THEATRICAL COLT TOPS FASIG-TIPTON

CALDER The Fasig-Tipton Calder Selected Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale got off to a dramatic start when hip number seven, a colt by Theatrical (Ire) out of the stakes-placed mare Rare Bird (Rahy) was purchased for a session-high \$825,000 by Brushwood Stables. Reilly McDonald signed the ticket for the colt, who registered two breezes in :11 flat in the week leading up to the sale. "We thought he was the most attractive, athletic colt in the sale," said McDonald. "We thought his breezes were very workmanlike and he did it easily. If you love the sire and believe in the sire like we do, it's a natural." Trainer Phil Serpe was reported to have been the underbidder. The pinhooking score of the first session came on the second-highest purchase, a ridgling by Phone Trick--Saratoga Style (Conquistador Cielo) who worked in :10 1/5 at the first under-tack show and was bought for \$675,000 by Stonerside Stable. He was consigned by the husband and wife team of Michael and Britt Mulligan who operate under the name Leprechaun Racing. "One of our clients, Bill Martin, bought him at Saratoga for \$40,000," explained Michael Mulligan. "He seemed to have gotten in some sort of accident. He had superficial blemishes at Saratoga and that certainly slowed him down. But he's a very gifted colt and he has come around very nicely for us." Despite the high price commanded by the Phone Trick, Mulligan expressed disappointment with how the rest of his consignment sold. "It was very spotty. We took six through the ring and sold only one other while buying four back," he said. "Good horses are commanding good money, but you have to have the full package: The work, the individual, clean X-rays, everything." In fact, 55 percent of the horses offered went unsold, an increase of 21 percent over last year's totals. The second session gets underway today at 12:00 p.m.

Last season he'd looked a galloper of huge potential, but he'd been disappointing this year, finishing on the board in only two of seven starts. Surface raced at the rear of the 12-horse field and took advantage of the cutaway rail to pounce down the inside under Noel Harris. He gained the lead from Centre Crest in the last 50 meters and then held off a late burst from Furnish.

Daiwa Texas, coming off a fourth-place finish in the Jan. 23 G2 American Jockey Club, settled at the back of the pack behind as favored Kris the Brave (Northern Taste) set a fast early pace. He shot through an opening on the rail at the top of the stretch and inched clear late for his first win of the year. "I worked him, so I knew he was ready," said winning rider Hiroki Goto. "When we found an opening on the final turn, he showed his gameness." Trainer Sueo Masuzawa said the winner would likely start next in the G1 Tenno Sho Spring at Kyoto on Apr. 30. Kris the Brave tired to sixth.

Last year's yearling sales provided plenty of evidence that Roberto's stallion sons are highly popular with some of the leading European-based buyers, who are becoming increasingly eager to find a viable alternative to the ubiquitous Northern Dancer.

Acting for Godolphin, John Ferguson was prepared to pay \$3.9 million for a son of Kris S., while Demi O'Byrne went to \$675,000 for a colt by the same sire. Godolphin also picked up the two highest-priced yearlings by Silver Hawk and Ferguson was again among the buyers of the choicest Lear Fan yearlings, notably selecting a filly for \$725,000. Red Ransom's top-priced colt was another Ferguson buy for Godolphin's stable in France and Shadwell Estate was among the European buyers of the Dynaformer yearlings. However, I cannot see any Europeans among the buyers of the handful of Major Impact yearlings which sold last year, but that could change in time.

I doubt whether most Europeans could tell you the first thing about Major Impact. The bare facts are that he was a member of the last crop by the 1972 Derby winner and he is out of a grand-daughter of Moment Of Truth II, a Broodmare of the Year. He is also a grandson of the top-class racemare Conveniently.

Major Impact soon showed himself to be a worthy member of his illustrious family. After winning his maiden on the main track at Hollywood Park early in his three-year-old season, he was soon switched to the turf, winning a nine-furlong allowance and a division of the Oceanside S. over a mile. He graduated to finish third in the GII Del Mar Derby and then just missed becoming a graded stakes winner in a desperate finish to the GIII Ascot H., going down by only a nose while giving four pounds to the winner.

The Blood-Horse handicappers considered him worthy of a rating of 115, just nine pounds below the top turf three-year-old, Lure, and Major Impact again showed that he wasn't far behind the best of his age at four, even though he was winless in four starts. He followed his third to Siberian Summer and Bertrando in the GI Charles H. Strub with an excellent third, beaten only a nose and a head, in the GI Santa Anita H. These two efforts established that Major Impact was equally at home on dirt as he was on turf and so did his third in a 10-runner Hollywood Gold Cup H.

