SOARING SOFTLY OFFICIALLY RETIRED

It has been officially announced that 1999 champion turf mare Soaring Softly (Kris S .-- Wings of Grace, by Key To The Mint) will not race again and will be bred this season to Storm Cat. Owned by the Phillips Racing Partnership and bred by the Galbreath/Phillips Racing Partnership, the five-year-old switched to the turf to win seven of eight starts in 1999. She stamped herself a major force with a 5 1/2-length victory in the GII Sheepshead Bay H. and followed up with a nose victory in the GII New York H. Shortened up in distance for the nine-furlong GII Diana, the chestnut could manage only a fourth-place finish, but concluded her season with back-to-backvictories in the GI Flower Bowl and a 3/4-length success in the inaugural Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Turf in what would be her final start Nov. 6. Owner John Phillips indicated that a soft-tissue injury contributed to the decision to retire the mare. "If she were not a champion, I would take another shot with her," Phillips told Blood-Horse Online. Soaring Softly retires with nine wins from 16 starts and earnings of \$1,270,433.

NUREYEV'S BREEDING SEASON DELAYED

Walmac International leading sire Nureyev (Northern Dancer) is being treated for a circulatory problem in his hind quarters and will not begin the 2000 breeding season. Dr. J. D. Howard, the resident veterinarian at Walmac, described the condition of the 23-year-old stallion as guarded. Howard told Blood-Horse Online, "While the chances for recovery are unknown at this time, we are optimistic that he will be able to return to stallion duties at a later date. He's not ready to quit yet." The sire of 111 stakes winners, Nureyev was scheduled to breed a full book of mares this year.

"I thought it was awful fast but the clockers told me not to worry that everybody was working fast today. I'll just gallop him up to the race now."

Trainer Ralph Ziadie reports that Tahkodha Hills (Prospectors Halo) will likely skip the Fountain of Youth and run instead in an allowance. "As long as it goes, that's definitely where I'll go," Ziadie said of the allowance.

SISTER ACT RETIRED Sister Act (Saint Ballado--La Ice Queen, by Icecapade), who scored a 1/2-length victory over last year's champion older female Beautiful Pleasure in the GI Hempstead at Belmont, has been retired from racing. She has been sent to Taylor Made Farm in Kentucky, but no breeding plans have been released as yet, though Deputy Minister and Storm Cat are under consideration, according to Daily Racing Form. The winner of her first four career starts in 1998, including the GIII La Troienne, the five-year-old also won the Oaklawn Breeders' Cup and was second to Banshee Breeze in the GI Apple Blossom last year. Campaigned by Dwight and Perry Sutherland, Sister Act retires with seven victories in 13 career starts and earnings of \$579,394.

Bond Duo Works at Payson:

Stablemates Behrens (Pleasant Colony) and Pleasant Breeze (Pleasant Tap) both worked at Payson Park Monday. Behrens breezed five furlongs in 1:02 3/5 while Pleasant Breeze went three-quarters of a mile in 1:16 4/5. "They both worked good," said trainer Jim Bond. "There is no guarantee on where they'll start next. We're looking at the (Feb. 26 GI) Gulfstream Park H. as well as races in New Orleans and California for both of them. We'll just see how they continue to work and see how things work out."

First American Retired:

First American (Quiet American--In Jubilation, by Isgala), winner of last year's GIII Flamingo S., has been retired from racing after a suffering a leg injury while running eighth in the GI Donn H. The four-year-old has a lesion in the suspensory of his right front leg. "It isn't life threatening, but it will take six to eight months to heal and then another four months to get him back to the races," explained trainer Eduardo Caramori. "Then there is no guarantee he will be the same horse he was before." First American retires with two wins in 13 starts and earned \$259,215.

A Florida real estate firm has entered into a tentative agreement to purchase Garden State Park, according to *Thoroughbred Times*. Graded Stakes Committee Issues Rulings:

The American Graded Stakes Committee has reviewed a pair of graded stakes events to determine whether the races, which were taken off the turf, would retain their graded status. The committee resolved that the Grade III status of The Very One H. at Gulfstream Park would not be reinstated, while the Tanforan H. at Bay Meadows should be recognized as a Grade III event. The result of a policy change in 1998, a graded race taken off the turf and run over the main track is automatically downgraded for that specific running. The committee reserves the right to reinstate the original grade following a review.

ARC DAY TOPS EUROPE Louis Romanet, Director General of France Galop, announced yesterday that the card on Arc Day will be Europe's richest raceday with FF15,830,000 in prizemoney on offer, putting it ahead of Derby Day at Epsom and King George Day at Ascot. First run in 1920, the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe will celebrate its 80th anniversary on Sunday, October 1 this year and will have a total value of FF10.5 million, with a first place prize of FF6 million. Thanks to the sponsorship contract signed with the Group Lucien Barriere, this represents a 50 percent increase over the last two years. Group Lucien Barriere ranks first in the casino and luxury hotel market in France and will once again sponsor the whole Arc weekend, as well as Arc trial weekend three weeks beforehand. Arc day itself will also score another notable European first when Longchamp hosts five Group 1 races. This is due to the upgrading of the G2 Prix de l'Opera to G1 status and the transfer of the G1 Prix du Cadran from its usual Saturday slot. France Galop also announced race names in full, incorporating their Group Lucien Barriere suffix. They are the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe-Lucien Barriere (value FF10,500,000), the G1 Prix Marcel Boussac-Criterium des Pouliches-Royal Barriere (FF1,360,000), the G1 Prix de l'Opera-Hotel du Lac Barriere (FF1,190,000), the G1 Prix de l'Abbave de Longchamp-Majestic Barriere (FF850,000), the G1 Prix du Cadran-Fouquet's Barriere (FF850,000), the G2 Prix du Rond Point-Casino La Rochelle Barriere (FF680,000) and a valuable handicap, the Prix de la Place Vendome (FF400,000).

Isca Retired:

Dual Group One-winning sprinter Isca (Aus) (Rory's Jester {Aus}) has been retired after her inglorious effort in last Sunday's G1 Lightning S. over 1000 meters at Flemington. She won the previous edition of the Lightning before claiming the G1Newmarket H. over 1200 meters at Flemington. Trainer Hayes said the filly's poor performance at the weekend confirmed that she had suffered permanent lung damage from a respiratory illness last spring when she finished second last in the Manikato S. at Moonee Valley. "Physically and healthwise I thought she was as good as she's ever been, maybe better, but we were always concerned how she'd go under 100 percent pressure (in the Lightning)," Hayes said. "I was really happy with her going into the race, all her work at Lindsay Park had been good, but when the pressure came on there was nothing there. I would say her lungs have suffered permanent damage and that she has scar tissue." Isca was unbeaten in five starts as a three-year-old and ended her career with six wins, a second and a third and earnings of \$A647,825. The bay filly was bred by Robert Sangster's Swettenham Stud and raced in his colours, and will likely be covered by either Danehill (USA) or Zabeel (NZ).
