STORM CAT BACK AT OVERBROOK

1999 Leading General Sire Storm Cat (Storm Bird) has returned to Overbrook Farm after being treated for a minor problem at the Hagyard-Davidson-McGee clinic, various sources reported yesterday. The 17-year-old horse was taken to the clinic Tuesday after showing signs of a fever, and was diagnosed with a "moderate bowel inflammation." It is unknown when he will return to the breeding shed. "Yes, it was a [precaution] initially, but obviously it was a real illness, not the suspicion of one," Overbrook adviser Ric Waldman told *The Blood Horse*. "Any time a horse has to go to a vet clinic, one becomes concerned. And you can multiply the concern with which horse it is. Storm Cat would be at the top of the scale, while our teaser is at the bottom of the scale."

HOPE SPRINGS ETERNAL IN FOUNTAIN With just over two months remaining until the first Saturday in May, the eyes of the racing world will turn to southern Florida as 11 contenders duke it out in the year's first Grade I event for sophomores when Gulfstream hosts the 54th running of the Fountain of Youth. High Yield (Storm Cat) ships in from California for the first confrontation between East and West. The chestnut colt, second in his last outing to The Deputy in the GII Santa Catalina Jan. 30, returns to the site of his thirdplace finish in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile last November. The Lewis/Magnier/Tabor colorbearer recorded a bullet five furlongs in :59 on Valentine's Day in preparation for the Fountain of Youth. Greenwood Lake (Meadowlake), a finalist for the Eclipse Award, will be seeking redemption following a punchless sixth at 6-5 in the GIII Holy Bull Jan. 15, where he finished 11 1/2 lengths behind front-running Hal's Hope (Jolie's Halo). Un Fino Vino (Demidoff), beaten only a head by Greenwood Lake in the GII Remsen at Aqueduct in November, captured an allowance over this surface Jan. 29 in his seasonal bow. Personal First (Personal Hope) was wide throughout in the Holy Bull, but captured a pair of stakes events at two, including a four-length triumph in the Turfway Park Prevue S. Dec. 26. Favorably drawn here in post five, he should be able to use his positional speed to advantage. Recent Kentucky Derby winners who prepped in the Fountain of Youth are Thunder Gulch, Go for Gin and Unbridled.

FULL FIELD FOR FRITCHIE

A full field of 14 distaff sprinters will go postward in Laurel's GII Barbara Fritchie H., with a pair of Argentinebred mares headlining. Speeding Star (Arg) (Fitzcarraldo {Arg}), a Group 1 winner in her native land, recorded an evecatching victory in her Northern Hemisphere debut as the even-money chalk in a money allowance at Gulfstream Jan. 19. Defending champion Passeggiata (Arg) (Samoan) defeated Catinca in last year's renewal and was a game winner of the Francis Scott Key S. over this surface Jan. 22. Rills (Clever Trick) blossomed late in her sophomore season, defeating Passeggiata by four lengths in the Contrary Rose S. at Laurel Dec. 4. In her most recent outing, the dark bay finished fourth in the Gill Interborough H. at Aqueduct Jan. 1. Her She Kisses (Dehere) will make her first start on the East Coast for new trainer Phil Johnson. The bay filly finished second in each of her two California starts for trainer D. Wayne Lukas, including a one-length loss to Olympic Charmer in the GII El Encino S. at Santa Anita Jan. 16.

BEAUTIFUL PLEASURE MAY RETURN IN RAM-

PART Newly crowned champion older female Beautiful Pleasure (Maudlin) could begin the defense of her title in the GII Rampart H. at Gulfstream on Feb. 27. "She's been training beautifully here at Palm Beach Downs for us," Donna Ward, wife of trainer John Ward, said. "She really enjoyed her time off after the Breeders' Cup and now that she's been back in training she's kicking the barn down. She looks good, although she might have just a little bit of fat on her. But, she's really feeling fresh." The Florida-bred mare captured three Grade I events in her championship season. "We would like to run her in the Rampart, but the main thing that would stop us is how much weight she would have to carry," said Ward. "It's the beginning of a new season and we wouldn't want to start the year off having her saddled with a lot of weight. If we do [run], then we'll ride Jorge Chavez."

More Than Ready To Swale S.:

After skipping today's GI Fountain of Youth S., More Than Ready (Southern Halo) will instead point to the GIII Swale S. on the GI Florida Derby undercard Mar. 11. The three-year-old came back after nearly four months off to win the Jan. 29 GII Hutcheson S., dead-heating with the now injured Summer Note. Trainer Todd Pletcher told the Daily Racing Form, "I'd really like to get (More Than Ready) to the (Kentucky) Derby with just three starts and not four, and if I ran him (in the Fountain of Youth), I'd probably have to come back with another race before the Blue Grass. Now I'll just run him in the Swale and the Blue Grass. I believe having two races at seven-eighths builds a lot better foundation for stretching a horse out around two turns than just one. And, if he wants to run long, that should do it."

