ELEVEN COLTS IN THE FOUNTAIN

Saturday's GI Fountain of Youth S. at Gulfstream Park has attracted 11 three-year-olds, but will be run without the two colts who excited fans with a dead-heat win in the race's local prep, the GII Hutcheson S. Summer Note (Notebook) will miss the Fountain of Youth with injury, while More than Ready (Southern Halo) will likely aim for the GII Louisiana Derby. In their absence, Greenwood Lake (Meadowlake) and High Yield (Storm Cat) will look to add to the Grade I success each enjoyed last year, Greenwood Lake, winner of the GI Champagne S., but an uninspired sixth in his three-year-old debut in the Jan. 15 GIII Holy Bull S., drew post position three at yesterday's draw. Gl Hopeful winner High Yield will break from post four. Former claimer Un Fino Vino (Demidoff), twice graded stakes placed, opened 2000 with a win in a Jan. 29 allowance. "Hey, sometimes you get lucky in this game and we certainly got lucky claiming him," said trainer Mitch Friedman who claimed Un Fino Vino for \$50,000 last August at Saratoga. "He really muscled up for us since and has gotten really good. His dam (Flowers and Vines) is a full sister to that top stakes-winning filly Blushing K.D., so he has a license to be a good horse. We're going to start finding out just how good." Ben the Man (Gulch) will try to justify his \$1.25 million yearling price tag with a first stakes win. The colt gets blinkers for the first time Saturday. "I put blinkers on him because I thought he would be more focused on his running," explained trainer Joe Orseno. "He's been working well with them and I'll use them on him in the Fountain of Youth." Ben the Man will break from the rail. After a week-long debate, Shug McGaughey entered Polish Miner (Danzig) in Saturday's Grade I race. "I think that's where he belongs," the trainer explained. "He's been training fine and I just galloped him a mile and a half today. He's ready." The colt, winner of a Jan. 29 Gulfstream allowance, drew post nine. The Fountain of Youth will be televised live on ESPN from 5-5:30 p.m. EST.

2000 WOODBINE SCHEDULE ANNOUNCED The

Ontario Jockey Club has unveiled the richest stakes schedule in Woodbine Thoroughbred history. A total of 103 stakes, worth over C\$16 million, will be offered during the 166-day meeting which runs from Apr. 1 through Dec. 3. Highlighting the season will be the June 25 running of the Queen's Plate, worth \$1 million this year, and the fillies' equivalent, the June 10 \$500,000 Canadian Oaks. The Breeders' S., final leg of the Canadian Triple Crown, will be run Aug. 12 and will be worth \$500,000. The \$1 million GI Atto Mile will be run Sept. 10. The richest race on the program is the 63rd running of the \$1.5 million GI Canadian International on Oct. 15. The race is part of the World Series of Racing Championship, sponsored by Emirates Airlines. On the International undercard is the \$500,000 E. P. Taylor S. for fillies and mares on the turf.

BREEDERS' CUP RELEASES 2000 ROSTER

Breeders' Cup Limited officials yesterday released the entire 2000 National Stakes schedule, which features 54 graded races and more than \$16.5 million in purses. The program, in its fifth year, offers a total of 90 stakes at 43 tracks in the U.S. and Canada. Breeders' Cup has committed \$6,070,000 in purses and awards to the enterprise this year. The upcoming Grade I races included on the calendar are the May 28 Milady Breeders' Cup H., June 4 Gamely Breeders' Cup H. and June 18 Shoemaker Breeders' Cup Mile at Hollywood Park; the Sept. 10 Garden City Breeders' Cup H. at Belmont Park; and the Sept. 23 Mazarine Breeders' Cup S. and Oct. 9 Grey Breeders' Cup S. at Woodbine.

