double UK betting turnover and increase racing's levy income by nearly 50 percent, according to yesterday's Racing Post. The committee projected a three-percent cut of the betting duty could help make the country the world's off-shore gambling centre. The market research firm MMD estimated that world-wide gambling could reach £638 billion next year. At current rates, MMD projected that £68 billion will be wagered world-wide via telephone or Internet and that £3 billion of that market could be expected to originate in the UK. But with competitive tax rates, the report finds, an extra £10 billion of that market could find its way to the UK. The current rate of duty is 6.75 percent. "Given a competitive tax environment, UK bookmakers would be well placed to take advantage of this growth, but careful consideration will need to be given to the environment within which they operate," the Post quotes MMD researchers as saying. "As an increasing number of UK gamblers become accustomed to betting offshore, primarily via the telephone, thought should be given, not only to ways to stem these outflows, but also to the potential for attracting foreign gambling turnover to the UK. The final key determinant of success in this market is the need for a regime of low taxes."

Webber & Sherwood to Face Jockev Club Hearing:

Trainers Paul Webber and Oliver Sherwood will face a Jockey Club inquiry in connection with a High Court ruling that found the pair engaged in collusive bidding to persuade a buyer to pay more than a horse was worth at the Doncaster Spring Sales in 1995. The disciplinary hearing will take place to see whether the two men have broken Jockey Club Rule 220 (iii). The Rule states "No person shall act in a manner which, in the opinion of the stewards of the Jockey Club, is prejudicial to the integrity, proper conduct or good reputation of horseracing in Great Britain whether or not such conduct shall constitute a breach of any of the foregoing orders or rules of racing." No date has been set for the hearing but it is likely to happen next month. Webber and Sherwood have strongly protested their innocence.

Racing to Receive Tax Revenues:

Irish Finance Minister Charlie McCreevy announced that the entire proceeds from the recently cut off-course betting tax would be given to the country's racing and greyhound industries, according to Racing Post. McCreevy's announcement, which was made Sunday at Punchestown, will likely double Irish racing's income. In 1999, the off-course tax generated Ir£53 million. In comparison, government grants to the industry reached nearly Ir£20 million. The proposal is contingent upon a merger between the Irish Horseracing Authority, the Turf Club and the Association of Irish Racecourses. "Never again will there be a minister for finance and a minister for agriculture who are both so committed to racing," McCreevy said. "I would be terribly disappointed if the people involved in the integration were not prepared to move considerably on it. Indeed that would be unpardonable."