Racing Cancelled in Northeast:

Old Man Winter reared his ugly head in the northeast yesterday, forcing the cancellation of racing at Aqueduct, Laurel, Philadelphia Park, Penn National and Charles Town. The storm dropped two to four inches of snow, which then turned to freezing rain and ice. Racing is scheduled to resume at all tracks today, but live racing at Suffolk Downs was cancelled.

Churchill Downs Sells Portion of Hoosier Park:

Churchill Downs Inc. announced Friday that Churchill Downs Management Company has sold a 26 percent interest in Hoosier Park to Indiana-based Centaur Inc. Purchase price for the interest is \$8.5 million. The transaction is subject to certain closing conditions, including approval by the Indiana Horse Racing Commission and other regulatory agencies. "Having more of Hoosier Park's ownership controlled by Indiana-based entities was a major consideration in our decision to accept Centaur's offer," said Thomas H. Meeker, president and CEO of Churchill Downs Inc. "Our key objective is to ensure the long-term stability of the track and Indiana horse racing."

Polar Expedition Still Going:

Three-time Illinois Horse of the Year Polar Expedition (Kodiack) breezed a half in :51 on Wednesday at Oaklawn Park in Hot Springs, Arkansas. The nine-year-old has not started since May 1998, when he captured the GIII National Jockey Club H. Overall, the multiple graded-stakes winner has earned \$1,488,635 in his career.

Underwood over six panels at Hollywood Dec. 4 before concluding his four-year-old campaign with a second going a flat mile to Elaborate in the restricted Ack Ack S. at Santa Anita Dec. 27. Training strongly for his 2000 bow, the chestnut tracked Opine (Pine Bluff) through the early fractions, angled out four wide for the stretch drive and wore down Invitato Mio for the victory as the second choice. 4-5 chalk Lake William (Salt Lake) was rank in the early going and weakened to sixth.

Triple Crown Trail:

Today's third race at Santa Anita features several highly regarded sophomores stepping into allowance company. Among the runners for the 1 1/16-mile test are a pair from Neil Drysdale's barn, Fusaichi Pegasus (Mr. Prospector), a \$4 million yearling and Toqueville (French Deputy). Lining up from the Baffert squadron is Tribunal (Deputy Minister), a \$1.8 million purchase.

NTRA Names Avioli Deputy Commissioner and COO:

The National Thoroughbred Racing Association announced the promotion of Gregory C. Avioli from Senior Vice President-Business Affairs to Deputy Commissioner and Chief Operating Officer. Avioli replaces Joseph A. Bailey III as the NTRA's number two executive. "Greg's promotion is richly deserved," said NTRA Commissioner Tim Smith. "He brought first-rate legal advice skills and six years of sports marketing and television experience to the NTRA, and has quickly learned a tremendous amount about the industry."

First Quarter Meeting for NTRA Board:

The National Thoroughbred Racing Association held its first-quarter board meeting in Hallandale, Florida Friday. Directors Robert Clay and Alan Foreman were reelected to three-year terms. Plans for upcoming elections for directors representing NTRA-member racetracks in the South and West regions were approved to replace retiring board members Doug Donn and R. D. Hubbard. A \$30.7 million operating budget was approved for 2000, including more than \$19 million in combined NTRA marketing and television expenditures and \$2.2 million earmarked for the reduction of the NTRA's start-up operating deficit. The 2000 television schedule was also reviewed, with the possible addition of a series for two-year-olds beginning in late summer.

DARK HORSES FOR 2000

Coming up with a list of dark horses from Ireland's juvenile class of 1999 is no easy task. Not since the heady days of the late '70s, when Vincent O'Brien dominated the scene, has the two-year-old division become the domain of one man. Namesake Aidan (no relation) was supreme in the way he placed his powerful team of youngsters, with Group 1 wins in England with Aristotle (Ire) (Sadler's Wells {USA}); and in France with Giant's Causeway (USA) (Storm Cat {USA}), Ciro (USA) (Woodman {USA}) and the now-retired Fasliyev (USA) (Nureyev {USA}), as well as at home with Fasliyev. Ireland's champion trainer won a staggering 54 of 148 domestic two-year-old races last season, a 36-percent strike rate, and still has a well of relatively unexposed talent based at his all-conquering stable.

But, believe it or not, there is more than one trainer based in Ireland and this list will also try to identify some horses that may emerge from the shadows of Ballydoyle to stake their claim for honours.

ADMIRAL'S CUP (IRE), c, 3, Bluebird (USA)--Flying Fairy (GB), by Bustino (GB).

He has to be better on good going and should be effective at around a mile and, quite possibly, further.

So far, the Niarchos bred has done nothing wrong, winning a seven-furlong Leopardstown maiden at his only attempt in great style, with both he and the promising runner-up pulling 10 lengths clear of the third-place finisher.