Major Impact was next in the news when he arrived at Jonabell Farm to stand at a fee of \$5,000 in 1994. After being reasonably popular in his first three seasons, he suffered the customary hard fourth season in 1997, when he attracted only 19 mares at a fee of \$3,500, and his book was only 27 mares in 1998. He is therefore going to be short of ammunition before too long, which is a shame in view of his achievements with his first three crops. He had four stakes winners in the U.S. last year, including Minor Wisdom, a winner of the GIII Hawthorne Derby, and he was unlucky not to add a second graded winner when his son Fortifier took Sunday's Baldwin S. This race lost its Grade III status when it had to be switched off the turf.

Even though Fortifier started his career in the claiming ranks, he has a fascinating pedigree. His dam, the stakes-winning Good Response, is inbred 2x3 to Foggy Note, through her stakes winners Relaunch (by In Reality) and Belle o' Reason (by Hail To Reason). Hail To Reason and In Reality also appear in Major Impact's pedigree as his two grandsires, which means that Fortifier is inbred to both of these highly successful stallions (3x3 to In Reality and 3x4 to Hail to Reason).

GI Fountain of Youth hero High Yield (Storm Cat) was on the Gulfstream track yesterday morning for a half-mile workout in advance of his next scheduled start in the GI Florida Derby Mar. 11. The D. Wayne Lukas charge got his four furlongs in :47 1/5, out five panels in 1:01 1/5. "We wanted him to go about :48, but Teri (exercise rider Berwanger) said he just picked it up and she had trouble holding him. It was an excellent work," said assistant trainer Barry Knight. Greenwood Lake (Meadowlake), who finished fast to be fourth in the GI Fountain of Youth S. Feb. 19, brezzed five furlongs in 1:02 4/5 yesterday at Hialeah prepping for his next start in the GI Florida Derby Mar. 11 at Gulfstream Park. Also at Hialeah, GII Hutcheson S. winner More Than Ready (Southern Halo) worked three quarters in 1:13 flat. He is scheduled to make his two-turn debut in the GII Louisiana Derby at the Fair Grounds Mar. 12. Scottish Halo (Jolie's Halo) came out of his fifth-place finish in a turf allowance Sunday in good order and remains on track for the Florida Derby. "We would have like to win Sunday's race," said trainer Paul Rizzo, "but I'm very happy with his effort. He desperately needed the race and that's the main reason we ran him against older horses." Trainer Carl Nafzger reports that Saturday allowance winner Unshaded (Unbridled) will head to the Florida Derby. "The way he won on Saturday I think he deserves the chance to run with those other horses. He's getting better with every race," Nafzger commented.

Hialeah Likely to Remain at Hialeah:

The odds of Hialeah running at Gulfstream are diminishing with each passing day. Hialeah owner John Brunetti said Sunday from his table in Gulfstream's Turf Club. "I think the deal to run at Gulfstream is dead. We're ready to open our meeting at Hialeah on schedule. I don't think it will happen. When (Gulfstream Park owner) Frank Stronach and I talked I felt we were both talking the same language. But when my talks went to lower levels of management it became very difficult." Hialeah is scheduled to open March 17 for a 63 day meeting. David Romanik, Gulfstream's attorney said, "It's unlikely it will happen. But, anything is possible with Brunetti."

2001 Funding Agreement:

The Horserace Betting Levy Board has reached agreement with the British Horseracing Board over the funding structure for the outline 2001 Fixture List. The core afternoon fixture criteria will remain unchanged at two fixtures on Mondays and Tuesdays, three on Wednesdays, Thursdays, Fridays and Sundays and four or five on Saturdays. There will be funding for racing on 20 Sundays during 2001, the same number as are set to be staged this year. The number of evening fixtures, 155, is due to remain the same in 2001 but some current third evening fixtures will move to Thursdays. The total number of funded fixtures is due to rise from 1,193 this year to 1,200 in 2001. Rodney Brack, Chief Executive of the Levy Board, said: "It is good news for the racing industry that the funding structure for 2001 has been agreed in February because it means that work towards compiling the detailed Fixture List can start immediately."

James Burridge Dead:

James Burridge, owner of Ab Kettleby Stud in Leicestershire and breeder of the great chaser Desert Orchid (GB), died over the weekend after a lengthy illness. He was 78. Burridge, a solicitor, owned Desert Orchid with his son Richard. The grey horse won four King George VI Chases, the Cheltenham Gold Cup and the Irish Grand National to become the most famous jumper of the last 20 years. The funeral will be held at St. Augustine's Church in Flintham on Saturday.