Fan Wagers \$51,000 in Derby Future Wager:

An unidentified fan wagered \$51,000 on the field yesterday during the opening session of the Kentucky Derby Future Wager at Churchill Downs Sports Spectrum. The anonymous bettor received the nickname the Lone Star Plunger after wagering \$10,000 on the field, which included eventual Derby winner Charismatic, last year at Lone Star Park. "Some people speculate on agriculture and precious metal futures, but I speculate on Kentucky Derby futures," said the bettor in a phone interview from the Spectrum. "This could be a saver bet for me. This is not the first or the last wager that I'll make on this year's Derby. There will be some excellent prices on the horses and this bet, in part, will help make those prices." The \$51,000 wager, his winnings from last year, dropped the odds on the field from 9-5 to 1-9.

Jockey Yutaka Take, Japan's top rider for the past eight seasons, will ship his tack to California full time, it has been reported. The 30-year-old is expected to begin riding in the U.S. in June and Ron Anderson, agent for the now-retired Gary Stevens, will book his mounts.

SWINBURN TO RETURN? Walter Swinburn, who hung up his helmet in August, 1998, may be getting ready to make his comeback, according to the Thoroughbred Times on-line. The 38-year-old jockey, who rode his first winner at Kempton Park in 1978, went on to capture more than a dozen European Classics, taking the the G1 Epsom Derby aboard Shergar (Ire). Shahrastani (GB) and Lammtarra (USA) and the Irish Derby with Shahrastani and Shareef Dancer (USA). Swinburn was badly injured in a spill at Hong Kong's Sha Tin racecourse on 11th February, 1996, suffering multiple skull fractures, but made a near miraculous return that August and ended the season in triumph, guiding 13-1 Pilsudski (Ire) to a 1 1/4-length victory over Singspiel (Ire) in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf at Woodbine. The Irishman rode sparingly thereafter and, despite taking the G1 Heinz 57 Phoenix S. in August, 1998, for trainer Aidan O'Brien, called it guits just days later, citing weight problems. But it has been reported that Swinburn has been seen on the Newmarket gallops. His father, former top jockey Wally Swinburn, told Thoroughbred Times, "We certainly hope he will be back." Added trainer Jeremy Noseda, "He rode out for me last Saturday and he is more than welcome any time he wants to ride. Walter is as talented a rider as there is. His skills have not deserted him and there are few better big-race iockevs than him."

DAM OF DR DEVIOUS DEAD Rose Of Jericho (USA) (Alleged {USA}), whose first foal was Irish champion sprinter Archway (Ire) (Thatching {Ire}) and whose second was 1992 G1 Epsom Derby hero Dr Devious (Ire) (Ahonoora {GB}), suffered complications after foaling a filly by Danehill (USA) at Ireland's Coolmore Stud and died, the *Thoroughbred Times* reports. The foal is healthy. Herself unraced, the 16-year-old Rose Of Jericho also produced Japanese stakes winner Shinko King (Ire) (Fairy King {USA}) and British Group 3 winner Royal Court (Ire) (Sadler's Wells {USA}). Dr Devious, a champion at three in Britain, also numbered the G1 Dewhurst S. and G1 Irish Champion S. among his victories and was the runner-up in the G1 Irish Derby.

SIR ALAN BUDD TO CHAIR GAMBLING REVIEW

The Home Secretary Jack Straw Wednesday revealed that Sir Alan Budd is to chair its previously announced review of British gambling legislation. Budd is former chief economic adviser to the Treasury and a member of the Monetary Policy Committee. Discussing the review, Straw said: "This will be a comprehensive review taking into account a wide range of issues, from the growth in e-commerce and technology, to the social impact, costs and benefits of gambling. The review will help shape and inform future gambling legislation which will balance the interests of business with a responsibility to protect the public." It is expected that the review body will commence work shortly after Easter and report back to ministers in the summer of 2001.

WRITERS UP

THE BETTING MAN'S TRAINER By Martin Pearce

Newmarket trainer Sir Mark Prescott is a hero to owner and punter alike. His only enemies would appear to be the bookmakers.

