ROYAL ANTHEM OUT OF DUBAI SHEEMA CLASSIC Prince Ahmed bin Salman has withdrawn The Thoroughbred Corporation's GI Gulfstream Park Breeders' Cup H. winner Royal Anthem (Theatrical {Ire}) from the Mar. 25 Dubai Sheema Classic after the horse sustained a minor training setback in Florida. "Royal Anthem will need a short break from training and we had no choice, in the horse's best long-term racing interest, other than to scratch him from the Dubai race," said The Thoroughbred Corporation President Richard Mulhall. Speaking from Riyadh, Prince Ahmed added, "My good friend Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid al Maktoum has done wonderful things for racing in Dubai and I am truly disappointed that Royal Anthem will not be able to compete on this great day of international racing."

BEHRENS LOOKS TO START NEW STREAK Last year, Behrens used a victory in the GI Gulfstream Park H. to propel him into the national spotlight and begin a four-race win streak. After a disappointing seventh in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic a third as the favorite in the GI Donn H. Feb. 5, the six-year-old is looking for his first win in eight months. Of his five opponents in what looks to be a paceless field, Augustin Stable's With Anticipation may be the biggest threat to Behrens' defense of his title. The five-year-old gelding has done well over the Gulfstream surface, breaks from what has been a golden rail for most of the meet and will most likely set a lonely pace. Coming from off the pace will be multiple graded stakes winners Adonis and Best of Luck. Adonis was most recently second in an allowance heat over the Gulfstream strip Feb. 5, and Best of Luck ran fourth last time in the GI Donn, H.

HIALEAH AT GULFSTREAM? A source close to South Florida racing said on condition of anonymity that the two tracks are close to signing a deal that would allow the upcoming Hialeah meeting to be run at Gulfstream Park, "They have cleared all the hurdles but two," said the source. "It could happen as early as Monday or ten days from now. It depends on when they can work out the problems." The problems center around concessions and tote companies. Gulfstream has a contract with Levy Concessions while Hialeah runs their own stands and Gulfstream uses AmTote while Hialeah uses Autotote. "The contracts and software for the two tote companies don't match up and some kind of arrangements would have to be made to meld them together," added the source. Commenting on the possiblilty of the deal, Calder lobbyist Wilber Brewton added, "They're going to do it this year. But I think they'll be flirting with danger because, although the regulations allow for a permit holder to conduct their meeting at another facility, there is a penalty of twice the tax rate for both meetings that has to be paid." Gulfstream president Doug Donn had no comment on the situation and Hialeah owner John Brunetti didn't return phone calls placed yesterday.

BRITISH RUNNERS ARRIVE IN SINGAPORE

Showboat (GB) (Warning {GB}) and Monsajem (USA) (Woodman {USA}), the British-trained entries for the March 4 S\$3million Singapore Airlines International Cup at Kranji, arrived in Singapore yesterday morning after a 23-hour flight from London Heathrow. They were joined by Night Style (Fr) (Night Shift {USA}), a stablemate of Monsajem who is entered in the S\$750,000 Singapore Plate. Showboat's trainer, Barry Hills, who intends to travel to Singapore Tuesday to supervise the horse's final preparations, said: "The horse is fine. He arrived safely and had a good trip, although it did take 23 hours. If all goes well, the plan is to then go to Dubai and he will come back to Britain in early May after going through the necessary period in quarantine." Showboat will be ridden by the trainer's son, Michael. Ed Dunlop's Monsajem and Night Style were accompanied by travelling head lad Robin Trevor-Jones and work riders Steve Nicholson and Tommy Imrie. They all enjoyed a troublefree trip and are relaxing at Kranji's quarantine compound. Monsajem will be ridden by John Reid, while Night Style will be partnered by Gary Carter. Said Dunlop, "They arrived well after a particularly long flight and the next 24 to 36 hours are going to be of critical importance with travel sickness an obvious danger. We are going to go gently with them for the next 36 hours or so which should give them a good chance to rehydrate. Monsajem is going as a longshot considering he will be up against some race-fit Southern Hemisphere racehorses and Jim And Tonic (Fr) will be hard to beat. Night Style will be the only three-year-old in the Plate, which is against him, but the race is worth an awful lot of money. It is going to be hard for him this year as he was a Group 1 winner in Italy at two and win, lose or draw, he has an entry in the UAE Derby so we will just have to see how it goes. If all is well, I expect the pair to have a light canter on Monday and a good blow on Tuesday." In other Singapore news, Timahs (GB) (Mtoto {GB}) will replace Grazalema (USA) (Storm Bird {Can}) as Godolphin's entry in the Singapore Plate. The United States will be without a runner in either race following the defections of the California-based Patrick Gallaghertrained Cerulean Sky (Ire) (Darshaan {GB}) and the Laura de Seroux-trained Pavillon (Brz) (Booming {Fr}).

CORAL TO GO PUBLIC?

Britain's third largest bookmaking firm, Coral, could be floated on the stock exchange, the company revealed yesterday.
