SEE HOW SHE RUNS

Off at 32-1 in her last appearance at Gulfstream Park, Cash Run (Seeking the Gold) turned back a challenge from champion Chilukki to win the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies by 1 1/4 lengths. The Padua Stables colorbearer disappointed as the odds-on favorite in her next two, but redeemed herself at Gulfstream yesterday afternoon, galloping to a seven-length victory as the 2-1 second choice in the GII Davona Dale S. "She was pretty strong all the way," regular rider Jerry Bailey said. "We got hung out a little wide, but with the post (number 9) I kind of thought that would happen. I guess this showed that the Breeders' Cup was not a fluke." People were beginning to wonder if that was the case after the \$1.2 million Keeneland July yearling finished second at 4-5 in the Nov. 27 GIII Golden Rod S. and fourth, beaten 12 3/4 lengths, at 9-10 in the Jan. 23 GII Santa Ynez S. But trainer D. Wayne Lukas insisted his charge had an excuse for that last performance. "I was disappointed in her fourth-place finish in California, but the next day she came down with a slight temperature and I think maybe that was affecting her during the race," he said. "This is a very underrated filly." As for what's next, Lukas said, "We'll keep her right here at Gulfstream and run her in the Bonnie Miss (GII, Mar. 16)." The 8-5 favorite in the Davona Dale, two-time Gulfstream allowance winner Secret Status (A.P. Indy) trailed early, but finished well to get third, a nose behind Regally Appealing (Valid Appeal). ROYAL ANTHEM DUBAI BOUND

GI Gulfstream Park Breeders' Cup winner Royal Anthem (Theatrical {Ire}) will make his next appearance in the \$2 million G3 Dubai Sheema Classic over the Nad al Sheba turf Mar. 25, Racing Post reports. Now trained in the U.S. by Bill Mott, the five-year-old, winner of the G1 Juddmonte International S. at York and runner-up to Daylami (Ire) in last year's GI Breeders' Cup Turf at Gulfstream, will ship to the Middle East Mar. 12. Mott told Racing Post, "We're actually playing into their hands in this race. I think we have the best dirt horses in the States, so the European and Middle East horses have to adapt to our game in the World Cup. But by and large, Europe and the Middle East have the best turf horses and many have been training in Dubai since October. It's a similar situation to when the Europeans run in the Breeders' Cup."

CENTER STAGE AT SANTA ANITA

Starting the new year as she ended the last, Show Me the Stage (Slew the Surgeon) led nearly every step through rapid fractions to win vesterday's GIII Las Flores H. at Santa Anita. The four-year-old was all over the country last year, taking the Jan. 10 Black Gold H. over the boys at Fair Grounds; the Apr. 8 America's First Ladies H. at Oaklawn Park; and the June 12 GIII Azalea Breeders' Cup S. and the July 31 Turf Sprint H., this time beating colts on the grass, at Calder. The speedy miss also raced unsuccessfully at Lone Star Park and Belmont Park and was third in the Nov. 5 Love's Exchange S. at Gulfstream Park during a campaign that ended with back-to-back wins in the Dec. 4 Dr. A.B. Leggio H. at Fair Grounds and the off-the-turf Dec. 31 Monrovia H. at Santa Anita. Staying put for a change, the dark bay made her 2000 debut as the 7-5 chalk. She dashed right to the front over the wet-fast surface, zipped through a guarter in :21.09 and a half in :43.88 and had enough left to draw off late, besting 5-1 Theresa's Tizzy (Cee's Tizzy) by three lengths. "She doesn't need a muddy track to win, but it helps," trainer Eric Guillot said of the Cal-bred filly who is now a perfect four-for-four on wet tracks. "Now she's got 11 stakes wins. She's explosive." Added jockey Kent Desormeaux, who was picking up his third consecutive Santa Anita stakes win, "She won this race in the second 100 yards. She got out to the front and I was just holding onto the knot in my reins. Then I chirped once when (Theresa's Tizzy) came up to her and she absolutely took off...she was gone. She has scintillating speed." Looking ahead, Guillot said, "We'll go back home now and run in the Victoria Lass (Mar. 18, Fair Grounds) and then the Humana Distaff (at Churchill Downs) on Kentucky Derby Day."

Affirmed Success, last-out winner of the GI Cigar Mile at Agueduct Nov. 27, will most likely be the heavy favorite to begin his 2000 campaign on a winning note. With regular jockey Jorge Chavez coming in from Florida for the ride, the six-year-old gelding could send his career earnings over the \$1 million mark. Providing the main opposition will be the fast but inconsistent Black Cash, owned by Frank Stronach. The six-length winner of the GIII Hall of Fame Breeders' Cup H. at Thistledown last year has started over the Aqueduct inner track in his last two and finished fourth both times, in a Dec. 17 allowance and the Jan. 22 GIII Agueduct H. Wise Dusty is nine years old, but doing better than ever. He missed by a neck when fourth in the Northern Wolf S. at Laurel Jan. 8 and overcame a terrible trip to be second in the Feb. 5 Hoover S. last time out.