Last year in Britain, Prescott's 50-horse Heath House stable won 77 races, a new mark for the trainer. Even more significantly, those 77 wins came from just 330 starters, a strike rate of 23 percent, comfortably the highest for a stable of that size in the country. Only Godolphin's trainer Saeed bin Suroor, with 33 percent, Irish trainer Aidan O'Brien with 25 percent and Henry Cecil with 24 percent could boast better records.

Of particular satisfaction to Prescott was the fact that he was able to win with 40 individual horses in his stable and, amongst his 30 juveniles, there were 15 individual winners of 30 races.

Prescott has earned the reputation of being one of the most skillful members of his profession at placing his horses. His owners know that their horses are being given every chance of winning and, at the same time, the betting public knows that every Prescott runner will give them a serious run for their money.

Prescott also has the distinction of being the longestserving trainer in Newmarket, having started 31 years ago when he had 25 horses in his stable. He has succeeded several remarkable trainers at Heath House, most notably the great Matthew Dawson, who trained there for 20 years and produced a whole host of Classic winners, including the Epsom Derby heros Kingcraft, Silvio and Melton, as well as the incomparable 1884 Ascot Gold Cup winner St Simon.

Prescott has watched the cast of characters change. "There were 66 trainers in Newmarket seven years ago. Thirty-three of them have come and gone. However the top echelon have remained, and we also have several very promising younger trainers beginning to make their mark, too. There is a very competitive pool, more competitive than 10 years ago," he said.

Explaining his own run of success, Prescott commented, "I have better horses these days than I used to. Owners like Kirsten Rausing, Cheveley Park Stud and Hesmonds Stud are sending me some of their nicer homebred horses, while some of my smaller owners have formed partnerships and gone to the sales and bought better horses. All this has gradually given me more fire power.

"Another major reason is that I have a horse for nearly every race in the country, no matter the class and type of race. A trainer like Henry Cecil will probably only aim at 50 percent of the races...I have a wide breadth of horse and owner in my stable."

This point is well illustrated by the number of horses he is able to run at the all-weather tracks at Lingfield, Southwell and Wolverhampton.

"My stable is now in action all year round," Prescott said. "Trainers like myself will run our horses if the races are there. My only complaint about all-weather racing is that there is not enough of it towards the end of the year. I think there should be an all-weather meeting every day when there is no turf racing."

Prescott also credits his choice of stable jockeys for his prosperity. When Alborada battled home to win the G1 Dubai Champion S. at Newmarket for the second year running last October, the cheers which greeted the victory were as much for her trainer and for the horse herself as for her rider, the veteran George Duffield.

Bucking the present trend employed by most trainers of using freelancers, Prescott has three stable riders-the rising star Seb Sanders; Colin Nutter, who also happens to be the head lad at Heath House and the man to whom Prescott listens more than anyone else when it comes to his horses; and the evergreen Duffield.

"I've said this many times before: George Duffield seems to be getting better with age. He is the longest serving rider in the weighing room and is also the strongest. I don't believe any other rider presently riding would have won the (G1) Racing Post Trophy last October on Aidan O'Brien's Aristotle, not even Michael Kinane. George is the best jockey in the world for that lazy, laid-back type of horse," Prescott said.

Despite his 31 years in racing, Prescott makes a point of steering clear of the politics. His reaction to decisions made by the British Horseracing Board and the Jockey Club is simple. "They make the rules and I'll get round them. Racing politics are not my province--I leave that to others. My sole duty is to my owners.

"However, I have to say that the sport is grossly underfunded compared to many others. Everyone involved in racing seems to be working infinitely harder but for less reward these days, but at the same time most of us enjoy doing it. Stable staff are paid more these days, but they do have to work much harder.

"Next summer, there will be 150 consecutive days racing at one stage. Sunday racing has meant that the quality of life for many people in the game has diminished. Everybody needs a day off."

But if there is racing anywhere on any day, Prescott will be looking for opportunities for his horses. His owners and the betting man, and woman, expect it of him.