CHEROKEE RUN COLT TOPS FASIG-TIPTON

PREVIEW A colt by Cherokee Run out of Marital Spook (Silver Ghost), selling as Hip #272, smoked a furlong in :10 flat to top yesterday's Under Tack Show for the Fasig-Tipton Calder Selected Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale. Consigned by Niall Brennan Stables, agent, the dark bay is out of a half sister to GISW Prenup, MGSW Honor The Hero and SW and GSP Capitalimprovement. A colt by Storm Creek worked the fastest quarter at the preview, getting the distance in :21 2/5. Named Storm Book, the son of stakes-placed Labiblica (Nasty and Bold) sells as Hip #248 for Mark Casse, agent. A total of 331 juveniles have been catalogued for the sale, which will be held Feb. 28-29. A second Under Tack Show is scheduled for Feb. 27 at Calder, beginning at 10 a.m.

AQUEDUCT CANCELS AFTER THREE RACES

Live racing at Aqueduct in New York was canceled after the third race yesterday due to poor track conditions caused by rain and snow in the area Friday and early Saturday. The featured race, the \$75,000 Hollie Hughes H. for New York breds at six furlongs, will be reopened to nominations, re-drawn and run Sunday, Feb. 27. Racing is expected to resume for today's holiday card.

FIELD FAVORED AS FUTURE POOL ONE

CLOSES Kentucky Derby Future Wager Pool 1 closed vesterday with the mutuel field a strong favorite among the 24 betting interests. Consisting of all three-year-olds other than the 23 individual Kentucky Derby betting interests named, the mutuel field closed as the 7-2 favorite. The odds had been as low as 1-9 in early wagering when an anonymous fan placed a \$51,000 bet on the field. Of the individual betting interests, Greenwood Lake (Meadowlake), a closing fourth in Saturday's GI Fountain of Youth S., closed at 9-1 while winner High Yield (Storm Cat) closed at 14-1 after opening at 15-1. Second among the individual choices at 12-1 was War Chant (Danzig), who is scheduled to make his stakes debut in the Mar. 4 GII San Rafael S. at Santa Anita. GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner Anees (Unbridled) closed at 13-1 while GI Hollywood Futurity hero Captain Steve (Fly So Free) was at 15-1. A total of \$465,454 was wagered over the four-day run of Pool 1, far exceeding last year's handle. There will be two more pools prior to the Derby. Pool 2 is set for Mar. 9-11 and the final pool is set for Apr. 13-16. (Complete List-Pool 1, p6)

☆ TRIPLE THREATS ☆

Fountain of Youth Wrap Up:

Trainer D. Wayne Lukas confirmed yesterday that GI Fountain of Youth winner High Yield (Storm Cat) would make his next start in the GI Florida Derby Mar. 11. "We're going to follow the same route with him that we did with Thunder Gulch (in 1995)," Lukas said. "He won the Fountain of Youth, the Florida Derby and Kentucky Derby." Lukas also indicated that he would also run High Yield in the Apr. 15 GI Toyota Blue Grass as his final Derby prep. Runner-up Hal's Hope (Jolie's Halo) is also slated to reappear in the Florida Derby, according to trainer Harold Rose. "He's still learning. He's really had only four races," Rose commented. "He's getting better, but he still has some things to learn." Mitchell Friedman, trainer of sixth-place finisher Un Fino Vino (Demidoff). was satisfied with the former claimer's performance. "I thought he ran a very good race. He'll definitely benefit from having that race under him and now I'll have to decide whether I'm going to run him in the Florida Derby or the Tampa Bay Derby," Friedman said. Deputy Warlock (Silver Deputy), seventh in Saturday's race, will ship to Kentucky for his next start, trainer Ken McPeek said. "He needs a track he can come from behind on so I'll run him next in the (GII) Spiral S. at Turfway Park (Mar. 25)."

Takhodha Hills Still On Track for Derby:

GIII What A Pleasure winner Takhodha Hills (Prospector's Halo), second behind pacesetting Bare Outline (Broad Brush) in Saturday's \$75,000 allowance cofeature at Gulfstream, came out of that effort in good order and will point to the Florida Derby, according to trainer Ralph Ziadie. Takhodha Hills was allowed to settle early under jockey Robbie Davis and closed well to be a clear second. "Speed held, that's all," Ziadie commented. "He's okay. I was happy with the race."

BRITISH PURSES ON THE RISE

Ascot Racecourse will host 25 Flat Pattern races this year with prize money of £3,758,000, an increase of £295,000 (8.52 percent) over 1999. Last year saw 235 Pattern races run in Britain, with prize money of £15,276,416, and the average being just over £65,000. Prize money will rise this year when there will be 133 Listed races supporting the G1s, G2s & G3s. Because of the late Easter, most of the main races are a week later than normal, with the Vodafone Derby for example being staged on the second Saturday in June rather than the first one.
